Title: Requests for hosting funding assistance – "mid-sized" sport events.

Issue: There are three funding requests that have been submitted to CSCD which require decisions and have been compiled in this singular briefing note for ease of comparison.

Background: The Hosting Program is divided into two funding streams with \$0.5M allocated to Hosting BC and the remaining \$0.5 M used to fund larger events – the "mid-sized" pot. Funding from the mid-sized pot has generally been in the range of \$25,000 to \$125,000, with a few larger exceptions. Previous events funded have included the Davis Cup (2012), Tim Hortons Brier (2014) and the Special Olympics Canada Summer Games (2014).

NR Based on the economic impact report from the 2013 Luge World Championships held in Whistler (est. economic activity over \$1M) it is anticipated that the 2014 Junior World Cup will yield important economic benefits to the community early in the winter season.

Given the timing in the current fiscal year, the quality of the events under consideration and the anticipated requests that will be submitted, an allocation of NR is recommended at this time. Further detail on each of the events is provided below.

2014 Junior Luge World Cup (December 4-7, 2014)

Luge Canada has requested \$30,000 to host a Junior World Cup at the Whistler Sliding Centre. The Province supported the Luge World Cup in 2011 (\$62.5k) and the World Luge Championships in 2013 (\$100k). A junior world cup event is less expensive to host; therefore a lower level of funding is being requested.

The proposed World Cup provides an opportunity for Canadian athletes to train in advance of the Junior World Championships in Norway. Training competitions at home help athletes get the experience they need at lower cost to their families.

The recommended amount of funding will not impact support from Sport Canada, which has provided \$50,000 of assistance for all recent bobsleigh/skeleton/luge World Cups held in Canada.

Funding of \$30,000 is recommended from the 2013/14 mid-sized event allocation for this event. A decision is required immediately as the event is in December 2014.
