Honourable Teresa Wat's Opening Remarks

Minister Wat welcomed all the MAC members and thanked them for their commitment and dedication to multiculturalism. Minister Wat mentioned that it was her very first meeting with the MAC since she became the Minister in June 2013 and she was looking forward to working with the MAC and receiving their advise on multiculturalism.

On the same note, she expressed her pleasure on the signing of CETA (Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement) on October 18, 2013, the same day of the MAC meeting. CETA is Canada's biggest bilateral initiative since NAFTA. An agreement in principle was signed by Prime Minister Stephen Harper and European Commission President on October 18, 2013.
