Subject: IAO Staffing Rationale July 2013

Here is the updated note. I believe I have captured our conversation accurately.

#### IAO Staffing Rationale - July 2013

In fiscal 2013/2014, FOI analysts are carrying a caseload of approximately 112 files. This caseload is not sustainable – timeliness is decreasing and the overdue backlog is increasing.

A sustainable caseload is 105 requests per analyst. At this level, the backlog will not continue to grow and timeliness will be in the range of 75-80 per cent.

Based on an average annual increase of 15 per cent more FOI requests per year, it is estimated that government will receive 11,000 FOI requests in 2013/14. In addition, IAO currently has a backlog of 450 requests that are overdue.

Currently, there are 98 FOI staff in IAO.

New staff (seven) are in addition to a number (21) of internal staffing actions to effect reorganizations that will allow for maximum performance. IAO is looking to re-structure their organization to reduce administrative staff to take advantage of new IT services and reflect increased specialization of function.

#### Request

Increase staff complement by 7 net new permanent staff and establish internal competitions so that IAO can backfill departing staff and allow more experienced analysts to carry out advanced work. Staffing requests will be submitted to maintain that number through future competitions. The costs will be covered internally to the division. 21 of the 28 proposed staffing actions will be filled by internal candidates.
