## Re: Request for Access to Records Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIPPA)

:

I am writing further to your request received by the Ministry of Advanced Education on October 4, 2011. Your request is for:

- "All records pertaining to which proposed new degree programs from public postsecondary institutions, both inside and outside British Columbia, were rejected by the board and the reasoning behind those rejections. Time frame is 2007 to [October 4, 2011]."

The ministry has indicated that Cape Breton University of Nova Scotia was the only public postsecondary institution which submitted an application to the board during the time frame of your request. The university opted to withdraw its application in 2007 as reported in the Degree Quality Assessment Board's 2007/2008 annual report. We provided you with links to the board's annual reports by email on November 1, 2011.

Please find enclosed a copy of the record located in response to your request. Some information has been withheld pursuant to section 13 (Policy advice or recommendations) of FOIPPA. A copy of this section is included for your reference. A complete copy of FOIPPA is available online at:

### FREEDOM OF INFORMATION AND PROTECTION OF PRIVACY ACT

### Policy advice or recommendations

- **13** (1) The head of a public body may refuse to disclose to an applicant information that would reveal advice or recommendations developed by or for a public body or a minister.
  - (2) The head of a public body must not refuse to disclose under subsection (1)
    - (a) any factual material,
    - (b) a public opinion poll,
    - (c) a statistical survey,
    - (d) an appraisal,
    - (e) an economic forecast,
    - (f) an environmental impact statement or similar information,

(g) a final report or final audit on the performance or efficiency of a public body or on any of its policies or its programs or activities,

(h) a consumer test report or a report of a test carried out on a product to test equipment of the public body,

(i) a feasibility or technical study, including a cost estimate, relating to a policy or project of the public body,

(j) a report on the results of field research undertaken before a policy proposal is formulated,

(k) a report of a task force, committee, council or similar body that has been established to consider any matter and make reports or recommendations to a public body,

(l) a plan or proposal to establish a new program or activity or to change a program or activity, if the plan or proposal has been approved or rejected by the head of the public body,

(m) information that the head of the public body has cited publicly as the basis for making a decision or formulating a policy, or (n) a decision, including reasons, that is made in the exercise of a discretionary power or an adjudicative function and that affects the rights of the applicant.

(3) Subsection (1) does not apply to information in a record that has been in existence for 10 or more years.
