This memo asks for your decision about the disclosure of information in response to the BCLDB FOI request for BCLDB correspondence on the 2011 Great Canadian Beer Festival Society.

Applicant: Media

Requested information:

- a) All correspondence between Gerry Hieter s.22 and the BC Liquor Distribution Branch regarding the 2011 Great Canadian Beer Festival Society.
- b) All internal BC Liquor Distribution Branch correspondence regarding the 2011 Great Canadian Beer Festival Society.
- c) All correspondence between the BC Liquor Distribution Branch and the BC Liquor Control and Licensing Branch ('the BCLCLB') regarding the 2011 Great Canadian Beer Festival Society.

Response due date: May 2, 2012

Fees: none, due to the reduction in the scope of request.

Responsive records:

- o Email correspondence between s.22 Gerry Hieter, and the following BCLDB departments: Purchasing, Finance, Store Operations as well as the Executive Director of Retail Services and the General Manager's office.
- o Internal email correspondence between BCLDB staff members regarding the 2011 Great Canadian Beer Festival.



- o External email correspondence between BCLDB and BCLCLB regarding the 2011 Great Canadian Beer Festival.
- o Email correspondence (minimal) between the BCLCLB, the BCLDB and the US Consulate staff regarding consular privilege at the 2011 Great Canadian Beer Festival.

The following offices were canvassed for records and the following records were found responsive to this request:

1. General Manager's Office and Policy Communications: one email chain, three pages in total
2. Retail Services – Store Operations: Eight email chains, 66 pages in total
3. Retail Services – Purchasing: 14 email chains, 44 pages in total
4. Finance: six email chains, 25 pages in total.

Disclosure of information:

Two FOI exceptions may be applied to some of the information in the attached documents: Third Party Business Interests, section 21 of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA) and Personal Privacy, section 22 of FIPPA. As well, Out of Scope of the Act (OOS) was applied to parts of the records that did not fall within the requested dates.

Section 21 and 22 are both mandatory exceptions. Section 21 must be applied to protect a third party business from financial harm and section 22 must be applied to protect an individual's privacy.

Information about third parties has been removed from these records under section 22 of FIPPA as this information, if disclosed, may be harmful to the personal privacy of these third parties. This includes information which the applicant could use to identify the individuals about which comments are being made.

In addition, the information interspersed in the responsive records that does not fall within the requested dates of the request has been marked as "out of scope" and will be removed from the documents disclosed to the applicant.

Information to be removed from the records before disclosure is outlined in red in the attached documents.

These disclosure recommendations are based on information received from departmental staff, primarily Kelly Wilson, Executive Director of Retail Operations, Bill Michael, Director of Purchasing and Michael Procopio, former Director of Purchasing. I&P Representatives from Finance (Nadine Tomlinson) and Store Operations (Susan Parragh and Susan Martinago) as well as Susan Anderson, assistant to Bill Michael have reviewed their departments' respective documents in detail and provided initial disclosure, recommendations, which were signed off by Mark Fukuhara, Gary Branham, and Bill Michael. Manami Calvo also met with Kelly Wilson separately to review the sensitive records from Purchasing and Finance for this request.

In addition, the BC Liquor Control Licensing Branch (BCLCLB) has also received a similar FOI Request and the Information Access Operations department has asked the BCLDB, on behalf of the BCLCLB, to review records of correspondence between the BCLDB and the BCLCLB that are responsive to this request. The BCLDB has also asked the BCLCLB to review common records of correspondence between the two branches that it has found responsive to its request. The BCLDB and the BCLCLB have made disclosure recommendations regarding each other's records and will be coordinating their responses so that a) no duplicate common correspondence will be sent to the applicant and b) there will be uniformity in the redactions made to their records.



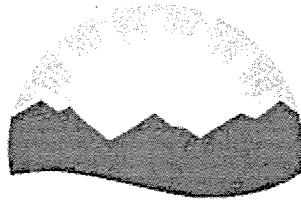

2.3 When a Special Occasion Licence is Not Required

An SOL is **not** required if:

1. The special event is held in a **private place** (if there is any doubt about whether a proposed venue is a private place, the individual or organization holding the event should consult with a BC Liquor Store manager or LCLB) and liquor is **served but not sold**. A private place includes:
 - a residence actually occupied and used by the event host, and
 - a closed office or business premise that is not a licensed establishment, provided that **all** the following conditions are met:
 - the area used for the event is not visible to the public
 - the nature and size of the event is such that it will not draw the attention of the public through excessive noise or other disturbances
 - members of the public cannot enter
 - attendance is by prior invitation only
 - the special event is attended only by the employer and employees and their guests (or board members and staff and their guests, if the office is not a business)
 - no fee is charged for entry or entertainment and no fee is charged for services related to the service of liquor (e.g., fees for mix, ice and glasses), and
 - the event occurs in the office space normally occupied by the business or agency hosting the event.
2. The event is held in a licensed establishment that is closed for regular business for the duration of a special occasion, such as a staff party, provided that the event can meet all of the conditions set out above for events in a closed office or business premise as well, as all of the conditions for the licence (see 3.0.1, 3.0.2, 3.0.3, 3.1 and 3.5).
3. The event is held in a place controlled by an embassy or consulate of a country recognized by the government of Canada.
4. The liquor used for the event was purchased by an embassy or consulate. (If the event is held in a licensed establishment the licensee does not need to apply for a temporary suspension of their liquor licence as long as the consular or diplomatic liquor is being served. The licensee may also serve its own liquor as long as it can identify which liquor has been served and keeps normal records of liquor sales of its own liquor.) [LCLB Operational Bulletin 03-06]
5. The event is held on an ocean-going ship engaged in international trade or a Canadian or foreign warship while in a harbour or in Canadian territorial waters and the liquor used comes from the ship's stores. [Customs Act, Ships' Stores Regulations, online Canada Border Services Agency, www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca/E/pub/cm/d4-2-1/d4-2-1-c.html.]

2.4 Special Occasions with a Charitable Purpose

See also section 8.3.1 for liquor price rules for charitable special occasions.

2.4.1 Special Occasions in Support of Charity

Organizations which are eligible to apply for an SOL may use the sale of liquor at a special occasion to raise funds for a charitable purpose.

The "charitable purpose" refers to the charitable purpose of the recipient of the funds; this may be either the SOL holder or another organization which is engaged in charitable purposes.

To qualify as a charitable purpose, the special occasion must be dedicated to relieving poverty, advancing education or religion, or otherwise benefiting the community – for example, by advancing recreation, sports or culture, or aiding the disabled, youth or senior citizens.

“Advancement of” means to promote the ability of one or more persons to take part in, as participant or spectator, recreational, cultural, sports or athletics activities or benefit the interests of one or more persons who may reasonably be described as disabled, youth, or senior citizen.

[Liquor Control and Licensing Act, s. 1.]

The liquor price schedule (see Appendix 4: Liquor Price Schedule) sets out the maximum prices that all licensees – except those holding an event for a charitable purpose – may charge for liquor. Those holding a charitable event may apply for an exemption to the liquor price schedule in order to make a profit (see Appendix 3: Application for Special Occasion Licence Policy Exemption). In deciding whether to grant the exemption, LCLB will look at who will receive the funds raised and the use to which they will be put, *not* the identity of the applicant.

An **applicant** for an SOL to raise funds for a charitable purpose must be a non-profit organization, such as a service club, community organization or community club, a non-commercial First Nation organization or other non-commercial organization or group. As an exception to the general rule that commercial enterprises do not qualify for an SOL, wineries may apply for an SOL to raise funds for a charitable purpose (see 2.5.3).

The **recipient** of any funds raised by the event must be a charitable, non-profit organization whose primary function is to undertake charitable purposes, and any funds given to such an organization must be used for charitable purposes. However, the recipient organization does not have to be a registered charity.

For example:

- Money raised at a special occasion in support of charity cannot be given to a municipal government for the purposes of building a children’s playground, but can be given to a local service club to build a children’s playground.
- Money raised by a charitable special occasion cannot be given to a school (unless the school is registered as a charity), but equipment or supplies can be purchased by a charitable organization with the money that was raised and the equipment or supplies given to the school.
- It is a charitable purpose to raise funds for the purchase of uniforms or sports equipment or to cover the expenses of participation in sports competitions sponsored by a sports organization or league to which the player belongs if the sports organization and league are both non-profit organizations and the players are not paid. Any durable goods (equipment, uniforms, etc) purchased with the funds must remain the property of the organization.
- It is not a charitable purpose if the funds are used by individuals for their sole personal benefit, for example buying a uniform that becomes the property of the player or paying the travel expenses of an individual to attend a profit-making tournament.

Organizations that are not charitable organizations and that cannot receive funds raised by licensed special occasions for charity include:

- organizations that have as a primary purpose, or that devote a considerable percentage of their time and resources to, the promotion of political objectives or which seek to influence some public issue which is the subject of political dispute, and
- provincial, municipal or local governments and First Nation governments.

(See 8.3 and 8.3.1 for rules about liquor pricing for charitable special occasions and financial reporting requirements.)

2.4.2 Making a Profit

Only special occasions that are intended to raise money for a genuine charitable purpose are permitted to make a profit.

If the purpose of a special event is to raise funds for a charitable purpose, the organizer(s) must apply to LCLB to exceed the liquor price schedule (see Appendix 4: Liquor Price Schedule). If the event is not for a charitable purpose, the maximum price that can be charged for drinks is set by LCLB and is enough to cover only the cost of the liquor and liquor service.

The **total profits from the entire event must be donated** to the charitable cause, not just the profits from the sale of liquor.

Licensees must provide LCLB with a financial statement (see Appendix 5: Financial Statement for Charitable SOL) within 60 days of the event, setting out all expenses for, and revenues from, the event along with tangible evidence that you have donated the profits to the charity. This evidence may be a copy of a receipt, cancelled cheque or letter of thanks from the charity or any other document indicating that the profits have been received by the charity, or a copy of any media coverage (see also 3.3).

2.4.3 Liquor Donations for Charitable Special Occasions

A liquor manufacturer or agent may donate liquor to any organization, agency or group which is holding a charitable special occasion and is licensed by a special occasion licence.

A manufacturer or agent must not donate money or liquor if the SOL licensee is also the holder of any other type of liquor licence.

2.5 Applicant Eligibility

2.5.1 Minimum eligibility requirements

An applicant for an SOL must:

- be 19 years of age or older and **either**:
- be a resident of BC, a Canadian citizen or lawfully admitted to Canada under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* (Canada) for permanent residence, **or**
- for any other person, have approval from the general manager to apply for an SOL (see Appendix 3: Application for Special Occasion Licence Policy Exemption).

The applicant must be the person who will host the special occasion, a member of the organization hosting the special occasion, or the owner or an employee of a business or agency hosting the special occasion.

In the case of a wedding or other private special event, the applicant must be the person who will take responsibility for the liquor service (such as a member of the wedding party).

2.5.2 Persons not eligible

Those **not** eligible to apply for an SOL include:

- professional event organizers (individuals or businesses), as well as individuals, service groups, caterers, etc., who are hired to plan and manage a special occasion or to provide bar service (the event host must be the applicant, see 2.5.1) (See 3.4.1 for an exception to this rule in the case of wine, beer and spirit festivals and tastings.),
- contractors who are doing work under a contract for an organization, but are not members of that organization, and

- temporary, probationary, or honorary members of an organization (if an organization is hosting the event, the applicant must be a regular member of that organization).

A non-profit organization which rents out its premises to others, whether those others are non-profit or for-profit entities, is not eligible for an SOL in its own name to provide liquor service to other organizations. The SOL must be obtained by the organization hosting the event and renting the premises. The non-profit organization renting out its premises may provide its bartender or other of its staff to work for the SOL holder as part of the rental agreement or under a separate arrangement.

2.5.3 Miscellaneous issues

The federal government and provincial and local governments or First Nations and their departments, agencies or divisions are eligible to apply for a SOL. They cannot, however, be the recipient of funds raised by a charitable SOL.

Commercial enterprises and businesses normally do not qualify for an SOL but there are some exceptions to this rule which are set out in this manual.

A commercial enterprise or business which is an SOL licensee must not charge for the liquor which is served at the event. For example, the event cannot have a no-host bar and no charges can be imposed to cover the cost of the liquor. (The only exception to this rule is that wineries may charge for liquor at an SOL event to promote the winery's products to the public (see 3.5.3) or to raise money for a charitable purpose (see 3.3).)

A commercial enterprise which does not have any type of liquor licence may apply for an SOL for an event such as a grand opening, anniversary, or customer appreciation day. Attendance at the event must be by invitation only, there must be no entry fees and the liquor must be given away free of charge. A commercial enterprise or business may allow its premises to be used, either at no charge or with a rental agreement, by a non-commercial organization which is independent of, or at arms length from, the business and that other organization may host a special event which is licensed by an SOL.

A commercial enterprise may apply for an SOL to hold a staff party for the employer, employees and their guests either at the regular place of business or at another location. Attendance at the event must be by invitation only, there must be no entry fees and the liquor must be given away free of charge.

Regular licensees may be eligible for an SOL, but an event cannot be the subject of two different types of licence at the same time (see 3.4.1 for an exception for wineries). In addition, an SOL cannot be used to enhance the scope of the existing licence – for example, a licensee may not use an SOL to extend the hours of sale or the area within a licensed establishment where liquor may be served and consumed (see 3.0 and 3.4).

Employees or members of organizations who apply for and receive an SOL who leave their employment or that organization before the event takes place remain responsible under the terms of the SOL as licensee. To avoid this responsibility, the licensee must notify the BC liquor store from which the SOL was obtained (in writing) that he or she is no longer an employee or member of the organization. The liquor store will cancel the SOL and advise the employer or the organization of the need to reapply for the SOL (this includes paying the licence fee for the new SOL).

A store manager may require **proof that a hosting organization** exists before he or she issues an SOL. An organization may prove it is a *genuine* organization by providing a copy of the certificate of registration under the Society Act; a copy of the constitution of the organization; or a letter certifying the existence of the organization from a person the store manager accepts as a person independent of the organization but knowledgeable of its existence, and who confirms the organization is not a business or commercial enterprise. If the store manager is not satisfied that the organization actually exists, he or she may refer the matter to LCLB for a decision.

Consular liquor privileges mean that under a protocol agreement with the Department of Foreign Affairs, foreign consulates can bring liquor from their country into Canada. Liquor brought into BC by diplomatic privilege is for the use of the consul general for events at the consulate. Consuls general may donate diplomatic or consular product to events at locations outside of the consulate provided there is a charitable fundraising component and the proceeds are donated to a registered Canadian charity. All consular liquor remaining after a consular liquor event must be returned to the consulate.

Both the Liquor Distribution Branch (LDB) and the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch (LCLB) had expressed concerns with respect to whether the Great Canadian Beer Festival was eligible for consular liquor privileges. At issue is the timing of the letter revoking the consular liquor privileges. Because of the lateness with which the revocation letter was issued, it was decided by both the LDB and LCLB that the letter would be rescinded and consular liquor was approved for the festival for this year.

The LCLB and the LDB regret any confusion and inconvenience that may have been caused by the last minute revocation and reinstatement of consular liquor privileges for the Great Canadian Beer Festival.

We are currently reviewing the province's policy on consular liquor privileges at festival events such as the Great Canadian Bee Festival and will be in touch with you, as the festival organizer, following that review.

Thanks for your response and the explanation of the keg recycling program, however your letter does not address my concerns.

The breweries who attend the GCBF bring their own kegs to the festival and once emptied, they take them home again. I believe that you and the other distinguished employees of the BCLDB who have been cc'd here can certainly agree that there is no need to charge any keg deposits under these circumstances.

I am not looking for a simplistic explanation of the keg fee system but rather, an answer to my problem. Special Orders don't have keg deposits and it seems perfectly reasonable on my part to ask that the rest of the orders don't have keg deposits as well. I understand if there is no logistical way for Store 231 to waive these deposits but it isn't reasonable to say they just exist and deal with it. This system costs you and me money and it is time to change it.

I look forward to a reasonable explanation why this can't happen and I will not accept some lame answer. Seems to me you guys can make this happen if you want to.

Your e-mail was passed onto me for a reply. I understand your frustration in the collection of these funds, but they have a purpose to help re-cycle the kegs.

All breweries should be charging a keg deposit as part of our provincial beverage container recycling program. The recycling program requires a seller of beverages to collect a deposit from the purchaser, specifies the amount of the deposit and requires sellers and/or authorized depots to accept containers and pay a refund per container not less than the amount of the deposit collected. The Liquor Distribution Branch encourages all sellers to charge a deposit on the containers, so that the customers have an incentive to return them to be refunded their deposits.

For keg sales, the Liquor Distribution Branch collects these funds and remits them directly to the breweries. The breweries are responsible for the re-cycling of their kegs and tracking the deposits and reimbursements to their customers. The Great Canadian Beer Festival will continue to be part of the recycling program and remit deposits on the purchase of products and return the empty kegs for a refund of their deposit. We encourage you to let your participants know about the recycling program and explain the process so that they understand the implications for you.

We don't have a written policy but a "guideline/summary" with reference to the SOL Manual Policy, which I email to charity upon request. The charity would then distribute the letter to participating agents. We require the agents to place the orders and pay for the wines.

Yes, sometimes these charity events are organized by marketing company or a middle person. As long as they could provide a statement that proves the charity authorizes them to hold a particular event and raise \$ on their behalf, I'd go ahead and process. In Gerry's case, he is not supposed to place the order himself nor pay for the wines. However, he should be the one submitting the request since he's representing two charities.

Our department handles the "30% agent tasting discount" requests and I am confused after reading the below email:

We've always required that the agents DONATE their liquor to the charity event, which I understand is permitted (based on 2.4.3. of the Special Occasion License Policy Manual May 2009 version). Now LCLB is saying that it's only permitted if the SOL holder is a federally registered charity.

Q: We require that the charity must be registered under the Income Tax Act (with a 9 digit charity number ends with RR0001).

Does it mean it's federally registered? How can we tell?

Q: Where was this policy stated under the SOL Policy Manual? I need to make it known to all future requesters.

Q: In the case of Gerry Hieter, he's raising money for two charities (Camosun College Foundation 118826502 RR0001 and C Fax Santas Anonymous 888674249 RR0001). What if the charities issue a letter authorizing him to raise money for them? Then is he allowed to accept donated liquor?

Hi Gerry,

I can't comment on another application/licence because of privacy considerations, but can let you know the following regarding SOL requirements:

-the liquor price schedule sets the maximum that can be charged for liquor. There is no problem charging less than the maximum, or offering drinks at no charge. You can only exceed the maximum if you've been granted a policy exemption for a charitable event where all the proceeds go to a charitable purpose.

-SOL policy discourages, but doesn't prevent, the practice of all inclusive entry fees where the entry price includes some liquor, or unlimited liquor. There needs to be a means of controlling how much liquor people can consume.

-All liquor at a SOL has to be purchased from a government liquor store or other authorized retail store. Donated liquor is only permitted if the SOL holder is a federally registered charity.

-a SOL policy exemption approval is required to serve spirits at a public SOL event.

I hope this answers your questions.

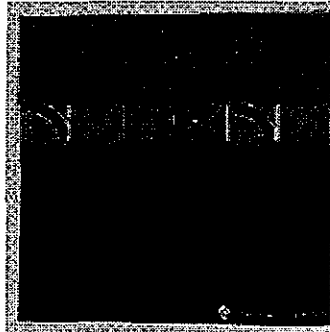

I was also advised that for \$5, I could enter the wine garden and "drink all I wanted to". I was informed by some of the vendors that not all of the beer and wine was paid for and I believe that none of the alcohol was purchased through Store 231.

The event appeared to be very well run and organized and the security was pretty well comprehensive. Did the Branch meet with the organizers beforehand and if so why were they not informed about the regs?



I noticed that there is another SOL next weekend and that they not only have wine and beer but hard liquor as well. Don't they need a special license for that and how do they regulate the number of drinks people receive. I don't see any mention of tokens here either and I'm wondering if perhaps there have been some changes to the act that I should know about. I would love to be able to operate without any rules just as these events do.

I would like an explanation as to how these event can occur. Do they get exemptions for everything and if so why do we have the regs in the first place if all you have to do is apply for an exemption.

In the event that I do not hear back from you I will just keep looking for these rogue events that the Branch obviously doesn't regulate and report them to you. I suspect that there are many of them.

Hello Bill,

I am following up with you in s.22

As Theresa and you have discussed, the LDB policy about donated liquor for charity events is not consistent with the Liquor Control and Licensing Act and policies. Under our Act and policies, manufacturers or agents may only donate liquor that has been purchased from the LDB to an organization holding an SOL if that organization is registered as a charity with the Canada Revenue Agency. This means that manufacturers/agents cannot donate liquor to the Great Canadian Beer Festival organizer, and obtain a discount, because the organizer is not a registered charity.

We have raised this matter with LDB and will be working with them s.22 to make align LDB's policy with what is allowed under the Liquor Control and Licensing Act. In the meantime, you will need to advise Mr. Heiter, if you have not already done so, that the beer festival is not a charitable special occasion event meaning that liquor cannot be donated and the agents/manufacturers are not therefore eligible for a discount.

In the context of approvals for the Great Canadian Beer Festival, a disconnect was identified between LCLB's legislation and policy (which permits donation of liquor only to a charity registered with CRA, and the charity must be the SOL applicant), and LDB's program that apparently provides a discount on a broader basis. We agreed to get the two organizations together to have a common approach, and my understanding is that Kelly you are the lead for LDB and our lead Theresa Killoran will be in touch with you

A further disconnect has emerged in connection with this same festival. Yesterday we received a copy of a letter from LDB to the GCBF authorizing Consular Liquor for the festival. To our knowledge, and based on our policy, this event is not eligible for consular liquor. Our policy, which exempts these events from the requirement to have a licence, allows for consular liquor for the use of the consul general at the consulate for events, and off-site of the consulate under limited circumstances and with the same expectation that this event is held by the consulate, and that the consul general or equivalent officials would be at the event. The GCBF is, from our perspective, not a consular event.

From a cursory look at the consular liquor approvals over the past while, it seems there is a disconnect between our consular liquor policy and some of the privileges that have been approved.

In the short term, can we discuss the GCBF, and in the medium term, we need to resolve the disconnect between our

respective approaches. On consular liquor, could you identify who from LDB would be your lead?

Hopefully we can get the two liquor branches "singing from the same hymn book"! Thanks.

Hi - Regrettably s.22 and not in the loop of the discussions around the GCBF event. In a snapshot:

- Karen Ayers called to inform us of a couple of issues. Firstly the social responsibility issues around the festival had been a serious issue in Victoria last year and secondly, the charitable component of the festival was questionable and that the event did not qualify for discounted product
- the issue caused further discussion and we the LDB realized that we have been approving events and discounts in circumstances where we should not have been
- a meeting has been called to review, Karen Ayers has assigned Teresa Killoran from their office to represent LCLB position

- I met with our Purchasing folks and we clarified to Mr. Heiter that the event did not qualify for discounted product. FYI we had already determined the previous year that we were in a loss position and had informed the event organizer that the discount would be dropping from 30 to 10 or possibly 12 percent. Some communication had been going back and forth over the year, more details available from Bill if you need them.
- Karen contacted me to confirm that the discount was declined and all was in order. Of course I said yes, never thinking for a minute about the possibility of consular privilege. I don't think any of us here thought of the consular piece when reviewing the situation.
- The day the event opened I received a call from Karen asking why a letter of consular approval had been given? I apologized, we had completely missed that piece in the process. I told Karen we would cancel the privilege.

- Going forward however, we must let the consulate know and the event know, that discounted beer is not approved for the GCBF event. This year all Cdn product sold was at full mark-up and all US beer sold was at no mark-up. Not a good situation but one the domestic producers are unlikely to be aware of? Mr. Heiter may have informed them, I am not sure?

- I think the response in this case should be something as follows: *As you are aware, the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch (LCLB) had concerns about this event and had conversations clarifying that beer would be required to be purchased at full mark-up going forward. That includes all beer at the event, not just the domestic portion. In this case consular privilege should not have been given. The LDB has been in error in their approvals in the past. The LDB and LCLB will clarify consular product privileges with the US consulate office.*
- I have not had any dealings with Mr. Heiter to date. In order to have a stepped process for response if necessary, I would suggest that Bill Michael respond with a cc to Mark Fukuhara and Karen Ayers. Those are my thoughts at this point, who was responsible is not Mr. Heiter's business. Any others for comment? Kel
