Schedule 1

Definitions

In this Act...

"personal information" means recorded information about an identifiable individual other than contact information:

"social media site" means the Internet site referred to as Facebook, YouTube, Twitter or MySpace or a prescribed social media site;

INTERPRETATION ACT

Powers to make regulations

- 41 (1) If an enactment provides that the Lieutenant Governor in Council or any other person may make regulations, the enactment must be construed as empowering the Lieutenant Governor in Council or that other person, for the purpose of carrying out the enactment according to its intent, to
 - (a) make regulations as are considered necessary and advisable, are ancillary to it, and are not inconsistent with it,
 - (b) provide for administrative and procedural matters for which no express, or only partial, provision has been made,
 - (c) limit the application of a regulation in time or place or both,
 - (d) prescribe the amount of a fee authorized by the enactment,
 - (e) provide, for a regulation made by or with the approval of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, that its contravention constitutes an offence, and
 - (f) provide that a person who is guilty of an offence created under paragraph (e) is liable to a penalty not greater than the penalties provided in the *Offence Act*.
 - (2) A regulation made under the authority of an enactment has the force of law.

OFFENCE ACT

General offence

5 A person who contravenes an enactment by doing an act that it forbids, or omitting to do an act that it requires to be done, commits an offence against the enactment.

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Appointment by Lieutenant Governor in Council

- **15** (1) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint persons the Lieutenant Governor in Council considers
 - (a) will be acting in a confidential capacity to the Lieutenant Governor, Executive Council or a member of the Executive Council, or
 - (b) will be appointed to a position that requires special professional, technical or administrative qualifications.
 - (2) A person referred to in subsection (1) (a) or (b) may be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council on terms and conditions, including remuneration, authorized by the Lieutenant Governor in Council or set out in the regulations.
 - (3) This Act, other than subsections (1) and (2) and sections 21 and 25 (3), does not apply to a person appointed under this section.

Background:

- On February 20, 2013, the Minister of Health introduced the Seniors Advocate Act to create Canada's first seniors advocate. Establishing an Office of the Seniors' Advocate is a key commitment in Improving Care for BC Seniors: An Action Plan, released February 2012.
- At the time of writing, the Act has not yet advanced to second reading. If enacted, a hiring
 procedure will need to be in place to recruit the seniors advocate.
- Under the Act, the Lieutenant Governor in Council must appoint a seniors advocate. The appointment under subsection (1) must be made under section 15 (1) (b) of the Public Service Act.
