Capilano University Proposed Program Cuts

Advice and Recommended Response:

- B.C. post-secondary institutions regularly undertake strategic planning processes to ensure they are effectively meeting the needs of their students and their local community.
- Capilano University has the authority to make decisions regarding programming, staffing and administration, but it also needs to consult with its academic community.
- I understand the university is now re-examining its options before it makes any final decisions to cut or suspend any programs currently being offered.
- Staff from my Ministry continue to have an ongoing dialogue with Capilano University staff regarding the university's financial pressures and financial sustainability.
- I expect Capilano University to make responsible budget decisions while ensuring a continued high standard of education for students.

BACKGROUND REGARDING THE ISSUE:

- In April 2013, media reported that Capilano University would be cutting its studio art and textile arts programs as part of the university's plan to address its budget deficit.
- The plan was widely criticized by staff and students who expressed public concern at the perceived lack of consultation from the administration on the proposed cuts.
- As of May 17, 2013, media are reporting that the university has put a short-term stay on the proposal while it looks at alternative plans. That decision was welcomed by staff and students.
- As a result of the publicity generated by the proposed program cuts, media has made a number of broad enquiries about the university's funding.
- At a May 14, 2013 meeting, the university's board agreed to postpone any discussion on the fiscal sustainability plan and proposed budget until its next meeting on June 11, 2013. The Senate Budget Advisory Committee has until June 4 to present a balanced budget to the Senate. The Senate will then send a budget to the June 11 University's Board meeting.
