A few minutes later I saw youth come out of the nursing office, said was leaving, and exited the building. The nurse speculated that youth had been looking for a different reaction and that when expectation was not met became agitated. I went outside and walked youth back to s.22, where grabbed jacket out of the s.22 office and exchanged a few words with s.22 before stating again that youth was leaving and exited the building. As youth was leaving I suggested that we make a plan and offered a ride but kept walking. s.22 followed youth outside. I called mother, youth, and she agreed to come and pick him up. s.22 returned to s.22 and reported that youth had said was going home and had gotten on the s.22 at 12:17. I called Dad,told him what had happened and asked him to call me when youth arrived home. Mom arrived on complex and I let her know that youth had taken the bus. Mom told me that youth had taken the bus from this location s.22 previously and that knew the bus route to get home. Dad called me at 1309 and reported that youth had just arrived home. At 1630 I spoke with Mom again and encouraged her to maintain vigilance around youths behaviour and take to the hospital if any concerns present. Youth's community case manager and Maples s.22 were informed of the situation.

Writer is waiting to hear back from s.22 to confirm the time. Staff attempted pick up but youth refused to leave the s.22 s.22 . The RCMP returned s.22 at 0230 Monday December 16th, 2013.</p>

ALL BLOOD WORK". I find this to be untrue as I was present during the blood work procedure on the morning of Nov 21, 2013 and the resident had tolerated the procedure well. I distinctly remember this incident because</p> <p>However, he was to complete the blood work with no issue on the morning of Nov 21, 2013 (See chart entry on Nov 21, 2013 at 0712hr). As I am working , I consulted with a senior nurse in the unit and was advised to inform the day nurse to follow up with Life Lab concerning the incident. After contacted Life Lab on Nov 19, 2013, day nurse reported that the personnel at Life Lab was rude and defensive with respect to the inquiry. Senior nurse was informed of same and the Program Co-ordinator was consulted. Hence, this Incident Report is being filed.</p>
