Dear Professor Toope:

I am pleased to confirm that the Ministry of Advanced Education (the Ministry) will fund an expansion of the University of British Columbia (UBC)

and implementation of an

s.17

More specifically, the Ministry will provide funding to support:

- An additional s.17 per space through the implementation of the s.17 beginning in 2014/15.
- A maximum of s.17 in start-up and planning funding for the s.17
- An additional s.17
 beginning with s.17 and s.17 These spaces will be annualized over three years to a total s.17
- A maximum of s.17 in start-up and planning funding for s.17

Ministry expectations for this funding include:

- Annual reporting of s.17 including number and description of increases achieved in northern and rural clinical placements.
- Annual evaluation reporting of program outcomes for the s.17
- Annual reporting of employment outcomes by region, once the first students have graduated.

Please note that these allocations will be provided on a year-to-year basis as per the attached schedule and are subject to annual approval of the Legislature. If the funding provided cannot be used for the intended purpose, the Ministry requires that your institution contact the health program area to develop a reallocation strategy. If a reallocation strategy cannot be reached, the funds may be withdrawn by the Ministry to reallocate to other health priorities.



On behalf of the University of British Columbia, I would like to thank you and your Ministries for continuing to support cutting edge research and innovation through the BC Knowledge Development Fund.

BCKDF ensures our province receives its fair share of federal funding by matching Canada Foundation for Innovation commitments—federal research support that would otherwise go unrealized. This critical funding model elevates British Columbian researchers and boosts their chances of making ground-breaking discoveries. With continued support from your government, we can ensure such discoveries continue to occur in our province. Moreover, supporting BC-based research attracts international academic talent and helps establish the province as a global center of innovation and discovery.

BCKDF-funded projects bring more than international prestige to BC; they lead to significant socioeconomic benefits for British Columbians. This year, for example, BCKDF funded Dr. Leonard Foster, a microbiologist who leads a team of scientists developing vaccines for infectious diseases like Tuberculosis and new approaches to treating antibiotic-resistant bacteria and inflammation. Infectious diseases alone cost the Canadian health care system billions of dollars and are a significant drain on economic productivity—burdens that could be reduced with more effective vaccines and treatments. Arts scholarships open for B.C. students

VICTORIA – Are you a B.C. resident attending a full-time fine arts degree or diploma program this fall? The BC Arts Council Scholarship program is ready to receive applications now from young British Columbians seeking world-class opportunities to study the arts, Community, Sport and Cultural Development Minister Coralee Oakes announced today.

The BC Arts Council (BCAC) provides scholarship funding of up to \$6,000 per individual per year to outstanding British Columbia art students. B.C. residents accepted for full-time studies and pursuing a fine arts diploma or degree at a recognized college, university, institution or academy in any country in the world can apply. The application deadline is April 30, 2014.

The B.C. government is providing \$750,000 again this year for the BCAC scholarship program. Last year, 144 young British Columbians shared this scholarship funding. Applications represented creative writing, music, theatre, dance, visual arts, media arts, museology and conservation. Jury panels representing B.C.'s arts and culture community evaluate applications and award scholarships.

Scholarship recipients experience top-calibre learning environments for the arts, including The Julliard School in New York City, Yale University, Oberlin College and Conservatory, Hochschule for Musik in Munich, Germany, the Royal Winnipeg Ballet School and Emily Carr University of Art + Design in Vancouver. Last year's successful applicants represented communities across British Columbia, including Vancouver, Victoria, Nanaimo, Sechelt, Kelowna, Armstrong, Revelstoke, Kamloops and Prince George.

Scholarship recipients from previous years have achieved success and acclaim in the arts, including:
