Dear Minister Bennett,

We are contacting you in regard to British Columbia's participation in the PNWER Legislative Energy Horizon Institute (LEHI). LEHI provides legislators with an in-depth background on energy infrastructure and operations so that they can make informed policy decisions related to the energy needs in their jurisdiction. We have enclosed background information on the Institute, and a list of graduates from the first three classes.

PNWER and the National Conference of State Legislators have been fortunate in getting some support for the program from the US Department of Energy, and the Canadian Federal government under Natural Resources Canada. US DOE has limited their funding to support for US state legislators to attend the program, and NR CAN has limited their funding to support Canadian content specifically for US legislators, but expressly not to support provincial MLA's to attend.

So, we cannot utilize either the US DOE or NRCAN money for travel and accommodations for Canadian legislators. As in the past we are asking for your assistance to include British Columbia's legislators in the Institute.

Tuition for the executive certificate program from the University of Idaho is \$6162 (US) per member. The travel and accommodation is in addition to this. Two three day face-to-face meetings, one in Richland, WA and one in Washington D.C., are part of the LEHI program for 2014. There are two ways you can participate. Either these funds can be paid by the Provincial government, or if you prefer, we are willing to work with you to raise scholarship dollars from the private sector in your Province to cover tuition and travel cost for your members.

We would like to have your Province's participation. If you would like to have BC MLA's join the class of 2014 please let us know by February 28, 2014 which pathway above you would like to take.

This will be an excellent opportunity for MLA's to spend two immersion sessions of 54 hours total with other energy policymakers from the PNWER region and North America. LEHI allows for relationship building with future leadership of the legislative energy committees of your neighboring jurisdictions.

At the conclusion of the course work the participants will get an executive certificate from the University of Idaho in Energy Policy Planning. I have included the brochure for the program.

I look forward to hearing from your office if you will participate in the Institute.

The fourth Legislative Energy Horizon Institute (LEHI), which begins this summer, offers emerging leaders in energy policy an excellent opportunity to increase their ability to address energy challenges in their Province. LEHI offers legislators the chance to dramatically improve their knowledge of the energy infrastructure and delivery system, enhancing their ability to make the complex policy decisions that will be necessary to ensure the region has a stable, secure and affordable energy supply and delivery system.

The 2014 institute will meet on August 23-26, 2014, in Richland, WA, and November 13-15, 2014, in Washington, DC.

We have requested in a separate letter guidance on how you would like to participate in this unique opportunity. We have restrictions on both USDOE and NRCAN funds with regard to funding Canadian provincial MLA tuition or travel. I have enclosed a copy of that letter, identifying the tuition costs per MLA.

After March 1st any empty positions will be filled by alternates in chronological order of those responding to this request for appointments. Getting your appointments in early makes a difference!

This unique opportunity is widely sought after and has required significant effort and resources to create and deliver. Selected legislators will be required to sign a letter of commitment and complete all of the 60 hours of coursework.

PNWER is collaborating with the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL), the University of Idaho, and the US Department of Energy to administer the Institute. Last year's Legislative Energy Horizon Institute was extremely successful, producing a corps of legislators with knowledge of how energy is produced, distributed and delivered to consumers. - Examine the rules and regulation of electric, natural gas, and petroleum infrastructure.
- Explain the regulatory, financial, and planning challenges associated with building new energy infrastructure.
- Apply technical knowledge to implement informed and effective energy policy.
- Analyze the relationship between climate and energy.
