Dear Premier,

According to a report published by Democracy Watch -- a national non-profit that advocates for democratic reform and government accountability -- the BC Liberals won Tuesday's election with the support of just 22 per cent of eligible voters.

The number proves one thing for Tyler Sommers, Democracy Watch coordinator: the system is broken. In his opinion, low voter turnout is the direct effect of a loss of faith in the political system.

He figures that people don't vote because they feel no matter what, the winner will be dishonest. If they're assured the winner will be honest, platforms will matter again, he added.

His suggestions? End negative campaigns, and make it easier for voters to file complaints to the Integrity Commissioner -- although voters should first be informed about what constitutes a violation on behalf of representatives, he added.

Sommers also proposes changing the current democratic system to a model that ensures the number of MLAs each party receives matches the popular vote percentages more closely. He suggests a mixed member system -- in which voters cast two votes, one for the party and one for their constituency representative -- and the Best Loser System. That system is used in Mauritius to ensure minorities have representation in congress, but Sommers says it could be applied to B.C. by reserving additional seats for the runner-ups with the highest percentage of votes. In the past, B.C. has unsuccessfully attempted to switch to the single transferable vote system twice -- once in a 2005 referendum and again in 2009.

Single transferable vote is a system where voters rank candidates in order of preference. The candidates that get the most support are elected and the ones with least support are eliminated so that the second preferences of voters can be taken into account. This system guarantees more parties can receive seats, but it can also make it harder for a single party to obtain a majority. More recently, Votes BC conducted a study with support from the University of British Columbia in which participants were asked to use three different systems to cast their vote for a simulated provincial election.

The three systems in the study were single transferable vote, first-past-the-post (B.C. and Canada's current system), and proportional representation. Results for this study have not been released, but researchers expect the different systems to have an impact on the results of the simulation.

While another attempt to change B.C.'s electoral system isn't on the horizon yet, one new solution Sommers' organization would like to see is a "none of the above" option on ballots. That would encourage voters to participate in the voting process, while still making their distaste for the available options known, he said.

The bitumen that will run through the proposed pipeline further concerns me, extremely sandy this material is and it would actually be eroding the pipeline from within at a great rate with the pressures and grit present. Further research shows that the company Enbridge actually has had leaks at one point or another in all of their pipelines. This seems a very risky chance to take with our pristine eco system. These contaminants, should they leak into our stream our ground water actually emit toxic gasses, and as you know stream water runs through our communities.

It is said the tailing ponds (the size of large lakes) of the tar sands are so toxic from processing extracting this bitumen that gun shots are emitted at regular intervals to scare geese away from landing on the water because they would become poisoned from the substances sitting in the lakes. This is what Alberta has chosen to do with their precious land. I understand in exchange they are receiving some of the lowest oil royalties of any country in the world, this in exchange for vast poison lakes that can leak into waterways, use of huge quantities of their fresh water. In exchange for pipelines running through their beautiful parks, such as Jasper.

I am not a politician, nor am I a scientist. I am a concerned mother. I have 2 sons that I want to grow up and have wonderful lives, hopefully in British Columbia. This would mean that the land was clean and safe. As you said in your speech at the conclusion of yesterdays election "we must leave this province better than we received it", a quote I love. I hope Ms. Clark, that when you say you want to improve the province, that it is not to strengthen the economy at all coststhese oil companies have bought and paid for many people and lands before, and we are not so sophisticated that we can outsmart corporations that have dealt with much stronger powers than us and have left them high and dry. For example a relatively small pipeline rupture in Arkansas, look it up if you get a chance. It was very recent with lots of off-gassing, the officials cleared the area quite quickly and stated it was ready re-habituate. Later the company and officials admitted to there being levels of toxic gas in the area.

Today I looked up the effects of the Gulf of Mexico oil spill. It affected thousands of species of birds, fish, and plants. Some of the species exist only in the areas that were affected. In essence,

human error or incompetence may actually make species extinct with our need to provide oil to needy nations.

At this point in our history we are able to observe the follies of the last 40 years and we can see the wasteland we have created. Canada now rated one of the most dirty countries in the world environmentally now. When I was young we were rated one of the cleanest countries in the world. We, ourselves, with conservation can produce most of our energy cleanly due to hydroelectric. Our natural gas is to be used for overseas and for the extraction of bitumen, this is vast amounts of resource that could provide warmth to millions of homes in our country instead of selling to outside interests.

There are more and more viable forms of renewable energy, and these will become more and more a part of our culture in the next few years. Maybe looking into these innovative and exciting industries would be a better use of our time and energy than building a pipeline that threatens our land, sea, and health. Please Ms. Clark, use your influence to make sure that my sons never have to clean up my generation's mess. Please think about the long term for our environment.

The need for the resources in our BC mountains will become increasing important as time passes. We need to start to think about how we can set the right things in motion to make the most of it, and preserve our province at the same time. Industry will of course only be as careful with the Earth as they are forced to be. It's not that hard to understand the fact that preservation costs money which affects the bottom line.

If we follow the long term vision of our province in a way similar to the late Premier Lougheed we can have the best of both worlds. He understood the need to dampen market forces with the need to create a more sustainable balanced growth for longer term security. This is what I hope you mean when you you say you want to leave BC a better place for our kids!

We have a province that is over 90% mountainous. It has untold riches within it. Consider for example that we had a long term plan that would for a relatively small percentage of our total land base to be mined at any one time. It's a figure that from the province's perspective could be managed and controlled successfully-controlled growth was Premier Lougheed's view of developing the tar sands. Even the Executives of the oil companies in Calgary didn't have the sense to slow the pace! They are now paying a 2 billion dollar per month penalty on their sales of crude oil in Cushing Oklahoma. The pipe line capacity to transport their product to markets was neglected.

It's actually hard to believe that they are paying 2 billion per month in lost revenue because of their lack of foresight. The Northern Gateway pipeline, or a new one to Churchill Manitoba for that matter, are around 6 or 7 billion dollars apiece in the current economy! That they can afford to take 24 billion a year in lost revenue because of the tremendous risk of a 5 or 6 billion dollar pipeline is economics that I can't buy into. Enbridge's brag about spending 500 million extra for the "best technology" is practically insulting!

Finally, I hope that you are able to read this rambling letter and make some sense of it! Watching you on TV on election night gave me the feeling that you are someone who will think a generation ahead.

It makes me feel like I have known the alumni for a long time, even though I probably just met him or her. I wanted to support you because you started your career from the same place that I am about to start mine. My first industry-related job that I obtained was a

government initiated. I was fortunate enough to have the opportunity to see and appreciate what 23 communities in British Columbia had to offer, meet people of various work experience, and gain hands on skills that I would need once I graduate. It was then that I realized that if it weren't for your actions, I would not have gained relevant Communications/Public Relations experience and I would have been struggling to finance my education by earning \$8.75 per hour.

I know I shared many personal anecdotes, but the message I wanted to communicate to you is that young voters are willing to vote. Often we simply do not realize the importance of doing so. It is only when decisions that will have an effect on our lives are made, that we will see the importance in voting. I hope I have provided you with some insight on my demographic and

some of the issues that appeal to us.
