Re: DriveBC Webcams

Thank you for your letter of June 6, 2008, requesting increased memory on the highway cameras used by my ministry's DriveBC web site. I am also responding on behalf of my colleague, the Honourable Wally Oppal, Attorney General. Please accept my apologies for the lateness of my reply.

I appreciate your suggestion about updating the existing DriveBC webcams to allow for additional memory but such changes would be costly and would offer questionable results. Our webcams are a great resource for travellers wanting to determine up-to-date route conditions. However, they are not suited for security or investigative purposes.

The DriveBC web cameras cannot be easily modified to store extended periods of full-motion video. As such, increasing the communications bandwidth to allow for the transmission of real time images would be very expensive to install and would significantly increase the overall operating costs.

In addition, the existing cameras have very low resolutions and are not designed to effectively capture faces or license plate numbers. They are also placed at irregular intervals, sometimes at a great distance from the next camera, lowering the probability of capturing an incident.


