#### **BACKGROUND:**

Government recently passed the *Laboratory Services Act* (*LSA*) to move forward on laboratory reform. The approved, but not yet in force, legislation replaces the current structure in which laboratory services are governed and funded under the *Hospital Insurance Act* (in-patient) and the *Medicare Protection Act* (out-patient). The *LSA* consolidates responsibilities for governance, funding and service delivery oversight of publically funded medical laboratory services under a single statute s.13, s.17
