

Our government recently announced funding in partnership with the City of Prince George and the Government of Canada toward flood protection.

The project will stabilize approximately 165 metres of a 12 metre high-gravel riverbank adjacent to the PW605

collector well. The work will include clearing and grubbing, slope trimming and reguarding, placement of geotextile, placement of approximately 5,000 cubic metres of Class 500 riprap, rock spurs (as required), slope revegetation, road realignment, environmental monitoring and DFO compensation.

This investment will go a long way towards protecting valuable public infrastructure, businesses and our residents, providing our community with stable long-term services.






A Message From Shirley

Trades, tourism and transportation!

Hello everyone,

Yesterday was a moving and powerful day at the Legislature as Premier Christy Clark read a formal apology for the laws, regulations and policies imposed by past provincial governments that discriminated against people of Chinese descent since 1871, when British Columbia joined Confederation. The apology motion follows an extensive three-month consultation process led by the Minister Responsible for Multiculturalism.



Premier Christy Clark formally apologized for the provincial government's historical wrongs to Chinese Canadians.


Today, the roots of multiculturalism run deep in British Columbia. Our diversity is our identity. We need to ensure it continues to flourish and that these past historical wrongs never happen again. It was a historic moment that I will not forget as all members in the house supported this long overdue opportunity to express our profound regret for what

happened in the province and country we love. A copy of the apology is available <u>here</u>.

Moody's Investors Service has affirmed our AAA credit rating, saying that it reflects the strong fiscal flexibility of the province and its track record of prudent fiscal management. Standard and Poor's has also affirmed B.C.'s AAA credit-rating with a stable outlook, saying the ratings reflect the province's strong management and improving budgetary performance. Controlling spending to balance our budget is never easy, but pays off in the long run.

Good news for our high school students this week. Education Minister Peter Fassbender announced new trades course to begin this fall. As part of our government's new B.C.'s Skills for Jobs Blueprint Re-engineering Education and Training, Skills Exploration 10-12 will provide students with additional career options by giving students a headstart to hands-on learning, one of the blueprint's main goals. The semester-long course is a practical way to help students explore a variety of trades to make educated choices about their futures.

A \$3.7-million contract has been awarded to AWA Asphalt Ltd. of Vernon for resurfacing projects scheduled to begin this summer in Prince George. This includes improvements on the Highway16 West corridor from Gauthier Road to the Highway 97 junction, and portions of Tyner Boulevard, Westgate Road and Gauthier Road

intersections. In addition, a four kilometre section of Highway 16 East between Upper Fraser Road and Tabor Ski Area will be resurfaced. As part of this project, a portion of Old Cariboo Highway will also be resurfaced through a partnership with the City of Prince George. Work is expected to begin in early June and be completed by mid-August. All of us will need to be patient on the highways as this much needed work is done.
