

## 1. Introduction

The Ministry of Health has a requirement that certain new claims limits should be supported in PharmaNet. These new limits, to be implemented in this release, will provide the ministry with new mechanisms to better manage costs for prescription drugs and high-cost items such as blood glucose test strips (BGTS) and certain prosthetics.

Regulations under the Pharmaceutical Services Act providing for the classification of PharmaCare providers are expected to come into effect in 2014. The new regulations will require development of an enhanced provider enrolment process and will involve the re-enrolment of all existing PharmaCare providers. In support of these new regulations, PharmaNet will be enhanced to support provider classes in a manner that allows for the reporting of claims activity by classification, and the limitation of PharmaNet claims transaction access for certain providers.

Recent incidents have involved the misuse of some intervention and exception codes due to vendor software malfunction and other factors. This has resulted in significant overpayment of claims. These incidents have exposed risks around the use of these codes, as have recent preliminary findings of a Deloitte financial risk and controls audit. Consequently, PharmaNet Release 3 will include new functionality that will allow the ministry to apply new limits on the use of intervention and exception codes as well as other claims limits, as deemed necessary.

For more detail please reference the PharmaNet Release 3 Charter and the related High-Level, Functional and Non-functional Requirements.

#### 2. DOCUMENT PURPOSE

The Business Continuity Assessment and Plan document provides documentation and analysis from a business continuity perspective of the current state and future state of the changes coming from the implementation of PharmaNet Release 3.

Analysis of the impacts will be done based on the current MAXIMUS BC Health Inc Business Continuity Plan/Disaster Recovery Plan, November 14, 2005 (the "MAXIMUS BC BCP") in general and its PharmaNet related component the MAXIMUS BC Health Business Continuity Plan – PharmaNet Help Desk, September 23, 2013 (the "PNet Helpdesk BCP") in particular.

#### 2.1 IN SCOPE

This document will review impacts of any changes resulting from PharmaNet Release 3 and the MAXIMUS BC BCP in general.


#### 2.2 OUT OF SCOPE

This review of the MAXIMUS BC BCP does not address or provide strategies for Resource and Geographic related issues including:

- Restoration of business
- Services managed by Shared Services BC
- Services managed by TELUS or HP
- Building evacuation procedures

Continuation under these circumstances is addressed within the MAXIMUS BC BCP itself.

# 3. CURRENT STATE

The current state of the system is PharmaNet Release 2. Areas that are affected by PharmaNet Release 3, from a business continuity perspective include:

- Claims Limits: A few limits are currently enforced during the claims adjudication process, primarily focused on Maximum Days Supply and Days Supply Remaining and used when calculating Good Faith Days Supply and Travel Supply. All claim limits introduced in PharmaNet Release 3 are considered new.
- Provider Enrolment: Although registered in the PharmaNet database, there is no ability to record or map provider classes and sub-classes as required by the new PharmaCare regulations.
- Clinical Service Claims: This program supports payments to pharmacies for the provision of services such as patient consultations, adaptations of prescriptions and administering vaccinations.

### 4. FUTURE STATE

The future state of the system is PharmaNet Release 3, areas that have changed related to the Business Continuity Assessment Plan include:



#### Provider Enrolment

- Provider Classification: Providers enrolled with PharmaCare are classified by regulation under the Pharmaceutical Services Act. All providers enrolled with PharmaCare will be classified into one or more class or sub-class levels.
- Provider Claims Status: Regardless of class or sub-class, providers will be further classified as either "Full-Access" or "DIS-Only". All PharmaCare claims submitted by a DIS-Only Provider will be adjudicated to zero. (PharmaNet will return an appropriate CPhA response code.)

- Clinical Service Claims: Enhancements to the payment process will ensure three critical financial controls:
  - 1. Exclusion of pharmacies from payment if they are already enrolled in a similar payment program (MMF).
  - 2. PharmaCare will pay a clinical service fee for administration of a publicly funded vaccine only in the case where the patient is a resident of BC.
  - Introduction of daily limits on the amount PharmaCare reimburses a pharmacy for a
    combination of Medication Review services, Adaptations, or administration of
    Vaccines on the same service day for the same patient at the same pharmacy.

#### 5. REQUIREMENTS

For more detail please refer to the PharmaNet Release 3 High-Level, Functional and Non-functional Requirements.

### 6. Business Continuity

The business functions currently supported by the PharmaNet system will be changing due to the deployment of PharmaNet Release 3. However, the MAXIMUS BCP or the PNet Help Desk BCP will not be affected for payment processing and Help Desk relocation.

#### 6.1 SERVICE DISRUPTION

The over arching MAXIMUS BC BCP and, specifically, the PNet Help Desk BCP applies to overall PharmaNet processing system failures, and includes the provisioning of emergency payment to PharmaNet providers and the relocation of the PharmaNet Help Desk. None of the processes or requirements of the MAXIMUS BC BCP or PNet Help Desk BCP will be modified as a result of this initiative.

### 6.2 DATA SYNCHRONIZATION / POST-OUTAGE PROCESSING

The existing data synchronization activities as outlined in the Release 1 BCP will not be changing as a result of this initiative. The Release 1 approved document describes the synchronization activities as follows:

It is the responsibility of the submitting POS, both pharmacy and EMR, to transmit prescriptions, dispenses and claims that were processed by the POS during a disruption following recovery from such disruption.

This responsibility is also documented in the Conformance standards.


### 7. Business Functions

If I recall correctly when eRx was built, the code changes were made only to DIS and not PCIS – therefore a FRCR was not required. Again, the DIS is not a financial system.
