Accomplishments to date on themes:

• A commitment to using wood first

Forestry Innovation Investment (FII) has been busy promoting the benefits of building with BC Wood through initiatives like the rethink Wood Initiative, the provision of courses on the benefits of building with wood for architects and design professionals, and the release of the report "The Case for Tall Wood Buildings" that proposes wood based structural design solutions for building up to 30 storeys.

• Growing trees, sequestering carbon, and ensuring that land is available from which to derive a range of forest products

The Legislative Committee on the Mid-Term Timber Supply, appointed in May 2012, to investigate and make recommendations to address the loss of mid-term timber supply in the central interior due to the mountain pine beetle epidemic has now completed public consultation. The final report was released in August.


• Embracing innovation and diversification
