

As you are aware, the unprecedented arrivals by boat of refugee claimants from China has resulted in British Columbia undertaking legal guardianship of approximately 100 juveniles, as required under the province's Family Relations Act. These juveniles are being cared for by the Ministry for Children and Families, until such time their status in Canada is clarified. In addition, on behalf of Canada, B.C. is detaining adult claimants in provincial correctional facilities. We are in full support of Canada's efforts to ensure the safety and security of all adult and juvenile claimants as they await their Immigration Refugee Board (IRB) hearings.

On behalf of the Government of British Columbia, I am requesting your assistance in providing proper care for these juveniles. While provincial facilities exist for the detention of the adults, we simply do not have the appropriate resources for such a large influx of juvenile claimants. British Columbia provides guardianship and care arrangements through small group home settings, independent living models, or family-based foster care homes. It is becoming abundantly clear that these are not good options for Canada and B.C. to ensure the safety and security of the juveniles in these particular circumstances.

I understand representatives of our respective governments have been meeting to discuss a strategy that involves using space at CFB Chilliwack to provide care for the juveniles. It appears that DND authority is required to proceed with negotiations for the use of this space. I would urge you to give

prompt approval for this strategy, and to do whatever is necessary to ensure that it is enacted as quickly as possible, as it would serve to relieve the extreme stress on our child guardianship and care resources. Additionally, this strategy assists both governments in meeting their safety and security obligations while the fate of the children is determined.

Thank you for your consideration, and I look forward to your quick response.

They are aware that this is a priority with the Mayor and have agreed that this road improvement will proceed as soon as practical, with completion required by fiscal year end at the very latest. The Municipality will advise the local community of the coming road improvements (as is normal in these situations) and I have committed to assist in responding to any concerns along with Municipal representatives, should this be required. Realistically though, this is a good news story locally and will benefit everyone using Wilkinson Road as it will assist in traffic flow, reduce accidents in front of our Centre (several in recent years), and allow easier access on to the road for our neighbours.

If you need anything further on this, I'm in all week.

Thank you for your letter of April 3, 2000, concerning the proposed changes at the Vancouver Island Regional Correctional Centre (VIRCC). I apologize for my delayed response.

Public safety remains the first priority of this ministry's Corrections Branch, especially with respect to proposed renovations of the carpentry shop at VIRCC. You are concerned that the closure of the shop will affect inmate work opportunities. You also ask for assurances that additional staff resources and support are put into place to manage the influx of more migrants into the Centre.

I requested that senior management at VIRCC review plans with you regarding the proposed conversion of the carpentry shop into a multiple use space. I have asked that Citizenship and Immigration Canada fund the construction of this new space in preparation for the possible arrival of more groups of migrants.

If the federal government agrees to fund all costs associated with housing additional migrants at VIRCC, the multiple use design will enable secure housing for migrants in the short-term, and future facilities for remanded and sentenced inmate programs. These programs are anticipated to require less space

addition, equipment from the carpentry shop will be transferred to the Nanaimo Correctional Centre (NCC). As a medium security centre, NCC incarcerates primarily sentenced offenders who will benefit from the instruction and use of this equipment.

The creation of multiple use quarters at VIRCC is consistent with the Corrections Branch strategic plan, which emphasizes the implementation of core programs in addition to work opportunities for offenders. Core programs promote long-term changes in the thinking, skills and lifestyles of offenders that are known to contribute to crime. VIRCC staff who currently work in the carpentry shop will be retrained to facilitate core programs and other skills development initiatives.

I have asked that municipal leaders, senior police officials and the RCMP be consulted by VIRCC management regarding the proposed plan. I am assured that the planned development will not affect the safety and security of local neighborhoods, or require additional support from community law enforcement. I would also like to assure you that adequate staff resources will be maintained to support the management and rehabilitation of criminally charged or sentenced inmates at the Centre.

I have also asked that because of the increased traffic on Wilkinson Road, we take the opportunity to install a left hand turn lane at the Centre. This is currently being discussed with Saanich municipal officials.

I appreciate the time you have taken to express the concerns of the Community Advisory Board about this important and evolving initiative at the Vancouver Island Regional Correctional Centre.

Thank you for your letter of April 26, 2000, concerning legal aid for the Korean citizens currently on trial in Victoria.

The Legal Services Society (LSS) is an independent agency responsible for the administration of legal aid in the Province of British Columbia. By statute, the Ministry of Attorney General cannot become involved in the day-to-day operation of LSS, including the approval of applications for legal services.

However, LSS is required by its legislative mandate to provide legal services to individuals who face criminal proceedings that could lead to incarceration and who cannot afford a lawyer, as is the case here. The Legal Services Society Act does not limit service only to citizens of Canada.

The Korean citizens have been charged under Canadian law and are being tried in Canadian courts. The right to a fair trial for everyone is a basic tenet of the Canadian justice system. Provision of legal aid to the Koreans is necessary to protect the integrity of that system. It is also important to our international reputation as a fair and just country.

Now that the legal fees have reached the LSS limit of \$50,000 per case, legal aid will no longer be available. As this is a federal prosecution, it will now be the federal government's responsibility to provide further funding as it deems necessary.

British Columbia spends more per capita on legal aid than any other Canadian province. However, LSS has had to make difficult choices in the past few years to provide appropriate legal aid services. LSS is continually reviewing their policies to ensure that British Columbians in need have adequate services. As of

April 1, 2000, the financial eligibility level has been increased so that more people can qualify for assistance. Last year, coverage was expanded to include more family law issues and to provide more services to people with mental disabilities.

I appreciate your bringing your concerns to the attention of government.

Corrections Branch has agreed to accommodate your request to be reimbursed for your air travel and one night's accommodation for these dates.

I can appreciate the anxiety the detainees may be experiencing as a result of their prolonged detention, and we are committed to addressing any issues they may have during their detention.


