(Mainroad) for the period January 3, 2018 to March 3, 2018; The quality assurance manual and business deployment plan provided by Mainroad; The highway inventory list for Highway 3/95 between Yahk and Cranbrook; A record of collisions on Highway 3/95 between Yahk and Cranbrook for the 5 years prior to February 3, 2018; Records of consideration of any upgrades to Highway 3/95 between Yahk and Cranbrook for the 5 years prior to February 3, 2018; RWIS weather records for Highway 3/95 between Yahk and Cranbrook for the period January 3, 2018 to March 3, 2018; The highway maintenance specifications audit reports for the 2017/2018 winter maintenance season; Mainroad winter deployment plans for the 2017/2018 winter maintenance season; Records of calls to Mainroad's 1-800-665-4929 (Drive BC contact number to report problems) telephone number for the period January 3, 2018 to March 3, 2018; and A record of the displays on any programmable road signs on Highway 3/95 between Creston and Cranbrook from 12:01 am February 3, 2018 to 12:01 am February 4, 2018.

Please see the additional comments regarding part of your request:

- 1. A record of collisions on Highway 3/95 between Yahk and Cranbrook for the 5 years prior to February 3, 2018;
 - Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, South Island Region provided the
 responsive records they hold on regarding incidents from 2013- 2018. MoTI does not
 attend all highway incidents. ICBC would have more comprehensive records. ICBC
 accepted a partial transfer to provide their responsive records related to this portion of
 the request.
- 2. Records of consideration of any upgrades to Highway 3/95 between Yahk and Cranbrook for the 5 years prior to February 3, 2018;
 - Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, South Island Region does not have records on consideration of upgrades, upgrades completed over past 5 years include: Hwy 3/95 Swansea Bridge replaced in 2017 and rehab to Moyie CRP retaining wall, SIR District replaced Hwy 3/95 culvert at Elizabeth Lake/Jim Smith Creek in Cranbrook Arterial in 2017.
- 3. A record of the displays on any programmable road signs on Highway 3/95 between Creston and Cranbrook from 12:01 am February 3, 2018 to 12:01 am February 4, 2018;
 - Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, South Island Region holds no records related to this. No programmable road signs on Hwy 3/95 between Cranbrook and Creston.
