You are fully informed that BCHRT in My 13, 2011 has \$\mathbb{S}\$ I disagree with your response, article 49 of the *University Act* clearly specifies that "At the request of the minister, a university must provide the minister with reports and any other information that the minister considers necessary to carry out the minister's responsibilities in relation to universities." even "personal information about a student". Please do contact the UNBC administration and ask for a report on both instances of \$\mathbb{S}\$ in compliance with the university act.

You have also dodged away from providing any answer to my concern regarding the annual over-payment of \$7 Million extra to UNBC. UNBC Senate public report April 24, 2013 also highlights this overpayment by your ministry (I can provide you with the exact quote). This amount is equal to more than 500 FTE greater than UNBC actual enrollment FTE (leftover and doubled from failed DTO funding in 2003-05). Is the ministry ending these over-payments this year? Again I bring your attention to Article 30 of the *University Act* which gives the power to the ministry to reduce the grant of a university.

I look forward to your prompt action on these two important issues instead of stonewalling the issues any further.

Dear President Laurin,

I am writing you to share my concerns regarding proposed cuts to the Early Learning and Care (ELC) Program by the Camosun College Board of Governors. This valuable program graduates ELC Educators with Diploma Certificate and Infant Toddler and/or Special Needs credentials.

I completely understand that funding shortfalls from the Ministry of Advanced Education is putting college and university boards in a very difficult situation where they have to contemplate making undesirable decisions. However, I believe that any cuts to the ELC program will have serious effects for our entire community because the two options to reduce the ELC program are too drastic and will significantly alter the program.

One suggestion from the Board of Governors is to only have a one-year Certificate program. This option risks reducing the scope of the education offered to students and could result in diminished enrollment. The second option is no more acceptable - to provide a Diploma program with intake that is only once every two years will severely deplete our region's early learning and care workforce. This concerns me in future years if young children in Greater Victoria with extra support needs grow-up without the crucial benefit of early intervention and care provided by qualified early childhood educators.

The shortage of qualified, licensed Early Childhood Educators in our region is part of a larger systemic set of child care challenges across British Columbia. In this context, a potential cut of 50% to the Camosun College ELC program makes no sense, especially as this government's Provincial Early Years strategy sets targets to increase the number of child care spaces.

It is my sincere hope that the Camosun College Board of Governors will advocate to the Premier and the Minister of Advanced Education to put the needs of children and families first in Greater Victoria by continuing to invest in quality, comprehensive programs to teach early childhood educators. I wholeheartedly support the Camosun College Early Learning and Care program and urge the Board to make the case to government for its continuing and critical value to the well-being of this community.
