Followup to the 2011 Summary Report on Employment Standards Stakeholder Engagement Process:

Government undertook a stakeholder engagement process with key labour and business stakeholders on the minimum wage as well as a review of employment standards in the province, in 2011. The results of that consultation were provided to the public in March 2011 in the form of a report (Summary Report on Employment Standards Stakeholder Engagement Process).

Subsequent to the release of the summary report, there has been no follow up engagement on minimum wage and employment standards generally. However, a review of the piece rates for hand-harvested crops listed in the employment standards reglation was udnertaken by government, utilizing the expertise of an industry consultant.
