There has been some media around the Federal Government intervening with the Health Ministry regarding people who have long-term addictions. The medical trial is called SALOME and it is attempting to develop new techniques to reduce crime and profits for the organized illegal drug trade and provide more effective treatments for those with chronic problems. This medical trial was supported by the provincial government for \$6.4 million and by the federal government for \$1 million. I personally raised over \$200,000 to get this established and the group I helped set up – Inner Change Society – put in \$1 million. This money came from a number of philanthropists including Don Rix, the Aquilinis, etc.

This federal intervention will likely cost additional money to the provincial health budget and will influence our ability to manage the social problems related to drug addiction. Recently I had an interesting discussion with a constituent who is knowledgeable in the area of residential care for seniors, and she made suggestions worthy of your attention, based on principles that I think are sound. I address each in turn:

- All facilities should receive equal treatment. Presently some senior's facilities are regulated 1. under the Hospital Act, and some under the Continuing Care Act. This means that some homes have advantages that others don't; for example, those regulated under the Hospital Act receive free pharmacy. This makes it difficult for private facilities to compete.
- There should be equal standards for complex care, so that it doesn't matter where a senior lives. 2. Presently there are no province-wide standards for complex care that equalize what must be provided by for-profit, nonprofit and Health Authority owned-and-operated facilities. This means that some seniors suffer worse care than others. As standards vary widely between institutions, it matters very much where a senior lives.
- Seniors should have a choice where to live. Presently a senior who needs complex care is placed 3. on a waiting list, and directed to the next available publicly-funded bed. That bed may be in a different community, or in a room with multiple occupants, or in a poorly-run facility. While regulations might attempt to mandate solutions, the problem could be more simply rectified by providing for consumer choice and competition. If the senior (and family), upon being allocated a publicly-funded bed, were to be able to choose the institution of their choice, they would choose the best one. This would give all Institutions the Incentive to compete for the choice of the senior through upgrades to living spaces and services. The worst places would have to change, or cease to exist. This would raise the quality of life of all seniors in complex care.

Looking to the future of an aging population, we need to put in place the incentives that will provide them with the best quality of care. Thank you in advance for considering and responding to these suggestions.
