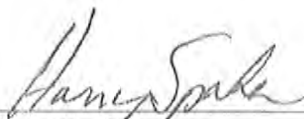

All other criteria for open fire under Category 1 remain restricted, as well as all open fire under Category 2 and Category 3.

The Kamloops Fire Zone includes the area south towards Logan Lake, west to the Hat Creek valley, north towards Wells Gray Park and to the east of Adams Lake in the Shuswap area.

The Lillooet Fire Zone extends from the Hat Creek Valley in the east to the Cascade Mountains in the east and from Boston Bar in the south to the Churn Creek Provincial Park in the north.

The restricted area in the Clearwater Fire Zone extends from the northern tip of Adams Lake south into the Kamloops Fire Zone.

KAMLOOPS– Effective at noon on August 17, 2009 and until further notice, campfires under Category 1 of Section 20 of the *Wildfire Regulation* are rescinded throughout the Kamloops Fire Centre, pursuant to Section 10(1) (a) of the *Wildfire Act*, except for the Kamloops and Lillooet Fire Zones and a southern portion of the Clearwater Fire Zone. All other criteria for open fire under Category 1 remain restricted, as well as all open fire throughout the fire centre under Category 2 and Category 3.

The Kamloops Fire Zone includes the area south towards Logan Lake, west to the Hat Creek valley, north towards Wells Gray Park and to the east of Adams Lake in the Shuswap area.

The Lillooet Fire Zone extends from the Hat Creek Valley in the east to the Cascade Mountains in the east and from Boston Bar in the south to the Churn Creek Provincial Park in the north.

The restricted area in the Clearwater Fire Zone extends from the northern tip of Adams Lake south into the Kamloops Fire Zone.

On average, half of all of wildfires are caused by human activity. PORTABLE PROPANE CAMPFIRE RESTRICTION RESCINDED

KAMLOOPS– Effective at noon on August 18, 2009 and until further notice, pursuant to Section 12 (1) of the *Wildfire Act*, the use of portable propane campfires is now permitted throughout the Kamloops Fire Centre area.

Within prescribed areas, the lifting of this portable propane campfire restriction applies to BC Parks and to all public (Crown) and private land outside of organized areas. It does not apply within municipalities or regional districts that have their own burning bylaws or bans. Please check with your local authorities before lighting a fire.

Campfire patrols will continue in all areas where the ban still applies and the public should ensure they are within the designated area before lighting a campfire.

This portable propane campfire restriction has been rescinded due to the fire danger being lowered by recent rainfall and cooler temperatures throughout specific areas of the Kamloops Fire Centre. Regardless of the lower risk in these specific areas, the public is urged to remain vigilant and cautious with their use of campfires.

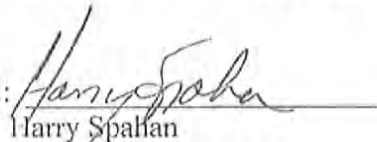

RESCINDING OF CAMPFIRE RESTRICTION In The Kamloops Fire Centre

Effective at noon on September 9, 2009 and until further notice, campfires are no longer restricted throughout the Kamloops Fire Centre. All other open fire within Category 1, 2 and 3 remains restricted until further notice.

Open fire is defined in three categories. A Category 1 open fire means an open fire that burns piled material no larger than one metre high and one metre wide. This Category 1 open fire ban no longer prohibits the use of campfires.

A Category 2 open fire means an open fire that burns piled material no larger than two metres high and three metres wide, or grass over an area less than 0.2 hectares (2000 square metres) in size.

A Category 3 open fire means an open fire that burns material in piles larger than two metres high and three metres wide, windrows, or grass over an area larger than 0.2 hectares (2000 square metres) in size.

The remaining Category 1, 2 and 3 open fire bans apply within BC Parks and to all public (Crown) and private land outside of organized areas. These fire bans do not apply within municipalities or regional districts that have their own burning bylaws.

The Kamloops Fire Centre extends from the northern border of Wells Gray Park, north of Blue River to the US border in the south, and from the Bridge River Glacier west of Goldbridge to the Monashee Mountains east of Lumby.

OPEN FIRE PROHIBITION ORDER
FIRE BAN

Under section 10(1) of the *Wildfire Act*, and pursuant to the authority delegated to me by the Minister of Forests and Range, to limit the risk of a fire, I, Steve Schell, Kamloops Fire Centre Manager, hereby **PROHIBIT** within the restricted area described below, the lighting, fueling or use of the following types of open fires:

- Waste, slash or other burning, whether piled or unpiled, larger than one metre in height and one metre in width,
- More than 2 piles of waste, slash or other burning, whether piled or unpiled, of any size; and,
- Stubble or grass burning over any area

Furthermore, I order all persons lighting, fuelling or using any of the open fires listed above within the restricted area to cease doing so and to **extinguish all such fires**.

This Order takes effect June 1, 2010 at 1200 hours and remains in force until September 30, 2010, or until the Order is lifted.

This Order applies within the geographic boundaries of the Kamloops Fire Centre described below and as outlined in dark green and shaded in yellow on the attached map, and includes all public and private land except land situated within the boundaries of a municipality or Regional District with an open fire bylaw.

The Kamloops Fire Centre extends from the northern border of Wells Gray Park, north of Blue River to the US border in the south, and from the Bridge River Glacier west of Goldbridge to the Monashee Mountains east of Lumby.

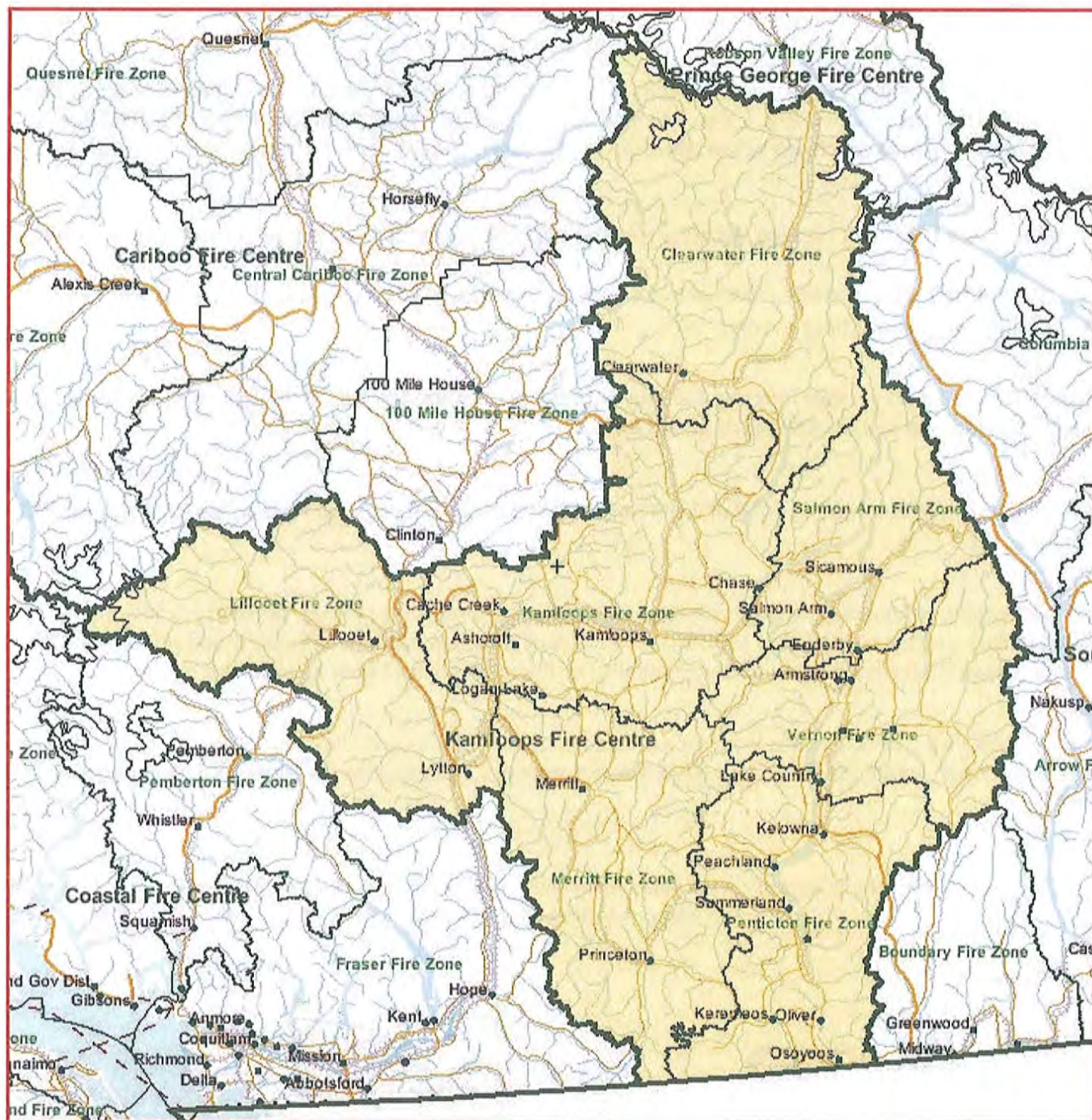

**EQUIPMENT and ACTIVITIES
PROHIBITION ORDER**

Under section 12(1) of the *Wildfire Act*, and pursuant to the authority delegated to me by the Minister of Forests and Range, I, Steve Schell, Kamloops Fire Centre Manager, hereby **PROHIBIT** within the area described below, the following activities, and the use of the following materials because I consider that they are likely to cause or contribute to the spread of a fire:

- Fireworks, including firecrackers

This Order takes effect June 1, 2010 at 1200 hours and remains in force until the earlier of September 30, 2010 or until the Order is lifted.

This Order applies within the geographic boundaries described below, and includes all public and private land, with the following exceptions:

- This Order does not apply to the use of fireworks within the boundaries of a local government with a bylaw that governs the use of fireworks.

The Kamloops Fire Centre extends from the northern border of Wells Gray Park, north of Blue River to the US border in the south, and from the Bridge River Glacier west of Goldbridge to the Monashee Mountains east of Lumby.

OPEN FIRE PROHIBITION ORDER

Under section 10(1) of the *Wildfire Act*, and pursuant to my authority as a designated official under the *Wildfire Act*, to limit the risk of a fire and protect public safety, I, Steve Schell, Fire Centre Manager, hereby **PROHIBIT** within the restricted area described below, the lighting, fuelling or use of Category 2 and 3 open fires. This includes the fires described below:

- Waste, slash or other burning, whether piled or unpiled, of any size
- Stubble or grass burning over any area
- Burning barrels of any size or description

Furthermore, I order all persons lighting, fuelling or using any of the open fires listed above within the restricted area to cease doing so and to extinguish all such fires.

The ban does not apply to cooking stoves that use gas, propane or briquettes, or to campfires that are 0.5 metres in height and 0.5 metres in diameter or smaller. Anyone lighting a campfire must have a hand tool or at least eight litres of water nearby to extinguish it.

The lighting, fuelling and use of resource management open fires pursuant to section 23 of the *Wildfire Regulation* is not included in this ban.

Under section 12(1) of the *Wildfire Act*, and pursuant to the authority delegated to me by the Minister of Forests and Range, I further **PROHIBIT** within the restricted area described below, to limit the risk of a fire, the lighting or use of fireworks of any size or description.

This Order takes effect at noon July 15, 2010 and remains in force until the earlier of September 30, 2010 or until the Order is lifted.

This Order applies within the area described below, falling within the jurisdictional boundaries of the Kamloops Fire Centre, and includes all public and private land except land situated within the boundaries of a local government with an open fire bylaw that provides for fire prevention and forest protection and is serviced by a fire department.

The Kamloops Fire Centre extends from the northern border of Wells Gray Park, north of Blue River to the US border in the south, and from the Bridge River Glacier west of Goldbridge to the Monashee Mountains east of Lumby.

OPEN FIRE PROHIBITION RESCIND

Under section 10(1) of the *Wildfire Act*, and pursuant to the authority delegated to me by the Minister of Forests, Lands Natural Resource Operations, I, Steve Schell, Kamloops Fire Centre Manager, hereby **RESCIND** the prohibition on campfires, within the restricted area described below, including:

- Campfires of 0.5 metres by 0.5 metres or smaller in size;
- Open fires in outdoor stoves.

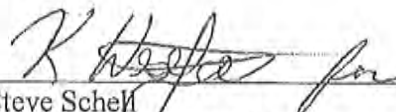
This Order rescinds and replaces Order # KFC2011-008 and takes effect at noon on September 22, 2011.

This Order applies within the geographic boundaries described below and as shaded in orange on the attached map, and includes all public and private land unless specified otherwise in an enactment.

The Order applies to the Kamloops Fire Centre area excluding the Clearwater Fire Zone (see the applicable area shaded in orange in the attached map). This includes from the US Border in the south, and extends to the northern boundary of Kamloops Fire Zone, (which is located approximately 5 km north of Little Fort and runs through the midpoint of Adams Lake), and from the Bridge River Glacier west of Goldbridge to the Monashee Mountains east of Lumby.

- North Boundary: the north boundary is located approximately 5 km north of Little Fort, Granite Mountain, and runs through the midpoint of Adams Lake.
- East Boundary: Monashee Mountains, east of Lumby
- South Boundary: United States border south of Osoyoos
- West Boundary: Bridge River Glacier west of Goldbridge

- Category 3 open fire as defined in the Wildfire Regulation

Restrictions and requirements different from those set out in this Order may be established for categories of persons upon application to, and order by, the Fire Centre Manager in the area to which this Order applies.

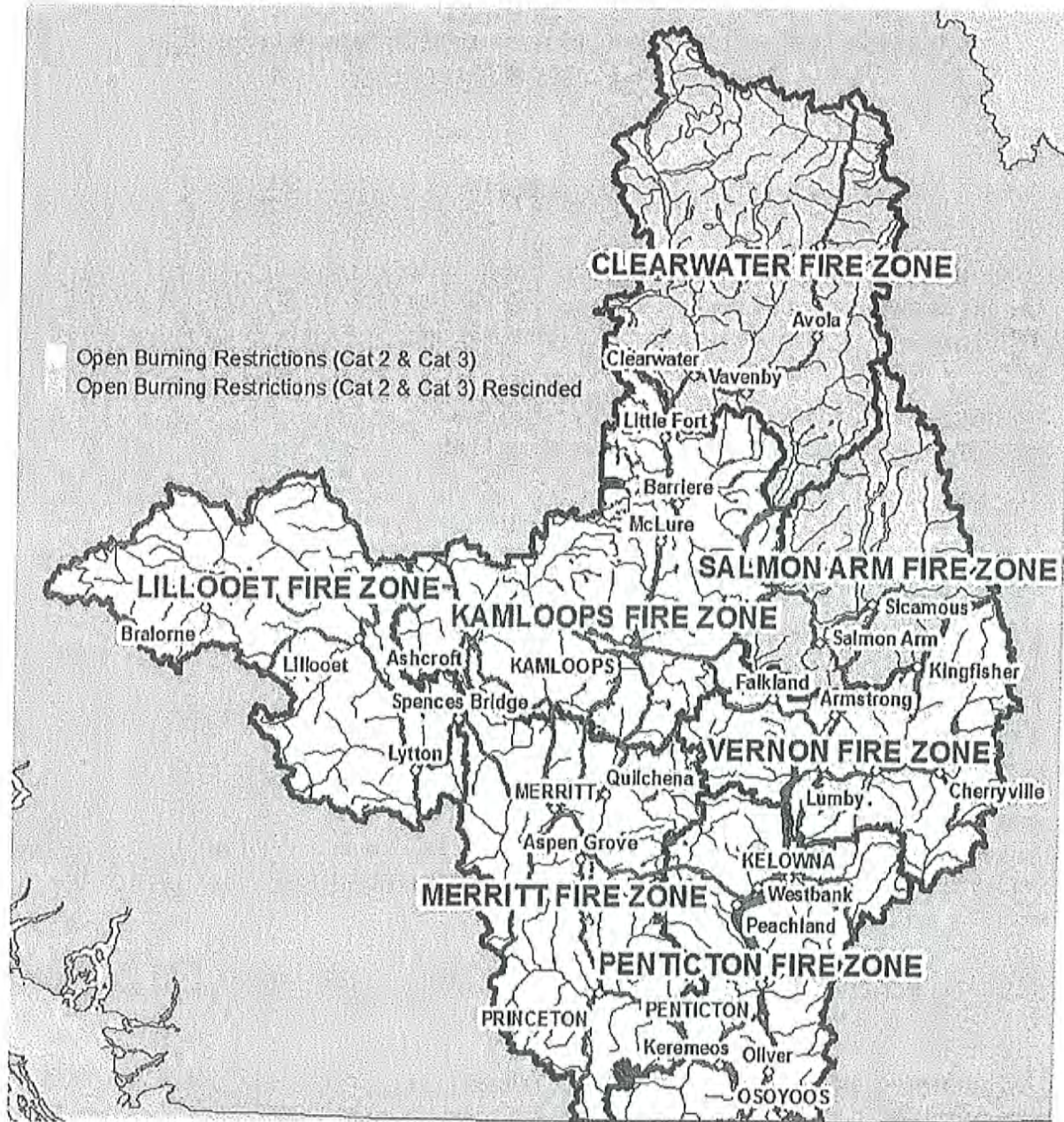

- burning barrels of any size or description.

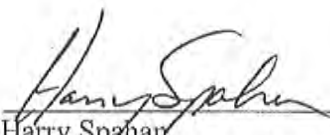
