Subject: Radio debate feedback/Ideas for April 29 TV debate

Dear Ms. Clark,

After listening to the leaders' debate (April 26) on CKNW, I want to give my feedback.

You performed well, but the points you continue to hammer on -- debt reduction/elimination and far off gas revenues (whose prices may actually stay low for a long time due to increasing world supply) -- aren't nearly sufficient. I grant you they are very important, but that MESSAGE IS NOT ENOUGH. People need to be reminded who built all the new infrastructure this province now has, and that building "things" is what helps spur the economy. This is in sharp contrast to the NDP approach: study everything but never make firm decisions about anything -- and for heavens sake, never DO anything.

I find it frustrating that neither you nor any of your cabinet and candidates every speaks about the achievements of the BC Liberals in the past years. I have been waiting a long time to hear you and the BC Liberal Party emphasize all the achievements of the governing party: highways, transit, convention centre, hospitals, etc., etc. It almost seems as though you're ashamed of these things! Why??? !

I understand that you, Ms. Clark, want to differentiate yourself from Mr. Campbell, but I'm afraid the major achievements -- at least the ones that people can see, use, feel -- happened BEFORE you became Premier. This should not be considered a disadvantage to you. We all know Mr. Campbell should have left office much sooner than he did, but now that he's gone, we can calmly see the tangible things created by people in your party: people who think like you, people who want to build things and DO things, just as you do. You were elected leader, and there is absolutely no reason you should not take advantage of the past achievements of the BC Liberal Party. If elected, you'll be able to add your own achievements in good time!

My second comment is a response to incessant NDP statements about how they will make skills training a priority. I am very much in favour of providing training for all manner of technical skills, and I think this is one of the best things we can offer our young people. For example, I hope there are Liberal plans to provide more funding for places like BCIT, etc.

SUMMARY:

1. However, there is rich irony in the NDP's mantra about skills training. Their answer to ALL resource development appears to be "no", so the people who receive skills training will find jobs ... where? In Alberta and Saskatchewan. IN THE TV DEBATE, PLEASE juxtapose the NDP emphasis on skills training with the fact there is going to be nowhere in BC to practice those skills, so any trained people WILL MOVE to provinces who are developing their resources and therefore have jobs on offer!

2. We are all aware there are only 2 weeks left to shake things up Ms. Clark. I hope you or your staff have taken time to read my comments, because I think I speak for a lot of non-NDP voters. I'm sure you realize you need to fire up enthusiasm for the BC Coalition, so please start pointing out your Party's achievements, ASAP, and place less emphasis on debt reduction (which is important, but not so easily swallowed right now).
