Here is what we have:

- Metro Vancouver's Solid Waste Management Plan, approved by the Minister of Environment in July 2011, included a strategy to target organics for recycling and energy recovery, as food waste comprises 21 per cent of the waste disposed in the region.
- Metro Vancouver has chosen to enact a ban on disposing food and compostable organics from all sources at their waste management facilities by 2015. These materials can be composted, donated or transported to a designated processing facility.
- More information on the ban is available on the Metro Vancouver website at http://www.metrovancouver.org/services/solidwaste/businesses/organicsban/Pages/default.aspx.
- Metro Vancouver is also considering draft Bylaw #280, allowing for the development of private sector mixed
 waste material recovery facilities for the purpose of recovering recyclables and organics from multi-family
 residential and commercial/institutional waste following source separation. The Bylaw will require the Minister's
 approval.
