SE N crew did a perimeter check of area to ensure no embers started fire in adjacent forest. SE N crew also helped clean up fire and bucked up the burned picnic table at site. Crew left fire at 18:17 to return to base. One woman received first aid due to a burn on her lower leg and was escorted to Revelstoke Hospital via BC Ambulance.

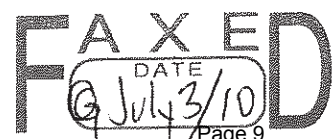
