

Here is the Saskatchewan Government's news release regarding the extension of municipal election cycles.

### GOVERNMENT TO INTRODUCE LEGISLATION TO EXTEND MUNICIPAL TERMS TO FOUR YEARS FROM THREE

Municipal Affairs Minister Jeremy Harrison today announced plans to lengthen the term of office for urban, northern municipal and school board officials.

Amendments to *The Local Government Election Act* will be introduced in the fall of 2010 and will lengthen the term of office from three years to four in the 2012 municipal and school board elections.

"We have consulted with various stakeholders and feel this is an innovative way of helping municipal officials," Harrison said.
"Taxpayers will benefit from cost savings from holding fewer elections and there will now be longer periods for municipal councils to plan and implement programs and longer term goals."

The Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association (SUMA) convention passed a resolution in 2008 to extend the term of office from three to four years. The Ministry of Municipal Affairs consulted with the education sector as school board elections are held concurrent with municipal elections.

The move would not affect rural municipalities. Rural municipalities prefer the two-year term of office under which they currently operate, but do not object to a four year term for other local governments.

The move would see Saskatchewan join seven other provinces which have four year terms (New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland and Labrador, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Ontario and Manitoba). British Columbia and Alberta have three year terms, as well at the Yukon. The Northwest Territories and Nunavut have two-year or three-year terms dependant on the size of the community.

Fair Voting BC (FVBC) is a province-wide non-profit society which works to promote fair, accountable and transparent democratic processes at all levels of government in BC. TC believes citizens can make the best decision about the kind of city they want when they are given

### Municipalities' Right to Self-Determination Regarding Choice of Voting System

Justice Berger Recommends Right of Self-Determination: In 2004, Vancouver convened an Electoral Reform Commission headed by Justice Thomas Berger. One of Justice Berger's key recommendations was that Vancouver, in particular, and any other municipality that might wish to, be granted the right to choose their own voting system. Justice Berger explained his reasoning as follows (emphases ours):

"In my view, these [ie, electoral reform issues] should be matters over which the City Council should now have a measure of control currently not permitted by the Charter. If Council agrees, it should petition the provincial government to change the Charter [and, should the Legislature decide to extend this measure of control to other cities, the Local Government Act as well] in order to give the City greater flexibility in designing a system that best meets the needs and expectations of its citizens, as these change over time. This increasing empowerment of municipalities appears to be the emerging trend in other Englishspeaking common law jurisdictions (Berger mentions legislation in California and Illinois permitting cities to adopt alternative systems of voting, as well as the recent developments in New Zealand and Britain). ... The amendments I foresee should be framed sufficiently broadly to permit, at the very least, preferential voting on municipal ballots. This would provide sufficient flexibility to allow election by STV at large or in multi-member wards, and preferential balloting (IRV) in single member wards."

Following this explanation, Berger then issued his Recommendation #12:

"That Council seek amendment of the Vancouver Charter to permit elections to be conducted using systems of proportional representation."

Vancouver City Council Agreed and Petitioned Province: Vancouver City Council under Mayor Larry Campbell affirmed a number of Justice Berger's recommendations and, in particular, passed the following motion on March 15, 2005:

"THAT City Council request the Government of British Columbia to amend the Vancouver Charter to allow Council the option to adopt a proportional representation electoral system, such as the Single Transferable Vote system, including multi-member wards."

Given that this request has already been submitted, the Task Force's consultation seems to be an excellent time to discuss how the province's response could be incorporated into the planned legislation.

### **Recommendations on Process**

Public Meetings: We note that the primary mechanism for public consultation appears to be written submissions. We would suggest that the public have opportunities to provide input in person and that the Task Force have an opportunity to ask questions of those making submissions. Such public meetings will likely attract media attention and will promote public awareness of the consultation process. We recognize that it will not be possible to have public consultations on the same scale as those of, say, the Electoral Boundaries Commission, but these electoral system reform issues deeply affect all British Columbians and all of us should have the maximum opportunity to participate in this discussion, especially since there are no opposition MLAs on the Task Force to ensure that there is balanced representation across the political spectrum. We recommend that at least three meetings be held — one in central BC, one in the Lower Mainland, and one on Vancouver Island.

**Post Online Submissions:** To maximize transparency in the consultation process, we recommend that you post all online submissions as soon after posting as possible, preferably immediately, or, if posting needs to be done manually, within a day of submission.

**Publish Interim Recommendations:** We further recommend that the Task Force commit itself to issuing interim recommendations with sufficient lead time to allow for public feedback prior to final submission of your report. Given that you have set a deadline of April 15<sup>th</sup> for written submissions and have a May 30<sup>th</sup> deadline for submission of your final report, we recommend that you plan to issue interim recommendations around May 1<sup>st</sup> and to allow further responses until May 15<sup>th</sup>.

### **Summary of Recommendations**

In summary, Fair Voting BC and Think City respectfully recommend that the Task Force:

- 1. Explicitly consider the issue of municipalities' right to self-determination in regard to choosing the most appropriate voting system to use for local elections,
- 2. Hold at least three public meetings to solicit input from the public.
- 3. Post all online submissions as soon as practical after submission.
- 4. Publish interim recommendations of the Task Force for public response prior to submission of the Task Force's final report.

Justice Berger Recommends Right of Self-Determination: In 2004, Vancouver convened an Electoral Reform Commission headed by Justice Thomas Berger. One of Justice Berger's key recommendations was that Vancouver, in particular, and any other municipality that might wish to, be granted the right to choose their own voting system. Justice Berger explained his reasoning as follows (emphases ours):

"In my view, these [ie, electoral reform issues] should be matters over which the City Council should now have a measure of control currently not permitted by the Charter. If Council agrees, it should petition the provincial government to change the Charter [and, should the Legislature decide to extend this measure of control to other cities, the Local Government Act as well] in order to give the City greater flexibility in designing a system that best meets the needs and expectations of its citizens, as these change over time. This increasing empowerment of municipalities appears to be the emerging trend in other Englishspeaking common law jurisdictions (Berger mentions legislation in California and Illinois permitting cities to adopt alternative systems of voting, as well as the recent developments in New Zealand and Britain). ... The amendments I foresee should be framed sufficiently broadly to permit, at the very least, preferential voting on municipal ballots. This would provide sufficient flexibility to allow election by STV at large or in multi-member wards, and preferential balloting (IRV) in single member wards."

Following this explanation, Berger then issued his Recommendation #12:

"That Council seek amendment of the Vancouver Charter to permit elections to be conducted using systems of proportional representation."

Vancouver City Council Agreed and Petitioned Province: Vancouver City Council under Mayor Larry Campbell affirmed a number of Justice Berger's recommendations and, in particular, passed the following motion on March 15, 2005:

"THAT City Council request the Government of British Columbia to amend the Vancouver Charter to allow Council the option to adopt a proportional representation electoral system, such as the Single Transferable Vote system, including multi-member wards."

Given that this request has already been submitted, the Task Force's consultation seems to be an excellent time to discuss how the province's response could be incorporated into the planned legislation.

### **Recommendations on Process**

**Public Meetings:** We note that the primary mechanism for public consultation appears to be written submissions. We would suggest that the public have opportunities to provide input in person and that the Task Force have an opportunity to ask questions of those making submissions. Such public meetings will likely attract media attention and will promote public awareness of the consultation process. We recognize that it will not be possible to have public consultations on the same scale as those of, say, the Electoral Boundaries Commission, but these electoral system reform issues deeply affect all British Columbians and all of us should have the maximum opportunity to participate in this discussion, especially since there are no opposition MLAs on the Task Force to ensure that there is balanced representation across the political spectrum. We recommend that at least three meetings be held – one in central BC, one in the Lower Mainland, and one on Vancouver Island.

**Post Online Submissions:** To maximize transparency in the consultation process, we recommend that you post all online submissions as soon after posting as possible, preferably immediately, or, if posting needs to be done manually, within a day of submission.

**Publish Interim Recommendations:** We further recommend that the Task Force commit itself to issuing interim recommendations with sufficient lead time to allow for public feedback prior to final submission of your report. Given that you have set a deadline of April 15<sup>th</sup> for written submissions and have a May 30<sup>th</sup> deadline for submission of your final report, we recommend that you plan to issue interim recommendations around May 1<sup>st</sup> and to allow further responses until May 15<sup>th</sup>.

### **Summary of Recommendations**

In summary, Fair Voting BC and Think City respectfully recommend that the Task Force:

- 1. Explicitly consider the issue of municipalities' right to self-determination in regard to choosing the most appropriate voting system to use for local elections,
- 2. Hold at least three public meetings to solicit input from the public.
- 3. Post all online submissions as soon as practical after submission.
- 4. Publish interim recommendations of the Task Force for public response prior to submission of the Task Force's final report.

Fair Voting BC and Think City Want Local Governments to Have the Choice to Change How They Elect Civic Officials

VANCOUVER – Today, Fair Voting BC and Think City are urging the Premier's task force on local government elections to widen its enquiry and allow local jurisdictions to choose how they elect their councils, as recommended by the City of Vancouver's 2004 electoral reform commission.

"In 2005, Vancouver's council under then Mayor Larry Campbell asked the province to make local elections more fair, accountable and accessible," said Fair Voting BC President Antony Hodgson. "In particular, Mayor Campbell's 2004 electoral reform commission, chaired by former supreme court justice Thomas Berger, recommended the province give the city the freedom to choose whichever voting system best suited its own needs."

"We applaud Premier Campbell for opening a public conversation about campaign finance reform and more accountable election oversight," said Think City Chair Neil Monckton. "However, we are also asking the task force to address outstanding recommendations from Justice Berger's report, particularly that Vancouver be granted the right to choose the voting system it thinks is best suited for civic elections. Furthermore, Think City and Fair Voting BC believe election system choice needs to be extended to all local governments across BC."

"Provincial legislation currently only lets local governments choose between neighbourhood wards and the at-large voting system through majority vote in council, but there are other options for how we

can elect governments," said Monckton. "Local governments need the freedom to explore these options."

"Larry Campbell's government asked the province five years ago to change the city charter to give Vancouver the power to make up its own mind about how to vote without having to constantly petition Victoria," said Hodgson. "Now that Premier Campbell is committed to overhauling the local elections act in time for the 2011 civic elections, it's time to affirm British Columbians' need for self-determination by enshrining in legislation the right of a local jurisdiction to choose their own electoral system."

Fair Voting BC and Think City also called on the task force to increase the transparency of its consultation by holding a number of public meetings, publishing all online submissions immediately after receiving them, and publishing an interim report at the beginning of May to solicit public feedback before submitting its final report.

### CORPORATE POLITICAL SPENDING IN THE UNITED STATES

### ISSUE

The January 21st US Supreme Court decision on Citizens United vs. Federal Elections Commission overturned political spending limitations for corporations who want to produce electioneering material. The 5-4 decision has opened the doors to corporations pouring unlimited dollars into election by recognizing this spending as essential to the freedom of speech of corporate bodies. In the Canadian Supreme Court, however, third party election spending is a settled issue, with outright bans on corporations spending on elections material and contributing to parties.

### BACKGROUND

Title 2, Chapter 14, Subchapter 1, § 441b states "It is unlawful for any national bank, or any corporation organized by authority of any law of Congress, to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with any election to any political office..."

Austin v. Michigan Chamber of Commerce (1990) prohibited corporations from using treasury money to support or oppose candidates in elections. The Supreme Court upheld the restriction on corporate speech based on the notion that "[c]orporate wealth can unfairly influence elections." Austin set the precedent that a ban on corporate spending in political campaigns was <u>not</u> an infringement on the first amendment.

Bi-Partisan Campaign Reform Act / McCain-Feingold (2002) campaign finance law prohibited corporations and unions from using their general treasury funds to make independent expenditures for speech defined as "electioneering material" or for speech expressly advocating the election or defeat of a candidate.

### THE CASE

Citizens United wanted to run a defamatory documentary on then Senator Hilary Clinton on pay per view television. The Federal Elections Commission found that thus constituted third party distribution of electioneering communications and was illegal according to McCain-Feingold. The Supreme Court heard arguments as to whether or not the documentary constituted electioneering material (the issue being the pay per view television does not reach an audience who does not want to watch it).

Supreme Court later opened the case for larger discussion. The Court was confronted with conflicting lines of precedent: "a pre-Austin line forbidding restrictions based on the speaker's corporate identity and a post-Austin line permitting them." The Court ordered a second oral argument in which Citizens United was, in part, to address whether Austin should be overturned.

### THE VERDICT

Austin is overruled and third party spending limits on electioneering material are removed. Third parties may now use general treasury monies to produce and distribute electioneering

communications. However, Portions of McCain-Feingold stand which limit corporate contributions to political parties themselves.

### FULL ARGUMENT OF THE SUPREME COURT

- 1. Austin is overruled, and thus provides no basis for allowing the Government to limit corporate independent expenditures.
  - a. Although the First Amendment provides that "Congress shall make no law . . . abridging the freedom of speech," §441b's prohibition on corporate independent expenditures is an outright ban on speech, backed by criminal sanctions.
  - b. The Court has recognized that the First Amendment applies to corporations and previously extended this protection to the context of political speech.
  - Court is confronted with conflicting lines of precedent: a pre-Austin line forbidding speech restrictions based on the speaker's corporate identity and a post-Austin line permitting them
    - i. Austin's rationale would permit the Government to ban political speech because the speaker is an association with a corporate form.
    - ii. This reasoning also shows the invalidity of the Government's other arguments. It reasons that corporate political speech can be banned to prevent corruption or its appearance.
    - iii. The Government's asserted interest in protecting shareholders from being compelled to fund corporate speech, which had been the purpose of the ruling in the past, would allow the Government to ban political speech even of media corporations.
    - iv. Because §441b is not limited to corporations or associations created in foreign countries or funded predominantly by foreign shareholders, it would be overbroad even if the Court were to recognize a compelling governmental interest in limiting foreign influence over the Nation's political process.

### **JUDGES STATEMENTS**

The following is a summary of the personal statements made by judges on either side of the decision.

### Concurrences:

- First Amendment does not limit free speech to only people. *Austin* was not grounded in the First Amendment.
- The restrictions on spending were seen as meaningless in a media saturated world because "... speakers find ways around campaign finance laws. Rapid changes in technology... counsel against upholding a law that restricts political speech in certain media or by certain speakers. "
- Corporations and unions spending money on electioneering material does not suggest corruption because it does not suggest the influencing of a political figure, as donations to a party would. Also, ruling stated it is not the role of the Court to determine if corporations are good or bad; the Court is to determine and apply the law, not determine who should have a voice in it. First Amendment protections do not depend on the speaker's "financial ability to engage in public discussion."

Hello Ian. I am following up on our phone call from earlier this week.

At the February 5 Elections Task Force meeting a discussion was held concerning a potential presentation by the Task Force at Area Association meetings and what such a presentation would look like.

I agreed to contact and seek input from the 5 Area Association Presidents.

I have now spoken with the 5 Presidents and indicated that the Task Force would be prepared to participate in a session at their respective meetings if they have room on their agenda and if it is their desire to hear from the Task Force.

Here are their responses to date:

AVICC (April 9-11 in Powell River) - They are interested in hearing from the Task Force and have tentatively set aside a 1 hour slot on Wednesday, April 9 from 11:00-noon. This would be part of their pre-conference agenda. I understand that the Minister is also scheduled to address the AVICC about 3:30 on Friday afternoon.

AKBLG (April 14-16 in Castlegar) - I have been in touch with the Area Association President early this week but have not heard back from her since that time. Preliminary indications is that they may wish to have a presentation. I will get back to you once I hear more from AKBLG.

SILGA (April 28-30 at Sun Peaks) - They are interested in hearing from the Task Force, possibly as part of their pre-conference agenda on Wednesday, April 28. You had asked me to send you the relevant sections of the Local Government Act that prevents an individual from lawfully holding office within a municipality. I have copied the sections below for you. Section 156 of the Regulation is also interesting as it indicates that the Lieutenant Govenor in Council may make exceptions to the definition of an employee. I realize that there are many nuances to the political machinery but, in any event, as you and I discussed it would be a great first step in finding out what the genisis of the legislation was. Perhaps then there may be an opporunity for Section 67 to be amended in the general overhaul that is being contemplated for the Local Government Act.

You had also asked me what I thought a solution might be to the problem. My first thought on this was that if an individual was elected to Council of a member municipality of a regional district, it could be written that such a member could not sit as a director or a committee member of the regional district. Instead the affected council could designate an alternative representative to sit as a director or committee member. It was interesting that when the UBCM resolution committee reviewed this particular issue, they had also asked the specific question as to how it would work if an elected official who worked for a regional district could sit as a director. The answer seems fairly simple to me on the surface, i.e., the elected official would not sit on the board or committee but again, designate an alternate. For some reason the UBCM resolutions committee didn't explore designating an alternate. - I am sure that I could be missing something but, I can't see it.

I will leave it with you lain. Thank you so much for taking the time to dig a little further.

# Disqualification of local government employees

- 67 (1) For the purposes of this section, "employee" means
- (a) an employee or salaried officer of a municipality or regional district, or
- (b) a person who is within a class of persons deemed by regulation under section 156 to be employees of a specified municipality or regional district.

but does not include a person who is within a class of persons excepted by regulation under section 156.

- (2) Unless the requirements of this section are met, an employee of a municipality is disqualified from being nominated for, being elected to or holding office
- (a) as a member of the council of the municipality, or
- (b) as a member of the board of the regional district in which the municipality is located.

- (3) Únless the requirements of this section are met, an employee of a regional district is disqualified from being nominated for, being elected to or holding office
- (a) as a member of the board of the regional district, or
- (b) as a member of the council of a municipality, including the City of Vancouver, that is within the regional district.

# Regulations

- 156 (1) In relation to this Part, the Lieutenant Governor in Council may make regulations referred to in section 41 of the *Interpretation Act*, including regulations for any matter for which regulations are contemplated by this Part.
- (2) Without limiting subsection (1), the Lieutenant Governor in Council may make regulations as follows:
- (a) prescribing information that must be included under section 55 in an application for registration as an elector, which may be different for resident electors and non-resident property electors;
- (a.1) prescribing classes of documents that may be accepted as evidence for the purpose of section 57 [how to register as a resident elector at the time of voting] or 57.1 [how to register as a non-resident property elector at the time of voting];

#### Dear Task Force Members,

My name is Ross Hickey. I am an Assistant Professor at UBC Okanagan in Kelowna in Unit 6 (Economics). I have been directed to the Task Force by the head of Unit 6 at UBC Okanagan, Dr. Peter Wylie. He suggested that I make myself and my research known to the committee.

I have been conducting research on local government political economy for a number of years. As part of my dissertation in Economics from Simon Fraser University (2008) I studied business property tax competition among BC's municipalities. Part of the novelty of my approach was the use of council re-election rates as a means of identifying the interdependency of tax setting among neighbouring municipalities. Other work in my dissertation involved analyzing the influence of alternative constitutional rules concerning representation on the decision to form a federation, and how election timing influences intergovernmental transfers in a setting with a hierarchy of governments (i.e. municipal and provincial or provincial and federal). The chapters of my dissertation are available from the SFU library. On October 2, 2009, Premier Gordon Campbell announced a joint Task Force to make recommendations for legislative changes to improve the electoral process for local government elections across B.C. The Task Force has been asked to report out by May 30, 2010.

A six-member Task Force has been established, co-chaired by Bill Bennett, Minister of Community and Rural Development, and Harry Nyce, UBCM President. As I recall the conversation at the last Board meeting, it was not that the Elections Task Force is not a subject worthy of membership debate - it is. Rather the issue was that the LGLA Board wants to maintain a leadership focus and not get caught up in issues of the day. Thank you for your letters of January 8, 2010, addressed to the Honourable Bill Bennett, Minister of Community and Rural Development, in regard to the Local Government Elections Task Force (Task Force) and the District of West Kelowna's rezoning process.

As you may be aware, the Task Force is composed of six members, including two Members of the Legislative Assembly and two Union of British Columbia (UBCM) representatives in addition to Minister Bennett and his co-chair, UBCM President, Mr. Harry Nyce. Additional membership is not being considered. The Task Force will consider a variety of issues, including those relating to campaign financing, over the coming months. If you have additional comments for the Task Force, they can be submitted through the Task Force website at: www.localelectionstaskforce.gov.bc.ca.

With respect to your experience related to a recent rezoning process in the District of s.22

I encourage you to bring your concerns about the public hearing process to the attention of the District and work with them to address those concerns. The Local Government Act gives local governments the authority and responsibility to deal with community planning and zoning, and is designed to give them a high degree of independence and autonomy on these matters. It is their responsibility to ensure that their bylaws and processes conform both to principles of good practice and to all legal requirements.

If after those discussions, you continue to believe that officials of the local government have acted incorrectly you may have recourse through the courts. However I appreciate that court action and legal advice can be costly. If you would like to get another perspective on the issues that you are concerned about you could enquire as to whether the Provincial Ombudsman's Office would be prepared to look into this matter. Site users: task force members from government (Community and Rural Development including Local Government Department, Deputy Minister, the Minister and staff from the Minister's office) as well as Union of B.C. Municipalities, City of Quesnel, City of Surrey and Regional District of Central Okanagan.

Content: As above, letters and submissions made to the task force. The submissions will contain personal information of the individuals making the submissions. The submissions will only be used for the purposes of informing the task force members of the views of persons writing to them. Once the site closes, that information will be dealt with in accordance with applicable FOI rules (i.e. treatment of hard copies of each of the submissions), as there will be no need for the site to continue nor for any submissions to remain available to task Force members

#### Dear Task Force Members,

My name is Ross Hickey. I am an Assistant Professor at UBC Okanagan in Kelowna in Unit 6 (Economics). I have been directed to the Task Force by the head of Unit 6 at UBC Okanagan, Dr. Peter Wylie. He suggested that I make myself and my research known to the committee.

I have been conducting research on local government political economy for a number of years. As part of my dissertation in Economics from Simon Fraser University (2008) I studied business property tax competition among BC's municipalities. Part of the novelty of my approach was the use of council re-election rates as a means of identifying the interdependency of tax setting among neighbouring municipalities. Other work in my dissertation involved analyzing the influence of alternative constitutional rules concerning representation on the decision to form a federation, and how election timing influences intergovernmental transfers in a setting with a hierarchy of governments (i.e. municipal and provincial or provincial and federal). The chapters of my dissertation are available from the SFU library. I have presented the research from my dissertation at international conferences in Canada, Ireland, France, Spain, and South Africa. In addition to the work involved in my dissertation I am currently involved in a project analyzing property taxation in BC by using insights from the literature on optimal taxation.

In relation to the above research I have already created a database linking information on council membership, and local government finances using information provided to me by UBCM and the Ministry of Community and Rural Development.

I would be happy to share the findings of my research with the task force.

Sorry again for the delay in getting back to you.

Since our telephone discussion earlier this week when you indicated that BCSTA would prefer to change their meeting time to the afternoon of March  $31^{st}$ , we have heard back from the other people we are scheduling a meeting with (the office of the leader of the Official Opposition). They are leaning towards asking for 3 p.m. on March  $31^{st}$ , so if BCSTA would be okay with 1:00-2:00, or 1:30-2:30, there would be no conflict there. As I mentioned, the Opposition has a very restrictive schedule due to the House being in session, so we have to try to accommodate that.

However, I want to make the BCSTA aware of the fact that the Minister of Community and Rural Development and potentially the other provincial MLAs will be called for House duty during Question Period. The afternoon sitting of the House begins at 1:30, and it looks like Question Period generally starts at 2 p.m., but can start as early as 1:45 or as late as 2:20. This means that the BCSTA representatives could potentially be talking only to the local government representatives on the Task Force, if the BCSTA chooses an afternoon meeting time.

It is possible that even during the morning, provincial members could be called to the House if there is a vote. But it is highly likely that at a minimum, our minister will be out of the room in the afternoon during Question Period.

If your other meetings you are booking for March 31<sup>st</sup> are flexible, you may wish to choose a morning appearance before the Task Force instead. If BCSTA does still want an afternoon slot, I think I would recommend **1:00 – 2:00 pm**. That way, it is possible to finish before Question Period generally starts. Thank you for your reply. I apologize for not responding sooner (I was enjoying my last days of midterm break). Attached in the file titled "Hickey.pdf" is the second chapter from my dissertation. It is a paper analyzing some municipal tax rates in British Columbia using term of office as a determinant of the changes in the tax rates. Section 4.1 on page 12 of this document discusses the effect of elections on municipal tax competition over the business property tax base. The main insight from this paper would be that the electoral cycle also has an effect on municipal taxation. Of course this is not a new idea, however I document this with BC's data.

Also attached is the third chapter of my dissertation "ross\_hickey\_trans.pdf" which argues that intergovernmental transfers can be affected by the electoral cycle. The main insight from this paper is that elected officials may have incentives to influence each other's electoral prospects if the electoral calendars of their offices are staggered. My name is Ross Hickey. I am an Assistant Professor at UBC Okanagan in Kelowna in Unit 6 (Economics). I have been directed to the Task Force by the head of Unit 6 at UBC Okanagan, Dr. Peter Wylie. He suggested that I make myself and my research known to the committee.

I have been conducting research on local government political economy for a number of years. As part of my dissertation in Economics from Simon Fraser University (2008) I studied business property tax competition among BC's municipalities. Part of the novelty of my approach was the use of council re-election rates as a means of identifying the interdependency of tax setting among neighbouring municipalities. Other work in my dissertation involved analyzing the influence of alternative constitutional rules concerning representation on the decision to form a federation, and how election timing influences intergovernmental transfers in a setting with a hierarchy of governments (i.e. municipal and provincial or provincial and federal). The chapters of my dissertation are available from the SFU library. I have presented the research from my dissertation at international conferences in Canada, Ireland, France, Spain, and South Africa. In addition to the work involved in my dissertation I am currently involved in a project analyzing property taxation in BC by using insights from the literature on optimal taxation.

In relation to the above research I have already created a database linking information on council membership, and local government finances using information provided to me by UBCM and the Ministry of Community and Rural Development.

I would be happy to share the findings of my research with the task force.

Sorry again for the delay in getting back to you.

Since our telephone discussion earlier this week when you indicated that BCSTA would prefer to change their meeting time to the afternoon of March  $31^{st}$ , we have heard back from the other people we are scheduling a meeting with (the office of the leader of the Official Opposition). They are leaning towards asking for 3 p.m. on March  $31^{st}$ , so if BCSTA would be okay with 1:00-2:00, or 1:30-2:30, there would be no conflict there. As I mentioned, the Opposition has a very restrictive schedule due to the House being in session, so we have to try to accommodate that.

However, I want to make the BCSTA aware of the fact that the Minister of Community and Rural Development and potentially the other provincial MLAs will be called for House duty during Question Period. The afternoon sitting of the House begins at 1:30, and it looks like Question Period generally starts at 2 p.m., but can start as early as 1:45 or as late as 2:20. This means that the BCSTA representatives could potentially be talking only to the local government representatives on the Task Force, if the BCSTA chooses an afternoon meeting time.

It is possible that even during the morning, provincial members could be called to the House if there is a vote. But it is highly likely that at a minimum, our minister will be out of the room in the afternoon during Question Period.

If your other meetings you are booking for March 31<sup>st</sup> are flexible, you may wish to choose a morning appearance before the Task Force instead. If BCSTA does still want an afternoon slot, I think I would recommend **1:00 – 2:00 pm**. That way, it is possible to finish before Question Period generally starts. April 1<sup>st</sup> is completely open still, though the same advice applies with regard to provincial members being likely to have to leave for House duty in the afternoon on April 1<sup>st</sup>.

**Purpose of the site**: to share with all members of the Local Government Elections Task Force letters and submissions made to the task force

**Site users:** task force members from government (Community and Rural Development including Local Government Department, Deputy Minister, the Minister and staff from the Minister's office) as well as Union of B.C. Municipalities, City of Quesnel, City of Surrey and Regional District of Central Okanagan.

Content: As above, letters and submissions made to the task force. The submissions will contain personal information of the individuals making the submissions. The submissions will only be used for the purposes of informing the task force members of the views of persons writing to them. Once the site closes, that information will be dealt with in accordance with applicable FOI rules (i.e. treatment of hard copies of each of the submissions), as there will be no need for the site to continue nor for any submissions to remain available to task Force members

Risk: This is a joint Task Force ... i.e. not purely government but shared with Union of BC Municipalities. In other words, the external members (BCeID users) of the task force are stakeholders in the process and site, and have a right to see the documents, letters and submissions made to the task force (i.e. the submissions being sent in are addressed to the Task Force — in other words, to <u>all</u> of the Task Force members, not just the government members). The site will be a "virtual binder", with the same contents that might otherwise be contained in a paper binder of all submissions.
