A) Description of Changes in your Operation: This operation did not undergo any substantive changes during the reporting period. In an attempt to increase our overall bookings, we did initiate a new program called *Nomads*. One program operated in the north (based out of either the Monashee or Gothics lodges when space was available), while another operated in the south (based out of Halcyon Resort). In these programs, two guides and a single helicopter worked in surgical fashion in ski terrain under tenure to CMH. In this Monashee operating area, the Nomads program did use some of this terrain along with terrain in the Gothics and Revelstoke. Section B (below) includes the use from this program.

We recorded 3138 skier-days in this operating area during the reporting period for purposes of rental

This includes working with meeting regularly with snowmobile clubs and operators, supporting the local alpine ski team and providing a scholarship to students in the high school graduating classes, etc. Our Revelstoke operation tends to be a hub for these activities.

Our staff from this operation (along with guides, pilots and helicopters from Adamants, Gothics, Monashees and Galena, and from Selkirk Tangiers) acted as the primary responders for two avalanche incidents on Boulder Mtn (Turbo) and Eagle Pass this past winter. This had a very profound effect on our staff and operations on a number of levels. We are working with local and provincial officials to change the policy environment and the local search and rescue capability in the wake of these incidents.

A) Description of Changes in our Operation:

Listed below are current concerns and or changes that effect STHS tenure and business.

- 1) The fuel cache in the " Downie Creek " location was relocated two Km down valley on the Downie FSR. The creek that is feed by Bridgland Peak and the Abyss glacier has changed its course as it nears the valley bottom, at the road. The new flow was working its way closer to the original fuel cache. The relocation occurred in October.
- 2) We are seeing a decrease in the regular large group bookings, groups of 11 pax in the 205 and an increase in Astar bookings the 4 pax capacity. The Astar groups are giving us more flexibility in terrain use and allowing us to better utilize our tenure, given current conditions being Avalanche stability and weather.
- 3) We have continued to foster our good neighbor relationship with Selkirk Mountain Experience and Selkirk Lodge. Both of these companies are ski tour lodges within our tenure area. We have two annual meetings, pre and post season. We review concerns, adjust boundaries, trade ERP, communications and logistics. It is felt that there is a good working relationship with good communications between these companies.
- 4) Great Canadian Helicopter Skiing has in the past used some of STHS tenure within the Benedict and Bachelor Creek. This had been an agreement between Peter Schlunegerr the previous owner of STHS and Greg Porter of GCH. At this time there was a signed M.O.U. between STHS and GCH. There has not been a signed M.O.U. over the past two ski seasons.
STHS feels that from a liability, economic, workers safety, and from the Hazard management perspective GCH should not be allowed to ski within STHS tenure.
Last year STHS ventured into this area on its heli ski program. We were confronted with difficult communications with GCH as they were within the same zone. GCH had made no effort no notify us of their intent, prior to skiing there. We have not been provided with their ERP, nor informed if their Insurance policy covered their activity within our tenure.

The decision of GCH not having skiing within STHS tenure would match the decision that ILMB made in favor of CHM with regards to tenure overlap with Eagle Pass Heli- skiing LTD.

5) West Twin FSR is a high profile area that STHS uses during periods of poor flying weather and or during periods of poor to fair avalanche stability. This area includes the runs West Twin with numerous landings and pick up along with the run "Subaru". This area has seen a significant increase in snow machine access as well as snow machine access for ski tourers. Prior to the road being constructed this zone saw none of this traffic.

6) Sale Mountain area is a popular Heli ski area for STHS as it is the first Zone we can ski North of Revelstoke, just north of Revelstoke Mountain National Park.

Within our tenure there was a season area closure for snow machine from December 15 till April 15. Unfortunately this date has been adjusted to January 01. We were not notified of this change nor were we asked for input. As shared tenure users, we would believe that we would be respected and informed. This was not the case.

Environmental conditions such as weather patterns and Avalanche stability are constantly the contributing factors in decision making for the guiding team in Hazard Management.

The Ski hill development of Revelstoke Mountain Resort has had a significant positive influence for STHS. STHS has developed a day skiing program that is improved our skier visits. With more marketing and product awareness it is felt that this business will grow.

The development of the ski hill has generated an influx of a younger generation, single and family oriented that has helped with fulfilling seasonal employment opportunities.

D) Community involvement

The majority of STHS staff is residents of Revelstoke. The birth of the ski hill and the added benefits of life style that Revelstoke offers have improved our employment realm.

D) Environmental

As previously noted, STHS had to move the fuel Cache in Downie FSR to avoid a river changing its course.

E) Optional

STHS effectively monitors its Seasonal Wildlife Tracking protocol and Wildlife Management Plan. "" Attached"

STHS maintains a HETS (Helicopter External Transport) Equipment system and trains its guides on an annual process. Last ski season this equipment was used on six missions to assist RMR, and PEP in and around the Revelstoke area. On several of these occasions STHS staff and helicopters provided added support.

An Annual report was provided this summer to ILMB, a copy of this has been attached.






