Re: Request for Access to Records Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIPPA)

I am writing further to your request received by the Ministry of Health. Your request is for:

- The value (cost) of the monofocal soft foldable lens which the Ministry now covers, as described in its official News Release dated June 4, 2012; the most recent documentation which supports that valuation.

In response to your question regarding the cost of monofocal soft lenses, the average cost that health authorities pay for the foldable monofocal lenses is \$200 and there is no charge to patients for this type of lens. Patients may also choose to purchase uninsured specialty lenses and health authorities use the \$200 cost of the foldable monofocal lens as the base value to calculate the patient charges, given that patients pay the incremental difference in cost when choosing a specialty lens.

While the ministry determined that the foldable monofocal lens would become the new provincial standard of care, the ministry does not actually purchase the insured lenses. Health authorities are responsible for purchasing all medical devices and supplies that are used in their facilities, and for intraocular lenses, all purchasing and negotiations with vendors is handled by Health Shared Services BC (HSSBC).
