## 1.09 ASSIGNING LIVING UNITS

- CS i/c assigns all inmates to a living unit upon admission.
- General population remand inmates will be housed separately from sentenced inmates whenever possible.
- Male inmates who were previously in a Protective Custody Unit will automatically be placed in a PC unit during the admitting process by the CS i/c.
- Male inmates who are charged with or convicted of a sexual offence shall:
- Be placed in a PC unit if they request it.

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- If general population inmates are aware of his status or in the opinion of the CS i/c inmates may become aware of his status, he will be placed in a PC unit. The CS must notify the classification staff in writing of the particulars.
- All inmates not convicted/ charged with a sexual offence requesting a PC placement will be interviewed by the CS and if necessary be housed in living unit s.15 until seen by a Classification Officer no later than the next working day (the CS i/c must notify Classification Staff in writing outlining the need for PC placement).

### 1.10 ADMISSION MEDICAL

All new admissions shall be interviewed by a Registered Nurse in order to identify current health and future needs.

### 1.11 MEDICAL SCREENING FORM

The admitting Registered Nurse will complete a Medical Screening form during the review described in 1.06 and provide a completed copy to an A&D Officer in a timely manner.

### 1.12 MEDICAL SEGREGATION

The admitting Registered Nurse may segregate any inmate they feel has a contagious disease, is suicidal, requires psychiatric care or is under the influence of an intoxicant. The Nurse will notify the CS i/c immediately when this occurs.

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
