A resident at Cottonwoods, one of IH's care facilities in Kelowna, is speaking to Global Okanagan today.

The 42-year-old man who has debilitating MS, and his elderly mother bundle up and go to the sidewalk off-property to smoke medical cannabis, as he has a licence from Health Canada.

He argues he shouldn't have to bundle up every day and go outside to take his medicine.

Here is a story with the same resident, done in 2012: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RPdiLiLVnzA

Here are the key messages they are planning to use for the interview:

- Interior Health (IH) is supportive of patients or clients who have authorization to use cannabis for medical purposes. At the same time we are also committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all clients and staff living and working in shared accommodation. That's why IH facilities are smoke free.
- There are other forms of medical cannabis that clients can take, however, if they do opt to smoke cannabis, it
  must be done off the property. This is in keeping with our smoke-free policy, which has been in place at
  Cottonwoods since 2012

If asked about the risk to his safety in the winter by going off property:

We encourage those who require medical cannabis to look for alternative options from smoking, recognizing it
would require them to go off property. However, if individuals choose this option, they do sign a smoke policy
risk agreement with us, acknowledge their awareness of our policy and the risk associated with continuing to
smoke. I can tell you in this situation, discussions have occurred with this client and family, and they are fully
aware of the policy.

If asked, "this is his medicine, don't you think more accommodation for him should be made based on that?"

Again, we have to balance the needs and safety of all our clients and staff. This is why anyone choosing to smoke
medical marijuana, rather than ingest it in another form, must leave the property as per our smoke free
environment policy.

What is the process for someone who smokes medical marijuana at a residential care facility?

- The client must abide by our policy, which involves signing a Use of Medical Cannabis agreement, acknowledging IH's Smoke Free Environment Policy. This means the client must smoke marijuana off IH property.
- Clients are offered options when it comes to using medical cannabis. If they choose inhalation (as opposed to oral, topical, or suppository), they must leave the property.

# RE: Health Ministers meeting and CDA requests

Dear Honourable Ministers,

As you prepare to meet in Vancouver for the federal/provincial/territorial health ministers meeting, I want to bring to your attention a number of issues that are important to the 10 million Canadians living with diabetes or prediabetes.

The first issue I want to highlight relates to foot care for people living with diabetes. As you may know, foot complications, including infections, ulcerations and amputations, are a major cause of morbidity in people with diabetes. In Canada, diabetes is the leading cause of non-traumatic lower limb amputations. In this context, we were pleased that foot care was highlighted as a key issue in the first report by the Council of the Federation's Health Care Innovation Working Group in 2012. In the report, the Working Group recommended that Ministers of Health be directed to work towards the adoption of clinical practices guidelines for the assessment and management of foot ulcers for people with diabetes.

Optimizing foot care remains very much a priority throughout Canada, and was identified as one of four policy priorities in the recently released CDA report on diabetes, "Driving Change", which was sent to your offices. We encourage you to continue to work towards improving the prevention and management of foot complications including, but not limited to: affordable and timely access to medications, devices, education; ensure access to publicly funded services and devices including professionally fitted off-loading devices as well as timely referrals and visits to a foot care specialist; and the care necessary to prevent amputations.

The introduction of a tax on sugar-sweetened beverages is a policy priority for the CDA because of the clear connection between the high consumption of such beverages and the development of type 2 diabetes. We recommend a tax on sugar sweetened beverages as a means to decrease excessive consumption and raise awareness about the health risks associated with excessive consumption. There is evidence from other jurisdictions that have implemented a tax, that consumption is reduced. The number of Canadians living with diabetes has doubled in the last twelve years, and the growth is relentless. We need to reduce the risk of people developing type 2 diabetes and we firmly believe bold policies are needed to address the mounting costs to our publicly-funded health care programs and the personal toll placed on Canadians with diabetes. The revenue generated from this tax should be used to promote healthy habits for Canadians.

The final issue I want to bring to your attention is the need for a national pharmacare program. Equitable and timely access to medications is important for the 16 million Canadians with a chronic condition, including diabetes and related complications (e.g., cardiovascular disease, stroke, kidney disease, amputation, blindness and mental illness). This is because 90% of Canadians with these conditions take at least one prescription drug, and 54% take four or more.

Since pharmaceuticals administered outside of hospitals are not publicly covered under the Canada Health Act, Canadians with a chronic disease without public coverage (e.g. social assistance, benefits to seniors, etc.) or private insurance (employers or other sources) can have high out-of-pocket costs. Out-of-pocket costs are particularly onerous for people with diabetes: most have catastrophic drug costs (>\$1,500 or 3% of individual annual income). As a result, many people are not able to adhere to prescribed therapies, compromising their diabetes management and leaving them vulnerable to complications.

I hope that you will seriously consider these issues at your upcoming meeting and future deliberations. I commit to have the Canadian Diabetes Association continue to be an empowering partner. Like you, we are determined to make a real difference in the lives of over 10 million Canadians with diabetes and pre-diabetes. I wish you all the best for a successful meeting and invite you to contact me if you require any additional information or wish to discuss further.

Dear Minister Lake,

On behalf of the CMA, I strongly welcomed your comments published in yesterday's Globe and Mail concerning federal funding to support the provision of health care for Canada's seniors population.

I'm pleased to note that as part of the CMA's initiatives on seniors care, we are recommending that the federal government implement a demographic-based top-up to the Canada Health Transfer in the next budget.

The CMA shares your concern that as an equal per-capita based transfer, the Canada Health Transfer does not currently account for population segments with increased health needs, specifically seniors.

Rather than modifying the existing transfer formula, the CMA is proposing an approach that delivers additional funding to provinces and territories to support meeting the needs of an aging population while respecting the transfer arrangement already in place. Put simply, there are no losers.

The CMA commissioned the Conference Board of Canada to calculate the amount for the top-up to the Canada Health Transfer using a needs-based projection. The amount of the top-up for each jurisdiction is based on the projected increase in health care spending associated with an aging population.

So you are aware, the CMA will be advancing this proposal as part of the federal budget consultation process. I've attached a briefing note describing the CMA's proposal. I welcome your feedback and support of this recommendation.

Hook forward to continuing this dialogue with you as part of the ministerial briefing and reception hosted by CMA and Doctors of BC in Vancouver next week.

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# Demographic Top-Up Transfer

ISSUE: How to address differential population aging in a manner that will not create losers among the provinces and territories.

#### BACKGROUND

In the 2007 federal budget the government announced that beginning in 2014 all the Canada Health Transfer (CHT) cash would be distributed on an equal per capita basis. This has had the effect of creating winners and losers among the provinces and territories. The only jurisdictions to gain in 2014-15 were AB and NT. (\$923 million and \$7 million respectively). The largest losses were experienced in ON and BC (-346 million and \$247 million).

In December 2011, the federal government announced that the losses would be compounded beginning in 2017-18 when the CHT escalator will be reduced from 6% to 3% or nominal GDP growth.<sup>2</sup> In January 2012 the Council of the Federation struck a Working Group on Fiscal Arrangements under the leadership of MB Premier Greg Selinger. It reported in July 2012 that over the 10-year CHT renewal period for 2014-15 to 2023-24 the provinces would receive \$36 billion less in CHT cash then they would have under the 2007 budget plan with a 6% escalator. Their report skirted around the gains and losses that would result from the shift to equal per capita funding.<sup>3</sup>

At their summer 2014 meeting, the Premiers released a report prepared by the Conference Board that examines federal versus provincial/territorial fiscal prospects out to 2034-35 under three health spending scenarios.<sup>4</sup> Regardless of the scenario, the federal prospects look better than those of the provinces and territories. The Parliamentary Budget Office (PBO) has reached this same finding repeatedly in its fiscal sustainability reports. Most recently, the PBO has estimated the fiscal gap in light of the recent drop in oil prices and has found that if the price remains low there will be an exacerbation of 0.2% GDP in the fiscal gap between the federal and sub national governments. (Estimated in 2014 at -1.4% and +1.7% respectively).<sup>5</sup>

Marchildon and Mou have proposed that the CHT might be allocated on the basis of need, which they have measured using the age-sex weighting of the expenditure profiles of the Canadian Institute for Health Information and a measure of geographic dispersion. The application of this formula would result in gains to all provinces except Ontario and Alberta, which would lose \$370 million and \$312 million respectively. Suffice it to say that neither province would be in support of such an approach.

At their January 30, 2015 meeting, the Premiers highlighted their aging populations and called on the federal government "to provide funding in support of provincial and territorial services that enhance the well-being of Canada's seniors, while meeting the unique requirements of each province and territory."

What might work to address differential aging? It would seem that any recalculation of the existing CHT that would take money away from any jurisdictions is a non-starter.

To support the innovation and transformation needed to address these needs, the Canadian

Medical Association recommends that the federal government deliver additional funding on an annual basis beginning in 2016–17 to the provinces and territories by means of a demographic-based top-up that would be in addition to the CHT. One approach to the calculation of this transfer is to estimate the increased provincial-territorial government health expenditure that would result from year-to-year changes in the age distribution alone, using the age-sex profiles of health expenditure that are calculated by the Canadian Institute for Health Information.8 The results for 2016 through 2020 are presented in Table 1. For the fiscal year 2016–17 this top-up would require \$1.6 billion in federal investment.

In conclusion, it seems abundantly clear that older jurisdictions will begin to feel the pinch in 2017-18, if they have not already, and this will likely undermine the solidarity behind the national Medicare program.



VS is working on a piece on mental health, related to Riverview and the need for services.

The response below is pretty long but I think necessarily so given the complexity of the issues.

Topic:

Mental health:

I am working on a story about one of the suspected fentanyl deaths in Vancouver. The mother of the victim says the mental health system failed her son (who had depression, anxiety and schizophrenia) because he was wait listed at several treatment centres.

I understand the ministry can't speak to individual cases, but one thing that has come out of this is that the mother and several agencies, including the BC Schizophrenia Society, say that the new Riverview plans do not include enough long term care beds. The latest estimate from the society is that more than 400 mental health patients are wait listed for treatment in Vancouver Coastal Health alone.

So my initial questions are:

What is the ministry's take on what the demand is for mental health illness in B.C.? IE: How many patients are estimated of 483

Also, the number of mental health beds being added at Riverview is very confusing. The Schizophrenia Society is saying it's only 17 beds but the ministry says 105. If you could please help sort this out I would be grateful. Thanks!!

#### Proposed response:

First off, I'd like to just make sure that we are talking about similar beds – while we obviously do not know the specifics of this patient or where he may have been waitlisted, we need to differentiate between long-term care beds (such as Connolly Lodge at the Riverview Grounds) and what are generally considered treatment beds, as these are usually not the same thing. Treatment is usually for a short period of time, to allow a patient to stabilize and then move into more community based care, whereas long-term care beds are for the smaller segment of the population that needs more intensive, long-term treatment and rehabilitation.

I'm also not able to comment on the Schizophrenia Society's numbers, as we do not know where they are sourced. However, from initial inquiries into treatment wait lists in VCH, the number is much lower – in the range of 50 to 100 individuals for those waiting for long term treatment and rehabilitation beds. However, as these are their numbers and information, you'd need to contact them for further details.

All that said, we do absolutely agree that there is the need for more mental health and substance use beds in the province — that is why in 2013 we committed to creating an additional 500 beds throughout the province in regional health authorities by 2017 — these beds at Riverview are just one component of that. Others include the new Joseph and Rosalie Segal Centre in Vancouver, which will open to patients in 2017, and plans for a 75-bed mental health and substance use facility at Royal Columbian Hospital to open in 2019.

However, our focus is not to lock people away in institutions, but to connect them to the right type of mental health and substance use care in their community. Clinical experts and evidence have shown that patients do better when they are well-connected with family and other support systems in their home communities. This is why we've focused much of the new investment in our mental health action plan in community-focused treatment and outreach teams.

It's important to remember that tertiary mental health facilities, like the Centre for Mental Health and Addiction soon be relocated to the Riverview lands, are not intended to provide life-long care to patients, but rather to stabilize them to a point where they can be transitioned to rehabilitation and recovery services. Last year we opened 14 new rehab and recovery beds — for a total of 40 beds offering these services on the Riverview lands — and committed \$20 million in additional health authority annual funding to services like community outreach teams.

These evidence-based teams, like the Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) teams, allow mental health and substance use patients to live in the community, close to friends and family, instead of being institutionalized. They provide ongoing, often lifelong support to clients with severe mental illness, such as schizophrenia, and substance use problems. Every health region in the province is now benefitting from ACT and other community outreach teams, with Vancouver's five ACT teams serving up to 420 clients.

Since 2001, we have increased community mental health beds in B.C. by 128 per cent, with 6,311 additional new beds (from 4,940 beds in 2001/02 to 11,616 beds as of March 2015). We've also increased community substance use beds by 195 per cent, with 1,708 new beds since 2003 (from 874 beds in 2002/03 to 2,582 beds as of March 2015). And we continue to invest in mental health and substance use services with over \$1.42 billion a year going to educate, prevent and treat people with mental illness and substance use.

We know we can't meet the needs of patients alone. We need to continue to work with our partners — our service providers, health authorities, police and the community — to provide the right care to each patient.

In regards to your questions about the number of beds being added at Riverview, before 2014, the Burnaby Centre for Mental Health and Addiction had 88 beds, including some acute stabilization beds. In December 2014, 26 of the acute stabilization beds were moved to the Brookside and Hillside facilities on the Riverview grounds. The Centre for Mental Health and Addiction Facility Replacement Project will eventually see the remaining beds at Burnaby transitioned to the 120 of 483

- B.C. has seen an increase in illicit drug-related deaths where fentanyl is also detected.
- The BC Coroners Service, regional health authorities and police have issued warnings that there could be heroin or other street opioids circulating that contain fentanyl.
- Provincial Health Officer, Dr. Perry Kendall, has asked health care
  workers to be on the lookout for potential overdoses, and BCCDC runs
  a surveillance and early warning network with provincial health
  partners to issue alerts about adulterants such as fentanyl in the illicit
  drug market.
- Vancouver Coastal Health, the Vancouver Police Department and the BCCDC have collaborated on a Know Your Source, a public service campaign to raise awareness on the importance of being drug smart and provide education on the dangers of fentanyl.
- Provincial partners also developed towardtheheart com to provide information and resources about harm reduction to health professionals, advocates and members of the public and to help people find a harm reduction site.
- While we always advise against the use of illicit drugs, if people do
  take illicit drugs, we encourage them to make a plan and make sure
  someone can call 911 at the first sign of distress; use sterile syringes
  and inject slowly with a small amount at first; do not mix with other
  substances or alcohol, and use supervised injection services such as
  Insite when possible.
- We also encourage people who may be at risk of an opioid overdose to seek out take-home naloxone training and kits as a precautionary measure.

## If asked about BC's Response

- B.C. has initiatives in place to reduce misuse of prescription opioids, but that is only a part of the problem.
- Our response to the situation in the health care system focuses on harm reduction, as much of the fentanyl seen on the streets is illicitly manufactured overseas, rather than from misdirected prescription drugs.
- B.C. funds harm reduction programs and services including needle distribution and collection, opioid substitution treatment, supervised injection services, and B.C.'s Take Home Naloxone program.
- Naloxone is a safe medication that can reverse the effects of an overdose of an opioid drug, such as heroin, morphine, fentanyl or oxycodone.
- Since 2012, people who use opioids and have overdose response training can receive "take home" naloxone kits at no cost. Training and kits are available at more than 92 sites across B.C.
- Since its launch, the program has shown effectiveness at saving lives
   more than 260 opioid drug overdoses have been reversed.
- Approximately, 3,000 kits have been distributed to people who use opioids, and more than 4,500 people have been trained to administer Naloxone, including people who use opioids, their friends and family, and service providers.
- As well Royal Inland Hospital in Kamloops, in collaboration with the Harm Reduction Program, is conducting a pilot project to provide Naloxone kits to patients at risk of overdosing. Nanaimo Regional General Hospital's ER also began making naloxone kits available to patients at risk of overdosing this year.
- B.C. also has one of the strongest prescription drug monitoring systems in Canada. This system includes:

- PharmaNet, a world class system that keeps track of prescription claims so prescribing patterns can be evaluated;
- The Restricted Claimant Review program, which registers certain PharmaCare patients to stop them from abusing the system;
- The Duplicate Prescription Program, also known as the Controlled Prescription Program, run by the B.C. College of Physicians and Surgeons. This program requires doctors to prescribe certain narcotics, such as opioids like OxyNEO, to be prescribed using a special security prescription pad that cannot be easily copied.
- The College of Physicians and Surgeons also runs the Prescription Review Program, which performs reviews for specific high-risk drugs. The college uses this information to educate doctors on prescribing patterns and areas for potential concern;
- The Ministry of Health's Provincial Academic Detailing (PAD)
  program offers education to health professionals regarding
  prescribing practices. It recently offered a module to doctors,
  pharmacists and other health professionals on opioids for noncancer pain patients.
- Both pharmacists and doctors have professional practice standards through their regulatory colleges when it comes to certain drugs – like opioids – that are more susceptible to non-medical or other problematic uses.
- Pharmacists may refuse to fill prescriptions based on suspected non-medical use or other professional practice standards.
- In 2013, for example, pharmacists documented 697 refusals in PharmaNet based on concerns about problematic use.

# FIRST NATIONS AND ABORIGINAL HEALTH

- Government is committed to working with our partners to improve the health and wellness of First Nations and Aboriginal children, families and communities.
- The 2007 Tripartite First Nations Health Plan outlined joint work among the First Nations Health Authority, Health Canada, and the BC Ministry of Health.
- · Work completed to date includes:
  - developing the First Nations and Aboriginal Mental Wellness and Substance Use Plan to help with regional and local planning;
  - implementing the First Nations Panorama project to gain access to health information for service providers; and,
  - supporting 44 new nurse practitioners in Aboriginal communities as part of the NP4BC program. The nurse practitioners are being placed Aboriginal communities, from Burnaby, to Hope, the Cranbrook Ktunaxa Nation Council, Revelstoke, Sicamous, Prince George, Old Masset and many more.
  - The safe sleep and Aboriginal Doula initiative provide culturally relevant and appropriate information to new Aboriginal mothers, and the oral health strategy aims to improve the oral health of Aboriginal children, teens, and their caregivers. Aboriginal Healthy Living Activities promote health and wellness through physical activity, healthy eating, healthy pregnancy and respecting tobacco training, using a 'train the trainer' model to reach communities. This initiative is delivered with the

support of our partners, through the Aboriginal Sport, Recreation and Physical Activity Partners Council, with approximately 260 Aboriginal leaders trained for 2014-15 delivering health and wellness initiatives to approximately 7,300 community participants.

- Gathering Our Voices is an annual youth conference hosted by our partners at the BC Association of Aboriginal Friendship Centres, which brings together approximately 1,500 youth annually. Through this avenue, youth participate in healthy living workshops, education opportunities and career planning.
- In addition to this provincial-level work, Aboriginal health programs developed by regional health authorities in partnership with Aboriginal partners work to increase cultural competency, respect and trust within our health care system. For example:
  - Aboriginal patient advocates ('liaisons'/navigators) employed by regional health authorities help families connect with health care professionals to access culturally safe care.
  - Two cultural safety coordinators were hired by Island Health to go into communities to enhance capacity to deliver culturally appropriate services to Aboriginal people.
  - All health authorities are looking at advancing cultural safety practices including Island Health's new online cultural safety training and Interior Health's new Aboriginal human resources plan to support a culturally competent workforce.
  - All health authorities participate in the San'yas Cultural Safety training. For example, 471 Northern Health staff and 347 Fraser Health staff took indigenous cultural safety training in the 2014/15 fiscal year; indigenous cultural safety training is now also mandatory for all FNHA staff, Northern Health executive and Northern

Program Area: Aboriginal Health Directorate

- Health new hires. Vancouver Coastal Health's cultural competency framework has been approved and is ready for pilot deployment.
- There has been active development in mental wellness programs and integrated community care programs in all regions in B.C., including hiring dedicated mental health clinicians and nurses, and investing in mental wellness and substance use treatment.
- The Ministry of Health, the FNHA and the Provincial Health
  Officer are prioritizing working together on implementing a
  health information governance model to update the First
  Nations Client File to link with provincial health information,
  to better fill knowledge and information access gaps with
  regard to the health status of First Nations and to support
  improved health care service delivery to First Nations.
- A Declaration of Commitment was signed by the Leadership Council in July 2015 in support of the Framework for Action on Cultural Safety and Humility for First Nations Health Services in BC.

# Key Messages - Home Support /Housekeeping Supports

Oct. 2, 2015

- The Ministry of Health is currently looking at how we can address the health care needs of today and tomorrow – including the way we deliver primary and community care.
- That is why we released Setting Priorities for the BC Health System, and a series of policy papers, which focus on how we can move away from our dependence on hospitals by:
  - o building community and primary care capacity,
  - better managing surgical services,
  - o revitalizing rural health care, and
  - continuing to promote healthy lifestyles.
- Our primary and community care policies need to be based on the principles of a health system that is patient-centred, integrated and comprehensive.
- We know that the majority of seniors want to be able to stay in their homes as long as possible.
- We've heard from the Seniors' Advocate how important it is for many seniors to stay independent.
- And, in fact, we know that providing them the tools to do that is not only the right thing to do from a patient care perspective, but from a financial perspective as well.
- It is far less expensive to provide care in the community than it is in the acute or residential care system.
- To set out our priorities and figure out the best ways to reach these goals, we are currently consulting with a wide range of stakeholders on our policy papers.

- In fact, we recently completed a two-day forum doing just that, bringing together leadership and representatives from the Ministry, the health authorities and key stakeholders to strategize about the direction our health system is moving.
- Dozens of representatives from every health authority in B.C., as well as key health organizations, gathered for a working session to find concrete actions we can take on the front lines of the health system to improve primary and community care for seniors.
- Because we recognize that while we are providing more funding to serve more seniors, there are still gaps, as the seniors population continues to grow. We need to identify innovative ways to close those gaps.
- Home care and home support services are of course a key component.
- Over the coming weeks and months, we will continue to consult with practitioners, health authorities, patient groups and other stakeholders on these papers as we seek to improve our health care system.

# Secondary:

- British Columbia has a range of comprehensive, well-funded home health services
- Some of these services include: community nursing, community rehabilitation, adult day programs and home support.
- Home support includes Choice in Supports for Independent Living and end-of-life care to support seniors and people with disabilities to manage their health care needs and remain in the community.
- Although there is an income-based client rate for home support services, in 2014, approximately 68% of clients did not have to pay to receive home support services.
- There is no charge for community nursing and rehabilitation services, regardless of income.

# Facts on Home Care and Home Support:

- In 2013/14, health authorities reported spending \$2.8 billion on home and community care, up \$1.2 billion from 2001 — an increase of 79%. This includes:
  - increased spending on residential care, from just over \$1.1 billion in 2001 to more than \$1.8 billion today — an increase of 56%;
  - increased spending on community care services, from \$404 million in 2001 to \$994 million today — an increase of 146%.
- Between 2001/02 and 2013/14:
  - o The number of clients receiving home health services increased 26% from over 78,349 to 98,611.
  - The number of clients receiving professional services (community nursing, community rehabilitation and other services) increased by 55% — from 53,454 to 82,594.
  - The number of clients receiving adult day services increased by 5% — from 5,899 to 6,206 clients.
  - The average number of hours of home support services per client, per year (including Choice in Supports for Independent Living) increased from 212 to 272 hours.
- In 2013/14 there were 8.45 million hours of home support provided, 21% more than just four years earlier.
- From 2005/06 to 2013/14 access to home support services for people
   75 and over increased by 22%

# If asked about changes to housekeeping supports:

- Health authorities review every home support client based on their individual needs. Clients who need personal medical care at home will always receive it.
- The health authorities focus their resources on providing personal medical care to ensure that home support is available to a growing number of people with health needs and to those assessed for and awaiting placement in residential care.

- Home support services aim to supplement, but not replace, care and support provided by individuals, their families and friends, and other community resources. Home support is just one of many resources available.
- There are a number of avenues that are often available for clients who
  receive home support but would also like non-home support services
  such as housekeeping.
- We know that there can be value in providing some housekeeping and maintenance services for seniors to help them remain independent and at home in their communities longer.
- That's why we've invested \$22 million with the United Way of the Lower Mainland to expand the Better at Home non-medical home support program across the province.
- The Better at Home program supports seniors with non-medical home services to help them stay living independently in their own homes for as long as possible.
- Examples of Better at Home services include: friendly visits, light yard work, minor home repair, transportation to appointments, snow shovelling, light housekeeping and grocery shopping.

**REQUEST:** Honourable Norm Letnick, MLA, Kelowna – Lake Country, is writing a column about wait lists in Interior Health (IH) (Vernon/Kelowna/Pentiction), and is requesting answers/information to the following points.

- 1. In BC do hospitals keep their own waitlists for various procedures or is it held at IH?
- 2. Information on how (and in what instances) British Columbians can travel within the province (or Canada) to get on a shorter waitlist.
- 3. Information on what is being done to reduce wait lists (across the board) i.e MRI announcement information
- 4. Capital investments etcetera...

### Q1 - Do BC Hospitals keep their own waitlists for various procedures, or is it held at IH?

- Waitlists in BC are surgeon-specific. They are not procedure-specific, facility-specific, or health authority-specific.
- Medical Practitioners are responsible for creating and maintaining their waitlists, and determining the order in which patients will receive surgery.
- Operating room time is allocated in accordance with the health authorities' policies and agreements with the surgeons. Such policies and agreements vary among health authorities, hospitals, and surgical groups.
- The wait time begins when the hospital receives notification from the surgeon's office that the patient needs surgery. Each surgeon is allocated operating room time and books their patients based on urgency and time spent on the wait list.
- Available operating room time is contingent on a number of factors, including the
  availability of medical professionals, equipment, medication, and bed space. Shortages in
  any of these areas can impact operating room availability and wait times.
- Wait lists may also be affected by emergency surgeries, which take priority and account for more than half of all surgeries, performed in the regional health authorities.
- A few instances exist in the province where surgeons have joined together to offer a service model often referred to as 'pooled referral' or 'first surgeon available.' In these instances, the patient will be referred to the service group, rather than an individual surgeon, and they receive their surgery from the next available surgeon. Waitlists are thus levelled out amongst the group of surgeons, with the objective of reducing a patient's wait.

# <u>Q2 - How and in what instances can British Columbians travel within the province</u> (or Canada), to get on a shorter waitlist?

• As waitlists are surgeon-specific, patients can request at any time that they be referred to an alternative surgeon (e.g. one with a shorter waitlist).

- Family physicians are able to refer patients to a surgeon with a shorter wait time, if one is available, anywhere in the Province.
- Individuals are responsible for arranging and paying for travel to a planned appointment or service not available in their community (e.g., visiting a specialist, obtaining specialized diagnostic testing, getting surgery).
- The Ministry of Health funds three programs to help alleviate some of the transportation
  costs for eligible British Columbia residents who must travel within the province for
  non-emergency medical specialist services not available in their own community: Health
  Connections, the Travel Assistance Program, and the British Columbia Family Residence
  Program.
- In regard to out of province care, residents of BC are covered for medically necessary physician and hospital services obtained in other Canadian provinces, provided the service rendered is a benefit of MSP, and the patient is registered with MSP at the time of service.
- A reciprocal agreement is in place with all provinces (other than Quebec) which covers
  only those medically required services provided by a physician or in hospital, in
  accordance with the Canada Health Act.
- Medical transportation is not covered under the Canada Health Act, and is not included in inter-provincial reciprocal billing agreements. Individuals are responsible for the costs associated with any travel and accommodation incurred.

# <u>Q 3 – What is being done to reduce wait lists (across the board) i.e. MRI announcement information</u>

#### **Diagnostic**

- BC hospitals maintain their own wait lists for medical imaging services performed within their facilities. Community imaging clinics maintain individual wait lists for ultrasound services they perform. Outpatient X-ray services are provided on a walk-in basis, and as such do not have formal wait lists.
- BC patients are able to receive publicly funded medical imaging services in any Canadian jurisdiction, based on a requisition from a duly qualified practitioner (usually a physician) licensed to practice in that jurisdiction. For patients living in border communities, BC physicians are able to refer patients to facilities in Alberta, and this commonly occurs. If patients wish to travel outside Canada to receive scheduled medical services, pre-authorization from the Medical Services Plan is required for services to be publicly funded.
- To reduce wait lists for MRI scans, in November 2015, Premier Clark announced the MRI Strategy, which will increase the volume of MRI scans being done each year by 45 percent within the next 3 years. To improve access to ultrasound, in 2012, government increased the training seats at the BC Institute for Technology by 6 seats, bringing the total to 30 per year.

#### Surgical

- Several initiatives are underway to improve surgical wait times in both the short-term and
  the long-term. In June 2015, the Ministry announced an additional \$10 million to increase
  surgical capacity throughout the province, including increasing surgical slates for patients
  who had been waiting the longest. This funding allowed health authorities to perform an
  estimated 1,000 extra surgical procedures (orthopaedics, hernias, ear, nose and throat,
  cataracts and plastics) between June and August, and we expect these increases will
  continue through March 2016.
- The Ministry recently published a policy paper outlining a number of other initiatives to improve wait times and help us better meet surgical demand. The paper, Futures Direction for Surgical Services, outlines improvements in operating room (OR) efficiency, human strategies and information that will help improve surgical care over the long term. If you are interested, the paper is available online at: www.health.gov.bc.ca/library/publications/year/2015/surgical-services-policy-paper.pdf.
- The health authorities are also working on initiatives that align with this strategy including:
  - o By using private surgical centres to perform day surgeries, this has freed up operating rooms (OR) in hospitals to complete more complex inpatient surgical procedures
  - Developing standardized care pathways and evidence-based timelines for surgeries
  - o Implementing practice guidelines for consulting with patients on treatment options
  - Encouraging alternative practice models such as multidisciplinary team-based practice, pooled referrals, alternative treatments and support from surgery to rehabilitation
  - Optimizing surgical infrastructure and OR time use
  - o Optimizing wait list management, a standardized approach, processes and definitions
  - o Implementing a comprehensive performance management and accountability framework for surgical services
  - o Implementing a surgical health human resources strategy.
- Specifically, IHA is committed to arranging publicly funded day surgeries in private
  facilities which will free up hospital operating rooms for more complex surgical
  procedures. As well, in November they began implementing the next phase of the plan to
  address patients who have been waiting in excess of 40 weeks for their surgeries. This
  includes local patients and surgeons in Kelowna and, again, will focus on the areas of
  orthopedics, cataracts and ears, nose and throats.

- 2) Supporting and facilitating comprehensive environmental monitoring systems for early detection and response to potentially hazardous conditions, and
- 3) Ensuring rapid and effective incident response systems are in place to protect public health It is important to be clear that Interior Health is not responsible for approval of the AJAX project. As such, we work in partnership with the responsible agencies and other stakeholders to achieve our objectives. Throughout the review process we keep an eye to our duties under the Public Health and Drinking Water Protection Acts if/when the operation is approved, including responding to complaints and undertaking health hazard investigations.

#### Q: What items will IH be looking at?

A: Interior Health's Health Protection department has provided a list of the 251 specific sections in the application that our team we will be reviewing. All these sections relate to the potential for exposure to unsafe air, water, or soil.

#### Q: What is the Medical Health Officer's Role

A: The Office of the Medical Health Officer is responsible for monitoring, protecting and improving the health of the population within the Interior Health region. Our Medical Health Officers (MHOs) are legally mandated to provide independent consultation and direction under the BC Public Health Act. The Office works in collaboration with public health programs to prevent disease, injury, disability and death, to reduce health inequities, and to protect the public from environmental and other risks to health.

#### Q:Does the request by the city of Kamloops change any of IH's involvement

A: Yes. It helps to clarify our commitment to support local communities in ensuring healthy and safe industries. The consultation period is open for comment until March 19, 2016. If Health Canada makes a decision to change the status of a prescription drug there is usually 6 month notice period between the decision and the implementation. However that can be waived and the Minister's statement says "Health Canada intends to waive the usual six-month implementation period that follows such decisions so that the change in status can occur as quickly as possible."

There is also another process where-by restrictions on the conditions of sale are based on recommendations made by National Association of Pharmacy Regulatory Authorities (NAPRA). NAPRA recommends that products be placed on one of three schedules (I, II, III), each reflecting a different level of restrictions (prescription, behind-the-counter, self-selection area of the pharmacy 145 of 483 thoughts on these issues, especially from the Pharmaceutical Services angle about implications for your services that we would not think about, would be appreciated.

Health Canada today proposed a change to make naloxone more widely available to Canadians in support of efforts to address the growing number of opioid overdoses. After taking the unprecedented step of initiating a review of the drug's prescription status, Health Canada has put forward an amendment to the prescription drug list to allow non-prescription use of naloxone specifically for emergency use for opioid overdose outside hospital settings. The product labelling would be revised and training would be required for those potentially administering the drug. A donsultation seeking views on this proposal has been launched.

Naloxone is a drug administered by injection that reverses the effects of opioid medications and can be used to temporarily counteract opioid overdoses. Some provinces have already expanded the availability of naloxone through community-based take-home programs, and others have undertaken regulatory changes to allow use by first responders.

Health Canada's goal in considering whether to change the prescription status of any drug is to determine whether it can be used safely outside the direct supervision of a health-care practitioner. Working closely with the provinces and territories the Department requested, collected and assessed: the health and safety data, such as the record of adverse reactions associated with naloxone use; the need for immediate follow-up treatment (since the effects of naloxone are temporary); and the requirements for administering the drug.

Health Canada undertakes a public consultation whenever a change is proposed to the prescription status of any drug. Canadians are encouraged to provide comments on the proposal [LiNK] until (GIVE DATE). If the change in status continues to be supported by the evidence and input received during the consultation, the change will be finalized. Health Canada intends to waive the usual six-month implementation period that follows such decisions so that the change in status can occur as quickly as possible.

Health Canada remains concerned about the growing number of opioid overdoses and deaths occurring across Canada, and will continue working with the provinces and territories and other stakeholders to address this important issue.

I am writing in follow-up to our meeting of December 1, 2015, regarding the closure of Mountain View Home. I appreciated the opportunity to speak with you and with other family members of those affected by the closure, and I commend your continued advocacy on behalf of your s.22

I was glad to know that you have been happy with the care your <sup>s.22</sup> has received at Mountain View Home, and I acknowledge that the upcoming change may be difficult for <sup>s.22</sup> However, I know Fraser Health staff are committed to working with your family to address your concerns as the transition moves forward. As well, I want to ensure you that the concerns you and other family members raised to me about the transition process have been passed onto representatives from Fraser Health Authority and Ministry staff will continue to monitor the transition process. I understand Mr. Doug Hughes, Assistant Deputy Minister, Health Services Policy Division spoke with you on January 11, 2015, to provide an update following further conversations with Fraser Health, and there is a follow up meeting planned for early February.

As you may be aware, while the Ministry sets the overall policy for the health system, decisions regarding the operation or closure of facilities such as Mountain View Home rest fully with the regional health authority. Fraser Health's focus remains on providing the best quality of care to clients like your s.22 and ensuring there are options that meet s.2 needs. Their decisions regarding Mountain View Home align with the provincial aim of helping people with mental health and substance abuse issues live as independently as possible with high quality, appropriate support services tailored to their needs.

I want to assure you again that mental health clients in Abbotsford will not be losing any services during or after the transition period. The new facility on Marshall Road will include the 25 licensed care beds currently associated with Mountain View Home, along with another 5 licensed care beds and 20 assisted living beds. In conjunction with 18 supported independent living beds, this will increase the total mental health housing units in the Abbotsford area to 68.

Fraser Health is also increasing the number of mental health spaces throughout the region. When an additional 24 beds at Nicola Lodge in the Tri-Cities and 90 Assertive Community Treatment spaces split between Abbotsford/Mission and Surrey/North Delta, New Westminster/Tri-Cities are added in 2016, it will bring the total to 2,050 mental health spaces in Fraser Health – a 31% increase since 2007.

Fraser Health's goal is to prioritize appropriately within their budget to ensure the best quality care for patients in the region. They have guaranteed that any client currently receiving licensed residential services who requires that level of care will continue to receive it at the Marshall Road facility or at a facility in another community of their preference. Each client will have an individually designed care plan that responds to their needs.

This transition is not just about providing more capacity, but also providing care better suited to each client's unique situation. A client who starts out needing 24-hour licensed care often can progress, with treatment, to more independence. We have heard from some clients that they want to live more independently in the community as they recover from their illness. The move toward diversifying the nature of the beds available will support them in achieving this goal.

The year-long transition process will also give Fraser Health time to address your family's questions and concerns, and to develop an individual care plan that supports your <sup>s.22</sup> needs. Fraser Health is committed to continuing to support clients and their families as Mountain View Home residents transition into their new homes. If you encounter any difficulties with the transition process or have further questions and concerns that are not satisfactorily resolved by health authority staff, I encourage you to contact the Fraser Health Patient Care Quality Office (PCQO). The PCQO works to investigate complaints about care received or access to services, as well as to ensure clients and their families are connected with the best information to resolve their concerns. Thank you for taking the time to meet with me and bring forward the shared concerns of the s.22 I appreciate the opportunity to clarify and reconfirm government's commitment to ensuring that clients at Mountain View Home will continue to have access to the services and support they require.

Dear Grand Chief Kelly and Co-Signers:

On behalf of Premier Christy Clark, let me thank you for your letter dated October 8, 2015, regarding healthy, self-determining, and vibrant BC First Nations children, families, and communities. The Premier has requested that I respond on her behalf. Please accept my apologies for the delayed response.

My colleague, the Honourable Stephanie Cadieux, Minister of Children and Family Development, and I are both pleased with the success to date of the BC Tripartite Framework Agreement on First Nation Health Governance (Framework Agreement) and the creation of the First Nations Health Authority (FNHA). The ongoing partnership between the First Nations Health Council and the BC Ministry of Health to implement the Framework Agreement has been a positive one due to our shared commitment to eliminate inequalities between the health of BC First Nations and other British Columbians. In particular, the collaboration that is occurring at the regional partnership tables between regional First Nation caucuses and regional health authorities, as well as the policy table between the Ministry of Health and the FNHA, which approves and funds primary care projects, continues to show positive results.

The success of the BC Cabinet-First Nations Leaders' Gathering on September 9, 2015, reinforced the need for First Nations Leaders and government to work together on issues such as improving services to children, youth and families. To support this partnership, Grand Chief Ed John was appointed as a Senior Advisor on Aboriginal child welfare to work with the Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD) and the Delegated Aboriginal Agencies to support and promote permanency planning in First Nations communities. In responding to the Representative for Children and Youth report, Paige's Story: Abuse, Indifference and a Young Life Discarded, we recognize the need to work with our Aboriginal partners in order to more effectively respond to the needs of Aboriginal children, youth and families.

I have asked my office to work with you and Minister Cadieux's office to arrange a meeting with the First Nations Health Council's Collaboration Partnerships Working Group to discuss how we can best approach working together to achieve better outcomes for First Nations children, families and communities. We look forward to developing with you some pragmatic next steps toward this important goal.

# Dr. Peter AIDS Foundation granted exemption for integrated supervised injection service

Vancouver, BC – The Dr. Peter AIDS Foundation and Vancouver Coastal Health are delighted at today's announcement by Health Canada that the Dr. Peter Centre has been granted an exemption under federal law to continue to provide supervised injection services.

Federal Health Minister Dr. Jane Philpott confirmed that the Dr. Peter AIDS Foundation received a Section 56 exemption under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (CDSA), which ensures the centre's nurses and clients would not be charged under federal drug laws.

In partnership with Vancouver Coastal Health, Dr. Peter AIDS Foundation operates the Dr. Peter Centre, an internationally recognized health care facility located in Vancouver, which cares for people living with HIV who also have complex health and social issues, including mental illness and addictions. The Dr. Peter Centre integrated nurse-supervised injection service into its broad range of health care services in 2002.

"This announcement is a significant step forward for Canadian health care," said Maxine Davis, executive director, Dr. Peter AIDS Foundation. "The Government of Canada has finally recognized that supervised injection reduces the harms of drug use for persons who are actively addicted to injectable drugs."

"Others have looked to our model as an example of how to incorporate supervised injection services into their health care system. This exemption validates that model and we can now hold the Dr. Peter Centre up as a leader in meeting the needs of people living with HIV and addictions," Davis said.

Incorporating supervised injection into nursing care at the Dr. Peter Centre helps prevent infections, overdose deaths and the spread of disease such as hepatitis C, while at the same time engaging vulnerable people in effective HIV treatment. Stable access to supervised injection is especially critical given the steadily increasing rates of opiate overdoses and the presence of fentanyl in the illicit drug market in Vancouver and throughout B.C.

"Overdose deaths in Vancouver are on the rise and injection services, like those provided at the Dr. Peter Centre and Insite, are needed now more than ever," said Dr. Patricia Daly, Chief Medical Health Officer, Vancouver Coastal Health. "Health Canada's approval of this exemption application paves the way for us to explore additional opportunities for incorporating supervised injection into existing health care services for those suffering from addiction."

VCH is responsible for the delivery of \$3.4 billion in community, hospital and residential care to more than one million people in communities including Richmond, Vancouver, the North Shore, Sunshine Coast, Sea to Sky corridor, Powell River, Bella Bella and Bella Coola.

The Dr. Peter AIDS Foundation, with funding from VCH, BC Housing, and donors, operates the Dr. Peter Centre, which provides compassionate HIV care to people living with complex health and social issues including mental illness, addictions, poverty and homelessness. The Centre uses an integrated model to engage individuals in their health care with a specific goal of improved adherence to HIV treatment and overall improved health.

#### Medical equipment funding for clinic in B.C.'s wild, rugged and beautiful West Chilcotin

TATLA LAKE – The West Chilcotin Healthcare Society received \$50,000 from the Province for specialized equipment for their remote medical clinic. The clinic provides primary and interim emergency care to a tight-knit community of 500 people.

"Supporting primary care in rural and remote communities is a priority in our work to strengthen the health-care model for all British Columbians," said Health Minister Terry Lake. "This medical equipment will help staff at the West Chilcotin Health Centre deliver high-quality care closer to where their patients live and work."

This Interior Health clinic serves the regions of Kleena Klene, Puntzi, Chilko, Bluff, Sapeye, Tatla and Tatlayoko lakes. Dr. Robert Coetzee provides medical services at the West Chilcotin Health Centre, which is staffed by Ruth Kuehl-Venn, a remote-certified nurse, and receptionist April Wright. With the nearest hospital three hours away by road in Williams Lake, the staff provide a wide variety of care daily, and emergency medicine as needed while ambulance support is on the way.

"The ranchers, loggers and old homesteader families of the West Chilcotin are an incredibly self-reliant community," said Donna Barnett, MLA for Cariboo-Chilcotin. "Providing this equipment supports this independence, while ensuring medical staff have the right tools at their fingertips to provide medical care guickly and effectively."

The government funds supplement the \$40,000 raised in the community over the past several years. Seeing a need to provide updated and specialized medical equipment for the community, residents and local businesses have come together to fundraise to buy medical equipment that they themselves or neighbours may need one day.

"For such a small community, we've had an overwhelming amount of support for the clinic; logging companies who work in the area, lodges and families have been incredibly generous," said Dr. Mike Smialowski, retired physician and president of the society. "The purchases we have made and are making will exponentially increase the medical capabilities within in the community."

In an area where house calls are a regular part of family practice, Dr. Smialowski shares that in a community where you know everybody, doctors may attend to patients wherever they are, at all hours, for a wide variety of medical concerns.

"Depending on the severity of the call, we may provide complete medical treatment for our patients on the spot or stabilize them until an ambulance arrives by air or road, which can sometimes take several hours," said Smialowski. "Having specialized medical equipment, such as a cardiac monitor and defibrillator or an intra-osseous drill can mean better emergency

medical treatment and outcomes for patients."

To improve health care for British Columbians in every region of the province, the Ministry of Health has developed the overarching strategy, Setting Priorities for the B.C. Health System. As part of this, a series of policy papers — with a focus on primary and community care, rural health services and health human resources — were created to help guide the changes needed to build a better health system.

## Q1. What are you announcing today?

- Government is providing \$50,000 for the West Chilcotin Healthcare Society to help purchase specialized medical equipment for the West Chilcotin Health Centre in the remote community of Tatla Lake.
  - The individuals and businesses in Tatla Lake and the surrounding community also contributed \$40,000 over the past several years to support the centre's equipment needs.

## Q2. Who will benefit from this funding?

 The clinic serves the regions of Kleena Klene, Puntzi, Chilko, Bluff, Sapeye, Tatla and Tatlayoko lakes — a community of approximately 500 people.

## Q3. What types of equipment is the West Chilcotin Healthcare Society purchasing?

 Currently, the society has purchased a cardiac monitor and defibrillator and an intraosseous drill, with plans to purchase other equipment such as a slit lamp, point of care laboratory testing, and a portable ultrasound.

## Q4. Does the West Chilcotin Healthcare Society run the clinic?

 No, the West Chilcotin Health Centre is an Interior Health facility, and is supported by the society.

## Q5. Who provides medical care at the West Chilcotin Health Centre?

- Dr. Robert Coetzee provides medical services at the centre, which is staffed by Interior Health employees Ruth Kuehl-Venn, a remote certified nurse and receptionist April Wright.
- The medical staff provide both primary health care and interim emergency care, as the nearest hospital three hours away by road in Williams Lake.

#### Q6. Where is Tatla Lake?

 Tatla Lake is located 223 km west of Williams Lake, along the Chilcotin-Bella Coola/BC-20 West Highway.

- A biobank is a collection of biological samples such as blood and tissue, along with associated health information, which have been collected with donor consent and under stringent ethical guidelines.
- This is important because the health care system is evolving from one that services the "average" patient to one
  that delivers personalized, targeted therapy to each individual. Estimates show that 37% of the North is rural and
  18% of the population is Aboriginal so it's critical to understand the genetic make ups of the different
  populations.
- This innovative research partnership involves Northern Health, the First Nations Health Authority, the Provincial
   Health Services Authority, the BC Cancer Agency and Genome BC.

Most of the information on SPH redevelopment is accurate...I think it's from the original announcement NR from April 13, 2015.

The only thing that's no longer being contemplated at the new site is "social housing"...this is based on the dialogues we've had with the City's planning department over the past few months.

The City of Vancouver is very opposed to discussion of certain kinds of residential solutions for that site – social housing or condo developments, etc. – as it's not zoned for it and not part of the existing community plan.

What the city agrees with is this definition: "institutional health-related residential uses (for example, complex care and/or frail elderly residential uses)."

If caucus comms can be made aware of this somehow, then they can ensure the information used during the byelection period is more aligned with what we've learned (i.e. not to'include "social housing" but to continue to include "residential care for frail elderly" etc.).

Sorry, I know this has nothing to do with your Ministry job. Let me know if I should directly send to someone else at Caucus communications?

We continue to work with residents and families regarding individualized transition planning looking at options that suit them best both at Marshall Road and other facilities.

- ? 3 beds are currently vacant: one person has gone to Willow Manor Chilliwack, one to Tertiary and one resident is in hospital awaiting Community Residential Program placement (but will not be returning to MVH). Vacant beds are not being filled as MVH downsizes.
- ? 2 residents are possible for Nicola Lodge (licensed beds, new build in Tricities, opening April 2016)
- ? 1: Assisted Living at Pleasant view campus Mission, OT assessment pending.
- ? 1: Chilliwack, level of care to be determined with client/family after OT assessment
- ? 2-3 possibilities for Willow Manor Chilliwack.
- ? Transition plans being developed for other residents to Marshall Road, mostly Licensed Care, one for Assisted Living confirmed.

# **Key Messages - Mountain View Closure**

Jan. 8, 2016

- Mental illness can strike any family, but providing the right care at the right time can save a life or prevent long term mental health issues.
- The ministry and health authorities have been working hard to ensure that our mental health services put patients and families first and meet their diverse needs.
- We cannot take a one-size-fits-all approach to providing care and services.
- That is why we have been introducing a larger variety of options for care

   from full licensed residential care services to supported housing and
   independent living with basic community supports for those who do not
   need or want to live in a care facility, and a wide range of options in
   between.
- We recognized long ago that institutionalization does not work for patients – providing care that meets the patients where they are is far preferable.
- Ending the contract with the 25-bed Mountain View Home in August 2016 will allow for funding to be reinvested in the new 50-bed Marshall Road Residential Campus.
- Fraser Health will work with each resident and their family closely over the coming months to ensure all arrangements are in place for a smooth transition to a new facility with the appropriate care they need – including continuation of 24/7 residential care if that is their preference.
- Mountain View residents will be offered the opportunity to remain in Abbotsford and will be given priority consideration to transition to the new development at Marshall Road.
- This change increases the number of mental health beds in the community from 58 to 68 and provides a wider range of services to patients.

- The new Marshall Road facility is a great example of the ministry's priority to invest more in community-based programs; ensuring people receive the care they need in the most appropriate environment.
- When Marshall Road opens in 2016, Fraser Health will have increased the mental health housing capacity in Abbotsford by 62 spaces since 2007 and increased by 450 spaces across Fraser Health.

# If asked about moving away from strictly licensed residential care:

- Individuals living and recovering from serious mental illness need an integrated continuum of housing options that allows them to progress to more independent forms of supported accommodation as they recover.
- Individuals living with mental illness have been clear that they do not want 24 hour licensed care as their only housing and care option, and that they want to live more independently in the community as they recover from their illness.
- As Fraser Health works with clients and family members over the course on individual transition plans in preparation for the opening of the new Marshall Road Campus of Care in the summer, they will ensure that all clients who need the 24/7 care provided by licensed residential care will continue to receive this level of care.

# If asked about reduced service claims:

- Fraser Health is increasing the number of mental health beds in the community, as well as the range of services their clients can access.
- In fact, when an additional 24 beds at Nicola Lodge In Tri-Cities and 90
  Assertive Community Treatment spaces split between Abbotsford/
  Mission and Surrey/North Delta, New Westminster/Tri-Cities are added
  in 2016, it will bring the total to 2,050 mental health spaces a 31%
  increase since 2007.
- When the new Marshall Road facility opens there will be 68 beds in place of the current 55 in the community.
  - o 30 licensed care beds
  - 20 assisted living beds

- 18 supported independent living beds
- This is about not just providing more capacity, but also providing care better suited to clients' unique individual needs.
- A client who starts out needing 24-hour licensed care often can progress, with treatment, to more independence.

# Supporting client transitions:

- Ensuring clients and families are fully informed and engaged is an important part of the transition process.
- The transition period is a year-long process and provides the health authority with the time they need to work closely with their clients and their families so they can be involved in the planning meetings.
- It is important they feel part of the process and that their concerns are addressed and needs are met.

# If asked about impacts to staff:

- Approximately 43 staff members (full and part-time) will be impacted by the termination of the Mountain View contract.
- These are not employees of Fraser Health; however, they will be able to apply for other opportunities with Fraser Health, including with the MPA Society, the service provider for the new Marshall Road facility.

# If asked about 900 beds needed:

- The Fraser Health mental health housing plan referenced was developed in 2006.
- The 2006 housing plan also called for a diversification of housing options, including more independent living options.
- As a result, Fraser Health has moved towards diversifying their housing options. If a client is in need of licensed residential care, they would get licensed care.

- Since the 2006 report, housing resources have been reshaped and expanded to include not only 24 hour licensed residential care but also a broader continuum of housing options that includes supported housing and assisted living - a model of care that provides clients with greater independence and on-site supports.
- Fraser Health continues to review its housing resources and develop new forms of housing, including licensed residential care.
- When Marshall Road opens in 2016, they will have increased the mental health housing capacity in Abbotsford by 62 beds since 2007 and increased by 450 beds across Fraser Health
- Fraser Health is committed to providing a broad continuum of mental health housing in a range of residential/housing environments where individuals can be supported in shaping their own recoveries.

VS is working on a piece on mental health, related to Riverview and the need for services.

The response below is pretty long but I think necessarily so given the complexity of the issues.

Topic:

Mental health:

I am working on a story about one of the suspected fentanyl deaths in Vancouver. The mother of the victim says the mental health system failed her son (who had depression, anxiety and schizophrenia) because he was wait listed at several treatment centres.

I understand the ministry can't speak to individual cases, but one thing that has come out of this is that the mother and several agencies, including the BC Schizophrenia Society, say that the new Riverview plans do not include enough long term care beds. The latest estimate from the society is that more than 400 mental health patients are wait listed for treatment in Vancouver Coastal Health alone.

So my initial questions are:

What is the ministry's take on what the demand is for mental health illness in B.C.? IE: How many patients are estimated to need long term care?

Why are there only 105 beds planned for the Riverview project when the demand is much higher?

What are the province's plans to house patients with severe mental health illness who require long term care on an indefinite basis?

Also, the number of mental health beds being added at Riverview is very confusing. The Schizophrenia Society is saying it's only 17 beds but the ministry says 105. If you could please help sort this out I would be grateful. Thanks!!

## Proposed response:

I'm also not able to comment on the Schizophrenia Society's numbers, as we do not know where they are sourced. However, from initial inquiries into treatment wait lists in VCH, the number is much lower – in the range of 50 to 100 individuals for those waiting for long term treatment and rehabilitation beds. However, as these are their numbers and information, you'd need to contact them for further details.

All that said, we do absolutely agree that there is the need for more mental health and substance use beds in the province — that is why in 2013 we committed to creating an additional 500 beds throughout the province in regional health authorities by 2017 — these beds at Riverview are just one component of that. Others include the new Joseph and Rosalie Segal Centre in Vancouver, which will open to patients in 2017, and plans for a 75-bed mental health and substance use facility at Royal Columbian Hospital to open in 2019.

However, our focus is not to lock people away in institutions, but to connect them to the right type of mental health and substance use care in their community. Clinical experts and evidence have shown that patients do better when they are well-connected with family and other support systems in their home communities. This is why we've focused much of the new investment in our mental health action plan in community-focused treatment and outreach teams.

It's important to remember that tertiary mental health facilities, like the Centre for Mental Health and Addiction soon be relocated to the Riverview lands, are not intended to provide life-long care to patients, but rather to stabilize them to a point where they can be transitioned to rehabilitation and recovery services. Last year we opened 14 new rehab and recovery beds — for a total of 40 beds offering these services on the Riverview lands — and committed \$20 million in additional health authority annual funding to services like community outreach teams.

These evidence-based teams, like the Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) teams, allow mental health and substance use patients to live in the community, close to friends and family, instead of being institutionalized. They provide ongoing, often lifelong support to clients with severe mental illness, such as schizophrenia, and substance use problems. Every health region in the province is now benefitting from ACT and other community outreach teams, with Vancouver's five ACT teams serving up to 420 clients.

Since 2001, we have increased community mental health beds in 8.C. by 128 per cent, with 6,311 additional new beds (from 4,940 beds in 2001/02 to 11,616 beds as of March 2015). We've also increased community substance use beds by 195 per cent, with 1,708 new beds since 2003 (from 874 beds in 2002/03 to 2,582 beds as of March 2015). And we continue to invest in mental health and substance use services with over \$1.42 billion a year going to educate, prevent and treat people with mental illness and substance use.

We know we can't meet the needs of patients alone. We need to continue to work with our partners — our service providers, health authorities, police and the community — to provide the right care to each patient.

In regards to your questions about the number of beds being added at Riverview, before 2014, the Burnaby Centre for Mental Health and Addiction had 88 beds, including some acute stabilization beds. In December 2014, 26 of the acute stabilization beds were moved to the Brookside and Hillside facilities on the Riverview grounds. The Centre for Mental Health and Addiction Facility Replacement Project will eventually see the remaining beds at Burnaby transitioned to the Riverview grounds, with an additional 17 beds, for a total of 105 beds at Riverview.

#### REQUEST

Ontario's Associate Minister of Health and Long Term Care (Long Term Care and Wellness) has requested a brief meeting with Minister Lake and the Ministers from Manitoba and Nova Scotia to discuss e-cigarette legislation.

#### BACKGROUND

Seven provinces (BC, MB, ON, QC, NB, NS, PEI) have passed legislation to regulate e-cigarettes, including a ban on sales to minors and restricting its use in indoor public/workplaces. Restrictions come into effect:

- Nova Scotia May 31, 2015.
- New Brunswick July 1, 2015.
- P.E.I. September 1, 2015 for provisions prohibiting use in places where smoking is banned; other provisions in effect October 1, 2015.
- Quebec November 26, 2015 for most provisions; others in 2016
- Ontario January 1, 2016 for sales to minors, other provisions awaiting proclamation.
- British Columbia awaiting proclamation. Bill 14 received Royal Assent May 14, 2015.
- Manitoba awaiting proclamation. Bill 30 received Royal Assent November 5, 2015.

At the request of the former federal Minister of Health, the House of Commons Standing Committee on Health held hearings and released a report recommending federal regulation of e-cigarettes. The federal government has not made any announcements on their regulatory direction for e-cigarettes.

#### **FINDINGS:**

- In BC, the *Tobacco Control Amendment Act*, passed this spring in the Legislature, amends the *Tobacco Control Act* to include requirements for retailers to ensure vapour products are sold only to adults aged 19 and above, and makes it possible to create regulations to ensure that no retail displays are targeted to youth and no retail advertising for vapour products is shown where youth can see it.
- Amendments will ensure vapour products are not sold in public buildings and their use is banned on public and private school grounds as well as in indoor public spaces and workplaces.
- These amendments also add prohibitions on tobacco and vapour products use on health authority properties; however health authorities will have the ability to set designated smoking/vaping areas if they wish.
- A discussion paper was sent to stakeholders for input on the regulations, including:
  - o Date of coming into force.
  - o Minimum age of customers and required identification.
  - o Restrictions on the promotion, sale and use of vapour products.

- o An increase to the size of the buffer zone outside doorways, open windows and air intakes for tobacco and vapour products.
- o The use of vapour products and tobacco on health authority property.
- Many of the current regulations related to tobacco remain unchanged.
- The consultation process closed on November 20, 2015 and feedback is being reviewed.
- A range of views were expressed in the consultation many users and retailers were
  concerned that vapour products were being associated with tobacco products legislatively;
  they also urged government to allow consumer testing of devices and liquids in retail
  settings. A significant majority of respondents supported adult-only purchases of the product
  but some felt vapour products needed to be advertised as a harm reduction tool for current
  tobacco users.
- Provisions are proposed to come into force February 1, 2016 and will be enforced by health authority enforcement officers, but this is tentative and subject to change.

#### SUGGESTED RESPONSE

- British Columbia's legislation is designed to reduce youth access to vapour products. Adults
  will still be able to purchase these products.
- The Ministry is reviewing the feedback from the consultation process and information on the final regulation will soon be released.

I'm afraid that it is simply too early in the process to tell what coverage might look like. We are still awaiting specifics from Health Canada around how it will be handled as a non-prescription, around issues like processing of claims, etc. That said, if it does wind up as a PharmaCare benefit, coverage would be subject to regular PharmaCare plan eligibility and general rules.

As far as methadone and suboxone — patients must be enrolled in PharmaCare (under one of the several available coverage plans), but both suboxone and methadone are regular PharmaCare benefits, meaning doctors authorized to provide opioid substitution therapy can simply prescribe the medication for patients, without any secondary approval process.

Finally, with respect to BC's response to the Health Canada decision – we view this as a very positive move, and in fact have been asking Health Canada to expedite their review for some time. While you are correct, BC does have some very positive harm reduction programs in place (including the Take Home Naloxone program:

http://towardtheheart.com/ezine/3/take-home-naloxone-program ), by enabling non-prescription use of naloxone for emergencies outside hospital settings, it removes a significant barrier to access that did still exist. That barrier has meant that naloxone must be prescribed by a physician to a specific individual — so people who do not use opioids, but know someone who does (such as support workers, friends and family members) were not able to have access to a kit. This decision should help to remove that barrier.

#### EVENT AND BACKGROUND

- The Ministry of Health, PHSA, BCEHS, BCCDC, health authorities and municipal authorities have been
  working together over the past 18 months to expand naloxone access in community settings across the
  province.
- A Ministerial Order has been signed which permits paramedics with BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) trained to the Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) level, and - for the first time - fire rescue first responders (EMA FRs), to administer naloxone (also known commercially as Narcan®).
- Allowing additional first responders to start administering naloxone to opioid overdose patients marks a
  rapid response to this public health issue, and will save lives of British Columbians.
- Minister Lake will announce this new step in the province's response to the opioid crisis, coordinated by PHSA through its various agencies including BCEHS, BCCDC and Fraser Health.
- This program is expected to save lives as fire services often arrive first in the majority of overdose emergencies in both Surrey and Vancouver,.
- A collaboration agreement is already in place between the Surrey Fire Department and BCEHS, allowing EMA FRs in Surrey to begin the program almost immediately. The City of Vancouver's Fire Department is expected to follow suit as soon as possible, once a collaboration agreement is in place between BCEHS and Vancouver Fire and Rescue Services. They are working to have an agreement signed by Jan. 15<sup>th</sup>.
- The training regimen for the firefighters and EMR paramedics is relatively short, allowing rapid implementation of the new BCEHS program. Surrey firefighters are trained and ready to go.
- RCMP and police are not part of this initial program launch, as only fire responders currently coordinate
  directly with BCEHS to receive dispatch calls directing them to emergency overdose cases.

#### **DESIRED SOUNDBITE / KEY NEWS RELEASE SOUNDBITE**

- Naloxone is safe, cost-effective and can be easily carried by fire crews.
- With fire rescue crews often being the first to reach someone suffering an overdose from an opioid drug, having them give naloxone as early as possible gives the best chance of surviving and minimizing other adverse health consequences of overdose.
- In response to this opioid overdose crisis, the Province of British Columbia has paved the way for medically-trained fire rescue crews to start doing this as soon as possible, with training beginning very soon.

#### **KEY MESSAGES**

- With more than 400 overdose deaths and over 4000 non-fatal overdoses recorded in British Columbia in 2015, the Province recognizes that opioid drug overdoses have become a major public health issue.
- In response to this issue the Minister of Health has just signed a unique directive which will allow all trained first responders to administer naloxone.
- The intent of this program is to put naloxone in the hands of EMR paramedics, and fire rescue crews in Surrey and Vancouver immediately as they are most often first to arrive in response to an
  overdose emergency.
- Surrey and Vancouver will be the first fire departments because together, these two cities regularly
  record the vast majority of overdose cases in BC. Other fire departments will come on board over the
  coming weeks while we sign agreements.
- EMRs and fire crews will be trained in a BCEHS-led program on the use of naloxone, and will
  administer it to opioid overdose patients earlier in many cases as they can do so prior to ambulance
  paramedics arriving, thus helping to save lives and limit brain damage in surviving patients.
- Following the successful administration of naloxone, opioid overdose patients still require further treatment and transport. Ambulance paramedics will take over the patient when they arrive at the scene and continue to treat and transport the patient to emergency department.
- Naloxone is safe. It only has an effect on opioids not any other drugs or alcohol. A healthy person receiving a dose of naloxone would not notice any ill effects.
- It is cost-effective, and can be easily carried by fire crews.
- Expanding the number of responders who can carry and administer naloxone is an effective strategy
  to reduce deaths from opioid overdoses and has been successfully implemented in many jurisdictions
  around the world, including Australia and the U.S.



#### **Proposed Response:**

Shapedown did run in Northern Health between 2013 and 2014, but the program in that region was put on hold. There is interest in looking at opportunities in those communities to focus the programming on First Nations populations — an option that is currently being explored. The program is also currently looking at revisiting the community's needs, the capacity in the region and demographics to best plan for future success.

In addition, there is a telehealth service through HealthLink BC which was launched in February 2015 to include healthy eating and active living coaching for at-risk families in rural and remote parts of the province who may have limited access to the direct, in-person supports provided through Shapedown BC. This would be available to families in the North.

Advances in genomics have triggered a revolution in discovery-based research to understand the most complex biological systems. Genomics offers insights into the unique biomarkers that life forms carry and enables sophisticated ways of segmenting and categorizing in areas such as diseases, tumours and viruses that are otherwise not perceptible through conventional assessment. It offers the clear possibility of better understanding and more precisely targeting diagnoses and interventions in all areas of life sciences.

At this time, genomic and genetic applications are emerging in many areas of medicine. Genomics have the potential to inform preventative, diagnostic and therapeutic care strategies. 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- populations may be very small the genetic makeup of an individualized cancer tumour may not be common enough for a drug company to target (also, cancer cells are remarkably adaptive);
- the state of the technology and the health care system need to achieve a state of readiness that does not currently exist:
  - the system requires quick, reliable technology to read DNA at a clinical quality level that is also a cost benefit to the medical system;
  - doctors and other medical professionals need to have the training and support to analyze and interpret data and drive appropriate clinical decisions based on this;
  - data analytics capabilities for high-throughput systems are necessary to interpret vast amounts of data which are produced from deriving genomics information.

The federal Advisory Panel on Healthcare Innovation, *Unleashing Innovation: Excellent Healthcare for Canada* (2015) put forward recommendations, including the use of genomics (precision medicine), to ensure that Canada's diverse populations and single-payer healthcare systems can be leveraged to the country's advantage. In particular, the panel found that it is important to develop and begin following a roadmap to ensure that Canada's healthcare information and communications technology will support these data-intensive models of care and the rapid-cycle innovations that characterize genomics in the field of medicine. The advisory panel perceives that there is substantial potential for the commercialization of made-in-Canada concepts and tools in genomics.

I'm afraid that it is simply too early in the process to tell what coverage might look like. We are still awaiting specifics from Health Canada around how it will be handled as a non-prescription, around issues like processing of claims, etc. That said, if it does wind up as a PharmaCare benefit, coverage would be subject to regular PharmaCare plan eligibility and general rules.

As far as methadone and suboxone – patients must be enrolled in PharmaCare (under one of the several available coverage plans), but both suboxone and methadone are regular PharmaCare benefits, meaning doctors authorized to provide opioid substitution therapy can simply prescribe the medication for patients, without any secondary approval process.

Finally, with respect to BC's response to the Health Canada decision — we view this as a very positive move, and in fact have been asking Health Canada to expedite their review for some time. While you are correct, BC does have some very positive harm reduction programs in place (including the Take Home Naloxone program: <a href="http://towardtheheart.com/ezine/3/take-home-naloxone-program">http://towardtheheart.com/ezine/3/take-home-naloxone-program</a>), by enabling non-prescription use of naloxone for emergencies outside hospital settings, it removes a significant barrier to access that did still exist. That barrier has meant that naloxone must be prescribed by a physician to a specific individual — so people who do not use opioids, but know someone who does (such as support workers, friends and family members) were not able to have access to a kit. This decision should help to remove that barrier.

SUBJECT: Amendments to the Drug Price Regulation

AUTHORITY: Pharmaceutical Services Act; Drug Price Regulation, section 17

PURPOSE: This order will amend and update s. 17 of the Drug Price Regulation to reflect

revised dates relevant to the sale of generic drugs by manufacturers under the Low

Cost Alternative (LCA) program.

#### BACKGROUND:

The Pharmaceutical Services Act (the Act) was brought into force May 31, 2012. Under the Act, the Minister has the authority to set limits and conditions on prices of drugs, within the bounds set by Cabinet, which are set out in the Drug Price Regulation (Regulation).

The Regulation codifies pricing policies that limit the amount that the Ministry of Health may pay for certain classes of drugs, including high cost drugs and LCA drugs. The LCA Program is a PharmaCare drug reimbursement program intended to ensure that best value is obtained for expenditures on multi-source drugs, commonly referred to as generic drugs. The program works by limiting reimbursement for generic and brand name drugs subject to an LCA price. In addition, the LCA class refers to categories of multi-source drugs (typically a brand name drug plus multiple generics; only generic products; or one generic product and one brand product) that have the same active ingredient, strength, and dosage form.

Section 17 of the Regulation supports the annual price confirmation process for generic drugs. Normally, the program branch seeks to establish the prices for generic drugs for a one year pricing period. The drug pricing period commences on April 1 of each year. Currently, the program branch is confirming prices for the April 1, 2016 to March 31, 2017 period. To conduct an annual price confirmation process for generic drugs, a one month transitional or 'washout period' between March 1 and March 31 of each year has been established to allow pharmacies to manage their inventories prior to the beginning of the next pricing period, which begins on April 1. It is desired that manufacturers do not take advantage of suppliers or providers by selling generic drugs to them at prices that are higher than what the price will be upon commencement of the pricing period on April 1.




