Answer:

Licence A16833 should be the only licence tied to Kitwanga Lumber Co Ltd. I would guess CIBC will become the owners based on the attached information I have provided. This is not my area of expertise, so someone else will have to make the call on this.

Kitwanga Mill closure

Advice and Recommended Response:

- The Kitwanga mill closed earlier this fall due to the uncertain economic conditions elsewhere in Canada, where a majority of its product is sent.
- That is precisely why we continue to expand and build new markets for B.C. lumber.
- B.C.'s lumber exports to China in 2010 were more than 10 times what they were in 2003, when B.C. first established an office there to market B.C. wood products.
- In 2010, lumber exports to China reached 4.56 million cubic metres –or the equivalent of 10 large B.C. sawmills.

Log exports:

- Log exports played no role in the mill's closure, rather it was about uncertain economic conditions.
- YTD August 2011, log exports were only 9.4 per cent of B.C.'s total forest product exports (value) to China.
- B.C.'s marketing efforts in China are focused on softwood lumber. A lot of mills are running today because of increased demand from China.

KEY FACTS REGARDING THE ISSUE:

On Dec 7th Kitwanga Lumber Company (KLC) filed for bankruptcy protection. The mill has been shut down since October. KLC attributed the closure and subsequent bankruptcy protection to decreased demand for lumber and lower prices, resulting from continued global economic uncertainty.

Lumber production resumed at Kitwanga in June 2011 after Pacific BioEnergy acquired the mill in fall 2009. An estimated 80 per cent of Kitwanga's production was for domestic markets across Canada, with the other 20 per cent destined for China, Japan and Korea.

The Kitwanga lumber mill's return to production had directly generated 45 mill jobs and another 45 indirect jobs in logging, hauling, silviculture and support services and supplies.

Kitwanga Lumber Co. Ltd. (KLC) announced this afternoon that has filed for bankruptcy protection. The action comes after efforts this fall to seek new niche markets for the specialty wood products mill proved unsuccessful. The outlook for 2012 is not expected to improve.

KLC restarted in June as lumber markets and prices looked stable and were expected to stay consistent through the remainder of the year and beyond. Continuing global economic uncertainty throughout the summer led to a decreased demand for lumber and decreased prices. KLC soon became unprofitable and was temporarily shut down in October.

KLC is a subsidiary of Pacific BioEnergy Corporation (PBEC) which spent two years attempting to make KLC successful while also working on plans to develop a wood pellet plant in Kitwanga. PBEC still believes there is a bright future for the Northwest BC bioenergy industry.
