 School District No. 62 (Sooke) has unbalanced capacity utilization at their schools some schools are under-utilized and others are overcrowded and experiencing continued growth.

- In the district facilities plan submitted to the Ministry in 2008, and updated in February 2011, the district's latest enrolment projections indicate significant growth pressure at the elementary levels.
- In order to meet the need for elementary space, the Board has proposed a grade reconfiguration in the Belmont zone (Colwood, Langford, Highlands, Metchosin) from a K-6/7-9/10-12 to a K-5/6-8/9-12 model, and the replacement of the aging Belmont Secondary with two new secondary schools.
- In its 2010/11 Capital Plan submission, the Board requested an 1100 capacity replacement for Belmont Secondary and a new 800 capacity Westshore Secondary as its number one and two priorities, respectively.
- Through the Full Day Kindergarten initiative, the Sooke School District was approved for eight modular classrooms at six different schools and will be receiving 19 new classrooms via additions at four other schools.

DISCUSSION:

- Belmont Secondary opened in 1953 and has a capacity of 1,375 grade 10-12 students. The September 2010 enrolment is 1,324 and this is expected to decline until 2016, exceeding capacity at its current configuration in 2018.
- The District proposes to sell the existing Belmont site and contribute the proceeds as well as additional funds from the sale of surplus elementary sites toward the cost of the replacement Belmont Secondary. The District estimates the proceeds of the sale of the existing Belmont Secondary to be approximately

- Ministry funding of \$88 million has been requested in the current capital plan to complete the two replacement schools.
- The District believes that both schools need to proceed at the same time.
- In a 2005 Facility Audit of 70 schools across the province, Belmont Secondary ranked 48th with a score of 50.3 percent, i.e. 47 schools across the province had lower facility audit scores. Of those, five have since been supported for upgrade or replacement and eight have been approved for construction.
- Ministry staff have been working with the district to review the plan relative to costeffective solutions, and discuss how the reconfiguration plan will meet the current need for elementary school space.



- District enrolment for the school age population is projected to increase by 30% by 2018/19. However, at the secondary level, enrolment is expected to remain relatively constant through to 2018, then to increase through 2023.
- It should be noted that former ministers of education and Ministry staff have had several conversations with MLA Horgan. Most recently, he was briefed by Ministry staff in early 2011. Minister MacDiarmid also met with the Board Chair and senior district staff regarding the project in February 2011.

SUBJECT: Borrowing Authority – Belmont Secondary School Replacement Site

School District No. 62 (Sooke).

BACKGROUND:

• Belmont Secondary School, built in 1953, has a capacity of 1375 grade 10-12 students with a September 2009 enrolment of 1327.

• The Sooke Board of Education wishes to replace Belmont Secondary with two new high schools to better serve the growing student population in that part of the district: Belmont Secondary and a new school in the Royal Bay area.

• The District's plan is to relocate the Belmont replacement school to the site of the former Glen Lake Elementary School, which closed in June 2008.

• Replacement of Belmont Secondary with two new high schools has been the top priority of the Board in its capital plan submissions since 2006/07. However neither has been supported due to competing priorities.

• The District requires an additional parcel of land adjacent to the site in order to ensure the site is of sufficient size to meet Ministry standards for a high school of its intended capacity.

• The District has been working with the developer of the adjacent land to determine a fair price for the additional parcel.

DISCUSSION:

- In a letter to the Sooke Board of Education dated September 1, 2009, the Board was asked to provide details of the anticipated cost and appraised value of the property.
- The Board responded on January 12, 2010 providing the required information. Copies of these letters are attached.
- The existing elementary site is 6.52 acres. The proposed site acquisition is 5.46 acres. With a combined site size of 11.98 acres.
- Due to elevation changes and rights-of-way restraints, the buildable portion of the combined site would be 8.86 acres which is less than the required size of 13.1 acres for a school of the proposed 1,100 capacity.
- The constrained size will not accommodate playing fields however new artificial turf sports fields are available for school use on city owned and developed land adjacent to the school site.

SUBJECT:

School site issues in School District No. 62 (Sooke)

BACKGROUND:

- The Sooke School District has requested a replacement for Belmont Secondary as the number one priority in their 2009/2010 capital plan submission. The project has been the district's highest priority for the past three years, but is as yet not supported for funding.
- The district plans to replace the school in two locations: one, Westshore Secondary, on a site at Royal Bay, currently owned by the board, and a second, Belmont Secondary, on the site of the former Glen Lake Elementary School, which closed in June 2008.
- The School District has worked cooperatively with the City of Langford in planning their facility needs.
- The Glen Lake Elementary site is a choice location for the new Belmont Secondary School because of its close proximity to city-owned recreation fields and facilities.
- The School District requires an additional parcel of land adjacent to the Glen Lake site in order to ensure the site is of sufficient size to meet Ministry of Education standards for a secondary school of its intended capacity.
- The estimated cost of the new Westshore Secondary is \$39 million and the Belmont Secondary replacement is \$52 million. The School District is planning to sell the current site of Belmont Secondary and intends to use the proceeds of the sale to offset a portion of the costs of the new schools.

DISCUSSION:

- The additional parcel of land required for the Glen Lake site is part of a larger parcel.
- The adjacent land on the Glen Lake site is part of a larger parcel owned by developer Westhills Land Corporation/Quadra Pacific Property Corporation (Westhills).
- Ministry staff are aware of an apparent provision in an agreement between the City of Langford and Westhills requiring the developer to sell the land in question to the School District at market value.

- The City of Langford has endorsed the plan and will support zoning for the highest and best use for the existing Belmont site, and is developing a \$15 million City Centre Park sports complex adjacent to the Glen Lake.

- The City of Colwood has agreed to provide and develop additional land adjacent to the Royal Bay school site.
- Colwood's West Shore Parks & Recreation Society is planning to construct two sports fields on the Royal Bay school site in 2009.
- Belmont Secondary has a capacity of 1375 grade 10-12 students with a September 2008 enrolment of 1342. The school opened in 1953 and has a facility audit score of 50.3%.
- The Board requested replacement of the school as the first priority in its 2006/07 capital plan, however the project was not supported due to competing priorities.
- District enrolment at the secondary level is expected to decrease by 7% over the next ten years, however district staff project that enrolment at the elementary level will increase by 27% due to anticipated development in the district. Should the anticipated elementary growth occur, it will impact capacity at the elementary level in the near future and will continue into the secondary level in later years.
- Ministry staff will work with district officials to ensure the enrolment projections that were completed for the 2007 Plan reflect current trends. The impact of adding grade 9 students needs to be calculated and projected forward.
- The development rate at Royal Bay may need to be re-evaluated to determine if the housing starts will be impacted by current economic conditions, and whether the development is expected to attract families with school-aged children. This may impact the need for future secondary spaces in the Belmont Zone.
- The potential impact of economic conditions on property values and construction costs may affect the Board's contribution to the project costs; Ministry staff will continue to monitor these issues with school district officials.
- The Board can be encouraged to address the issues above, and submit this project as part of its 2009/10 Capital Plan request in May 2009.

Dear Doug:

We had hoped to get the final version of the Matrix Report to your staff, but we had coffind scioned Division Ken Hunt to double check all of the crucial data to ensure that there are no flaws. I was given assurance that we would have it today. It will confirm the big issues we are raising with the Minister and outlined below.

Regardless, our short presentation to the Minister will be mostly verbal and will not contain any surprises. Outlined below are the issues we will bring up and will come as no surprise;

- 1. Recognition of Ministry help in securing funding for additions and modulars
- 2. Reminder of the business plan to replace Belmont with two secondary schools
 - we are not proposing downsizing the public trust, we are upsizing
 - moving from 17 acres to development of approximately 25
 - joint use with municipalities / recreation / arts
 - moving from one 1375 school to two, totalling 1900-2500 in the communities
 - stemming the outflow of students from Sooke to Victoria and Saanich approximately 300+
 - grade configuration can relieve pressure in all schools for at least 3-5 years at the elementary
 - land is in place
 - full and complete municipal and parent support
 - as soon as two secondaries are built, additions need to be planned for them
 - declining condition of Belmont since last official audit (48 points in 2000)
 - two secondaries couldn't be opened for at least 4-5 years
 - Belmont's physical building has deteriorated more
 - · enrolment pressures have increased
 - cost to build two is \$50 million vs. cost to build one (\$40 million)
- 3. Overall conservative estimated growth will necessitate building 320 seats per year for next fifteen
- 4. Elementary schools are maxing out and are landlocked, in that suitable sites are hard to find
- 5. Future needs in Sooke (Milnes Landing) area reviewed
- 6. Reference to all of the valid studies done over the past twelve years which reinforce the District's position and direction

One procedural idea that came to mind while I was pulling this together for you is that we could jointly sponsor a study group of Ministry officials and school district staff to go through each of the items so that we can further review the School District's position. In this way, we can come to a mutual understanding and hopefully a mutually acceptable goal.



Standing Committee on Finance and Government Services Presentation by School District No. 62 (Sooke) October 2, 2008

- Thank you for the opportunity to address the standing committee today.
- I would like to speak to the Board's items on broad categories of finance:

1. Capital Funding

The high cost of construction and the burgeoning liability of seismic have eroded the province's ability to add many new capital projects to the K-12 capital envelope. The capital envelopes have remained unchanged despite the province's unprecedented surplus. We believe that the province should move some of its surplus into improving capital plans for school districts and for the health sector. Massive resources are being spent on the Olympics initiative and infrastructure, but long range educational and health needs also require support.

The School District has a business plan before government that recommends the replacement of an overcrowded 1953 secondary school with two new secondary schools. The new schools will allow for more seats distributed in local neighbourhoods and will provide for more choice and opportunities for students. Even though a large part of this plan would be funded by the School District consolidating and selling property, the new "Neighbourhoods of Learning" has further delayed these innovative plans.

3. Capital Assets / Neighbourhoods of Learning

A few years ago, this government gave school districts the right to manage their buildings and sites. The per student funding makes it financially irresponsible to carry half-full schools if there is another school near by. The closure of small neighbourhood schools will actually fund an operating deficit. This has led to school closures and the lease and disposal of school sites. The government also made it attractive for school districts to put together business plans, consolidating and collapsing sites to purchase new sites or build new schools.

The recent announcement of "Neighbourhoods of Learning" has suspended these discussions. What are school districts to do if they can't close half-full, redundant schools? There is a need to replace aging school buildings with more environmentally friendly buildings that can be used by the community also. Will the government be subsidizing school districts to keep those schools active to support full day kindergarten, early learning and other government-initiated social programs that fall outside the present K-12 mandate? These pending changes in direction are not just disconcerting, but undermine the stability of school districts within the communities that they serve. "Neighbourhoods of Learning" came about without consultation with the affected parties.

Thank you for your letter dated January 12, 2010, requesting borrowing authority for the acquisition of land adjacent to the former Glen Lake site in anticipation of the replacement of Belmont Secondary School.

I note that the purchase price of \$4.5 million is supported by a recent property appraisal, and that the District plans to contribute \$1.5 million from its School Site Acquisition Charge account towards acquisition, leaving a balance of \$3 million. On September 17th, 2009, we sent you the attached urgent request to borrow funds to acquire land adjacent to a closed elementary school. The land is necessary to advance our business plan and to rebuild Belmont on that site.

Since September 17th, we have fine-tuned the purchase price by securing an appraisal which shows that the value of the additional land is \$4.5 million. We can supply one-third of that, or \$1.5 million, by the school site acquisition charges we have collected for that purpose. Therefore, the School District requires approval from the Ministry to borrow \$3.0 million.

All additional supporting documentation has now been submitted with the P.I.R.

We respectfully request the approval of the \$3.0 million borrowing, so that we can complete the last transaction required for the School District business plan.

I am writing in response to your letter dated September 1, 2009, regarding the Board of Education's previous request for authority to borrow funds to enable the School District to secure necessary land adjacent to the site of the former Glen Lake Elementary School for future development of the Belmont Secondary School replacement in Langford.

The School District appreciates the continued support for facilities to address the unprecedented population growth in the Western Communities and the urgent need to replace Belmont Secondary School. The approval of funding in the 2004/05 Capital Plan enabled the School District, working in partnership with the City of Colwood, to acquire a site at Royal Bay for a new secondary school in Colwood. This approval is evidence of the Ministry's support for additional secondary capacity in the Western Communities.

More recently, the Board of Education has received assurance that the Ministry supports acquisition of land adjacent to the Glen Lake site for replacement of Belmont Secondary School.

The School District has previously submitted its Long Range Facilities Plan completed in 2005 as well as the Plan Update completed in 2007. The School District has also submitted a comprehensive business plan for proposed new facilities.

Our plan addresses the following objectives:

- the urgent need to replace Belmont Secondary School which is assessed as moderate high/high seismic risk and has reached the end of its useful life
- the need to align grade configuration with other south Island school districts and provide students with a choice of secondary school within the Belmont Zone
- the need address serious overcrowding at both elementary and secondary levels by transitioning to a
 junior middle school model, thereby transferring the equivalent of one grade level from elementary
 schools to secondary schools

Our business plan relies on partnerships and land value capture to substantially lessen the burden of capital investment on the taxpayer. Just as Colwood is partnering in the development of the Royal Bay Secondary site, Langford is partnering with us in co-development of the Glen Lake site and City Centre Park. In addition, the School District proposes to fund about

S17 f its overall costs through the disposition of a majority of the Belmont site.

The City of Langford will cooperate with the School District to ensure that we generate highest and best use values from the disposition of this prominent and highly sought after commercial site.

Our Long Term Facilities Plan and the Belmont Business Plan have been reviewed and endorsed by Honourable Shirley Bond, former Minister of Education; Emery Dosdall, former Deputy Minister, James Gorman, Deputy Minister; Keith Miller, Assistant Deputy Minister; and Doug Stewart, Director, Capital Branch. The Plan has also been reviewed and endorsed by Larry Blain, President and CEO, Partnerships BC.

At its meeting with Honourable Shirley Bond, Minister of Education, on March 12, 2009, the Board of Education affirmed its decision to proceed with implementation of the plan.

However, acquisition of land adjacent to the former Glen Lake site is required prior to implementation. While the City of Langford has arranged for the adjacent land to be reserved for school purposes to a period of time, the property owner is only prepared to sell the land through a market-based transaction. Further the company that owns the property has informed the Board of Education that it is only prepared to enter into negotiations at such time that the School District can enter into a binding Agreement for Purchase and Sale.

The Board of Education has requested approval to borrow funds in order to acquire this property adjacent to the Glen Lake site. The purchase price may be in the range of \$5.7 Million. The Board of Education undertakes to fund up to \$1.1 Million of the purchase price from its School Site Acquisition Charge Reserve. Accordingly, the Board of Education requests approval to borrow up to \$4.6 Million, the balance of the purchase price. The School District proposes to capitalize borrowing costs and repay both principal and interest from the proceeds of disposition of the Belmont Secondary site, estimated to be in the range of

Additional supporting documentation requested in your letter dated September 1, 2009 has been forwarded to Ministry staff under separate cover.

Your approval of borrowing authority is urgently requested. Further delays are expected to compromise our relationship with the property owner and place implementation of this fundamentally sound plan at risk.

Thank you for your letter dated July 7, 2009, requesting borrowing authority to support your Board's plan to acquire additional property to supplement an existing school site.

I am aware of the Sooke School District's business plan to construct two new secondary schools; however, as you know, the project has not yet been supported and approval of borrowing authority will establish a liability for government. To support this request, the Board should confirm its plan for this project and include an updated review of options for provision of the replacement secondary spaces.

Furthermore, your letter did not provide details of the anticipated cost and appraised value of the property that the Board wishes to acquire. A copy of any recent property appraisals indicating its assessed value would also be required to support the Board's request to acquire the property. 

We met with Jim Cambridge, Dave Lockyer, Pete Godau (Facilities director) and Bill Wood (Matrix Consultants) about the district's enrolment pressures in the Belmont zone and options for dealing with them. Their focus is on the two secondary schools as a first step, supported or enhanced by the value of the existing school toward the cost of the new facilities. This would allow them to change grade configuration and move the grade 9's into the new schools, thus saving the need for elementary space.

Our start point was that we see this as a strong option, enhanced by the contribution from the existing school site. We noted that the direction of government has been to fewer site disposal approvals so this is not a given, but we acknowledged it to be a good business case. Our main point however was that the plan must be driven primarily by the need for space: condition of Belmont, and value of the site will help the case, but not drive it. This took repeating, but I believe they got it, and Bill Wood was very helpful here.

I asked them to look at their elementary pressures now, plus 5 years and 10 years out, using the enrolment projections Matrix has provided (a bit more optimistic than Ministry numbers but realistic I believe); then to determine where new space is needed, and what sites will be required. Their pressure for secondary space does not show up until about 2017 at the current grade configuration (K-6; 7-9; 10-12) but changing to K-5; 6-8; 9-12 will put pressure at the secondary level sooner (even now) while relieving some of the need for elementary space/site. The side by side comparison will show us the differences in scope and cost of each.

Assuming the plan is supported, the critical issue from our perspective is given the local pressure to replace Belmont, and the ability to contribute to the project, knowing that it is a growing district, at what point does it make sense to let the school(s) go forward? This should become clearer as they do the work we asked for today.

I also talked about other districts with immediate pressures (Surrey, Langley etc) and reminded them about the scarcity of capital, and the pent up demand caused by 6 years of no capital; effectively, their competition. They also reminded me about the local pressures and expectations so I'd have to say that part was a saw-off.

They continue to see the two schools as one project, and can't contemplate either as a one-off.

I spoke with Dave Lockyer: the district held a parent meeting at John Stubbs on Monday night, also attended by John Horgan. Replacement of Belmont continues to be the top priority, and a number of parents are quite frustrated with the lack of progress toward approval of the two replacement schools. Apparently the Chair committed to continue to seek a meeting with MMM until she is successful and can personally make the case for replacement. The district has apparently lost almost 500 secondary students to Victoria because of the condition of Belmont.

The business plan the chair would like to discuss is to seek approval to use Land capital funds that the district has acquired from SSAC's to start a planning process so they don't lose another year should a project be approved in an upcoming capital plan.

The project is a high priority but has not been supported in previous capital plans; also will involve the demolition of existing Belmont, and sale of the site to generate proceeds to one of the two replacement schools. The Ministry has provided borrowing authority for the board to acquire additional site required at Glen lake, the site for one of the replacement schools.







The School District asked for a meeting with the Minister of Education to discuss the need for two new secondary schools in the Westshore. The Superintendent, Board Chair and Secretary Treasurer were accompanied by the Mayors of Langford, Colwood and Metchosin on March 12/09.

The School District outlined for the Minister the main elements of the business plan:

- 1. Two new community-based secondary schools, one in Colwood and one in Langford, designed to better serve the students of the School District
- 2. Support of the parent community for renewed secondary school buildings
- 3. Grade configuration to 6-8 middle school model for Belmont zone to align with rest of District
- 4. Sale of Belmont property, contributing at least S17 to the total cost
- 5. No additional elementary closures (e.g. Savory, Sangster) in the Belmont zone in order to plan for the anticipated future enrolment growth, based on recent solid data collection
- 6. Cooperative, supportive partnerships with the municipalities for recreational and shared facilities, saving the School District millions of dollars in grounds and recreational development, and providing much needed community buildings and infrastructure
- 7. Continued consultation with public and education community throughout the process

The Minister complimented the School District and municipalities for working together to develop this partnership model. She acknowledged that this is a new plan which looks long range and provides education for students in their communities. The Minister concluded by recognizing the ingenious features of the plan and encouraged the School District to do all of the data collection and work necessary to include this in the May 15/09 capital plan submission.

The School District will continue its consultation with the parents and public. As well, the School District will research and develop strategies for the disposition of assets requirement as it pertains to the Belmont site. Work will continue with the municipalities around joint use agreements and shared facilities.

SUBJECT:

Update on the plans for a new Oak Bay Secondary School in School

District No. 61 (Greater Victoria)

KEY POINTS:

1. Oak Bay Secondary was supported in the Ministry's 2003/04 capital plan. Studies suggest that the school should be replaced.

2. The Ministry has not yet received the Project Definition Report for the replacement project.

3. It is expected that the District will be requesting a community theatre as a Neighbourhood Learning Centre within the new school. Media reports indicate that Oak Bay council has committed \$1 million towards the theatre.

BACKGROUND:

Oak Bay Secondary was supported in the 2003/04 capital plan.

A feasibility study completed in September 2004 recommended that the best option was to construct a replacement building but retain the East building gymnasium and convert it to a theatre and drama support space.

In April 2008, the Ministry engaged Stantec Consultants Ltd to conduct an independent review. The final report was received by the Ministry in October 2008.

In February 2009, in response to the independent review, the Ministry notified the school district that it accepted the recommendation of the Stantech report for a 1200-student capacity replacement school, subject to the current and projected enrolment and capacity at other district schools being supported by a long range facilities master plan. To date, the Ministry has not received the District's plan.

In that February 2009 letter, the Board of Education was also given approval to proceed with the Phase Two Feasibility Study, now called a Project Definition Report (PDR), to determine the appropriate scope, schedule, budget and risk factors for the project. This report is not expected before the end of February 2011.

It is expected that the PDR will include the district's proposal for a community theatre as a Neighbourhood Learning Centre. The NLC should not exceed 15% of the total space allocation.

DISCUSSION:

The current capacity of the replacement school is 1200 grade 9-12 students, subject to confirmation of enrolment need. At a 1200 capacity school, the total project budget is expected to be approximately \$45 million. Including 15% extra space for a NLC, the budget is expected to be approximately \$50 million.

The project has been scheduled for cash flow starting in fiscal 2013/14.

The current capacity of Oak Bay Secondary School is 1,500 grades 9-12 students. The September 2010 enrolment is 1061 students. The enrolment is projected to remain constant through 2018/19.

The recent addition and renovation of Victoria High School – Fairey Tech Building will see the capacity of that school reduced from 1200 to 800 students. The enrolment for Vic High is projected to be 732 students by 2018/19.

I am writing in response to the recommendations of the Oak Bay Secondary School Feasibility Study Independent Review Report, prepared by Stantec Consulting Ltd.

The Ministry agrees to the following independent review recommendations with regards to Oak Bay Secondary School:

- 1. The capital project should proceed as a replacement school on the existing site.
- 2. The Ministry will provide capital funding for a 1,200 capacity secondary school for grade 9 to grade 12 students.
- 3. The determination of the capital project procurement method can be deferred to the start of the second phase feasibility study. As the replacement project budget is expected to exceed \$50 million, the Board is obliged to undertake a formal procurement process analysis, and to submit the Board's recommendations to Partnerships BC for their review and comment before a final decision is made. The school district may wish to consider further collaboration with Partnerships BC in the procurement analysis.

The following comments from the independent review will require further consideration by the Board and the Ministry:

1. Ministry support for a capacity of 1,200 student spaces at Oak Bay Secondary will impact the proposed capacity for future secondary school capital projects in Greater Victoria. Current and projected enrolment and capacity at other schools will need to be supported by a long range facilities master plan.

../2

- 2. The Board will be responsible for funding any additional space at Oak Bay Secondary that would increase the capacity of the replacement school beyond 1,200 students. The provision of space for 100 international students would be the Board's responsibility.
- 3. While the existing site area exceeds Ministry area allowances, the Ministry understands that the Municipality of Oak Bay holds title to the majority of the existing Oak Bay Secondary site, so the potential sale of any surplus land to generate capital funding for the project is improbable. However, the Ministry wishes to encourage the Board to work collaboratively with the Municipality regarding the possible incorporation of a community auditorium as part of the school development in a manner that would benefit both the students and citizens of Oak Bay.

The board of education should proceed with the Phase Two Feasibility Study to determine the appropriate scope, schedule, budget and risk factors for the capital project. The feasibility study process is described in more detail in the Ministry's 'Capital Asset Management – Project Procurement Procedures and Guidelines', and a current project agreement template can be provided by your Planning Officer.

The Board is encouraged to give preference in the use of building materials, all else being equal, to wood and wood products and consideration to the use of wood as a source of renewable energy supply.

The Ministry encourages the school district to enter into discussions with the community regarding the future provision of an auditorium on the Oak Bay Secondary site. We anticipate that the consultation and feasibility study process would be finalized in order to enable the project to proceed by 2010.

The Ministry fully supports the efforts of the Board with respect to this important project, and looks forward to working with the Board as the project moves forward.
