#### Amendment Details/Rationale:

The proposed facility is a new modular portable on the site of Brent Kennedy Elementary. This new child care program would provide 20 spaces for Out of School Care and 8 spaces for Preschool Care. There is a high need for this program as there are few alternatives for licensed child care in the area. Licensing has reported a definate need for more child care spaces here and a local needs survey confirmed the considerable demand for a new program in the Brent Kennedy area.

Costs for this project have been provided by the School District and the project meets Ministry guidelines for quality child care. Strong support for this project has been provided by the community, including the School District, the Brent Kennedy Elementary School staff and Parent Advisory Council, the Ministry of Health, and by Corky Evans, MLA for Nelson-Creston.

The new facility would serve working parents in the area of Brent Kennedy, as well as parents in education and training programs at Mt. Sentinel Elementary-Secondary, and/or the Selkirk College Learning Centre. The child care program will also serve families in the the surrounding areas of Blewett, Taghum, Tarry's, Thrums, and Winlaw.

# Rationale for School District No. 7 (Nelson) Brent Kennedy Elementary

#### Title:

Brent Kennédy Elementary School-Based Child Care Program - Funding Recommendation

Request:

School District No. 7 (Nelson) is requesting funding for a new child care facility for 28 licensed child care spaces.

• Child care type: Out of School Care - 20 spaces

Preschool Care - 8 spaces

Total spaces: 2

Location: Brent Kennedy Elementary School

Project type: Modular Portable

Size: 205 m<sup>2</sup>

### Rationale:

• There is a high need for this new child care program as there are few alternatives for licensed child care in the area.

- The Chief Licensing Officer, Deborah Bockner, has reported a definite need for more child care spaces here and a local needs survey confirmed the considerable demand for child care in the area of Brent Kennedy Elementary School.
- Inadequate transportation to child care centres for parents and children has been a major concern in this community. A new child care facility on the site of Brent Kennedy Elementary will provide an accessible and safe centre for children before and after school hours.
- The new facility will serve working parents in the area, as well as parents in education or training programs at Mt. Sentinel Elementary-Secondary School, or Selkirk College Learning Centre. The facility will also serve families in the surrounding rural areas of Blewett, Taghum, Tarry's, Thrums, and Winlaw.
- This facility would be located in an area of increasing population and new housing developments.

- The West Kootenay Family and Child Care Services Society will be the nonprofit operator of this new program.
- Strong support for this project has been provided by the community, including the School District, the Brent Kennedy Elementary School staff and P.A.C., the Licensing Officer, and Corky Evans, MLA for Nelson-Creston.
- A new modular facility of 205 m<sup>2</sup> meets Ministry of Education, Skills and Training and Ministry of Women's Equality established guidelines for quality child care.
- The Ministry of Women's Equality and the BC21 Implementation Team support this project.

### Recommended Decision:

Support the request for funds of \$239,705 for a new modular portable on the site of Brent Kennedy Elementary School for 28 licensed child care spaces .
