## Re: Peters Band Issues

Please see the attached, which I received some time ago as per the referenced meeting. This was reactivated lately by concerns raised in the August 22, 2002 letter concerning alleged actions by Cheam Band. A drive-by did not reveal any activity by Cheam Band. Interfor have proposed several cut blocks on the upper slopes in this area, but there are no formal applications or approvals at this time.

Since the above referenced meeting, we have made every effort to provide material to the Band if the economics were reasonable. During the cleanup for the January debris torrent events our Maintenance Contractor hauled 2911 loads from Patterson Creek and 186 loads from Ted Creek to a dumpsite on the Reserve at the Band's request. At approximately nine cubic metres per load (we were hauling overloads) this translates into approximately 28,000 cubic metres of rock and graveley material. In addition, we gravelled and graded their main access road with 685 cubic metres of crush at an approximate value of \$18,000 on the open market. We are looking at the possibility of making grindings available to them from our Paving Projects in the area. As well, the 2000 plus cubic metres of rip-rap stored in the median with an approximate production value of \$34,000 is still available for consideration.


For your information, at this time I have no clear thoughts on how to resolve this (perceived) long standing issue.





Thank you for your letter of April 11, 1996, in reply to mine. I am sure, in the continuing spirit of co-operation, you will agree that it would not likely be appropriate for the Peters Band to agree to accept 1500 cubic meters of rip rap if 52,000 cubic meters of material were removed from the reserve and are owing to the Band. On the other hand, I recognize that you have not had a chance to research this matter yet and require to do so.

I regret the oversight in not attaching the pages that I received from NuRoad Contracting Ltd. outlining the waste material removed from the reserve during the 1985-86 highway reconstruction. Those two pages are attached to this letter.

I understand that the Ministry would desire to exchange 1500 cubic meters of rock material now in exchange for 52,000 cubic meters owed since it would be a heck of deal; but I am sure you understand both our expressed desire to accept what is offered already as partial satisfaction of the existing debt. I cannot view it as appropriate nor would I recommend to the Band that they accept 1500 cubic meters and sign off. This is not the Island of Manhattan.

- 2 -

I know that you are concerned to rapidly resolve this issue as are we. Certain works were performed on the river bed in anticipation of the 1500 cubic meters of Rip Rap being available. If that material is not made available there may be some resulting damage to the diking and island behind it. As the river rises, so does concern about the impact of the river upon surrounding lands. I continue to urge that the 1500 cubic meters be released now as a set off against the existing obligation of the Ministry. It seems a perfectly reasonable resolution to the immediate situation.

May I have your earliest reply.



Further to our recent discussions, the Headquarters Construction Branch C2907 file has been examined for any references to providing the Peters Creek Indian Band with excess rock and/or gravel.

There is a January 29, 1985 memo from Headquarters Property Services to the Director of Construction that deals with this issue. A copy is enclosed (Enclosure #1) Item #6 is relevant and it states:

6. "The Band desires any excess rock and/or gravel which may be surplus to our construction requirements and requests that we make known to the Contractor that they will provide a convenient site on their Reserve as a dump site. The Band was advised that we would so inform our Contractor but would leave arrangements to be made directly between the Band and Contractor. Would you kindly inform the successful Contractor."

Unfortunately there is no correspondence in the Headquarters file that identifies the Contractor, Nu-Road Construction Co. Ltd, being advised of these requirements.

To an extent the Ministry Project Supervisor and Construction dealt with the issue.

### 1. Enclosure #2

There are eight documents from the Regional Property Peters Reservation file that identify the Project Supervisor was notified the issue was one for consideration of the Contractor.

However there is no document identifying the Contractor was notified.

### 2. Enclosure #3

The Project Supervisors Daily Record has five diary entries dealing with the issue.

After one of my staff has reviewed all the Project Supervisor's Daily Record there is no indication the Contractor was notified of Peter's Creek Indian Band's desires of and excess rock, gravel and or topsoil.

It appears the Construction Manager gave direction not to provide any excess material.

Dealing with wasted material on the project, the Headquarters construction file identifies approximately 250,000 m3 of material hauled to waste. Upon review of the Project Daily Record there are records some rock was hauled to waste.

This will report that we have successfully negotiated the new right-of-way for the current project and that the following construction commitments were made:

- 1. The Province will construct an access road including installation of a cattleguard and proper railway signals, from the proposed underpass location to the existing Peters Road (per design). The road will be fenced with standard barbed wire.
- 2. The Province will restore the existing access and cattleguard where the existing Peters Road will be aligned to meet the Trans Canada Highway (per design).
- 3. The Province will construct and pave an access road from the south side of the highway to the existing house located on the south side of the highway.
- 4. The Province will cold-deck all merchantable timber cut from the right-of-way at a convenient location off the right-of-way for the use of the Band. (Suggested site shown cross-hatched on attached drawing.)

This has reference to my telephone discussion with Kathy Stewart 22nd instant with respect to the Band's claim we "will allow the Band to have the excess rock from the construction site", as evidenced by item 9 of the Band Council Resolution dated 3rd December, 1984.

I enclose herewith copies of subsequent correspondence upon which I have highlighted the relevant passages. You will note that we would not agree to the Band's demand above, but correctly stated the matter was one for the consideration of the Contractor. Mr. Zapf was so notified 29th January, 1985.

The contents of your December 17 letter has been discussed with Chief Frank Peters and we wish to make the following comments:

- 1. Item 9 of the B.C.R. now reflects the agreement made at the meeting of November 9, 1984, namely, the Band will not require the Province to place the excess rock and soil at locations on the Reserve as determined by the Band Council. However, the Province will allow the Band to have any excess rock and topsoil and this excess, if any, will be placed at one dump area.
- 2. Chief Frank Peters has verbally given the consent of himself and the Band Council to allow the Province and its agents immediate access to the Reserve for survey and construction purposes.
- 3. The Band, once again, wishes to make the point that no artifacts are to be removed from the Reserve. When construction takes place in an area which may contain artifacts, a Band member should be notified and be allowed to be present.
- 4. I wish to confirm that the Band Council have verbally instructed me to have the Province pay the compensation to "Jack Andersen In Trust". This instruction is not required in the Band Council Resolution.
- 5. We wish to acknowledge that the subject area is 5.9817 hectares which are shown on 3 drawings, namely, Rl-174-04, Rl-174-05 and Rl-174-06. However, the final area to be transferred will be defined by the legal survey which will be done by the Province as referred to in item 2 of the Band Council Resolution.


This office is now in receipt of a Band Council Resolution dated December 3rd, 1984, consenting to transfer Reserve lands to the province for certain considerations. We wish to point out some discrepancies and make more clear some items as agreed to with your clients at your office, November 9,1984:

The first paragraph of the B.C.R. should be corrected as to the following:

;the area is more precisely 5.9817 hectares. ;there are 3 drawings, namely R1-174-04,R1-174-05 and R1-174-06. ;we prefer the wording to be "for road purposes and other works of public utility and convenience."

- Item #1 Add to the existing sentence "...unless otherwise directed".
  We already have direction from D.I.A. to pay the compensation to "Jack Andersen In Trust"
- Item 17 The topic of excavation was discussed at our November 9th meeting. It was explained there would have to be some minor excavation for the deceleration/acceleration lanes in order to maintain the proper grades and place gravel for the road base. Our Design and Surveys Branch has prepared a drawing indicating the quantity and area affected and has shown same crosshatched in red on attached drawing. You will note the excavation is very shallow and the total amount of material to be removed is approximately 200 cubic meters. It is suggested the material removed be placed on the reserve. Perhaps Band members could examine this area to determine what artifacts may exist, if any.
- Item #8 As discussed at the November 9th meeting, the area where merchantable timber will be cold-deck is also crosshatched and identified on attached drawing.

- 3. The Province will return to reserve status the 0.089 hectare portion of the Trans Canada Highway, as shown in green on drawing No. Rl-174-04.
- 4. The Province will construct an access road including installation of a cattleguard and proper railway crossing signals, from the proposed underpass location to the existing Peters Road. The road will be fenced with standard barbed wire.
- 5. The Province will restore existing access and cattleguard where the existing Peters Road will be aligned to meet the Trans Canada Highway.
- 6. To construct and pave an access road from the south side of the highway to the existing house located on the south side of the highway.
- 7. The Province will not allow any excavation in areas of archaeological value.
- 8. The Province will deck all merchantable timber from the right-of-way area for the Band.
- 9. The Province will allow the Band to have the excess rock from the construction site and topsoil.

The Band, their lawyer and D.I.A. have given verbal approval to enter onto the reserve for construction purposes. It is my understanding that it will be ratified by another B.C.R.

Our construction commitments are as follows:

- (1) Construct an access road, including installation of a cattleguard and proper railway crossing signals from the proposed underpass location to the existing Peters Road. The road shall be paved and fenced on either side with type 'C' barbed wire.
- (2) Restore existing access and cattleguard where existing Peters Road will be aligned to meet the Trans Canada Highway.
- (3) Construct and pave an access road from the south side of the highway to the existing house located on the south side of the highway.
- The Band has requested no excavation on areas of archaeclogical value. In the area of the old cemetry where the deceleration and acceleration lane will be constructed, they feel there may be artifacts. A member of the Band should be present when excavation in this area is done. The material can be delivered to the reserve for the members to examine.
- (5) Merchantable timber shall be cold decked for the Band on the reserve.
- (6) The Band desire any excess material being removed, Contractor should be aware of this commitment and if feasible, arrange with the Band an area to dump it.

#### Georgia:

I have read your document "Peters.doc" and have the following comments.

Your April 23, 1985 item: Kathy Stewart may have been the Ministry's Area Manager at the time; if not, I believe that she was employed at the time. \$.22

A person who still works with the Ministry who might have a recollection of this is Dick Jones, Area Manager in Hope.

Your March 26, 1996 item: This refers to an existing mound of rock that was left over from the highway construction. It has grown over with trees and other vegetation. The rock is situated on the south side of the freeway, within a couple of kilometers of the Peters interchange.

Your April 4, 1996 item: This asks what the conversion is from meters to yards.

1 yard = 0.9144 metres

Therefore, 1 cubic yard = 0.765 cubic metres.

It is possible that the original contract used cubic yards as a measurement. Converting to cubic meters would increase the volume by 31%.

Your April 11, 1996 memo assumes that the referenced photo shows the rock pile that was being offered to the band. Yes, it is. The rock is very competent, hard rock in large chunks from approx. 1-foot diameter to perhaps 1-meter diameter.

Your second April 11, 1996 memo notes that ARB does not have a copy of Tony's letter of that date. Please ask Tony for that memorandum.

w.r.t. your "Questions and Notes" section:

"Rock and Gravel" refers to rocks and clean gravels with no organics (peaty soil, grass, leaves, wood, trees, etc.). "Rock and topsoil" refers to rocks and soil that would be used for planting grasses and other landscaping. The soil may or may not contain organics.

For information on whether or not the contractor was notified of the Band's request, I suggest that you contact the project supervisor of that contract. Singh Jassal is still with the Ministry, \$.22 This seems like a key item in your research; you may wish to strongly urge him to pull his diary and/or other relevent documentation from his archived files.

I hope that this has assisted you.

Could you print my memo and Georgia's chronology document, and file with this claim in your district?

Thank you for your letter of October 4, 1996. We apologize for the delay in our response which was due to internal changes within our Region and the re-distribution of files.

We have researched our construction records, Properties Branch documents, records of Nu Road Contractor you provided us, and interviewed personnel. The review brought up two important points pertaining to the agreement between the Peters Band and the Province.

The first point is, that the Province agreed only that the Band would make all arrangements for the excess material and the dumping location with the contractor. The Ministry was not to be directly responsible for this arrangement. To the best of our knowledge the Band did not make any arrangements with the contractor

The second point is, that the Province did not object to the Band having any excess rock and/or gravel material, should it become available. Our records show however, that the material in question was organic and unusable dirt with some unrecoverable rock mixed in- a volume less than 10% of the total. Some other rock material available was used to construct the haul road to the waste dump site. The construction did not produce any excess rock and/or gravel material.

Rock Material

A considerable time has passed since April 12, 1996, when you, in correspondence explained the Ministry would continue to research records and interview personnel respecting the rip rap material stored by the Highways Department and subsequently sold without provision to the Peters Band of material owing to them. Please see my letter of April 11, 1996.

The Band requires your co-operation in resolving this issue and providing the appropriate material to the Band which the Highways Department owes it. As far as we are aware, no further efforts since your letter of April 12, 1996 have been undertaken.

Would you please provide us with some explanation of what continuing research, interviews of personnel, etc. have taken place since April 12/96 so that we can better understand when the Highways Department will honour its obligation. As you are well aware, the Highways Department's offer of 2,500 cubic meters of rip rap does not anywhere near meet the Highways Department's obligation of providing some 52,000 cubic meters of material which were removed from the reserve and which

comprise part of the land transaction in which the Government of British Columbia acquired a portion of the Peters Reserve.

As you know, the Peters Band were promised and as part of the consideration for the transfer of their lands, required that the Highways Department set aside 52,000 cubic meters of material removed from their reserve for their later use. The land upon which the material was stored has since been sold by the Province of British Columbia without any provision for providing the Band with the materials stored there or some alternative source of material of a like of volume.

I cannot view the offer made in your letter of April 12, 1996, and earlier, of 2,500 cubic meters as a genuine offer to resolve this matter. Please advise that a proper response will be made and soon.

Further to your phone call from Jack Anderson regarding an outstanding issue with the Peter's Band concerning excess rock material, I've talked to Bill Sunderwood, DHM, and Tony Gazdik.

- In the mid 80s, MoTH negotiated for Reserve land, and the transfer was completed.
- As part of the settlement, MoTH committed to provide excess rock and topsoil left over from the construction of the right of way. A BCR dated February 1, 1985, confirms this, but in the OIC and the BCR. no quantities were stated.
- MoTH staff who are familiar with the deal remember that perhaps 200 cubic metres of excess material might be available.
- Part of the agreement involved a condition that the BAnd would contact the construction excavator to arrange for the transfer of the rock to a place designated by the Band.
- The Band contends they haven't received any material to date.
- Band's concern is that they need the material for their dyking project immediately as the waters are rising.
- Tony Gazdik has written a letter to Jack Anderson, Band Lawyer, dated April 11, 1996, following a meeting with Chief Frank on March 20, 1996.
  - Chief advised that MOTH not able to establish with certainty whether there was excess material from the construction.
  - MoTH prepared to assume there was excess material in the interest of settling this matter.
  - Tony and Chief identified a rock material site which was offered to the Band in return for a BCR releasing MoTH from further claims.
  - The volume of rock offered to the BAnd is approximately 1500 cubic metres.
  - Jack Anderson claims the amount owed to the BAnd is 52,000 cubic metres.
  - MoTH is offering to settle the matter for the amount discussed with the Chief on March 20 (1500 c.m.)
  - If the Band wants to pursue the 52,000 c.m. MoTH has advised it will have to conduct research prior to any further negotiation.

A copy of Tony's letter is in your office. Mike Welwood has reviewed the PS file for any reference to rock quantities and has found none. ....Sharon.



Thank you for your letter of April 11, 1996 which was in response to our letter to you dated April 11, 1996.

We regret your interpretation of the Ministry's efforts to settle the matter as trying to take advantage of the Band, particularly since the Band was a recipient of free land material from the Ministry on several occasions in the past and as recently as a few days ago.

You will appreciate that the Ministry, while trying to maintain good relations with the public and the Band, can not be considered as a permanent source of land material every time someone desires it. In this particular circumstance, the Band request refers to a specific agreement, and the Ministry is prepared and willing to fulfill its obligations, provided such an obligation exists.

We will continue researching our records and interviewing personnel who were involved in the project. Our information thus far not only contrasts the volume in your two pages with certain recording of "waste material" provided to us (unfortunately without any details or verification of the author, construction project, place of excavation, etc.) but indeed suggests, no excess material was produced at ail. This, unfortunately, hardly justifies the release of any material to the Band at this time without proper release of claim.


Re: Peters Band Rip Rap Pile





### Re: TCH project through Peters Indian Reserve during the 1984/85 period

This office has been involved in discussion with the Peters Band, West of Hope, adjacent to the TransCanada Highway, for several years regarding a Band Council Resolution. The BCR involved MoTH agreeing to various conditions for the right to construct the additional lanes for the TCH. One of the conditions was that we would supply the band with any excess material, i.e., rock from the construction. This one condition was supposedly unresolved since 1984.

This year I was contacted by the Chief, Frank Peters, to discuss this matter, I involved Pat Cruickshank, Bill Sunderwood, and Tony Gazdik in several discussions, meetings and some research. We thought that we had come to a resolve to the issue by offering the Peters Band in excess of 2500 m3 of rock.

Now their lawyer has contacted Tony Gazdik and informed him that they would not sign a BCR to resolve this but instead would accept the 2500m3 of rock and insist that they have records showing that they are due 52000 yds of rock.

We need to acquire all information from the project to prove the quantities of excess rock that was truly available from the construction of the TransCanada through and around the Peters Band property in Laidlaw. If we can obtain the information then we may be able to avoid potential legal action.

Could you please check your records from the construction of the TCH in this area and supply us with any pertinent documents that could shed some light on this dispute. If you have any questions please contact myself, Tony Gazdik or Pat Cruickshank.

Band Council Resolution

I would like to thank Chief Peters and Frank Peters for meeting with us on March 20, 1996 to discuss the excess rock material issue which dates back to an agreement made between the Band and the Ministry in the early 1980's.

You advised us that the Band never received the excess rock material from a reconstruction of the Trans Canada Highway in early 1980s'. You requested the Ministry provides the material to the Band at this time.

We reviewed our file and noted that the Band Council Resolution of February 1, 1985 and some other correspondence refer to an intent by the Ministry to provide the Band Some an excess rock material. While this intent is evident, the available documents do not clearly indicate whether of not there was any excess material available and what quantify of rock was considered.

From the Trans Conda reconstruction project.

Further, it appears that, indeed some excess material may had been left from the construction and the contractor stored it on Ministry property. Inadvertently, this property was subsequently sold to a private interest and the Band was not able to access the rock material.

We are prepared to settle this issue fairly and in the spirit of cooperation. We have offered to the Band certain rock material deposit located on the Ministry right of way along the Trans Canada Highway. The location and the deposit were identified by an on-site visit of the Ministry officials and Chief Peters on March 20, 1996. The material would be removed and hauled by the Band. In return we requested that the Band agrees to acknowledge that this is a satisfactory resolution of the issue and will release

the Ministry from any further obligations. We requested that the Band passes a Band Council Resolution in which it agrees to the proposed offer and deliver it to the Ministry prior to any works.

The following suggested wording for the Band council Resolution bellow reflects, in our understanding, the terms and conditions of an agreement discussed in the meeting:

- In reference to item 9 of the Band Council Resolution of February 1, 1986, the Peters Band hereby agrees to accept certain rock material from the Ministry of Transportation and Highways, as identified by Chief Frank Peters and the Hinistry officials in their meeting of March 20, 1996. The location to be confirmed by a plan to be prepared by the Ministry.
- 2) The Band accepts this material as satisfactory compensation and acknowledges this as a fulfillment of the Ministry obligation which releases the Ministry from any and all further obligations in the material.
- 3) The hauling and removal of the rock material will be done by the Band at their own costs.

By copy of this letter i request the Fraser Valley Highway District Office to identify as soon as possible the available rock material in a plan and provide a copy to the Band and to the Properties branch.
