Introduction

This is in response to your application for a temporary change to your liquor licence to allow for liquor service during the televised presentation of all Vancouver Canucks road games during the Western Conference Finals and Stanley Cup Finals.

Decision / Analysis

I have taken into consideration the following:

- Application for temporary change to allow for the liquor service during the televised presentation of all Vancouver Canucks Road games during the Western Conference Finals and Stanley Cup Finals:
- The conditions identified on the application under which the licence would operate during these games;
- Current conditions on licence, including a condition that the licence would not be in effect for televised events unless otherwise approved by the general manager on a case by case
- E-mailed comments from Paul Teichroeb of the City of Vancouver;
- Letter from Al Niedtner of the Vancouver Police Department;
- Memorandum from Norm Stackhouse, Ministry Inspector.
- October 1994 British Columbia Police Commission Report on the riot that occurred in Vancouver on June 14-15, 1994;
- Previously approved application for temporary change to allow for the liquor service during the Olympic Men's Hockey Final;

I have considered that the application is for all televised games from May 07 to June 15, 2003 and I have reviewed your outline of how you would operate during the games. I have noted that the estimated attendance at the events is between 12,000 to 15,000 people with the cost of tickets between \$5.00 and \$10.00, and that the security would be the same as for a home play-off game.

I have taken into account that Paul Teichroeb of the City of Vancouver does not support the request due to the potential negative impacts on the community after the game is over and the lack of sufficient police resources to deal with the event; that the Vancouver Police Department references the 1994 Stanley Cup Riot and the potential detrimental impact on the community from over consumption and subsequent patron behaviour, and does not support the request. As well, I have taken into account that Norm Stackhouse, Ministry Inspector, does not support the request based on concerns that this event is similar to the 1994 Stanley Cup and that the limit of one beer per-person would not be a deterrent to over-consumption by patrons.

The following issues associated with the application give cause for concern:

- the current amount of enforcement required to monitor the current at home games and the need to provide significant additional enforcement to cover the televised games;
- the low cost of tickets at between \$5.00 and \$10.00 potentially attracting a different patron base from the season ticket holder fans;
- the estimated attendance of up to 15,000 people;
- the lack of significant restriction to the availability of liquor at the event;.
- That this is leading to and may become a Stanley Cup playoff, with a potential for a similar situation as the 1994 Stanley Cup riot;
- the lack of demonstrable support from the City of Vancouver, the Vancouver Policy Department or the Ministry's Compliance and Enforcement Division;

Based on my consideration of the above, the history of violence and misbehaviour associated with certain types of sporting events, the need for restrictions on the service for liquor, and the requirement to consider public safety issues, I am denying your application to serve liquor at the televised events. This does not preclude you from applying in the future for other events which may not have the same emotional force and the subsequent significant impact on the community.

PART 13: What Happens Next?

The temporary change application process:

- 1. If the requested temporary change(s) require local government/First Nation comment, the applicant must take the completed application form and all required documents to their local government/First Nation and request that the local government/First Nation complete and sign Part 12.
- 2. The applicant will submit the signed application, all required documents and application fee to the Victoria Head Office (LCLB). Note: Applicants should ensure they submit their completed application two weeks before the proposed change.
- The LCLB licensing staff will review the application package and advise the applicant by phone, mail or fax, of any information or documents required before the application can be processed.
- 4. LCLB licensing staff will request comments from the local liquor inspector.
- 5. If required, the local liquor inspector will work with the applicant on security and related issues.
- 6. LCLB licensing staff will review the comments from the local government/First Nation (if applicable) and local liquor inspector.
- 7. LCLB staff will contact the applicant by, fax or mail to let them know whether or not the change has been approved. The applicant will receive LCLB's decision in writing.

I have included the following information to support this application:



This letter of discretion is written in support of the application of Vancouver Arena Limited Partnerships for a temporary change to the Terms and Conditions of the Liquor Primary License at Rogers Arena. The temporary change would permit the sale of liquor during the presentation of all Vancouver Canucks road play-off games during the 2011 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

Ticket prices and a growing season ticket base have made it increasingly difficult for us to provide an "in game" experience for families and fans that cannot afford to attend a live Canucks game. The most effective way for us to reach Canucks fans is to have them experience the energy of cheering on their favourite team along with thousands of other fans. We believe that events such as these have a positive impact on a fans perception of the team and go a long way in our efforts to grow and retain our fan base.

This has never been more apparent to us then with the overwhelming response we received at our Super Skills event held on Sunday, February 27th 2011. This event attracted 15,000 fans and was a huge success in helping connect our team with the community.

We also view these types of events as a great opportunity to raise money for our many charitable endeavors. The presentation of these events would afford us the opportunity to donate all net proceeds of ticket sales to the Canucks For Kids Fund.

The following is a response to the concerns listed in Mary Freeman's letter dated May 8, 2003:

- 1. "the current amount of enforcement required to monitor the current at home games and the need to provide significant additional enforcement to cover the televised games";
 - Each game and the expected attendance would be monitored closely and we would staff the building accordingly. If an event such as this was to attract a full building we would staff the event with the same number of security, hosts and
 - police as we would for one of our home play-off games. We would work closely with the Vancouver Police Department to determine the appropriate staffing levels for each event.

- 2. "the low cost of tickets at between \$5.00 and \$10.00 potentially attracting a different patron base from the season ticket holder fans";
 - The purpose of this event is to attract fans and families who cannot normally afford to attend a live Vancouver Canucks game. We do not view this as a negative. We do understand the concern expressed and have put in place a marketing strategy to distribute tickets to true Canucks fans. For example; sending e-mails advertising the event to our season ticket holders, invite all Lower Mainland Minor Hockey teams and grassroots hockey groups through the Canucks Centre for Hockey, invite all our charitable organizations, and invite teachers who participate in the Fin's Friends Literacy program to promote the event to their classrooms.
- 3. "the estimated attendance of 15,000 people";
 - In 2002 we were granted approval for a similar event when we showed the Men's Gold Medal Hockey Game at the Salt Lake City Olympics between the United States and Canada. We had 15,000 people at that event and had no behavioural problems or disruptions. It was a great event which allowed fans to come together to cheer Canada on to the Gold Medal. We believe the same kind of excitement and energy will be created when fans come together to cheer on the Vancouver Canucks.
- 4. "the lack of significant restriction to the availability of liquor at the event";
 - As outlined in our attached Event Summary we will be restricting the service of alcohol. Liquor service will end at the end of the 2nd period intermission; normally we would sell alcohol until the 12 minute mark of the 3rd period. We will only allow a 1 beer limit per-person, per-service; at live hockey games we have 2 beer limits. We would also reduce the number of points of sale that would be available at a regular hockey game.
- 5. "that this is leading to and may become a Stanley Cup playoff, with a potential for a similar situation as the 1994 Stanley Cup riot";
 - We are aware of the concerns that the City of Vancouver and the Vancouver Police Department have in regards to avoiding a repeat of the events that took place after game 7 of the 1994 Stanley Cup Final. As an organization we are planning to launch a campaign before the play-offs that will encourage fans to "celebrate responsibly". This campaign will include player Public Service Announcements encouraging fans to celebrate responsibly. There will be in game messaging as well as other members of our organization speaking about this campaign with the media. We will be working closely with the Vancouver Police Department in getting this message out to our fans.
- 6. "the lack of demonstrable support from the City of Vancouver, the Vancouver Police Department or the Ministry's Compliance and Enforcement Division";
 - We have sent letters to the City of Vancouver and the Vancouver Police Department seeking support for this application and I will forward their response to this application to your office. They have supported this application in previous years and expect they will do so again. I would be happy to meet with representatives from the Ministry's Compliance and Enforcement Division to further discuss this application.



Along with this letter I have attached an event summary which explains our marketing strategy and clearly outlines how we will operate the building for the presentation of Canucks road games.

Event Summary For Presentation of Canucks Road Games 2011 Stanley Cup Play-offs

Vancouver Arena Limited Partnership is applying for a temporary change of its Liquor Primary License to provide alcohol service during the presentation of Vancouver Canucks road games during the 2011 Stanley Cup Play-offs. The following summary outlines how we would operate during these games:

- Doors would open to the public one hour prior to the game (this is consistent with a live home game)
- The estimated attendance would be 12,000 15,000
- We would use assigned seating as opposed to general admission for these events
- Liquor service would begin at door opening and will conclude at the end of the 2nd period intermission. (Our normal cut-off time for a live hockey game is the 12 minute mark of the 3rd period)
- There would be a 1 beer limit per-person, per-service (at live games we have 2 beer limit per-person, per-service)
- The River Rock Club would be open, however there would be no in-seat service and spirits would not be available (at live games we do provide in seat service and spirits would be available both in seat and at the bars located within the Club)
- The number of points of sale compared to live home play-off game would be reduced
- A similar number of security guard's, host's and police would be deployed to work these events as is deployed for a live home play-off game
- We would work closely with the Vancouver Police Department in designing an effective security plan for these events


The following outlines our marketing strategy in order to target families and community groups for this event:

- Print ads in the forward news section of the Vancouver Sun and The Province
- Provide our season ticket holders the opportunity to pre-purchase tickets
- Invite Lower Mainland minor hockey teams and grassroots hockey groups through the Canucks Centre for BC Hockey
- Invite all or our charitable organizations (including families from Canucks Place, Canucks Autism Network, Canucks Family Education Centre)
- Invite teachers who participate in the Fin's Friends program to communicate to their classrooms.
- Use our social media outlets (twitter, facebook) to get the message out to our fans

Overview:

We see these road broadcasts as the perfect way to welcome a broader base of Canucks fans to Rogers Arena, the home of the Vancouver Canucks, to cheer on their team. These may be fans that would otherwise not have the chance or means to attend a game.

Promotion of the games will focus on the fun and affordable nature of the event, encouraging families to come together to experience the 2011 Canucks run for the Stanley Cup. A relatively low ticket price (\$10.00 - \$15.00) will be offered in order to support the positioning of the games as a memorable, yet inexpensive family event. We will also consider special reduced prices or promotions for families and children.
