

Title: First Nations Accommodation for Surplus Assets Disposal

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Background / Context:

As outlined in Budget 2012, the Province reviewed its asset base and identified those that are surplus to requirements. The sale of these assets is intended to generate revenue and stimulate economic activity and business opportunities. The initiative is being lead by the Release of Assets for Economic Generation (RAEG) team within the Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services (MTICS).

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Discussions with the three First Nations began separately in March 2013. On July 5, 2013 Provincial representatives were informed of the First Nations' intention to work together. The Province has continued to work with all three nations as a group.

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
