Hello Deborah,

As discussed yesterday, VIU has not used consultant lobbyists for provincial government work.

We have, however, worked with an Ottawa-based firm, Tactix Government Relations and Public Affairs, for federal government outreach.

While they have done some registered lobbying for us, most of their work has been focused on research, strategic planning, advice and counsel on accessing federal government programs and opportunities in support of, for instance, our proposed Health and Science Centre, as well as other initiatives.

The cost of this work has totalled \$103,656.05 during the past three fiscal years (2012/13 – 2014/15). We are not currently using their services, but may in the future.

Hi Rob. Matt Wood forwarded your questions to me since I have “government relations” as one part of my portfolio (along with alumni relations, fundraising, and communications). I maintain communication with all levels of government – both staff and elected officials – to inform them of UNBC developments and events, for example, as well as serve as a liaison if they have questions about the University. It’s worth noting that the role of the President is also to maintain relationships with government on behalf of the University and our president takes this role very seriously. UNBC’s history is very much rooted in the active engagement of government officials at the local, regional, First Nations, and provincial levels and we have been very fortunate to have elected officials who support UNBC and are happy to engage with us. We do not presently pay for external Government Relations consultants or lobbyists, and we haven’t in recent years to the best of my knowledge.

Hello Tony,

Following your conversation with Carmen this afternoon, she has asked me to forward this information to you.

- UVic is not paying for any lobbyists or government relations consultants for their engagement with the provincial government.
- In one instance, in the last five years, Ocean Networks Canada, which is an initiative of the university, hired Wazuku Advisory Group to assist with its engagement with industry partners and the provincial government. ONC did not have any internal government relations capacity at the time.
- The hiring of Wazuku was specific to one project in 2013/14 that was complex in that it involved engagement with multiple business entities, identifying potential private sector partners and finally multiple government departments. That project is now concluded. The amount paid to Wazuku was \$43,710.00.

Carmen also checked on your last question, and the answer is “No”.
