At Approximately 0400 July 6, 2013 an unknown person breached the fences at KRCC with what I believe were bolt cutters. They cut through the barb wire and then through the second fence chain link, crawled through and used a drill to cut through the window into unit B

(uncertain of the cell number at this time). The outside window shattered and the inside window was drilled through the size of a pen. We are unsure what, if anything made it through but the inmate in this cell. [REDACTED] s.22 has been dry celled and moved to segregation. [REDACTED] s.15 the 2 inmates in the next cell over were also moved and dry celled and a frisk of the cells is underway as I write. WSI emergency line has been contacted to repair the fence line as soon as possible and RCMP were contacted this morning. I should have a more detailed report for you by later this afternoon and will forward the INC report number to you as well.

I will be at the center after 1200 today should you require more information.

- it was the unit officer that heard the sound of glass breaking as he patrolled his two assigned units (A&B) during the long-night shift
- in response to the previous breach, we did increase the perimeter foot patrols to 6 during long nights between the hours of 2200 and 0600 (SOP) . The union wanted us to decrease the number of foot patrols but the supervisory group advised to keep the 6 so we did.
- There is no evidence that the incident was [REDACTED] s.15

Pete,

I talked to Evan and Shane and reviewed the options for security improvements at KRCC. We went through the PBA report and felt that [REDACTED] s.13, s.15 would be the best course of action. I then talked to the Consultant from PBA that made the recommendations and his opinion hasn't changed. Of all the centres, KRCC lends itself the best to [REDACTED] s.15, s.13 especially with the current challenges. [REDACTED] s.15 will also show to staff and others that physical changes are being made.

Increasing [REDACTED] s.13, s.15 would also require [REDACTED] s.13, s.15 and both are costly. I would also suggest that when the parking lot upgrade happens early in 2014, there will be [REDACTED] s.13, s.15 additional [REDACTED] s.13, s.15 will only give an [REDACTED] s.13, s.15 [REDACTED] s.15 will require [REDACTED] s.13, s.15 [REDACTED] s.13, s.15

From a budget perspective, we should estimate [REDACTED] s.15, s.17 [REDACTED] s.15 I do believe this to be on the high side. If we can use the same consultant we used for the perimeter

security report which is also the same consultant we used for the [redacted] s.15
[redacted] s.15 we can save a lot of time and money. We would get to tender ready stage and then use BC BID or select tender
for the actual installation. Same for [redacted] s.15 We could also defer [redacted] s.15 for now
and do that in combination with [redacted] s.13 We can ask for separate pricing on that part of the
project and make a decision based on the cost submitted.

If we agree that this is the correct approach then the next step would be for me to raise an unplanned MOE project
with WSI (SSBC has no role in MOE projects) and get this kicked off. We would have FLIR (previously PBA) submit a
fee proposal to WSI and provided we are happy with it, sign off on a RFS.

At Approximately 0400 July 6, 2013 I was contacted by A/CS Malo to say that an unknown person breached the fences at KRCC with bolt cutters. They cut through the chain link fence, crawled through and used a drill to cut through the window into unit B cell 3. The outside window shattered and the inside window was drilled through the size of a pen. We are unsure what, if anything made it through but the inmate in this cell. s.22 has been dry celled and moved to segregation. s.15 the 2 inmates in the next cell over s.22 were also moved to another unit, both were dry celled and a frisk of the cells took place with nothing found. WSI emergency line has been contacted to repair the fence line and they still have been unable to contact someone to attend KRCC and repair the fence. The WSI reference number is BCB1131789. We have a staff member sitting outside the fence as it is wide open and have manned the fence for the evening.

The RCMP were contacted @ 0830 and attended. The police file number for this incident is s.16 Constable Kent Novakowski and Constable Michelle Kerpan state they have an investigation team on it. I spoke with Constable Kerpan later in the afternoon and she advises s.15


