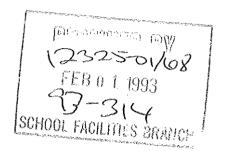

Re: Site Acquisition - Pioneer Park

Over a year ago, I tabled with the City a number of site ownership issues that need to be resolved, and proposed that we attempt to resolve them as a group. Subsequent proposals, counter proposals and discussion have not led to a resolution and I now agree that grouping the issues has so complicated the matter that a timely resolution is not possible. Accordingly, I now propose that we deal with the issues individually.

The highest priority issue for the District is the acquisition of an elementary site in north Nanaimo.

Funding for acquisition of a North Elementary site is currently supported by the Ministry. However, because of the Provincial demand for capital funding and the length of time taken to date regarding this issue, it is possible that support and funding might be withdrawn in the very near future. Therefore, it is important that we try to reach agreement, so that an application for funding release can be forwarded to the Ministry no later than March 27, 1995.

In previous discussions, the District expressed interest in acquiring a portion of Pioneer Park. In response, the City indicated a willingness to transfer ownership of an 8.35 acre portion (see attached site plan) to the District if the District provided funding to the City so that the transferred park land could be replaced on a quid pro quo basis. The 8.35 acre was valued at \$800,000 in an appraisal commissioned jointly by the City and the District.

It is my understanding that City and the District were in agreement relative to this particular land ownership issue but that ownership transfer was not initiated because of other complicating issues. Setting the other issues aside, I propose that the District and City work together to amend the original crown grant so as to provide ownership of the 8.35 acres to the School District while the remainder of the Park remains in the ownership of the City. To that end, I proposed the following:

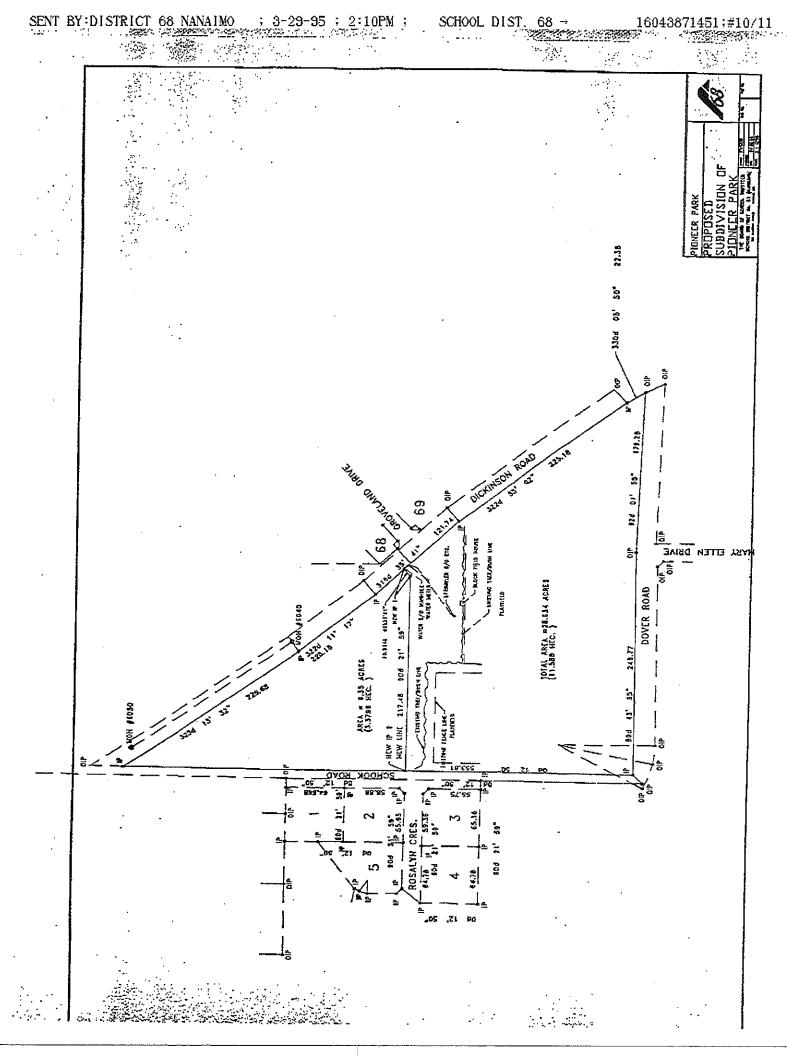

# Briefing Note Elementary North Site Acquisition School District No. 68 (Nanaimo-Ladysmith)

#### **Issue:**

• The acquisition of an elementary school site in north Nanaimo, School District No. 68 (Nanaimo-Ladysmith).

#### **Current Status:**

- The Ministry approved funds for site acquisition for an elementary school in north Nanaimo in the 1993/94 Capital Plan.
- In June, 1994, a representative from the Ministry of Education met with a delegation regarding a proposal to purchase a portion of Pioneer Park from the City of Nanaimo for the school site. The delegation included representatives from School District No. 68, the City of Nanaimo and the Ministry of Crown Lands.
- The proposal was for the school district to pay market value for the land, which had been issued to the City as a Crown grant for park purposes. The City would, in turn, use these funds to purchase park land elsewhere in the City. Crown Lands agreed to amend the Crown grant to permit use of the land for school purposes.
- The discussion and any decisions made at the meeting were not documented by the Branch. The school district did not request any expenditure approval to purchase the site until an expenditure request was submitted on March 29, 1995. The Ministry did not agree to approve this request, and responded in writing on June 22, 1995 outlining some concerns with the proposal. These included:
  - Expenditure of \$800,000 of Provincial funds to acquire land that had previously been granted to the City by the Crown;
  - Enrolment projections for five surrounding schools that do not support acquisition of a new elementary site in the next five years; and
  - Encumbrances to be placed on the property by the City.
- School district officials have indicated that they had advised City officials on several occasions that the acquisition of Pioneer Park may no longer be required as a future school site, and therefore funding was no longer being supported.
- On February 16, 1996, a representative from the Branch was asked to attend a meeting
  with officials from the Ministry of Environment, Lands and Parks and a delegation from
  Nanaimo. The topic was the proposed acquisition of property on Neck Point for a new
  city park. The acquisition was to be jointly funded by the Province and the City. The
  City of Nanaimo is counting on proceeds from the sale of a portion of Pioneer Park to
  meet its obligations. Parks is preparing a Treasury Board submission to request the
  Province's share.

• The meeting was told that the Ministry has not approved the acquisition of the Pioneer Park site. The proposed acquisition of the Neck Point property may fail if the Pioneer Park deal is not completed.

### Other Relevant Considerations:

- The school district has revised its enrolment projections for north Nanaimo since June 1995. These projections still do not support acquisition of a new site in the next five years; however, projections to eight years would support a new school.
- The Ministry has proposed to discuss the availability of other Crown land in Nanaimo with Crown Lands to seek other possible land swaps with Crown Lands and the City for future elementary or secondary sites.
- A meeting has been established with the Ministry of Environment, Lands, and Parks for March 5, 1995 to review other available options.

## New Elementary North Site Acquisition

I am writing with regards to your letter and EdCap of March 29, 1995, requesting expenditure approval for the purchase of an elementary school site.

As reviewed at our meeting in Nanaimo on June 7, 1995, the expenditure was not approved at the time, as the Ministry has some concerns with the current proposal at Pioneer Park. At our meeting, it was agreed that the following actions will be taken in order to resolve some of the outstanding issues regarding this site.

# 1. Enrolment Projections for North Nanaimo

An analysis of the District's elementary enrolment forecasts for 1999 (published in July 1994) indicates that they do not support the need for a new school in north Nanaimo in the next five years. The original approval of the project in 1993 may have been based on higher enrolment projections than are currently forecast.

The District has agreed to provide updated enrolment forecasts for the area based on current enrollments and growth assumptions.

## 2. Acquisition of Former Crown Land at Fair Market Value

The proposed school site was originally acquired by the City of Nanaimo as a Crown Grant for park use. You have indicated that Crown Lands would be willing to amend the Crown Grant only if a mutual agreement can be reached between the City and the School District. The City wishes to receive fair market value for the land, in order that it may purchase park land elsewhere in Nanaimo.

It will be difficult to justify payment of market value for land that was owned by the Crown and has not been developed. Other site acquisition options must be identified and analysed for comparison with the current proposal.

The Ministry will initiate discussions with Crown Lands to determine if there are any other Crown Land holdings in the area for a possible exchange with the City. The District will commission a new appraisal on the Pioneer Park site, and also engage a realtor to identify other potential school sites in the area. The Board should then prepare a cost-benefit analysis of all available sites, with the cost analysis to include estimated costs for site servicing and development.

In the process of identifying alternate school sites, sizes closer to five acres would be supportable, depending on the configuration of the property. It should be noted that the Pioneer Park site is 8.35 acres, which is large for a 50K/200 capacity elementary school site.

## 3. Other Pioneer Park Issues

Supporting documentation submitted as part of the District's request to purchase part of Pioneer Park indicates that the City wishes to place certain encumbrances on a proposed agreement to sell the property. Specifically, the City wishes to realize revenue from the sale of timber on the site and apply it to the development of a trail network and other amenities. As specified on the Ministry's Site Report Checklist - which should be submitted with the expenditure request - the School Board should be negotiating free and clear ownership of the property, which should include any timber rights.

Having viewed the proposed site on a previous visit to the District, I would expect some community reaction to the logging of the site to accommodate any proposed development. This reinforces the necessity to give full consideration to any alternative sites to justify the development of a school on this park land.

Please call me if you have any questions regarding these comments. I am returning the original EdCap submitted March 29, 1995, unsigned to the District. The District should submit a new EdCap to request any fees required to complete the cost analysis of alternative sites.

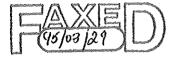

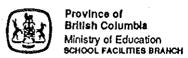

### Background:

The school district has completed an extensive evaluation of school capacities and projected student population, both on a district-wide and an individual school basis. This survey was intended in part to evaluate the need for new school sites as part of the Bill 35 School Site Acquisition Process, and to evaluate the specific needs in the north Nanaimo area.

The district has forecast a decline in student population for several years in the future. Although some portables may be required in the short term, the existing capacity of most schools in the area will be adequate. There is, however, a need to address the growth of enrolment at Hammond Bay Elementary, as a result of the school being designated a French Immersion school. There is an immediate need for two additional classrooms in September, 2001, and the school is forecast to grow by at least one classroom annually until 2006.

A project was approved in 1997 (Project No. 110091) to renovate Hammond Bay Elementary (\$1.498 million). This was intended as a first phase renovation, with consideration to be given to construct a future addition when enrolment increased. The first phase included the construction of two shelled-in classrooms, which would be completed as part of the requested addition.

The north Nanaimo area is served by seven elementary schools. In September, 2000, there were 14 portables located at these sites, reduced from 29 a year earlier. Four of the 14 portables are no longer required with the recent completion of an addition at Pleasant Valley Elementary, and only 2 of the remainder are eligible for operating funding in 2000/01.
