Description of current incident: At 19:05 EDT on 10 Apr 2012, the pilot of Korean Air flight 072 informed Nav Canada that the aircraft was going back to Vancouver International Airport, BC, due to a bomb threat. The aircraft's original destination was Seoul, Korea. There were 149 passengers on board and a crew of 10. NORAD scrambled fighter aircrafts from Portland, OR to escort the flight, which was diverted from Vancouver to Comox, BC, where it landed safely at 20:26 EDT. The flight was met by security forces.

Source(s) of reporting: RCMP, DND, TC, CBSA, DFAIT.

Current actions: The following activities were carried out overnight by the agencies involved:

Once on the ground in Comox, the control of the aircraft was transferred from TC to RCMP and DND personnel. Military Police (MP) in conjunction with RCMP unloaded the passengers who were then bused to a secure military area (main mess hall at CFB Comox) while the aircraft's crew remained onboard with security personnel.

Carry-on and checked bags were off-loaded by military personnel into a secure hangar where the RCMP canine unit screened the luggage. The aircraft was searched.

CBSA dispatched officers on site, all 149 passengers and 10 crewmembers were processed without incident. A small contingent from CBSA remained on site to address any passenger concerns as well as support the local RCMP and Military personnel.

DFAIT established contact with staff of the Japanese Consulate in Vancouver after the consulate was notified by the airline that 5 Japanese citizens were onboard the aircraft.

At 05:52 EDT on 11 Apr 2012, DND advised GOC that the aircraft was still on the ground in Comox because a suspicious package had been found. A military explosive ordinance disposal unit from Victoria, BC is on the way to Comox. All passengers and crew are housed in local hotels.

RCMP is the primary federal agency for this incident.

DND, TC, CBSA and DFAIT are the supporting departments/agencies for this incident.

Emergency Management British Columbia (EMBC) is the primary provincial/territorial agency for this incident, including public communications until otherwise advised.

RCMP is the primary agency for this incident for federal level Public Communications.

Future actions: As of 06:00 EDT on 11 Apr 2012, no accurate time estimate was available as to when aircraft, passengers and luggage would be cleared to fly.

Assessment/Analysis: The threat was received through Korean Airline head office in Los Angeles, CA, approximately one hour after the flight had departed Canada. The incident is being investigated by RCMP. The choice of Comox as a diversion airport created logistical challenges for the agencies involved.
