Educational Institution Eligibility Policy Framework

Context

On 15 June 2010, federal, provincial and territorial (FPT) Ministers responsible for immigration agreed to work together to improve Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students. Since this time, Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) has worked with provincial/territorial ministries of immigration and education—through the Federal-Provincial/Territorial Working Group on International Students—to discuss a number of proposed reforms to the International Student Program (ISP), which will assist Ministers in meeting this commitment. The key reforms proposed include the introduction of new conditions that would require international students in Canada to study, and that this study takes place at an educational institution designated by provinces/territories for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits. These new requirements will be put in place through amendments to the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations* (IRPR).

The designation of educational institutions across Canada involves an important new role for provinces/territories given their jurisdiction over education. In fact, in order to be able to host international students with study permits, educational institutions will be required to first obtain designation from their respective ministry of education or advanced education. To support this new requirement, the following "Educational Institution Eligibility Framework" will outline common elements educational institutions will be required to meet in order to obtain designation, and identify the roles and responsibilities of provinces/territories and CIC in the administration of the Framework.

Objective

The "Educational Institution Eligibility Policy Framework" outlines a pan-Canadian approach to guide jurisdictions in the designation of educational institutions based on common elements. The Framework takes into account that provinces/territories have common levers over educational institutions, both formal and informal, which enable them to provide varying degrees of oversight over education institutions. It also recognizes that the specifics of these mechanisms are varied both within and across jurisdictions.

This Framework gives assurance that a suitable basis exists for the purpose of designating educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits in both the public and private education sectors. It also supports cooperation and coordination between federal and provincial/territorial governments in meeting common goals to improve the integrity of Canada's ISP, enhance accountability to international students as well as to Canadians, and improve Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students seeking a quality education.

This Framework is intended to structure subsequent bilateral arrangements between CIC and provinces/territories, and between provinces/territories and educational institutions in their respective jurisdictions. The objective of the arrangements is to outline roles and responsibilities with respect to administering the ISP, and to facilitate information-sharing, based on the provisions outlined in this Framework.

It is recognized that while the denial of designation and/or revocation of designation status could potentially affect an institution's revenue or reputation, protecting the interests of international students, the Canadian public, and Canada's reputation abroad are the paramount considerations under this Framework.

Scope

This Framework will outline common elements educational institutions must meet in order to be eligible to host international students with study permits, as well as the roles and responsibilities of CIC and provinces/territories regarding designation and revocation of designation.

Given the active role played by educational institutions in the promotion, recruitment and admission of foreign nationals, educational institutions have an important role to play with respect to maintaining the integrity of the ISP. Educational institutions are also a key source for up-to-date information on the status of international students after their arrival to Canada, such as enrolment status. As such, educational institutions are central to efforts by both levels of government to effectively manage the risks inherent in admitting foreign nationals to Canada for the purposes of study, work, and potential immigration.

For this reason, designated educational institutions will be asked to report on the status of international students with study permits after arrival in Canada, to determine whether or not international students are meeting the conditions of their study permit. This requirement will be a condition for hosting international students with study permits, and will form part of the common elements for designation. To support this work, CIC will be responsible for developing a compliance reporting system for educational institutions.

Access to international student work permit programs will be limited to eligible study permit holders attending a designated institution. Any decisions concerning expanding access to CIC's work-permit programs will not be considered as part of this framework.

Approach

This framework is premised on the establishment of common elements to be used when designating educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits. These common elements should apply across all education sub-sectors, both public and private, in recognition of the need to accommodate the diversity of purposes of Canadian education.

The common elements should be reflected in the designation policies of each jurisdiction across Canada. It is recognized that jurisdictions will require flexibility in the specific measures implemented under the Framework. Each jurisdiction will therefore implement designation policies that are responsive to their own particular needs while being consistent with the Framework.

Federal and provincial/territorial governments will ensure that the decisions they make in implementing this Framework apply their respective legislative, regulatory and/or policy frameworks, and are consistent with this Framework. Implementation will be formalized through bilateral CIC-provincial/territorial arrangements, which will outline respective provincial/territorial designation

policies, formalize CIC and provincial/territorial roles and responsibilities with respect to the designation and enforcement of designation, and facilitate information sharing.

Provinces/Territories will subsequently establish bilateral arrangements with designated educational institutions outlining the provincial/territorial designation policy, which shall include the common elements established under this Framework, and may include additional provincial/territorial requirements over and above those identified in this Framework.

Common Elements for Designation

All jurisdictions agree to the development of common elements or minimum standards for developing designation criteria in order to assure the integrity of Canada's ISP, enhance accountability to international students as well as to Canadians, and assure Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students seeking a quality education. Designation criteria will include the following minimum common elements:

- In order to be eligible for designation by a province or territory, an institution must be deemed by
 the province/territory in which it is located to be in good standing with respect to any applicable
 provincial/territorial legislation, regulations, and/or policies governing education, and/or with
 bylaws, standards, and policies respecting the delivery of education or training programs set by
 accrediting or standard-setting bodies recognized by the provincial/territorial government.
- 2. That I the educational institution agrees to and is will be accountable for meeting the following terms and conditions:
 - a. has adopted policies and put procedures in place that provide for the protection of international students with study permits, including a transparent tuition-fee refund policy which is made available to all incoming international students upon offer of admission;
 - b. has established policies and procedures related to language proficiency and credential assessment and recognition for international students, and disseminates accurate and transparent information regarding those policies to prospective students;
 - c. has sufficient administrative capacity to provide services to meet the unique needs of international students:
 - d. undertakes promotional initiatives that are, where applicable, in compliance with existing provincial or territorial regulations or policies on advertising, including compliance with the Imagine Education au/in Canada brand-eligibility framework;
 - e. has a published policy that outlines the elements that constitute a student's good standing at the institution and, where applicable, demonstrates that that policy is consistent with provincial/territorial requirements.
 - f. is capable of maintaining the following enrolment-reporting requirements and has designated an individual who will be responsible for:
 - i. confirming the initial enrolment of each international student with a study permit;
 - reporting on the ongoing enrolment status of all international students with student permits attending that institution;

I am writing regarding the timing of implementation for Citizenship and Immigration Canada's (CIC) proposed regulatory changes to the International Student Program, currently planned to take effect on January 1, 2014.

I would like to express British Columbia's continued support for the overall objectives of the changes to the International Student Program. Ongoing federal-provincial/territorial cooperation has been productive and has resulted in significant progress on this initiative. I also appreciate your offer to meet with provincial deputy ministers of education, and believe this will provide a great opportunity for further discussion of the International Student Program.

At this time, I would like to highlight British Columbia's concerns regarding the timeframe for the reforms. While acknowledging our appreciation of Minister Kenney's extension of the original implementation date of June 2013 to January 1, 2014 in response to a request from the Chair of the Council of Ministers of Education, Canada, British Columbia requires additional time to properly implement the changes. As such, we request an additional six month extension to June 2014.

In British Columbia, we are committed to ensuring a quality education experience for all students and in this context our international students, and we appreciate that CIC also shares that commitment. There are currently nearly 400 regulated institutions, and potentially 200 unregulated institutions and organizations providing education programs to students at the post-secondary level in British Columbia. The CIC regulation changes and provincial approach to designating institutions eligible to host international students have significant policy, operational and resource implications for government, institutions, students and the various regulatory bodies in British Columbia. An extension to the implementation timeframe would help our post-secondary institutions and organizations, including qualified theological schools, private career colleges, language schools, and others meet our quality standards in time to allow them to continue to qualify to host international students.

Details of many of the issues we note above were not available at the time of the previous Council of Ministers of Education, Canada request for an extension in 2012. With the new information that has come from our shared progress on this initiative, we feel strongly that an extension is necessary to undertake policy, regulation and legislative changes that may be required in British Columbia to ensure successful implementation.

British Columbia and CIC share a goal of increasing the integrity of the International Student Program. We both also want to ensure we minimize disruption to students and institutions, and minimize economic and other risks. It is in the best interests of students, institutions and governments that we work carefully to ensure a positive outcome of the regulatory changes to the International Student Program.

Dear Minister:

I wish to first congratulate you on your new role as Minister of Citizenship and Immigration Canada. I also acknowledge our effective federal-provincial/territorial cooperation and collaboration on international education related initiatives, which has resulted in significant progress in this area, in particular with respect to proposed regulatory changes to the International Student Program (ISP). I would also like to express my appreciation for Citizenship and Immigration Canada's (CIC) recent approval of an extension to the date that the regulations will come into force, subject to final federal Cabinet approval.

I am writing to you with respect to British Columbia's concerns regarding issues that fall under the purview of CIC, which are negatively impacting the ISP, as well as British Columbia and Canada's international reputation as a top study destination. These impacts affect our joint ability to achieve the ambitious targets we have each set for the growth in international students. For example, the International Consultants for Education and Fairs Agent Barometer 2012, a survey of over a thousand international student agents from more than a hundred countries, ranked Canada as the most challenging country with respect to the study permit application and approval process. While we fully support CIC's aim to protect the integrity of Canada's immigration system, the study permit application and approval process must be reasonable and not inhibit quality students from completing their studies in Canada. If Canada's study permit processing remains slow, it will become increasingly difficult to compete with other countries. Once this market share is lost, it could be very challenging to regain again in future.

In the last year, several immigration sections at Canadian missions have been closed. Furthermore, staff cutbacks in immigration sections in many other countries, such as in China, have resulted in delays in study permit and visa processing. British Columbia understands and supports CIC's efforts to make its domestic and international operations more cost-effective and efficient where there is assurance that these changes will result in client service standards as good as or better than pre-closure standards in terms of ease of access and processing times.

The ability of our schools and post-secondary institutions to provide support to international students is a critical part of the quality learning and living experience that students experience when they come to British Columbia and Canada. This is a key goal of the Province's International Education Strategy.

Amendments to the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act (IRPA)* that came into force on June 30, 2011, have had a significant impact on the international education sector as now only members of a prescribed regulatory body may represent, or provide advice, including to international students, on applications or proceedings under IRPA.

To ensure compliance with *IRPA*, international student advisors at our schools and institutions are now required to become authorized representatives (members of a Canadian law society or registered with the Immigration Consultants of Canada Regulatory Council), or to ensure such representation is provided by other means (e.g. by contracted representation). Our schools and institutions have advised us that meeting the requirement to become an authorized representative is typically lengthy and costly, and further, may be beyond the scope of many schools and institutions.

We acknowledge CIC's work to improve the accessibility of immigration services and clarity of immigration information for all clients through initiatives such as the Come to Canada Wizard, a reorganized CIC website, as well as a new online Help Centre. British Columbia commends CIC on these initiatives. Despite these improvements, our international students continue to experience significant challenges when trying to access CIC's services and information. The current average response time from the CIC's e-mail answer service is approximately three weeks, which is not acceptable for students who have made a commitment to study in Canada.

The current job action of the Professional Association of Foreign Service Officers (PAFSO) is having a negative impact on British Columbia's international education sector. Our institutions have advised us that the PAFSO job action this summer, the most important period of the year for incoming international students, has already resulted in reductions in international student admissions for fall 2013. We remain concerned about long-term implications on our sector and our international reputation.

You are likely aware that British Columbia is Canada's second largest destination for international students and temporary foreign workers. You may also be aware that British Columbia has set an ambitious target under the *Jobs Plan* to increase international student enrolments at schools and institutions in the province by 50 percent over the next four years. The Jobs Plan also sets out British Columbia's interest in partnering with the federal government to attract more foreign skilled workers and entrepreneurs to meet our growing labour market needs. As stated in the final report from the Advisory Panel on Canada's International Education Strategy in August 2012, "efforts to attract international students and researchers to Canada will be hampered without a coherent and well-supported visa system to process their entry."

In the spirit of our federal/provincial partnership, and consistent with the Advisory panel report, we seek your assurance that CIC will continue to make improvements to the immigration system that will ensure Canada remains a top study destination for international students.

I look forward to our continued work together as we advance our shared priorities.

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


Part I: Background Information



International Student Program - Overview

Roles and responsibilities:

- The federal government supports Canada's national security interests by ensuring the integrity of the study permit program and preventing the entry of non-genuine student
- CIC and the Canada Border Services Agency are responsible for the implementation of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act and regulations, and for managing the entry of foreign nationals into Canada for study/work purposes (a.k.a. Canada's International Student Program)
- Provinces and territories share jurisdiction for immigration and have full jurisdiction over education, including the regulation and oversight of educational institutions
- Provinces and territories do not, however, have a comprehensive formal role in the selection of educational institutions that recruit and accept international students



iternational Student Program - Overview

Value of the program:

- International students enrich the academic environment, enhance the intercultural competencies of domestic students, and serve as unofficial ambassadors after returning to home countries
- Opportunities for international students to gain Canadian work experience during/after their studies, through work permit programs, help prepare those interested in immigration for the labour force while filling labour market needs
- A Canadian educational credential, coupled with Canadian work experience, provides international students with opportunities to qualify for permanent residence through the Canadian Experience Class and Provincial Nominee Programs
- International students contribute approximately \$6.5 billion a year to the Canadian economy through tuition fees and other expenses

By the Numbers

Total number of international students in Canada in 2011: 239.121

Principal countries of origin: China (28%), India (10%), Korea (9%), Saudi Arabia (6%), USA (5%), France (4%)

Main provinces and institutions of destination: Ontario (40%), British Columbia (28%), Quebec (15%)

Levels of study: University (42%), Other PSE (25%), K-12 (22%)





International Student Program - Overview

Innovations:

- Program improvements to make Canada more attractive for international students include:
 - 2006 extension of Off-Campus Work Permit Program to private degree-granting institutions in certain provinces/territories
 - 2008 Post-Graduation Work Permit Program modification to allow international students to work in any occupation for up to 3 years after graduation from Canadian university/college; prior, students could work up to 2 years, and had to obtain a job offer
- Direct route to permanent residence implemented in 2008 through the Canadian Experience Class to provide an immigration stream for international graduates with Canadian work experience

International Student Program – 2010 Evaluation

- CIC released an evaluation of International Student Program July 2010
- The evaluation confirms that the International Student Program:
 - Aligns with Government of Canada and CIC objectives and priorities, and with provincial activities
 - Brings important benefits to Canada:
 - Educational institutions and communities receive economic benefits through extensive international student-generated revenue which is distributed across much of Canada
 - Social and cultural benefits include diversification of Canadian communities and internationalization of Canadian campuses
 - International students staying to work after graduation and/or reside in Canada is increasing, consistent with growing recognition of economic benefits to Canada of their retention



International Student Program – 2010 Evaluation

- The evaluation also pointed to areas that need improvement:
 - CIC's policy framework currently leaves the International Student Program
 vulnerable to potential misuse
 - Non-genuine students and questionable educational institutions are primary concerns in the student application caseload
 - CIC does not have a complete inventory of legitimate educational institutions in Canada, nor the authority to ensure their quality
 - In general, there is reported fraud and misuse in the International Student Program
 - Extent of fraud is unclear due to a lack of data and consistent reporting, and efforts to mitigate the risk of fraud and misuse are quite varied

Current Program Framework – Program Integrity Gaps

No standards for educational institutions hosting international students:

Current context

- Under current Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations, any educational institution offering educational or training courses can host international students, whether or not it is accredited, regulated, overseen by a Ministry of Education, or accountable to a recognized standard-setting body
- The educational institutions that currently host international students vary widely in terms of quality and accountability

Current gaps

- CIC does not have jurisdiction over educational institutions and therefore has limited ability to assess whether or not institutions are genuine and providing students with quality education and services
- In some cases, institutions take advantage of international students by offering sub-par education, or promise programs of study that they are unauthorized or unequipped to deliver
- Other institutions involved in more unscrupulous activities, such as operating as so-called "visa mills" with the sole purpose of facilitating the entry of foreign nationals into Canada

Current Program Framework – Program Integrity Gaps

No requirement for international students to study once in Canada:

Current context

- Under current Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations, foreign nationals must only demonstrate intent to study at time of application
- Currently no requirement for study permit holders to be enrolled or actively pursuing studies
- Study permits issued for length of program of study, often up to 4 years
- No tracking of international students after arrival in Canada

Current gaps

- Foreign nationals may come to Canada on a study permit for extended periods of time without ever having to undertake studies, leaving the International Student Program open to abuse
- Some foreign nationals use study permits as a means to enter Canada for purposes other than study, including conducting illegal activity
- In addition, 2010 RCMP report on human trafficking identified study permits as one avenue leading to exploitation in the sex trades



Current Program Framework – Program Integrity Gaps

Need to ensure that study, not work, remains primary focus of students:

Current context

- Under current Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations, international students may work in Canada during their studies without a Labour Market Opinion in the following ways: On-Campus, Off-Campus (maximum 20 hours per week), or to fulfill co-op/internship requirements
- Generally international student work provisions limited to students attending public postsecondary and private degree-granting institutions; co-op/internship work available to students attending any type of institution, provided work component is requirement of program of study
- Youth unemployment remains high in Canada (14%) need to ensure work privileges for international students are managed to ensure overall benefit to Canada

Current gaps

- Some institutions and complicit employers use work programs for international students in order to facilitate the entry of low-skilled workers into the Canadian labour market
- Access to various work avenues for international students is not consistent across public and private educational institutions





Proposed change: Designation of educational institutions

- Limit issuance of study permits to students destined to institutions designated by a province or territory
 - CIC has asked provinces and territories to take responsibility for designating educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students
 - Provinces and territories have developed, in consultation with CIC, minimum common standards that institutions would be required to meet to be designated
 - Designation requirement applies to post-secondary institutions in all education sectors (K-12 sector out of scope)
 - Each province and territory will determine its own designation policy and process, taking into account minimum common standards
 - CIC would not play an active role in designation process; its role would be limited to applying the list of designated institutions when processing study permit applications
 - No deadline to become designated institutions may be added or removed from the list of designated institutions at any time once proposed regulations come into force






Proposed change: Designation of educational institutions (cont'd)

- In the event that a province/territory does not sign an agreement with CIC agreeing to designate educational institutions, under proposed regulations CIC would limit issuance of Study Permits to foreign nationals attending only the following types of institutions:
 - a public post-secondary learning institution in Canada that is recognized by the province;
 - in the case of Quebec, a private post-secondary learning institution that operates under the same rules and regulations as public post-secondary learning institutions in Quebec;
 - a private post-secondary learning institution in Canada that is recognized by the province and that is authorized by the province to confer degrees, but only in the case where the foreign national in question is enrolled in a program of study that leads to a degree as authorized by the province;
 - a learning institution within a public school board or district that is funded by and accountable to the province; or
 - an independent or private learning institution in Canada that delivers provincial curricula.



Proposed change: Non-designated educational institutions

- Non-designated institutions would not be eligible to host foreign nationals under a study permit or offer work opportunities to students
- Foreign nationals who wish to undertake programs of study of six months or less, for which a study permit is not required, would continue to be able to pursue studies at a non-designated institution, as members of the visitor class
- Foreign nationals in Canada who have completed a short-term program at a non-designated institution, that is a precondition to their enrolling at designated institution, i.e. language training, may apply for a study permit to a designated institution from within Canada



Proposed change: Introduction of new study permit conditions

- Introduce new study permit conditions, through regulations, that would require study permit holders to enrol and actively pursue a course or program of study
 - CIC would have the authority to verify that study permit holders are meeting the conditions of their permit, including through sampling or audit exercises
 - In circumstances where students are found to be non-compliant with study permit conditions, a removal order will be issued and these cases will not be referred to the Immigration and Refugee Board for a hearing
 - Exemptions include protected persons, refugee claimants, and family members



Proposed change: Access to work during studies

- Streamline access to work permit programs
 - Expand access to work during studies to include eligible students attending both public and private, postsecondary designated institutions
 - Limit work access to full-time students undertaking academic, vocational or professional training programs at a designated, post-secondary institution
- Introduce facilitative measures to attract and retain international students
 - Eliminate Off-Campus Work Permit and allow eligible students to work off-campus part-time for up to 20 hours as long as they hold a valid study permit
 - Institutions no longer required to conduct verification or reporting exercises under the Off-Campus Work Permit Program
 - Work permit still required for students wishing to perform work as part of a co-op or internship program
 - Students would be required to meet the conditions of their study permit in order to maintain authorization to work during studies
- No changes proposed to Post-Graduation Work Permit Program at this time
 - Currently, eligibility includes graduates of a public post-secondary institution, a private post-secondary institution in Quebec that operates under the same rules and regulations as public institutions or a Canadian private institution authorized by provincial statute to confer degrees (but only if you are enrolled in one of the programs of study leading to a degree as authorized by the province and not in all programs of study offered by the private institution)





Proposed change: New compliance reporting role for institutions

- Institutions play an active role in promotion, recruitment and admission of international students and are a key source for information on students, i.e. enrolment status
- CIC views institutions as important partners in managing the risks inherent in admitting foreign nationals to Canada for the purposes of study, work, and potential immigration
- CIC would like to obtain information about international students from designated educational institutions, in a systematic way, in order to ensure that study permit holders are meeting the conditions of their study permit





How would the system work?

- CIC is proposing to develop an integrated technology solution that would:
 - Host a drop-down list of designated institutions, to be used by immigration officers
 - Provide a portal for designated institutions to verify student compliance with study permit conditions and provide reports to CIC – i.e. enrollment, good standing status
 - Create an interface between portal and CIC system to facilitate two-way data exchange,
 allowing automated referrals to CIC/CBSA when case review or investigation is required
 - Allow CIC to collect operational data on international students by educational institution
- CIC would request reports from institutions on a regular basis or may initiate targeted requests
- Institutions may also proactively identify students who don't show up
- Reporting frequency is still TBD but would likely occur once or twice per year
- CIC would like to undertake separate consultations with stakeholders to develop system design and reporting requirements





What's in it for institutions?

- CIC able to provide better data to stakeholders, including reports on student compliance trends by educational institution
- CIC overseas and in-Canada Visa Offices able to adjust processing of study permit applications based on actual risk and compliance trends
- Institutions can use compliance data to adjust future recruitment practices to improve outcomes, including choice of education recruiters
- Examples of similar, successful collaboration between CIC and institutions include:
 - Off-Campus Work Permit Program (Electronic Notification System)
 - Student Partners Program

- Data-based information on student compliance patterns and relative risk
- Improved recruiting practices by DFAIT, PTs and educational institutions

ansitional Provisions

- As of January 1, 2014:
 - Individuals who already hold a study permit and are studying at a non-designated institution may complete the program of study in which they were enrolled
 - Individuals who already hold a study permit and are studying at a non-designated institution may obtain an extension to complete the program of study in which they were enrolled for the duration of their program of study or three years after the day on which the proposed Regulations come into force, whichever is shorter
 - The condition of actively pursuing studies would immediately be effective at the coming into force of the Regulations, and therefore, the option to issue a removal order for not actively pursuing studies would also be in place immediately

Educational Institution Eligibility Policy Framework

Context

On 15 June 2010, federal, provincial and territorial (FPT) Ministers responsible for immigration agreed to work together to improve Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students. Since this time, Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) has worked with provincial/territorial ministries of immigration and education—through the Federal-Provincial/Territorial Working Group on International Students—to discuss a number of proposed reforms to the International Student Program (ISP), which will assist Ministers in meeting this commitment. The key reforms proposed include the introduction of new conditions that would require international students in Canada to study, and that this study takes place at an educational institution designated by provinces/territories for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits. These new requirements will be put in place through amendments to the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations* (IRPR).

The designation of educational institutions across Canada involves an important new role for provinces/territories given their jurisdiction over education. In fact, in order to be able to host international students with study permits, educational institutions will be required to first obtain designation from their respective ministry of education or advanced education. To support this new requirement, the following "Educational Institution Eligibility Framework" will outline common elements educational institutions will be required to meet in order to obtain designation, and identify the roles and responsibilities of provinces/territories and CIC in the administration of the Framework.

Objective

The "Educational Institution Eligibility Policy Framework" outlines a pan-Canadian approach to guide jurisdictions in the designation of educational institutions based on common elements. The Framework takes into account that provinces/territories have common levers over educational institutions, both formal and informal, which enable them to provide varying degrees of oversight over education institutions. It also recognizes that the specifics of these mechanisms are varied both within and across jurisdictions.

This Framework gives assurance that a suitable basis exists for the purpose of designating educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits in both the public and private education sectors. It also supports cooperation and coordination between federal and provincial/territorial governments in meeting common goals to improve the integrity of Canada's ISP, enhance accountability to international students as well as to Canadians, and improve Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students seeking a quality education.

This Framework is intended to structure subsequent bilateral arrangements between CIC and provinces/territories, and between provinces/territories and educational institutions in their respective jurisdictions. The objective of the arrangements is to outline roles and responsibilities with respect to administering the ISP, and to facilitate information-sharing, based on the provisions outlined in this Framework.

It is recognized that while the denial of designation and/or revocation of designation status could potentially affect an institution's revenue or reputation, protecting the interests of international students, the Canadian public, and Canada's reputation abroad are the paramount considerations under this Framework.

Scope

This Framework will outline common elements educational institutions must meet in order to be eligible to host international students with study permits, as well as the roles and responsibilities of CIC and provinces/territories regarding designation and revocation of designation.

Given the active role played by educational institutions in the promotion, recruitment and admission of foreign nationals, educational institutions have an important role to play with respect to maintaining the integrity of the ISP. Educational institutions are also a key source for up-to-date information on the status of international students after their arrival to Canada, such as enrolment status. As such, educational institutions are central to efforts by both levels of government to effectively manage the risks inherent in admitting foreign nationals to Canada for the purposes of study, work, and potential immigration.

For this reason, designated educational institutions will be asked to report on the status of international students with study permits after arrival in Canada, to determine whether or not international students are meeting the conditions of their study permit. This requirement will be a condition for hosting international students with study permits, and will form part of the common elements for designation. To support this work, CIC will be responsible for developing a compliance reporting system for educational institutions.

Access to international student work permit programs will be limited to eligible study permit holders attending a designated institution. Any decisions concerning expanding access to CIC's work-permit programs will not be considered as part of this framework.

Approach

This framework is premised on the establishment of common elements to be used when designating educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits. These common elements should apply across all education sub-sectors, both public and private, in recognition of the need to accommodate the diversity of purposes of Canadian education.

The common elements should be reflected in the designation policies of each jurisdiction across Canada. It is recognized that jurisdictions will require flexibility in the specific measures implemented under the Framework. Each jurisdiction will therefore implement designation policies that are responsive to their own particular needs while being consistent with the Framework.

Federal and provincial/territorial governments will ensure that the decisions they make in implementing this Framework apply their respective legislative, regulatory and/or policy frameworks, and are consistent with this Framework. Implementation will be formalized through bilateral CIC-provincial/territorial arrangements, which will outline respective provincial/territorial designation

policies, formalize CIC and provincial/territorial roles and responsibilities with respect to the designation and enforcement of designation, and facilitate information sharing.

Provinces/Territories will subsequently establish bilateral arrangements with designated educational institutions outlining the provincial/territorial designation policy, which shall include the common elements, established under this Framework, and may include additional provincial/territorial requirements over and above those identified in this Framework.

Common Elements for Designation


All jurisdictions agree to the development of common elements or minimum standards for developing designation criteria in order to assure the integrity of Canada's ISP, enhance accountability to international students as well as to Canadians, and assure Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students seeking a quality education. Designation criteria will include the following minimum common elements:

- In order to be eligible for designation by a province or territory, an institution must be deemed by
 the province/territory in which it is located to be in good standing with respect to any applicable
 provincial/territorial legislation, regulations, and/or policies governing education, and/or with
 bylaws, standards, and policies respecting the delivery of education or training programs set by
 accrediting or standard-setting bodies recognized by the provincial/territorial government.
- 2. The educational institution agrees to and will be accountable for meeting the following terms and conditions:
 - a. has adopted policies and put procedures in place that provide for the protection of international students with study permits, including a transparent tuition-fee refund policy which is made available to all incoming international students upon offer of admission;
 - b. has established policies and procedures related to language proficiency and credential assessment and recognition for international students, and disseminates accurate and transparent information regarding those policies to prospective students;
 - c. has sufficient administrative capacity to provide services to meet the unique needs of international students;
 - d. undertakes promotional initiatives that are, where applicable, in compliance with existing provincial or territorial regulations or policies on advertising, including compliance with the Imagine Education au/in Canada brand-eligibility framework;
 - e. has a published policy that outlines the elements that constitute a student's good standing at the institution and, where applicable, demonstrates that that policy is consistent with provincial/territorial requirements.
 - f. is capable of maintaining the following enrolment-reporting requirements and has designated an individual who will be responsible for:
 - i. confirming the initial enrolment of each international student with a study permit; and
 - ii. reporting on the ongoing enrolment status of all international students with student permits attending that institution.
- 3. The educational institution meets such other criteria as may be specified in the terms and conditions of the institution's bilateral arrangement with the province/territory in which it is located.



Overview of Proposed Changes to Canada's International Student Program

Regulatory Amendment to Require Study after Arrival in Canada

Currently, foreign nationals destined to Canada for the purpose of study must only demonstrate intent to study. Under the current *Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations* (IRPR), there is no requirement for students to be registered at an institution to attend classes after arrival in Canada. Students who have not registered, or attended classes for extended periods of time, but who still hold valid Study Permits, cannot currently be reported under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* (IRPA) for misrepresentation, and can remain in Canada legally until the expiration of their Study Permit.

To ensure that foreign nationals entering Canada for the purpose of study are genuine students, CIC will introduce new Study Permit conditions in the IRPR which will require all Study Permit holders to be enrolled and actively pursuing a course or program of study at a designated educational institution after arrival in Canada, in order to maintain legal status. In support of proposed regulations, CIC is proposing to establish an electronic system that would, with support from provinces/territories, require educational institutions to report to CIC on the status of international students' compliance with Study Permit conditions.

CIC and CBSA officers would have the authority to take enforcement actions against Study Permit holders who fail to meet conditions after arrival in Canada. Enforcement actions could include desk investigations undertaken by CIC or field investigations undertaken by the CBSA regarding student compliance with Study Permit conditions. CIC or CBSA would issue a removal order in circumstances where students do not comply with their study permit conditions.

Regulatory Amendment to Limit Issuance of Study Permits to Foreign Nationals Destined to Designated Educational Institutions

In Canada, there are currently no limitations on the types of educational institutions allowed to host international students. While provinces/territories have jurisdiction over education, and may set quality assessment standards for certain education sectors within their jurisdictions, some education providers are not overseen by education ministries. There is, therefore, a wide variation in the types of accountability and/or quality assurance measures that may be in place for different types of institutions across provinces/territories. The proposed amendments to the IRPR will only allow a foreign national to apply for a Study Permit if he/she has been accepted to a designated educational institution.

Designation of educational institutions would be guided by the "Educational Institution Eligibility Policy Framework" developed by provincial governments in consultation with CIC, which sets out to identify minimum common standards that educational institutions must meet to host international students, including agreeing to report to provinces/territories and CIC on international student enrolment and good standing status. The Framework also outlines both CIC and provincial/territorial roles in the administration of the Framework.



The Framework is designed to establish a common approach to the designation policies that would be developed and implemented in each jurisdiction across Canada. It is also recognized that jurisdictions will have flexibility in the specific measures implemented to address these principles. The common approach outlined in the Framework document provides the basis for bilateral agreements to be concluded between CIC and each province/territory. Building upon this basis, provinces/territories will further tailor these bilateral agreements according to iurisdictional requirements.

In the event that a province/territory does not sign an agreement with CIC agreeing to designate educational institutions, under proposed regulations CIC would limit issuance of Study Permits to foreign nationals attending only the following types of institutions:

- a public post-secondary learning institution in Canada that is recognized by the province;
- in the case of Quebec, a private post-secondary learning institution in Quebec that operates under the same rules and regulations as public post-secondary learning institutions in Ouebec:
- a private post-secondary learning institution in Canada that is recognized by the province and that is authorized by the province to confer degrees, but only in the case where the foreign national in question is enrolled in a program of study that leads to a degree as authorized by the province;
- a learning institution within a public school board or district that is funded by and accountable to the province; or
- an independent or private learning institution in Canada that delivers provincial curricula.

Although they are not required to do so, foreign nationals would continue to be authorized to apply for a Study Permit for a program of six months or less, as is currently the case, but only if they are destined to a designated institution.

Non-Designated Educational Institutions

Those foreign nationals who wish to attend an institution that has not been designated would be permitted to undertake a course or program of study lasting six months or less (short-term studies) as a temporary resident (assuming all other requirements are met). At the end of the period of authorized stay, the foreign national would be required to leave Canada, as is currently the case.

Foreign nationals at non-designated institutions would not be eligible for Work Permit programs designed for international students - e.g. Co-op/Internship Work Permit Program, Off-Campus Work Permit Program, Post-Graduation Work Permit Program.

Work Permit Programs

Proposed Regulations would limit access to Work Permit programs to only those students attending designated educational institutions. Further, Work Permit programs would be limited to full-time students who are enrolled in and actively pursuing an academic, professional or vocational training program leading to a degree, diploma or certificate; those students



undertaking English or French as a Second Language (ESL/FSL) programs, general interest courses or preparatory courses would, therefore, be excluded from all Work Permit programs.

The proposed amendments would also authorize full-time international students to work off-campus for a maximum of 20 hours per week without a work permit, provided they hold a valid Study Permit and their program of study is at least six months in duration at the post-secondary level. International students would, consequently, no longer be required to apply for an Off-Campus Work Permit.

In-Canada Study Permit Application

Certain foreign nationals who wish to apply for a study permit to attend a designated institution after they have entered Canada as a temporary resident, including those studying at the preschool, primary or secondary level, or those who have completed a course or program of study that is a condition for acceptance at a designated institution, would be authorized under the proposed Regulations to apply for a study permit from within Canada instead of being required to leave the country to apply from abroad. This change would further facilitate the transition from visitor to study permit holder for minor students once they reach the age of majority, as well as for those students who wish to transition from a short-term preparatory program to a longer-term college or university program.

Implementation of Regulatory Amendments

Once finally published, these regulations would come into force in January 2014. Upon the coming into force of these proposed Regulations, those students who already hold a study permit and are studying at a non-designated institution would be permitted to complete the program of study in which they were enrolled, or obtain an extension for this purpose for the duration of their program of study or three years after the day on which the proposed Regulations come into force, whichever is shorter. The condition of actively pursuing studies would immediately be effective at the coming into force of the Regulations, and therefore, the option to issue a removal order for not actively pursuing studies would also be in place immediately.

International Student Program - Study Permit Compliance Verification System

What it is

CIC is planning to develop a technology solution that will be used to implement the main components of amendments to the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations* pertaining to students, which include new study permit conditions requiring a study permit holder to enrol and actively pursue studies at a designated educational institution. The solution would be implemented in two phases: in phase I, a drop-down list of designated educational institutions would be established in GCMS, for use by immigration officers; in phase II, a third-party portal would be created, allowing educational institutions to verify student compliance with new study permit conditions – i.e. that the student is enrolled and actively pursuing studies.

An interface would be established to facilitate two-way data exchange between CIC and institutions, allowing for automated referrals to a CIC office when a case review or investigation is required.

Why we're doing it

A technology solution, web based - will allow CIC to introduce a back-end compliance mechanism to capture study permit compliance information in a systematic way and ensure the automatic transmission of this information to CIC/CBSA officers for follow-up. Given the large volume of international students in Canada, including those who work during studies, CIC's ability to effectively ensure program integrity will depend on a robust and systematic method for monitoring student compliance. It will also require support from institutions, which have up-to-date information on the status of international students. While a number of approaches to compliance Verification are feasible, technology is the most effective and operationally efficient means for verifying student compliance with new study permit conditions and ensuring appropriate follow-up by CIC/CBSA officers.

Similar approaches to compliance verification have been successfully undertaken by CIC under the Off-Campus Work Permit Program as well as the Student Partners Program. Under both of these programs, educational institutions have been willing partners in verifying the status of international students for the mutual benefit of both CIC – from an immigration integrity perspective – and educational institutions themselves, who use compliance data to analyze and adjust their recruitment practices.

What it means for institutions

While consultations with stakeholders need to be undertaken to finalize system design and reporting requirements, designated institutions will likely access a third-party portal to record information related to a student's "good standing" which would be retained in CIC's system. Reporting frequency is still to be determined but would likely occur either once or twice per year, maximum. Institutions may also proactively identify students who don't show up, or, CIC may initiate targeted requests.

For some institutions, new reporting requirements will result in additional workload, particularly for those that host large volumes of international students. Information provided by institutions to CIC would, however, allow CIC to analyze data on international student compliance trends, including by institution, and share this information with institutions. Compliance data would allow institutions to adjust recruitment practices, including their choice of recruiters, to ensure that the types of international students being recruited will actually pursue study after arrival in Canada. Institutions whose recruitment practices result in high levels of compliance would also benefit, as visa officers would have access to quantifiable indicators on risk levels to facilitate processing.

Melissa and Jessica,

As a follow up to this morning's conversation regarding feedback received via Evaluation Forms from the BC/CIC consultation session on January 15, I did another quick scan of the comments specific to CIC and found a couple of points that may be relevant for your discussions with other provinces (as requested):

- One participant commented that he/she was a bit skeptical about the nature of the evidence CIC had on hand related to issues of abuse of the system, as follows: "Data on issues of abuse of study permits and work permits just how many students are not showing up to class etc...seems like a knee jerk reaction! Let's build a credible system with the monitoring and reporting that has not yet been put in place"
- Another participant commented: "Language school background information seemed more anecdotal than clear 'some schools have students that disappear' "
- A third participant noted that CIC office closures have had a direct impact on international offices (at institutions). Called for more CIC resources for institutional contacts.

This is by no means a comprehensive summary of the comments (I'll provide this as soon as I have a chance), but you asked for comments specific to CIC that you could use as a reference point for possible adjustments in your approach to the consultations within other provinces. I realize you may not be able to address the third point noted above, but perhaps you could contextualize your comments related to the first two.

International students wishing to study here for periods of six months or less on visitor permits will continue to be able to do so following implementation of the regulation changes, regardless of whether their institution of choice is on the list of eligible institutions for the Province.

The Government of British Columbia is working to establish specific criteria for the list of eligible institutions for BC. Further details on this process will be made available as they become known.

The Province of BC is speaking with <u>ALL</u> schools, educational institutions, and organizations to which the changes will apply when they take effect in <u>January</u> 2014, including the following institution types:

The purpose of this message is to provide an update on the timing of Citizenship and Immigration Canada's (CIC) proposed International Student Program regulations.

As you are aware, and as was discussed during cross-country consultations on this subject this past winter, the proposed regulations were pre-published in the *Canada Gazette* for a 45-day public comment on December 29, 2012. The Department is currently assessing and duly considering the comments that were received both during the 45-day comment period as well as at consultation sessions. As per the pre-publication document, the regulations were planned to come into force as of January 1, 2014, following final publication of the regulatory amendments in the *Canada Gazette*.

Final published regulations were planned for June, however, the publication has not yet occurred and will likely be delayed until this coming fall. The proposed regulations have not, therefore, yet passed into law.

Given the delay in the publication date, CIC plans to postpone the coming into force of regulations until spring 2014, noting that the final regulatory package, including the coming into force date, is still subject to final Cabinet approval.

The proposed reforms are intended to address program integrity concerns by ensuring students are studying throughout their period of authorized stay in Canada, and attending quality, genuine educational institutions. It is anticipated that these measures will help reduce instances of fraud within the program, improve overall services to international students and educational institutions, and strengthen Canada's overall image as a study destination of choice for prospective students.

In support of this work and in line with their jurisdiction over education, provincial and territorial governments have developed policies that would guide the designation of educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students.

We hope that this additional time will not only assist provinces and territories in their efforts to finalize their educational institution designation policies but also allow educational institutions adequate time to undergo the designation processes that provinces and territories will undertake in support of this initiative.

As stated in my voicemail message, I am contacting you regarding CIC's 2012 international student data. Specifically, the results that are included in the "Entries of International Students to BC by Top 20 Source Countries" are available on page 10 (Table 4b).

As you will see, this table includes the international student intake data for BC, which indicates a decline from 29,575 students in 2011 to 26,693 in 2012 (-2,936 overall). Stock was up modestly by 1,766. Both intake and stock data for BC are notably out of line with general trends in Canada.

It appears that CIC undertook a sizable re-assignment of students away from Vancouver into "Other British Columbia" in 2012. For example, the intake data for Vancouver declined from 24,401 in 2011 to 14,677 in 2012, while intake in the "Other British Columbia" area rose from 3,748 to 10,264. It is not clear from CIC's website why this re-assignment was undertaken.

With regard to the apparent decline/slow-down of intake/stock, we are concerned that CIC may have under-reported intake/stock based on a potential assignment mistake (such as under-counting or dropping an institution).

Dear colleagues,

In follow-up to our June 19 teleconference, I am writing to provide an update on the timing of the International Student Program regulations.

As you are aware, proposed regulations pertaining to international students were published in the *Canada Gazette Part I* on December 29, 2013, with a coming into force date of January 1, 2014. Final published regulations were planned for June, however, the publication has not yet occurred and will be delayed likely until this coming fall.

Given the delay in the publication date, we have asked and obtained approval from our Minister for an adequate delay in the coming into force of regulations, from January 1, 2014, to spring 2014, noting that this is still subject to Cabinet approval of the final regulatory package. We hope that this additional time will not only assist provinces and territories in their efforts to finalize their educational institution designation policies but also allow educational institutions adequate time to undergo the designation processes that provinces and territories will undertake in support of our joint objectives in enhancing program integrity.

While there will be some adjustments to the pre-published regulations following feedback provided by stakeholders, they are not major in nature and continue to support the original objectives of the regulations. In the coming days, we will be providing an update to our major national education stakeholders, including CBIE, AUCC, ACCC, Languages Canada, CAPS-I and NACC:

JOINT UPDATES:

1. International Students

Update:

- On December 29th, 2012, CIC pre-published regulations requiring international students to enrol and actively pursue their studies and attend an educational institution designated by a province/territory (PT) to host international students.
- In January-February 2013, CIC travelled across the country to consult on the proposed regulations and to present jointly with PTs the draft pan-Canadian designation criteria for institutions outlined in the "Educational Institution Eligibility Framework" which PT Deputy Ministers of Education approved as a basis for stakeholder consultation in July 2012.
- CIC is now compiling and analyzing the feedback on proposed regulations it received during consultations. This feedback will inform the final publication of the proposed regulations, which is expected to occur during summer or fall 2013. The coming into force (CIF) of these regulations is proposed for January 1st, 2014.
- PTs are currently working on their designation strategies with a view to beginning the
 negotiation of bilateral agreements on educational institution designation with CIC this
 summer. A draft Memorandum of Understanding has been sent out for initial PT
 comments.
- Some provinces have written to CIC expressing their continued support for the proposed regulations but requesting a delay in the CIF of proposed regulations to allow them to complete their designation processes. The request is being considered by Minister Kenney and CIC will provide an update as soon as the decision is received.
- PTs and CIC continue to work collaboratively to advance additional implementation
 aspects of the proposed regulation changes, including participation on the CIC IT task
 team for the reporting system and discussion of information sharing components required
 as a result of the proposed reforms.

Educational Institution Eligibility Policy Framework

Context

On 15 June 2010, federal, provincial and territorial (FPT) Ministers responsible for immigration agreed to work together to improve Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students. Since this time, Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) has worked with provincial/territorial ministries of immigration and education—through the Federal-Provincial/Territorial Working Group on International Students—to discuss a number of proposed reforms to the International Student Program (ISP), which will assist Ministers in meeting this commitment. The key reforms proposed include the introduction of new conditions that would require international students in Canada to study, and that this study takes place at an educational institution designated by provinces/territories for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits. These new requirements will be put in place through amendments to the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations* (IRPR).

The designation of educational institutions across Canada involves an important new role for provinces/territories given their jurisdiction over education. In fact, in order to be able to host international students with study permits, educational institutions will be required to first obtain designation from their respective ministry of education or advanced education. To support this new requirement, the following "Educational Institution Eligibility Framework" will outline common elements educational institutions will be required to meet in order to obtain designation, and identify the roles and responsibilities of provinces/territories and CIC in the administration of the Framework.

Objective

The "Educational Institution Eligibility Policy Framework" outlines a pan-Canadian approach to guide jurisdictions in the designation of educational institutions based on common elements. The Framework takes into account that provinces/territories have common levers over educational institutions, both formal and informal, which enable them to provide varying degrees of oversight over education institutions. It also recognizes that the specifics of these mechanisms are varied both within and across jurisdictions.

This Framework gives assurance that a suitable basis exists for the purpose of designating educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits in both the public and private education sectors. It also supports cooperation and coordination between federal and provincial/territorial governments in meeting common goals to improve the integrity of Canada's ISP, enhance accountability to international students as well as to Canadians, and improve Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students seeking a quality education.

This Framework is intended to structure subsequent bilateral arrangements between CIC and provinces/territories, and between provinces/territories and educational institutions in their respective jurisdictions. The objective of the arrangements is to outline roles and responsibilities with respect to administering the ISP, and to facilitate information-sharing, based on the provisions outlined in this Framework.

It is recognized that while the denial of designation and/or revocation of designation status could potentially affect an institution's revenue or reputation, protecting the interests of international students, the Canadian public, and Canada's reputation abroad are the paramount considerations under this Framework.

Scope

This Framework will outline common elements educational institutions must meet in order to be eligible to host international students with study permits, as well as the roles and responsibilities of CIC and provinces/territories regarding designation and revocation of designation.

Given the active role played by educational institutions in the promotion, recruitment and admission of foreign nationals, educational institutions have an important role to play with respect to maintaining the integrity of the ISP. Educational institutions are also a key source for up-to-date information on the status of international students after their arrival to Canada, such as enrolment status. As such, educational institutions are central to efforts by both levels of government to effectively manage the risks inherent in admitting foreign nationals to Canada for the purposes of study, work, and potential immigration.

For this reason, designated educational institutions will be asked to report on the status of international students with study permits after arrival in Canada, to determine whether or not international students are meeting the conditions of their study permit. This requirement will be a condition for hosting international students with study permits, and will form part of the common elements for designation. To support this work, CIC will be responsible for developing a compliance reporting system for educational institutions.

Access to international student work permit programs will be limited to eligible study permit holders attending a designated institution. Any decisions concerning expanding access to CIC's work-permit programs will not be considered as part of this framework.

Approach

This framework is premised on the establishment of common elements to be used when designating educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits. These common elements should apply across all education sub-sectors, both public and private, in recognition of the need to accommodate the diversity of purposes of Canadian education.

The common elements should be reflected in the designation policies of each jurisdiction across Canada. It is recognized that jurisdictions will require flexibility in the specific measures implemented under the Framework. Each jurisdiction will therefore implement designation policies that are responsive to their own particular needs while being consistent with the Framework.

Federal and provincial/territorial governments will ensure that the decisions they make in implementing this Framework apply their respective legislative, regulatory and/or policy frameworks, and are consistent with this Framework. Implementation will be formalized through bilateral CIC-provincial/territorial arrangements, which will outline respective provincial/territorial designation

policies, formalize CIC and provincial/territorial roles and responsibilities with respect to the designation and enforcement of designation, and facilitate information sharing.

Provinces/Territories will subsequently establish bilateral arrangements with designated educational institutions outlining the provincial/territorial designation policy, which shall include the common elements, established under this Framework, and may include additional provincial/territorial requirements over and above those identified in this Framework.

Common Elements for Designation

All jurisdictions agree to the development of common elements or minimum standards for developing designation criteria in order to assure the integrity of Canada's ISP, enhance accountability to international students as well as to Canadians, and assure Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students seeking a quality education. Designation criteria will include the following minimum common elements:

- In order to be eligible for designation by a province or territory, an institution must be deemed by
 the province/territory in which it is located to be in good standing with respect to any applicable
 provincial/territorial legislation, regulations, and/or policies governing education, and/or with
 bylaws, standards, and policies respecting the delivery of education or training programs set by
 accrediting or standard-setting bodies recognized by the provincial/territorial government.
- 2. The educational institution agrees to and will be accountable for meeting the following terms and conditions:
 - a. has adopted policies and put procedures in place that provide for the protection of international students with study permits, including a transparent tuition-fee refund policy which is made available to all incoming international students upon offer of admission;
 - b. has established policies and procedures related to language proficiency and credential assessment and recognition for international students, and disseminates accurate and transparent information regarding those policies to prospective students;
 - c. has sufficient administrative capacity to provide services to meet the unique needs of international students:
 - d. undertakes promotional initiatives that are, where applicable, in compliance with existing provincial or territorial regulations or policies on advertising, including compliance with the Imagine Education au/in Canada brand-eligibility framework;
 - e. has a published policy that outlines the elements that constitute a student's good standing at the institution and, where applicable, demonstrates that that policy is consistent with provincial/territorial requirements.
 - f. is capable of maintaining the following enrolment-reporting requirements and has designated an individual who will be responsible for:
 - i. confirming the initial enrolment of each international student with a study permit; and
 - ii. reporting on the ongoing enrolment status of all international students with student permits attending that institution.
- 3. The educational institution meets such other criteria as may be specified in the terms and conditions of the institution's bilateral arrangement with the province/territory in which it is located.

Educational Institution Eligibility Policy Framework

Context

On 15 June 2010, federal, provincial and territorial (FPT) Ministers responsible for immigration agreed to work together to improve Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students. Since this time, Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) has worked with provincial/territorial ministries of immigration and education—through the Federal-Provincial/Territorial Working Group on International Students—to discuss a number of proposed reforms to the International Student Program (ISP), which will assist Ministers in meeting this commitment. The key reforms proposed include the introduction of new conditions that would require international students in Canada to Study, and that this study takes place at an educational institution designated by provinces/territories for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits. These new requirements will be put in place through amendments to the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations* (IRPR).

The designation of educational institutions across Canada involves an important new role for provinces/territories given their jurisdiction over education. In fact, in order to be able to host international students with study permits, educational institutions will be required to first obtain designation from their respective ministry of education or advanced education. To support this new requirement, the following "Educational Institution Eligibility Framework" will outline common elements educational institutions will be required to meet in order to obtain designation, and identify the roles and responsibilities of provinces/territories and CIC in the administration of the Framework.

Objective

The "Educational Institution Eligibility Policy Framework" outlines a pan-Canadian approach to guide jurisdictions in the designation of educational institutions based on common elements. The Framework takes into account that provinces/territories have common levers over educational institutions, both formal and informal, which enable them to provide varying degrees of oversight over education institutions. It also recognizes that the specifics of these mechanisms are varied both within and across jurisdictions.

This Framework gives assurance that a suitable basis exists for the purpose of designating educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits in both the public and private education sectors. It also supports cooperation and coordination between federal and provincial/territorial governments in meeting common goals to improve the integrity of Canada's ISP, enhance accountability to international students as well as to Canadians, and improve Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students seeking a quality education.

This Framework is intended to structure subsequent bilateral arrangements between CIC and provinces/territories, and between provinces/territories and educational institutions in their respective jurisdictions. The objective of the arrangements is to outline roles and responsibilities with respect to administering the ISP, and to facilitate information-sharing, based on the provisions outlined in this Framework.

It is recognized that while the denial of designation and/or revocation of designation status could potentially affect an institution's revenue or reputation, protecting the interests of international students, the Canadian public, and Canada's reputation abroad are the paramount considerations under this Framework.

Scope

This Framework will outline common elements educational institutions must meet in order to be eligible to host international students with study permits, as well as the roles and responsibilities of CIC and provinces/territories regarding designation and revocation of designation.

Given the active role played by educational institutions in the promotion, recruitment and admission of foreign nationals, educational institutions have an important role to play with respect to maintaining the integrity of the ISP. Educational institutions are also a key source for up-to-date information on the status of international students after their arrival to Canada, such as enrolment status. As such, educational institutions are central to efforts by both levels of government to effectively manage the risks inherent in admitting foreign nationals to Canada for the purposes of study, work, and potential immigration.

For this reason, designated educational institutions will be asked to report on the status of international students with study permits after arrival in Canada, to determine whether or not international students are meeting the conditions of their study permit. This requirement will be a condition for hosting international students with study permits, and will form part of the common elements for designation. To support this work, CIC will be responsible for developing a compliance reporting system for educational institutions.

Access to international student work permit programs will be limited to eligible study permit holders attending a designated institution. Any decisions concerning expanding access to CIC's work-permit programs will not be considered as part of this framework.

Approach

This framework is premised on the establishment of common elements to be used when designating educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students with study permits. These common elements should apply across all education sub-sectors, both public and private, in recognition of the need to accommodate the diversity of purposes of Canadian education.

The common elements should be reflected in the designation policies of each jurisdiction across Canada. It is recognized that jurisdictions will require flexibility in the specific measures implemented under the Framework. Each jurisdiction will therefore implement designation policies that are responsive to their own particular needs while being consistent with the Framework.

Federal and provincial/territorial governments will ensure that the decisions they make in implementing this Framework apply their respective legislative, regulatory and/or policy frameworks, and are consistent with this Framework. Implementation will be formalized through bilateral CIC-provincial/territorial arrangements, which will outline respective provincial/territorial designation

policies, formalize CIC and provincial/territorial roles and responsibilities with respect to the designation and enforcement of designation, and facilitate information sharing.

Provinces/Territories will subsequently establish bilateral arrangements with designated educational institutions outlining the provincial/territorial designation policy, which shall include the common elements established under this Framework, and may include additional provincial/territorial requirements over and above those identified in this Framework.

Common Elements for Designation

All jurisdictions agree to the development of common elements or minimum standards for developing designation criteria in order to assure the integrity of Canada's ISP, enhance accountability to international students as well as to Canadians, and assure Canada's standing as a destination of choice for international students seeking a quality education. Designation criteria will include the following minimum common elements:

- In order to be eligible for designation by a province or territory, an institution must be deemed by
 the province/territory in which it is located to be in good standing with respect to any applicable
 provincial/territorial legislation, regulations, and/or policies governing education, and/or with
 bylaws, standards, and policies respecting the delivery of education or training programs set by
 accrediting or standard-setting bodies recognized by the provincial/territorial government.
- 2. That I the educational institution agrees to and is will be accountable for meeting the following terms and conditions:
 - a. has adopted policies and put procedures in place that provide for the protection of international students with study permits, including a transparent tuition-fee refund policy which is made available to all incoming international students upon offer of admission;
 - b. has established policies and procedures related to language proficiency and credential assessment and recognition for international students, and disseminates accurate and transparent information regarding those policies to prospective students;
 - c. has sufficient administrative capacity to provide services to meet the unique needs of international students:
 - d. undertakes promotional initiatives that are, where applicable, in compliance with existing provincial or territorial regulations or policies on advertising, including compliance with the Imagine Education au/in Canada brand-eligibility framework;
 - e. has a published policy that outlines the elements that constitute a student's good standing at the institution and, where applicable, demonstrates that that policy is consistent with provincial/territorial requirements.
 - f. is capable of maintaining the following enrolment-reporting requirements and has designated an individual who will be responsible for:
 - i. confirming the initial enrolment of each international student with a study permit;
 - ii. reporting on the ongoing enrolment status of all international students with student permits attending that institution;

Thank you for your question related to the eligibility for on-campus employment.

R186(f) allows full-time post-secondary students to work without a work permit on the campus of the university or college at which they are a full-time student. This authorization is valid for the period for which they hold a study permit at the institution and during which they are enrolled in full-time studies. This Regulation applies to students engaged in full-time studies (regardless of the course/program of study including English as a Second Language (ESL)/ French as a Second Language (FSL)) at a university, community degree-granting college, collège d'enseignement général et professionnel (CÉGEP), publicly funded trade/technical school or private institutions authorized by provincial statute to confer degrees.

In this case, if the student is registered as a full-time student at this institution, he/she is eligible to work on the campus of this institution during the school break.

Dear Jennifer,

One of our BC public post-secondary institutions has a question regarding international students' eligibility to work. The question is the following:

An international student at the institution holds a valid study permit, has studied full time for a period of four months in an academic program (Jan-April 2013), and is in good standing with the institution. The student wishes to work <u>on campus</u> May – August 2013, but will not be studying at the time (e.g. is on summer break). She will resume her full-time studies in September 2013. According to CIC guidelines, we know that students are permitted to work on campus if they hold a valid study permit (http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/study/work-oncampus.asp). However, does this regulation apply <u>only</u> when students are in full-time studies, or can it also apply when students are on scheduled program breaks (e.g. summer)?

Kindly advise on this issue so that I may inform the institution concerned.

Good morning, Laurie,

On October 9-10, FPT DMs of immigration will meet; a policy update on work related to ISP reforms is on the agenda. Normally the FPTWGIS co-chairs develop joint updates, or take turns. CIC will be leading this item and so I have taken the liberty of drafting an update. This will need to be reviewed by yourself, as well as your counterpart on the immigration side, since this is an immigration forum. Not extremely efficient, but I think it makes sense for you to review as the FPTWGIS co-chair and consult with your colleague on the immigration side, rather than me approaching the ministry of immigration directly.

This will need to be reviewed and approved by end of day – let me know if you agree with this approach. Draft text follows.

Policy Update:

- Work continues to progress well with provinces and territories on International Student Program
 reforms. [Note: I'm being a bit picky here, but I removed "well", as I wouldn't want to give the
 impression that there are no issues to work out. "Progress" is sufficient, I think, to indicate that things
 are moving.]
- This past June CIC published a Notice of Intent in the Canada Gazette to solicit feedback on proposed regulatory changes pertaining to the International Student Program. Responses were generally very positive and were representative of all education sectors [except K-12, correct? If so, we may want to revise the phrase to note that they were reflective of all "post-secondary" education sectors.]. The majority of responses were from private career colleges.
- In July, the Advisory Committee of Deputy Ministers of Education approved, as a basis for consultations, an "Educational Institution Eligibility Framework". This framework will support the

proposed regulations by outlining a set of pan-Canadian criteria that provinces and territories would use as a basis for the purpose of designating educational institutions that may host international students with study permits.

- CIC continues to work towards the pre-publication of regulatory amendments in fall 2012, with a coming into force in June 2013. Once in force, institutions will need to be designated by provincial/territorial ministries of education in order to be able to host international students with study permits. Institutions that are not designated by provinces/territories will no longer be able to host international students with study permits. They will, however, be able to offer programs of study lasting six months or less (short-term studies) to foreign nationals who are in Canada as "Visitors".
- The FPT Working Group on International Students held its 6th meeting on September 26-27 in Ottawa. A key issue for provinces and territories is timelines; provincial/territorial officials have indicated that the June 2013 implementation timeframe is not feasible for a number of reasons, including concerns about time and resources required to develop and implement designation processes (which may in some cases require policy and/or legislation changes), and the requirement for sufficient notice to institutions and students so as to minimize any adverse impact on student recruitment and admissions. The Chair of the Council of Ministers of Education Canada (CMEC) has formally written Minister Kenney to outline key challenges in meeting this timeframe and request further discussion on implementation.

• Broad stakeholder consultations on the proposed regulatory changes are expected to occur later this fall, with format and timing of the consultations still to be determined.

Notice requesting comments on a proposal to introduce new requirements and conditions for foreign nationals who seek to study in Canada

Summary

Notice is hereby given that Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) is seeking written comments from all interested parties on a proposal to amend the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations* to introduce new requirements and conditions on foreign nationals who seek to study in Canada. The proposed measures would apply principally to foreign nationals who enter Canada temporarily under a study permit.

The proposed regulatory amendments are intended to ensure that foreign nationals who obtain study permits enter Canada for the primary purpose of study. CIC seeks to deter foreign nationals from applying for a study permit if their intentions are disingenuous, and prevent foreign nationals from remaining legally in Canada on a study permit should they abandon their studies. These measures are also intended to ensure foreign nationals who hold study permits are studying at educational institutions eligible to host international students.

These regulatory amendments would support the Government of Canada in improving the integrity of Canada's immigration system, enhance accountability both to international students and Canadians, and improve Canada's reputation as a destination of choice for studies abroad.

Background

Compared to its key competitors for international students, Canada is the only country that has not put in place an International Student Program integrity framework that requires international students to pursue study after entry, and that limits the types of educational institutions that are eligible to host international students. The number of international students choosing Canada as a study destination has been on the rise in recent years. In 2011, 98 378 International students entered Canada, an increase of 34% since 2007. A 2010 study commissioned by Foreign Affairs and International Trade Canada found international students contributed more than \$6.5 billion to the Canadian economy in 2008. Despite these successes, the International Student Program continues to be vulnerable to fraud and abuse from those who would exploit either study permit holders or the program itself for personal gain. An evaluation of the International Student Program released by CIC in 2010 concluded that gaps in the Department's regulatory and policy framework leave the International Student Program vulnerable to potential misuse.

Currently, study permits can be issued to students attending any type of educational institution, regardless of whether it is accredited, or regulated or overseen by a provincial/territorial ministry of education, or accountable to a recognized standard-setting body. As a result, the educational institutions that currently host international students vary widely in terms of quality and accountability. In some cases, these institutions take advantage of international students by offering sub-par education, or promise courses or programs of study that they are unauthorized or unequipped to deliver. Such activities hurt Canada's international reputation amongst prospective international students and may discourage them from choosing Canada as their destination for studies abroad.

Under current regulations, study permit holders are not required to pursue study after they arrive in Canada. While foreign nationals must meet certain regulatory requirements in order to be eligible for a study permit, a prospective international student must only demonstrate the intent to study in Canada. In other words, there is no requirement for international students to actually enrol in or pursue a program of study at a Canadian educational institution after arrival. Those foreign nationals who hold a valid study permit but who fail to enrol or pursue their course of study cannot therefore be reported under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* and can remain legally in Canada until the expiration of their study permit. Additionally, while current regulations allow genuine students to access limited work opportunities during studies under international student work permit programs (On-Campus, Off-Campus and Co-op/Internship Programs), in some cases,

disingenuous study permit holders use their study permit as a primary means to gain full access to the Canadian labour market. Further, some study permit holders in Canada who fail to study after arrival in Canada may have more unscrupulous intentions, including engaging in illegal work and/or criminal activity.

Description

The purpose of this Notice of Intent is to signal an intention to amend the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations* for the purpose of ensuring that study permit holders are genuine students who will study in Canada and that they are attending educational institutions that are eligible for this purpose. The goal is to strengthen the integrity of Canada's immigration system by reducing fraud in the international student movement, while improving Canada's standing as a desirable study destination.

A new regulatory requirement is proposed that would limit the issuance of study permits to educational institutions eligible to host international students. CIC is working in collaboration with provinces and territories, respecting areas that fall under their jurisdiction, on a proposed approach that would guide the eligibility of educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students.

Additionally, new study permit conditions would be put in place requiring students to enrol in and actively pursue a course or program of study after arrival in Canada. The current provision that allows a foreign national to apply for a study permit for programs of less than six months would be eliminated in order to ensure that study permit holders only pursue studies at eligible institutions. Foreign nationals may, however, continue to enter Canada as visitors for the purpose of undertaking programs of study of less than six months in duration.

Foreign nationals who wish to apply for a study permit to attend an authorized school after they have entered Canada as a visitor would be authorized to apply for a study permit from within Canada in order to reduce barriers to study in Canada and facilitate pathways to further education.

Access by international students to work permits will be limited to eligible study permit holders, and these work permits would be limited to work permit programs specifically designed for international students (such as the Off-Campus Work Permit Program and the Co-op/Internship Work Permit Program). Eligible study permit holders who want to take part in these programs would need to be in compliance with the conditions of their study permit in order to qualify for a work permit, and to maintain its validity.

These regulatory changes will provide CIC and CBSA officers with the clear authority to take enforcement action against a foreign national who fails to actively pursue studies at an authorized educational institution after arrival in Canada, potentially leading to the loss of their temporary resident status and revocation of their study permit.

Comments

This Notice of Intent is an opportunity for the public to provide early comments and input into the proposed regulatory amendments described above, before the regulations are prepublished in the *Canada Gazette*. The prepublication process will provide an additional opportunity for public consultation on the proposed regulations.

Additional public consultations with key stakeholders on a proposed approach to the designation of educational institutions for the purpose of hosting international students will take place later this year.

Anyone (including immigration lawyers, stakeholders, provincial, territorial and municipal governments, interested groups, and the general public) may, within 30 days of this notice, provide their comments on this Notice of Intent, in writing, to the person named below at the address provided.







Overview of Proposed Changes to Canada's International Student Program

Regulatory Amendment to Require Study after Arrival in Canada

Currently, foreign nationals destined to Canada for the purpose of study must only demonstrate an intent to study. Under the current *Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations* (IRPR), there is no requirement for students to be registered at an institution or attend classes after arrival in Canada. Students who have not registered, or attended classes for extended periods of time, but who still hold valid Study Permits cannot therefore be reported under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* (IRPA) for misrepresentation, and can remain in Canada legally until the expiration of their Study Permit.

To ensure that foreign nationals entering Canada for the purpose of study are genuine students, CIC will introduce new Study Permit conditions in the IRPR which will require all Study Permit holders to be enrolled and actively pursuing a course or program of study at a designated educational institution after arrival in Canada, in order to maintain legal status.

In support of proposed regulations, CIC is proposing the establishment of an electronic system that would allow educational institutions, with support from PTs, to report to CIC on the status of international students' compliance with Study Permit conditions. Over the next year, CIC is proposing to begin consultations with PTs and stakeholders in the education sector to explore the role of educational institutions in monitoring student compliance with Study Permit conditions, aiming for a possible system to be in place by January 2014. In the meantime, CIC is developing an alternative approach to compliance monitoring to support a June 2013 coming into force date, which would involve verifying the compliance of a sample population of Study Permit holders through direct communication with students.

CIC and CBSA officers would have the authority to take enforcement actions against Study Permit holders who fail to enrol or pursue studies after arrival in Canada. Enforcement actions could include desk investigations undertaken by CIC or investigations undertaken by the CBSA regarding student compliance with Study Permit conditions. CIC or the CBSA will issue a removal order in circumstances where students are not complying with their study permit conditions.

Regulatory Amendment to Limit Issuance of Study Permits to Foreign Nationals Destined to Designated Educational Institutions

In Canada, there are currently no limitations on the types of educational institutions allowed to host international students. While provinces/territories have jurisdiction over education, and may set quality assessment standards for certain education sectors within their jurisdictions, some education providers are not overseen by education ministries. There is, therefore, a wide variation in the types of accountability and/or quality assurance measures that may be in place for different types of institutions across provinces/territories.

Amendments to the IRPR will be made which will only allow a foreign national to apply for a Study Permit if he/she has been accepted to a designated educational institution.

Designation policy will be guided by the "Educational Institution Eligibility Policy Framework" developed by provincial governments in consultation with CIC, which sets out to identify minimum common standards that educational institutions must meet to host international students, and outlines both CIC and provincial/territorial roles in the administration of the Framework.

The Framework is designed to establish a common approach to the designation policies implemented in each jurisdiction across Canada. It is also recognized that jurisdictions will have flexibility in the specific measures implemented to address these principles. The common approach outlined in the Framework document will provide the bases for bilateral agreements signed between CIC and each PT. Building upon this basis, PTs will further tailor these bilateral agreements according to jurisdictional requirements.

In the event that bilateral agreements are not signed between CIC and PTs, under proposed regulations, CIC will limit issuance of Study Permits to foreign nationals attending public and private-degree granting institutions, including:

- public, provincially recognized post-secondary educational or training institutions;
- private post-secondary institutions in Québec that operate under the same rules and regulations as public post-secondary educational or training institutions in Québec;
- private, provincially recognized post-secondary educational institutions specifically authorized to grant degrees in Canada, but only if the student is enrolled in one of the programs of study leading to a degree as authorized by the province;
- public school boards or districts funded by and accountable to a provincial government;
 and,
- independent and/or private elementary and secondary schools in Canada authorized to deliver provincial curricula.¹

Non-Designated Educational Institutions

Those foreign nationals who wish to attend an institution that has not been designated will be permitted to undertake a course or program of study lasting six months or less (short-term studies) as a Visitor (assuming all other requirements are met). At the end of the period of authorized stay, the foreign national will be required to leave Canada, as is currently the case. Although they are not required to do so, foreign nationals may apply for a Study Permit for a program of six months or less, as is currently the case, but only if they are destined to a designated institution.²

² CIC would like to discuss this provision with PT members. The *Notice of Intent* had communicated that foreign nationals would *not* be authorized to apply for a Study Permit for six months or less, however, the vast majority of respondents asked for a reversal of this provision. In particular, from a PT perspective, is there any specific reason that a foreign national would benefit or need to apply for a Study Permit for short-term studies? Does this impact minors?

Foreign nationals at non-designated institutions will not be eligible for Work Permit programs designed for international students – e.g. Co-op/Internship Work Permit Program, Off-Campus Work Permit Program, Post-Graduation Work Permit Program.

Temporary Residents, including Visitors undertaking short-term studies in Canada, would be authorized to apply for a Study Permit from within Canada if they wish to attend a longer-term course or program of study at a designated institution to which they have been accepted. Currently, those foreign nationals under the Visitor class who wish to apply for a Study Permit are required to leave Canada in order to submit a Study Permit application.

With these changes, access to short-term studies will still be facilitated, and a more streamlined process and pathway will be in place for those who wish to transition from the Visitor class to the Student class, without having to leave the country.

Work Permit Programs

Proposed Regulations would limit access to Work Permit programs to only those students attending designated educational institutions. Further, Work Permit programs would be limited to full-time students who are actively pursuing academic, professional or vocational training in a program of at least six months at a designated institution. Those students undertaking general interest courses, preparatory courses or English or French as a Second Language (ESL/FSL) programs would be excluded from all Work Permit programs.

The proposed amendments would also automatically authorize eligible international students to work part-time (20 hours per week) off-campus during their studies provided they hold a valid Study Permit. Consequently, the proposed amendments would extend the ability to work off-campus to designated private career colleges. Additionally, Study Permit holders will no longer be required to wait six months in order to be eligible for off-campus work; work can begin once the student is enrolled in studies. Students will no longer be monitored with respect to their full time and good standing status for the purpose of off-campus work; should a Study Permit holder become non-compliant with conditions of their Study Permit, however, CIC or CBSA would revoke both their Study and Work Permits and a removal order would be issued.

Decisions regarding access to post-graduation work have yet to be finalized. CIC plans to review the design and eligibility for access to this program in time for the coming into force of regulations.

Processing improvements


Making the ability to work a condition of the Study Permit eliminates the need for duplicate reporting by institutions and allows CIC immigration officers to redirect resources spent on assessing the genuineness of institutions, while making Canada a more attractive study destination.

Implementation of Regulatory Amendments


Once finally published, these regulations would come into force in June 2013 (or January 2014 if an extension is obtained). CIC is proposing (still to be confirmed) that upon the coming into force of these regulations, those students who already hold a Study Permit and are studying at a non-designated institution will be grandfathered and will be permitted to complete their program of study or obtain a study permit extension for this purpose for the duration of their program of study or a maximum of three years. By June 2016 international students will only be attending designated educational institutions. New Study Permit conditions would not apply to these grandfathered students.

Modification réglementaire visant à exiger la poursuite d'études après l'arrivée au Canada

Actuellement, les ressortissants étrangers qui veulent venir au Canada pour étudier doivent seulement démontrer une intention d'étudier. Modification réglementaire visant à limiter la délivrance des permis d'études aux ressortissants étrangers qui veulent fréquenter des établissements d'enseignement désignés

Il n'y a actuellement au Canada aucune limite quant aux types d'établissements d'enseignement qui peuvent accueillir des étudiants étrangers. Même si les provinces et les territoires ont compétence en matière d'éducation et peuvent fixer des normes d'évaluation de la qualité pour certains secteurs de l'éducation de leur ressort, certains établissements d'enseignement ne sont pas supervisés par les ministères de l'Éducation. On observe donc que les types de mesures de reddition de comptes et/ou d'assurance de la qualité varient grandement selon les établissements d'enseignement des différentes provinces et des différents territoires.

Des modifications seront apportées au RIPR pour qu'un ressortissant étranger ne puisse faire une demande de permis d'études que s'il (ou elle) a été accepté(e) dans un établissement d'enseignement désigné.

La politique de désignation s'appuiera sur le « Cadre stratégique sur l'admissibilité des établissements d'enseignement » en cours d'élaboration par le Groupe de travail fédéral-provincial-territorial sur les étudiants étrangers (GTFPTEE), qui s'attache à établir les normes minimales communes que les établissements d'enseignement devront respecter pour accueillir des étudiants étrangers et qui présente le rôle de CIC et des provinces/territoires dans

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l'administration du Cadre. Le Cadre est destiné à établir une approche commune pour les politiques de désignation mises en œuvre dans chaque province/territoire, partout au Canada. Il est également admis que les provinces/territoires jouiront d'une flexibilité en ce qui a trait aux mesures spécifiques mises en œuvre pour répondre à ces principes. Chaque province/territoire mettra en œuvre des politiques de désignation répondant à ses propres besoins tout en étant conformes au Cadre.

Établissements d'enseignement non désignés

Les ressortissants étrangers qui souhaitent fréquenter un établissement d'enseignement qui n'a pas été désigné seront autorisés à suivre une formation ou un programme d'études d'une durée de six mois ou moins (formation de courte durée) en tant que visiteurs (dans la mesure où toutes les autres exigences seront respectées). À la fin de la période du séjour autorisé, le ressortissant étranger devra quitter le Canada.

De plus, les ressortissants étrangers qui suivront une formation ou un programme d'études d'une durée de six mois ou moins ne pourront plus demander un permis d'études, comme le permet actuellement le RIPR étant donné que la catégorie « étudiants » (soit celle des détenteurs de permis d'études) sera limitée à ceux qui fréquentent des établissements d'enseignement désignés. En outre, les visiteurs qui suivront une formation de courte durée dans des établissements non désignés ne seront pas admissibles aux programmes de permis de travail conçus pour les étudiants étrangers (soit le Programme de permis de travail coopératif/ pour stagiaires, le Programme de permis de travail hors campus, et le Programme de travail postdiplôme. Cette mesure est conforme aux objectifs décrits dans la section sur les programmes de permis de travail ci-dessous, qui n'autorisent que les détenteurs de permis d'études qui fréquentent des établissements d'enseignement désignés à présenter une demande à ces programmes.


Ces modifications seront toutefois compensées par une modification réglementaire qui permettra aux visiteurs, y compris aux ressortissants étrangers qui suivent une formation de courte durée au Canada, à demander un permis d'études depuis le Canada³, si une fois cette courte formation terminée, ils souhaitent poursuivre une formation ou un programme d'études de plus longue durée dans un établissement désigné dans lequel ils ont été acceptés.

Par suite de ces modifications, il demeurera possible de suivre une formation de courte durée et il existera un processus et une voie simplifiés pour ceux et celles qui souhaitent passer de la catégorie des visiteurs à celle des étudiants, sans avoir à quitter le pays.

Programmes de permis de travail

Entre autres modifications du RIPR, CIC propose de limiter la possibilité pour les détenteurs de permis d'études de demander un permis de travail, à moins que le travail ne soit autorisé aux termes d'une dispense de permis de travail prévue à l'intention de la catégorie des étudiants (soit le permis de travail hors campus ou le permis de travail coopératif/pour stagiaires). Dans la situation actuelle, un détenteur de permis d'études peut, depuis le Canada, demander un permis

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de travail aux termes soit du Programme des étudiants étrangers, soit du Programme des travailleurs étrangers temporaires.

Les étudiants étrangers peuvent actuellement obtenir des permis de travail ouverts par le truchement du Programme de permis de travail hors campus et du Programme de permis de travail coopératif/pour stagiaires. Ces programmes ont été conçus spécialement à leur intention et CIC a imposé certaines limites à ces permis de travail. Il autorise, par exemple, le travail à temps partiel seulement pendant les trimestres d'études et veille à ce que l'étudiant étudie à temps plein et ait un dossier scolaire en règle. Ces limites ont été imposées pour que l'objectif principal du détenteur de permis d'études soit d'étudier et pour s'assurer que l'intention d'étudier du ressortissant étranger, au moment de sa demande de permis d'études, est authentique. La possibilité pour un détenteur de permis d'études de demander un permis de travail en vertu du Programme des travailleurs étrangers temporaires ne correspond donc pas à l'intention de CIC relativement aux programmes de permis de travail pour les étudiants étrangers.

Une fois leur diplôme obtenu, les diplômés étrangers continueront de pouvoir présenter une demande au Programme de permis de travail postdiplôme et au Programme des travailleurs étrangers temporaires.

De manière plus générale, CIC examine actuellement la conception des programmes de permis de travail hors campus, de permis de travail coopératif/pour stagiaires et de permis de travail postdiplôme et l'admissibilité à ces différents programmes. L'admissibilité, dans le cas des collèges d'enseignement professionnel privés désignés selon le cadre stratégique, est examinée dans le contexte des réformes des programmes des étudiants étrangers et fera aussi partie d'un examen élargi du Programme des travailleurs étrangers temporaires que CIC mènera au cours de la prochaine année et pour lequel il consultera les provinces et les territoires.

Améliorations du traitement

Les ressortissants étrangers qui détiennent un permis d'études et qui fréquentent un établissement d'enseignement postsecondaire public ou privé qui décerne des diplômes (soit les établissements actuellement admissibles dans le cadre du Programme de permis de travail hors campus) seront automatiquement autorisés à travailler et n'auront plus à présenter une demande distincte pour un permis de travail hors campus⁴ ou un permis de travail pour stagiaires⁵. De plus, compte tenu des nouvelles exigences proposées pour les permis d'études et décrites ci-dessus, les étudiants ne seront plus tenus d'attendre six mois pour présenter une demande de permis de travail hors campus. Lorsqu'ils ne respecteront plus les conditions du permis d'études, l'autorisation d'étudier et de travailler cesserait d'être valable, selon ce permis combiné.

En faisant de la possibilité de travailler une condition du permis d'études, les établissements n'auront plus à présenter plus d'un rapport et les agents d'immigration à traiter plus d'une demande, tout en faisant du Canada une destination plus attrayante pour les études.

⁴ Les étudiants participant au Programme de permis de travail hors campus ne pourront travailler que 20 heures par semaine pendant les périodes scolaires et 40 heures par semaine (temps plein) pendant les périodes de congé scolaire, dans la mesure où ils continuent de respecter toutes les autres conditions d'étude.

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Cette initiative n'est offerte qu'aux établissements qui participent déjà au Programme de permis de travail hors campus en reconnaissance du taux très élevé de conformité des étudiants participants.

Mise en œuvre des modifications réglementaires

CIC examine actuellement une approche progressive pour la mise en œuvre des modifications réglementaires exposées ci-dessus. Pour commencer, les provinces/territoires devront fournir à CIC une liste des établissements d'enseignement désignés se trouvant sur leur territoire respectif, dans les six mois suivant la publication des modifications réglementaires. Une fois la liste établie, CIC propose de mettre en place un système d'examen de la conformité afin de déterminer si les étudiants étudient bien au Canada, comme l'exigent les nouvelles dispositions réglementaires. Des discussions relatives à l'approche, aux options et aux échéances pour la mise en œuvre des réformes proposées sont menées à CIC, à l'interne, ainsi qu'en consultation avec les provinces/territoires.

- On December 29th, 2012, CIC pre-published regulations requiring international students to enrol and actively pursue their studies and attend an educational institution designated by a province/territory (PT) to host international students.
- In January-February 2013, CIC travelled across the country to consult on the proposed regulations and to present jointly with PTs the draft pan-Canadian designation criteria for institutions outlined in the "Educational Institution Eligibility Framework" which PT Deputy Ministers of Education approved as a basis for stakeholder consultation in July 2012.
- CIC is now compiling and analyzing the feedback on proposed regulations it received during consultations. This feedback will inform the final publication of the proposed regulations, which is expected to occur during summer or fall 2013. The coming into force (CIF) of these regulations is proposed for January 1st, 2014.
- PTs are currently working on their designation strategies with a view to beginning the negotiation of bilateral agreements on educational institution designation with CIC this summer. A draft Memorandum of Understanding has been sent out for initial PT comments.
- Some provinces have written to CIC expressing their continued support for the proposed regulations but requesting a delay in the CIF of proposed regulations to allow them to complete their designation processes. The request is being considered by Minister Kenney and CIC will provide an update as soon as the decision is received.
- PTs and CIC continue to work collaboratively to advance additional implementation aspects of the proposed regulation changes, including participation on the CIC IT task team for the reporting system and discussion of information sharing components required as a result of the proposed reforms.
