There is no vaccine available to protect cattle from bovine TB, and no treatment for affected cattle. Tests are available to identify infected cattle, under the jurisdiction of CFIA. Bovine TB can infect humans through unpasteurized milk, direct contact with infected cattle, or raw, infected meat and the clinical consequences can be exacerbated by pre-existing conditions.
