2. traffic in live chinook and coho salmon and steelhead, and
3. transport live chinook and coho salmon and steelhead between the  
location described in Item 1 (above) and the fish culture  
facilities of any other person authorized to possess those species  
alive in B.C. **provided the stock**
  - (a) originated from coho parent stocks tested and found to be  
free of BKD (bacterial kidney disease), or
  - (b) originated from chinook or steelhead parent stock tested and  
found to be free of BKD and IHN virus (infectious  
hematopoietic necrosis), and
  - (c) had only been reared on ground water or fish-free water.

- NOTE:**
1. Stocks of chinook and coho salmon and steelhead which  
originated from unscreened parents may be moved alive  
between fish farms authorized to possess those species  
alive, but only within a maximum distance of 50 km and  
not across Vancouver Island.
  2. "Steelhead" includes rainbow trout.

Lots 5, 6, 7, 8, S 1/2 D.L. 1410 GP. 1, NWD, Plan 4719

Management Unit 2-5,

2. traffic in live fish of the species listed in item 1 with any person or company authorized to possess those species alive in B.C., and
3. transport live fish of the species listed in item 1, between the location described in Item 1 (above) and the fish culture facilities of any other person or company authorized to possess those species alive in B.C. **provided the stock**
  - (a) originated from coho parents tested and found to be free of BKD (bacterial kidney disease),
  - (b) originated from chinook or steelhead parents tested and found to be free of BKD and IHN virus (infectious hematopoietic necrosis), or
  - (c) if rainbow trout, originated from a (disease) certified fish farm, and
  - (d) had only been reared on ground water, surface water not containing finfish, or surface water treated in a manner to kill fish pathogens (e.g. UV treatment).

NOTE: Fish stocks not complying with provisions 3.(a), (b) or (c) and (d) shall not be moved from one fish culture facility to another without Transplant Committee approval.

**SPECIAL PROVISIO**

The following proviso is in addition to the general terms of

Aquaculture Licence # 585

issued to: Scanmar Seafood Limited

When transporting fish overland, the licence holder or a person acting on behalf of the licence holder, shall not discharge water from any shipping container into public water other than public water within a location specified on an Aquaculture Licence issued under the Fisheries Act or Live Fish Permit issued under the Wildlife Act.
