

Hello. Our office has not fully researched the history of Speyside Road, but British Columbia claims it as a public road for the following reasons.

Speyside Road existed as a "traveled" road over or through the land in 1938 when British Columbia transferred the reserve to Canada for the use and benefit of the band as an Indian reserve. According to the provisions in the 1938 order in council "traveled roads" were excluded from the transfer of the reserve. Canada acknowledged British Columbia's claim to Speyside Road in a letter dated March 1, 1993 in which Indian and Northern Affairs Canada wrote that "according to our records Speyside Lane Road ... is a public road". The letter further stated that the "Indian Lands Registry shows that this road was retained by the Province when the reserve was confirmed by Order in Council #1036, in 1938."

Although the Province claims Speyside Road as a public road there is ongoing litigation in which at least one British Columbia First Nation is challenging the validity of OIC 1036. This is not intended to be, nor should it be construed as a legal opinion.

Becher Bay Indian Reserve No. 1

Clarification of the subject road's status became necessary when, in the spring of 1993, the Becher Bay Band commenced construction on a residential subdivision in I.R. 1. The work was soon halted when South Island Highway District expressed concerns about whether permission had been obtained for work on what it viewed as a public road.

Becher Bay I.R.1 and Speyside Lane are shown on the attached Maps A and B.

Administration and control of the lands comprising I.R.1 was conveyed from B.C. to Canada, in trust for the Band, by B.C. Order-in-Council 1036 of 29 July, 1938, see copy.

History

How the road came into existence is quite well documented. It was built in s.22 1912-13 by the Province at the request of who wished to have his property at Becher Bay connected with East Sooke Road. A copy of application of 9 April 1912 is attached. It was also reported in April, 1912, by the Road Superintendent that the "Indians in the vicinity" were much in favour of the proposed road. As would be the chief beneficiary of the road, the Ministry suggested that he pay half the construction cost, to which he agreed. Plans of the projected road were then obtained by the Ministry and forwarded to the Department of Indian Affairs in July, 1912. Construction appears to have followed in the later months of 1912. Correspondence from January, 1913, indicates that the road was completed by that time, and with his letter of 17 February 1913, sent a cheque for s.22 being half the cost of construction. In 1917, at Canada's request, the Province paid for the right-of-way through I.R.1.

Since the initial construction, the Ministry has periodically maintained the road up to the present. When first built, it was usually known as Milne Road (or s.22 , though sometimes it was also called Beecher Bay Road. Milne Road came to be the route's official name, one probable reason being to distinguish it from another road in the vicinity, just west of I.R.1, known as Beecher Bay Road. In 1953, the Ministry changed the road's name to Speyside Lane.

Status

Available evidence clearly indicates that Speyside Lane through I.R. 1 is a public highway. As such, our views accord with those in the Ministry report of 3 December 1984. Public status appears to arise, in the first place, from that provision of Order 1036/38 which states:

"Provided also that all travelled streets, roads, trails, and other highways existing over or through said lands at the date hereof shall be excepted from this grant."

Obviously, the road existed by 1938. This is demonstrated not only by numerous file references from the construction period of 1912-13 onward, but also by several maps and plans dating before 1938 and by listings of work and public spending in at least seven Ministry annual reports prior to 1938. Attached are copies from annual reports for 1912-13, 1914-15, 1915-16, 1921-22, 1923-24, 1924-25, and 1925-26.

Secondly, Speyside Lane appears to have acquired public status pursuant to Section 4 of the Highway Act, which deems a road public if public money has been spent on it. Annual report listings cited above show Provincial spending before administration and control of the lands forming I.R. 1 was transferred to Canada in 1938. File references to expenditures predating 1938 do likewise.

The Ministry appears entitled to claim a width of 33 feet for the road through I.R.1 in accordance with the plans submitted to Canada in 1912 and 1918.

No record has been found of any gazetting of the road.

. . .3

Arrangements with Canada, 1912 and 1917-18

The steps necessary to settle matters to Canada's satisfaction for construction of the road through I.R.1 took place in two stages, in 1912 and 1917-18. In 1912, it was the Ministry's understanding that the Becher Bay Band was clearly in favour of the road; see copies of the Road Superintendent's report of 22 April 1912 and Deputy Minster's letter of 14 June 1912. Available records indicate that, in the main, the Ministry in 1912 left it to s.22 to make arrangements with the federal government. See copies of Department of Indian Affairs letter to s.22 of 7 May 1912 and B.C. Minister of Public Works letter of 18 July, 1912. Presumably, this was duly achieved, as construction proceeded sometime in the later months of 1912 and we have no record of objection by the federal authorities. At the time, Provincial dealings with Canada apparently were restricted to the furnishing of acceptable plans by B.C.

By letter to the Ministry of 26 June 1917, DIA submitted a claim for compensation for the lands in I.R. 1 used for building the subject road in 1912, see copy. A reason for this delayed claim was that in 1912 the Becher Bay Band was not, it seems, consulted about the proposed road. Instead, another group of Indians was mistakenly approached, as explained by the Indian Agent in another letter of 26 June 1917, copy. The Indian agent also stated that "... the amount should have been paid before the construction of the road ..." In his initial response of 28 June 1917, the Public Works Engineer expressed his surprise that such a claim had not been made previously, and stated that there was nothing on file to indicate a prior claim (i.e. in 1912), see copy. It may also be observed that while Canada was, of course, involved with the arrangements of 1912, we have found no record of a claim for compensation from that date.

By letter of 20 November 1917 to the Indian Agent, the Ministry agreed to the compensation requested, and by letter of 27 November 1917, the Assistant Public Works Engineer was advised that a cheque had been forwarded to Canada, see copies. A few months later, in 1918, the Ministry forwarded plans of the road (referred to then as "Beecher Bay Road") to Canada on which it is shown as 33 ft. wide with an area in I.R.1 of 1.74 acres. Attached is a copy of the plan, RS 1120, and a copy of RS 848A, prepared probably in 1912 at the time the road had first been proposed. This appears to have been the final action necessary to meet Canada's requirements.

There is some question as to Speyside Lane's terminal point. The early correspondence from 1912-13 is not clear on where in relation to s.22 property the road was to terminate. In fact, there is perhaps some suggestion that it was to be built to the water. The records are inconclusive but there is the possibility that it was build as a public route some distance into the s.22 property, to his house, for instance. Presently, Highways maintains Speyside Lane as far as the property line separating I.R. 1 from the s.22 land. Any portion of public road which may exist within the land would fall within the jurisdiction of Metchosin municipality.



I refer to our telephone conversation on March 1, 1993 regarding the matter of road access to Beecher Bay Indian Reserve No. 2.

There is no public or band road access to Beecher Bay Indian Reserve No. 2. Present land access is through Department of National Defense property (Rocky Point). Band members travelling to their No. 2 Reserve must report to the main gate at the military establishment. The Band has requested that they be provided with unrestricted access from Beecher Bay Indian Reserve No. 1 to their No. 2 Reserve (see attached sketch) .

According to our records Speyside Lane Road (formerly Yates Road). a 33 foot wide road from East Sooke Road to Lot 50 is a public road. The Indian Land Registry shows that this road was retained by the province when the reserve was confirmed by Order-in-Council #1036, in 1938. Attached are letters from the Ministry of Highways dated April 25, 1947 and October 1, 1979 confirming this as a public road. Attached is a copy of part of plan No. 1737 showing the location of Speyside Road.



Thank you for your letter of September 21, 1999, regarding the legal status of Speyside Lane through Becher Bay Indian Reserve No. 1. I have discussed this issue with staff from the Ministry's Aboriginal Relations Branch.

The research indicates that the Ministry believes that Speyside Lane through Becher Bay Indian Reserve No. 1, is claimable as a public road pursuant to the following:

- BC Order-in-Council 1036 of 29 July 1938 which conveyed administration and control of IR 1 from BC to Canada in trust for the Band, but excluding from the transfer travelled roads existing at the time. There is ample evidence to show that the subject road well predates 1938.
- Section 4, <u>Highway Act</u> there is substantial evidence to show public spending on the road before IR 1 was conveyed to Canada.
- 3. In 1918 a road survey was made of the road (Road Survey 1120) which shows the road 33 feet wide and which was provided to Canada (I have attached a copy of the survey plan for your information)

There seems to be some question as to where Speyside Lane terminates. Records are inconclusive, though the Ministry has maintained the road as far as the property line separating IR 1 from fee simple land.

Please note that as is the case on all roads through reserves where the Ministry bases its claim to that road on its travelled status as of a particular date, the foregoing information is subject to further research and litigation.

I have been in contact with the Provincial Approving Officer regarding the issue of Section 75(1)(c) of the Land Title Act. Mr. Howat advises that it would be inappropriate to comment at this time, as the Approving Officer for the Municipality of Metchosin will

BACKGROUND

The ministry has been working with the Beecher Bay Band to provide access to a proposed subdivision on the Band's reserve No. 2 near Sooke. ARB originally became involved when the Band started work on a subdivision access road onto East Sooke Road, which is a public road, in 1993. The access road potentially would have cut off Speyside Lane, which is also a public road, and, as a result, cut off access to the property of s.22

s.22 Work was stopped on the road at the request of the Saanich District Highways Office.

ARB, with the assistance of the Saanich office, has been working with the Band to arrive at alternatives for providing access to the subdivision and s.22 property. The current option would involve closing Speyside Lane and locating the access at a location which will better serve the

subdivision and continue to provide access to s.22

The Band is currently dealing with drainage questions concerning its proposed subdivision. It is also meeting with the federal government to address the issue of access to its reserve No. 1, which was landlocked in the 1950s by the surrounding Department of National Defense property. Meetings will begin again to address the subdivision and access questions when the Band has finished dealing with these other issues, possibly this fall.

MINISTRY POSITION

ARB and the district will continue to work with the Band to address access issues concerning the proposed subdivision and to maintain its commitment to preserve access to s.22 property.


