It is intended that Mr. Gardner's headquarters would remain in Prince George during the secondment.

The term of secondment would be until strategy implementation is complete, which is estimated to be five months. At project completion Mr. Gardner will return to his previous position on a full time basis. Mr. Gardner will be provided with an appraisal of the work performed.

Mr. Gardner has some continued project responsibility with his home office and estimates this to be 50% of his work. The Ministry of Health, therefore, would provide 50% salary and benefits, travel expenses, and clerical support. Actual expenditures will be determined based on a time reporting schedule.

RE: Secondment to Health

The Ministry of Health has approached our office with a Biomedical Waste Processing Strategy. This strategy involves the secondment of Larry Gardner to act as a coordinator for the health care facilities in the Province. His role will be similar to his existing role on the Cariboo & Omineca-Peace Region, Biomedical Waste Working Group (BWWG).

The strategy document outlines the implementation of provincial strategy for the processing of biomedical waste taking into account the following:

existing methods other available methods geographic impact singular and multiple facility use regionalization business case development proposal requests purchase protocol

MOH would like the term of the secondment until the strategy implementation, estimated to be four months. In consideration of his existing work responsibilities, Health is prepared to pay 90% of his salary and benefits, travel expenses and clerical support. The strategy proposal does not identify a reporting structure.

I am prepared, conceptually, to support the secondment, however, there are many areas that will need exploring before a final decision can be made. We would first need the support of Municipal Reduction Branch in Victoria. Ron Driedger's memo

dated May 13, 1996 may conflict with this proposal. Secondly, we would have to receive backing from all regional offices.

Locally, I would have to review Larry's workload and define what activities that can be delegated to other staff or postponed until his return. I am not comfortable with his departure from solid waste management planning (SWMP) as we are in the crunch period between finalization of plans and their implementations.

s 22 I believe greater than 10% of his time must be devoted to SWMP, somewhere in the order of 40%. There will also be need for clarification on supervisory reporting role.

This strategy would provide BC Environment an opportunity to address nonconforming facilities as well as put Larry's skills, developed from the BWWG, to good use by providing cost effective strategies for all aspects of biomedical waste management for the province.

As an alternative to MOH's proposal, Larry could carry out this task under BC Environment in concert with MOH. Since this issue is crucial due to the Ministry's commitment to biomedical waste management, I would like to discuss a plan of action with you at your earliest convenience.
