Hi Dave,

I just spoke to Kathleen Ward and explained the deadlines regarding tabling the annual report and the work that would need to be done before the end of November in order for the Minister to table the report with the Legislative Assembly.

Our material is complete – with minor edits, we can forward to her tomorrow. However, the statistics that IAO has put together are simply print outs from CRTS – they do not contain any accompanying text that explains the statistics (although she thinks someone could pull that type of information from the Commissioner's timeliness report). And by someone, she means someone from my office.

Kathleen is of the view that compiling information for the Annual report, briefing and preparing the Minister for the Cabinet Committee review, and tabling the report with the Legislative Assembly is something that falls under "governance" and therefore my area. She is willing to help by sending us her material but she does not have resources to take this on now. I explained that we were in the same boat and that we were of the opinion that because an annual report on the administration of the Act (particularly one that was going to be entirely statistical) had more to do with access than privacy, we believed that IAO should take the lead.

At this point, I think we need direction on whose responsibility it is. Both of us are willing to help the other by sending them our material but neither of us thinks we have primary responsibility.

Knowledge and Information Services: Privacy Statistics for Fiscal Year 2011/12

As government's corporate privacy and legislation office, Knowledge and Information Services (KIS) in the Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) is responsible for managing and administering the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy* Act (FOIPP Act). KIS is also responsible for providing privacy and access policy advice to public bodies. Staff also review Privacy Impact Assessments (PIAs) on all government enactments, systems, projects, programs and activities to identify and make recommendations on privacy or access implications under the Act.

This section of the report describes the amendments to the FOIPP Act that were made in 2011 and the administration of the Act through two services: the Privacy Helpline and the Privacy Impact Assessment process. This section also offers a high-level description of the Annual Privacy and Security Conference, an event that KIS staff coordinate in collaboration with public and private sector partners.

Act Amendments

The 2011 amendments are the most significant made to the Act since its introduction in 1992. They continue government's practice of enhancing the FOIPP Act to ensure it remains the strongest legislation of its kind in Canada.

Bill 3 represents a balanced set of amendments that enable the use of new technologies and the delivery of citizen-centric, integrated and online services, while ensuring the strongest privacy protection and oversight in Canada. The amendments also increase government accountability and transparency by establishing categories of information that must be released without a request for records under the Act.

Specifically, the amendments:

- Facilitate necessary information sharing for the purpose of delivering common or integrated programs or activities;
- Enable greater communication and engagement with citizens through the use of social media tools and electronic communications;
- Support open government by setting legislative requirements for open information and open data;
- Establish personal identity information as a special category of information, subject to specific information sharing authorities and governance;

Its main purpose, with regard to the FOIPP Act, is to aid in the interpretation of the Act so that public bodies understand their responsibilities with respect to the collection, use and disclosure of personal information. It is also a resource for citizens seeking to understand their privacy and access-to-information rights.




Figure 1: Percentage of Helpline Requests Related to FOIPPA FY2011/12

During the 2011/12 fiscal year, the Privacy Helpline received nearly 1,250 calls and emails. Nearly three-quarters (73.9%) were related to the interpretations of the FOIPP Act, Privacy Impact Assessments, or other matters related to the Act. The remaining 26.1% of inquiries were related to such topics as the *Personal Protection Act, Electronic Transactions Act*, and the Open Data initiative. See Figure 1.

Ninety-three percent (93.0%) of inquiries related to the FOIPP Act were made on behalf of a public body; this category includes core government (i.e. ministries and offices of the provincial

government) and broader public sector organizations (e.g. crown corporations; municipalities and regional districts; public education establishments; public healthcare institutions). Privacy Impact Assessments

Privacy Impact Assessments (PIAs) are used to identify the potential privacy risks and requirements of new or redesigned government policy, programs, services and legislation. In accordance with section 69(5.1) of the FOIPP Act, ministries must complete a PIA for all new enactments, systems, projects, programs and activities.

A privacy impact assessment (PIA) is a tool designed to ensure compliance with the privacy protection responsibilities in the Act. The process supports ministries in careful consideration of how personal information required for the implementation and delivery of the new venture will be collected, stored, used, disclosed and ultimately destroyed. The PIA process helps to ensure that ministries meet their privacy protection obligations and facilitates the creation of a privacy-enhancing culture.

In total, KIS processed more than 260 PIAs in the 2011/12 fiscal year. For data tracking purposes, Knowledge and Information Services distinguishes between the PIAs required for new systems, projects, programs and activities and those performed on new and revised enactments as a mandatory component of the Request for Legislation process. The former are referred to as General PIAs and the latter as RFL-PIAs.

General PIAs

Ministries access the standard General PIA form via the Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) website. KIS Privacy Advisors provide support and guidance to program staff through the PIA process to ensure that they complete the assessment appropriately and have addressed all privacy implications satisfactorily.




Figure 2: General PIAs per quarter FY2011/12

During the 2011/12 fiscal year, KIS Privacy Advisors reviewed 177 General PIAs. Figure 2 shows the number of General PIAs processed per quarter.




Figure 3: General PIAs by Pod FY2011/12

RFL-PIAs

To ensure that the requirements of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIPP Act) are met, all Requests for Legislation (RFLs) must be discussed with Knowledge and Information Services (KIS) to determine if a privacy and access review is necessary. If such a review is required, ministries send a copy of the RFL along with a Privacy Impact Assessment (PIA) to KIS. KIS advises Cabinet Operations of the results of its review and any consultations with the Information and Privacy Commissioner.




Figure 4: RFL PIAs per quarter FY2011/12




Figure 5: RFL PIAs by Pod FY2011/12

KIS processed 85 RFL-PIAs in the 2011/12 fiscal year. Figure 4 shows the number of RFL-PIAs processed per quarter. Figure 5 presents a breakdown by "pods".

Knowledge and Information Services: Privacy Statistics for Fiscal Year 2011/12

As government's corporate privacy and legislation office, Knowledge and Information Services, (KIS) in the Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO), is responsible for managing legislative changes to and administering the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIPP Act). KIS is also responsible for providing privacy and access policy advice to public bodies. KIS staff also review Privacy Impact Assessments (PIAs) on all government enactments, systems, projects, programs and activities to identify and make recommendations on privacy or access implications under the Act. KIS also provides advice to public bodies on the access and privacy impacts of proposed legislation and regulations and, in appropriate cases, facilitates consultations with the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner on these items.

This section of the report describes the amendments to the FOIPP Act that were made in 2011 and the administration of the Act through two services: the Privacy Helpline and the Privacy Impact Assessment process. This section also offers a high-level description of the Annual Privacy and Security Conference, an event that KIS staff co-ordinate in collaboration with public and private sector partners.




Figure 1: Percentage of Helpline Requests Related to FOIPPA FY2011/12




Figure 2: General PIAs per quarter FY2011/12




Figure 3: General PIAs by Pod FY2011/12




Figure 4: RFL PIAs per quarter FY2011/12




Figure 5: RFL PIAs by Pod FY2011/12




Figure 1: Percentage of Helpline Requests Related to FOIPPA FY2011/12




Figure 2: General PIAs per quarter FY2011/12




Figure 3: General PIAs by Pod FY2011/12




Figure 4: RFL PLAs per quarter FY2011/12




Figure 5: RFL PIAs by Pod FY2011/12

Knowledge and Information Services: Privacy Statistics for Fiscal Year 2010/11

The Office of the Chief Information Officer's corporate privacy and legislation office, Knowledge and Information Services (KIS), is responsible for maintaining the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy* Act (FOIPP Act). KIS is also responsible for all policy advice that flows from the Act and for reviewing all new government initiatives, systems, projects, programs and legislative changes for privacy implications related to the FOIPP Act.

The data in this section of the report pertains to FOIPP Act support KIS provides through two specific services: the Privacy Helpline and the Privacy Impact Assessment process. This section also offers a high-level description of the Annual Privacy and Security Conference, an event that KIS staff coordinate in collaboration with public and private sector partners.

Privacy Helpline

The Privacy Helpline was established in 2002 to assist the citizens and organizations of British Columbia with their questions about the FOIPP Act and PIPA. Its main purpose, with regard to the FOIPP Act, is to aid in the interpretation of the Act so that public bodies understand their responsibilities with respect to the collection, use and disclosure of personal information. It is also a resource for citizens seeking to understand their privacy and access-to-information rights.

During the 20110/142 fiscal year, the Privacy Helpline received over 1,000959 calls. Fifty-six percent were related to the interpretations of the FOIPP Act, Privacy Impact Assessments, or other matters related to the Act.

Eighty-nine percent of inquiries were made on behalf of a public body; this category includes core government (i.e. ministries and offices of the provincial government) and broader public sector organizations (e.g. crown corporations; municipalities and regional districts; public education establishments; public healthcare institutions).

Privacy Impact Assessments


Privacy Impact Assessments (PIAs) are used to identify the potential privacy risks and requirements of new or redesigned government policy, programs, services and legislation. In accordance with section 69(5) of the FOIPP Act, ministries must complete a PIA for all new initiatives. The process enables ministries to examine carefully how personal information required for the implementation and delivery of the program or service will be collected, stored, used, disclosed and ultimately destroyed. The PIA helps to ensure that government is meeting its privacy protection obligations and facilitates the creation of a privacy aware culture.

Ministries can access the standard PIA form via the Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) website. KIS Privacy Advisors provide support and guidance to program staff through the PIA process to ensure that they complete the assessment appropriately and have addressed all privacy implications satisfactorily.

For data tracking purposes, Knowledge and Information Services distinguishes between the PIAs required for new programs and services and those that are a mandatory component of the Request for Legislation process. The former are referred to as General PIAs and the latter as RFL-PIAs.

General PIAs

During the 2010/11 fiscal year, KIS Privacy Advisors were involved in the processing of 141 General PIAs. The graph below shows that there was a steady rise in the number of PIAs throughout the year.





The Province of British Columbia hosts the *Annual Privacy and Security Conference*, in collaboration with its partners and sponsors. The Conference Committee includes representatives from KIS and the Information and Security Branch of the OCIO. The Committee works with a private contractor to develop the conference agenda and to bring in speakers.

The conference is renowned for its outstanding content dealing with emerging issues and cuttingedge subjects; its world class keynote speakers; and its excellent peer to peer networking opportunities with industry and government leaders. Plenary session topics have included these: social media; cloud computing; mobile security; electronic health records; identity management; smart card technologies; lawful access; and data stewardship.

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This section of the report describes the amendments to the FOIPP Act that were made in 2011 and two of KIS's services related to the administration of the Act: the Privacy Helpline and the Privacy Impact Assessment process. FOIPP Act Amendments

The 2011 amendments in Bill 3-2011 are the most significant made to the FOIPP Act since its introduction in 1992. They continue government's practice of enhancing the FOIPP Act to ensure it remains the strongest legislation of its kind in Canada.

Bill 3 represents a balanced set of amendments that enable the use of new technologies and the delivery of citizen-centric, integrated and online services, while ensuring the strongest privacy protection and oversight in Canada. The amendments also increase government accountability and transparency by establishing categories of information that must be released without a request for records under the Act.

Specifically, the amendments:

- Facilitate necessary information sharing for the purpose of delivering common or integrated programs or activities;
- Enable greater communication and engagement with citizens through the use of social media tools and electronic communications;
- Support open government by setting legislative requirements for open information and open data;
- Establish personal identity information as a special category of information, subject to specific information sharing authorities and governance;
- Strengthen and extend requirements for conducting privacy impact assessments;
- · Add new requirements to govern data-linking; and
- Provide significant new oversight powers for the Information and Privacy Commissioner.

The amendments also address a number of recommendations made by the 2004 and 2010 Special Committees that reviewed the FOIPP Act, including the ability for citizens to consent to the collection of their personal information with consent for the purpose of receiving "one-stop" or customized services from government. The establishment of personal identity information as a special category of personal information will enable a provincial identity services provider to establish a trusted and secure method of identifying citizens so that they can interact with government online with the same level of security that they expect with in-person services.

The amendments were prepared in consultation with a broad group of internal and external stakeholders. The amendments also incorporated feedback from the Special Committee reviews, the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner, the Union of British Columbia Municipalities and the broader public sector, as well as other key stakeholders such as the Canadian Bar Association's BC FOI and Privacy Subsection. BC Statistics led focus groups and conducted surveys with citizens around the province to gather information on citizens' preferences and opinions about provincial service delivery.

The amendments to the FOIPP Act also necessitated changes to the FOIPP regulation. These are under development, in consultation with stakeholders.

Privacy Helpline

The Privacy Helpline was established in 2002 to assist citizens, public bodies and organizations in British Columbia with their questions about the FOIPP Act and the *Personal Protection Act* (PIPA). Privacy Advisors offer interpretations of the <u>FOIPP</u> Act and assist public bodies in understanding their privacy and access obligations. Advisors also act as a resource for citizens seeking to understand their privacy and access-to-information rights.




Figure 1: Percentage of Helpline Requests Related to the FOIPP_Act

During the 2011/12 fiscal year, the Privacy Helpline received nearly 1,250 calls and emails. Nearly three-quarters (74%) concerned interpretations of the FOIPP Act, Privacy Impact Assessments or other matters related to the Act. The remaining 26% of inquiries were related to such topics as PIPA, the *Electronic Transactions Act* and the Open Data initiative. See Figure 1.

Ninety-three percent (93.0%) of inquiries related to the FOIPP Act were made on behalf of a public body. Public bodies include core government (i.e., ministries and offices of the provincial government) and broader public sector organizations (e.g., crown corporations; municipalities and regional districts; public education establishments; public healthcare institutions). The remaining 7% of inquiries came primarily from not-for-profit organizations, individuals and government bodies from other jurisdictions.

Privacy Impact Assessments

Privacy Impact Assessments (PIAs) are performed on new or redesigned government policy, programs, services and legislation to identify the potential privacy risks and ensure compliance with the privacy protection responsibilities in the Act of. In accordance with section 69(5.1) of the FOIPP Act, ministries must complete a PIA for all new enactments, systems, projects, programs and activities. Ministries must submit completed PIAs to KIS for review and comment.

The PIA process assists ministries in a careful consideration of how personal information required for the implementation and delivery of the new venture will be collected, stored, used, disclosed and ultimately destroyed. The PIA process helps to ensure that ministries meet their privacy protection obligations and facilitates the creation of a privacy-enhancing culture.

In total, KIS processed more than 260 PIAs in the 2011/12 fiscal year. For data tracking purposes, KIS distinguishes between the PIAs required for new systems, projects, programs and activities ("General PIAs") and those performed on new and revised enactments as a mandatory component of the Request for Legislation process ("RFL-PIAs").

General PIAs




Figure 2: General PIAs per quarter FY2011/12

During the 2011/12 fiscal year, KIS Privacy Advisors reviewed 177 General PIAs. Figure 2 shows the number of General PIAs processed per quarter. One contributing factor in the increase in the numbers of PIAs processed in the fourth quarter may be that an amendment was made to the legislation codifying the practice of providing PIAs to KIS for review and comment.




Figure 3: General PIAs by Pod EV2011/12

RFL-PIAs

All Requests for Legislation (RFLs), along with a Privacy Impact Assessment (PIA) on the proposed legislation, come to KIS for a privacy and access review. KIS advises Cabinet Operations of the results of its review and of any consultations with the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner.




Figure 4: RFL PIAs per quarter FY2011/12




Figure 5: RFL PIAs by Pod FY2011/12

KIS processed 85 RFL-PIAs in the 2011/12 fiscal year. Figure 4 shows the number of RFL-PIAs processed per quarter. Because the legislature sits in the fall and again in the spring, there are higher numbers of legislative PIAs processed at these times. Figure 5 presents a breakdown by pod.

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Scope of this Act

- 3 (1) This Act applies to all records in the custody or under the control of a public body, including court administration records, but does not apply to the following:
 - (j) a record that is available for purchase by the public;


Information that will be published or released within 60 days

- 20 (1) The head of a public body may refuse to disclose to an applicant information
 - (a) that is available for purchase by the public, or



- Clarifies that records available for purchase by the public are not covered by the Act and are, therefore, not subject to formal access to information requests and fee waivers under the Act.
- Should reduce the costs of processing and responding to formal access to information requests.






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Scope of this Act

- 3 (1) This Act applies to all records in the custody or under the control of a public body, including court administration records, but does not apply to the following:
 - (k) a record of a service provider that is not related to the provision of services for a public body;



- Resolves the confusion that currently exists about what records of a service provider are covered by the Act.
- Will provide assurance to public bodies and to service providers that the records of a service provider that do not relate to its services for a public body are not covered by the Act.


Information that will be published or released within 60 days

- 20 (1) The head of a public body may refuse to disclose to an applicant information
 - (c) that must be published or released to the public under an enactment.

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
 Will reduce the costs and administration associated with processing access to information requests by permitting public bodies to refuse to disclose information that will be published or released to the public according to a statutory schedule.





Information that will be published or released within 60 days


20 (3) If the information referred to in subsection (1) (b) is not published or released to the public within 60 days after the applicant's request is received, the head of the public body must disclose the information to the applicant on, or within 30 days of, that date unless the head of the public body is authorized, or required, to refuse to disclose the information under other sections of this Division.



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 Where information that was initially refused because it was to be published or released within 60 days is not published or released within that time, this amendment sets a firm additional 30 days for the public body to consider exemptions and release the records.






Disclosure harmful to personal privacy


22 (2) (i) the information is about a deceased person and, if so, whether the length of time the person has been deceased indicates the disclosure is not an unreasonable invasion of the deceased person's personal privacy.



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- Clarifies that, while deceased persons still have privacy rights, those rights generally diminish over time.
- A public body should consider the length of time a person has been deceased when determining whether disclosure of information about the person would be an unreasonable invasion of privacy.





Disclosure harmful to personal privacy

- 22 (3) A disclosure of personal information is presumed to be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy if
 - (h) the disclosure could reasonably be expected to reveal the content of a personal recommendation or evaluation, a character reference or a personnel evaluation supplied by the third party in confidence and the applicant could reasonably be expected to know the identity of the third party,



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People Collaboration Innovation

- Provides greater protection for recommendations, evaluations and references provided in confidence to a public body by clarifying that in some cases it is not enough to simply remove the identity of the referee.
- Where the applicant could reasonably be expected to know who the referee is, the content of the recommendation, evaluation or reference should be withheld.





- 22 (1) The head of a public body must refuse to disclose personal information to an applicant if the disclosure would be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy.
 - (5) On refusing, under this section, to disclose personal information supplied in confidence about an applicant, the head of the public body must give the applicant a summary of the information unless
 - (a) the summary cannot be prepared without disclosing the identity of a third party who supplied the personal information, or
 - (b) with respect to subsection (3) (h), either paragraph (a) of this subsection applies or the applicant could reasonably be expected to know the identity of the third party who supplied the personal recommendation or evaluation, character reference or personnel evaluation.



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
- Provides greater clarity on when it is reasonable to prepare a summary of personal information about an applicant that has been withheld on the grounds that it was supplied in confidence by a third party.
- Clarifies that, where the applicant can reasonably be expected to know the identity of the third party, a summary of the information should not be prepared.





Disclosure harmful to personal privacy

- 22 (4) A disclosure of personal information is not an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy if
 - (i) the disclosure, in respect of
 - (i) a licence, a permit or any other similar discretionary benefit, or
 - (ii) a degree, a diploma or a certificate,reveals any of the following with respect to the applicable item in subparagraph(i) or (ii):
 - (iii) the name of the third party to whom the item applies;
 - (iv) what the item grants or confers on the third party or authorizes the third party to do;
 - (v) the status of the item;
 - (vi) the date the item was conferred or granted;
 - (vii) the period of time the item is valid;
 - (viii) the date the item expires, or



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- Will resolve any confusion around what a detail of a licence or permit or other discretionary benefit is and ensure that this type of information is not withheld on the grounds that it would unreasonably invade a third party's personal privacy.
- Clarifies that disclosure of the details of a degree, diploma or certificate is similarly not considered to be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy.





Disclosure harmful to personal privacy


- 22 (4) A disclosure of personal information is not an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy if
 - (j) the disclosure, in respect of a discretionary benefit of a financial nature granted to a third party by a public body, not including personal information referred to in subsection (3) (c), reveals any of the following with respect to the benefit:
 - (i) the name of the third party to whom the benefit applies;
 - (ii) what the benefit grants to the third party;
 - (iii) the date the benefit was granted;
 - (iv) the period of time the benefit is valid;
 - (iv) the date the benefit ceases.



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- Resolves any confusion around what a detail of a discretionary financial benefit is.
- Ensures that this type of information is not withheld on the grounds that it would unreasonably invade a third party's personal privacy.



How access will be given

- 9 (1) If an applicant is told under section 8 (1) that access will be given, the head of the public body concerned must comply with subsection (2), (2.1) or (3) of this section.
- (2) If the applicant has asked for a copy under section 5 (2) and the record can reasonably be reproduced, a copy of the record or part of the record must be provided with the response.
- (2.1) If the applicant has asked for a copy under section 5 (2) in electronic form and it is reasonable to provide the record in that form, a copy of the record or part of the record must be provided in that form with the response.
- (3) If the applicant has asked to examine the record under section 5 (2) or if the record cannot be provided in accordance with subsection (2) or (2.1) of this section, as applicable, the applicant must
 - (a) be permitted to examine the record or if the record or part of the record can reasonably be examined, or
 - (b) be given access in accordance with the regulations.

- Updates the Act in recognition of citizens' growing preference to receive records in electronic form and over the Internet.
- Also ensures that, where it is unreasonable for a record to be examined (such as where the document is very fragile or cannot be separated from other protected information), the public body can refuse to permit the examination.





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Extending the time limit for responding

- 10 (1) The head of a public body may extend the time for responding to a request for up to 30 days if one or more of the following apply:
 - (d) the applicant has consented, in the prescribed manner, to the extension.



 Permits public bodies to extend the time period for responding to an access request up to 30 days where the applicant consents



- More time with permission from the Commissioner
- No right to complain to OIPC


Records available without request

- 71 (1) Subject to subsection (1.1), the head of a public body must establish categories of records that are in the custody or under the control of the public body and are available to the public without a request for access under this Act.
- (1.1) The head of a public body must not establish a category of records that contain personal information unless the information
 - (a) may be disclosed under section 33.1 or 33.2, or
 - (b) would not constitute, if disclosed, an unreasonable invasion of the personal privacy of the individual the information is about.
- (1.2) Section 22 (2) to (4) applies to the determination of unreasonable invasion of personal privacy under subsection (1.1) (b) of this section.



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- Supports Open Information and Open Data policy and initiatives by requiring public bodies to establish categories of records that are routinely available to the public without a request for access under the Act.
- Requires invasion of privacy test for personal information





Records that ministries must disclose


- 71.1 (1) Subject to subsection (2), the minister responsible for this Act may establish categories of records that are in the custody or under the control of one or more ministries and are available to the public without a request for access under this Act.
- (2) The minister responsible for this Act must not establish a category of records that contain personal information unless the information
 - (a) may be disclosed under section 33.1 or 33.2, or
 - (b) would not constitute, if disclosed, an unreasonable invasion of the personal privacy of the individual the information is about.
- (3) Section 22 (2) to (4) applies to the determination of unreasonable invasion of personal privacy under subsection (2) (b) of this section.
- (4) The minister responsible for this Act may require one or more ministries to disclose a record that is within a category of records established under subsection (1) of this section or under 71 (1).
- (5) If required to disclose a record under subsection (4), a ministry must do so in accordance with any directions issued relating to the disclosure by the minister responsible for this Act.



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





FOI Highlights from Quarter 1 2012/13

- Government continues to receive higher volumes of FOI requests year over year. From 2008/09 to 2011/12, there was a 28 per cent increase in the number of FOI requests.
- A similar pattern is emerging this year with requests up by 36 per cent over the same time period last year.
- Despite high volumes and flat staffing levels, government continues to process requests on-time 91 per cent of the time.
- However, there are indications that current performance cannot be maintained. To date this year, the average processing days and average overdue days have risen.
- The number of requests from media and political parties has increased substantially. To date this year, government has received close to 400 per cent more requests from political parties.


