- ABCS has also expressed support for consideration of those under 18 years of age to serve on a board of directors.
- The Act received Royal Assent on May 14, 2015.

Analysis:

- Section 69 deals with termination of membership. It was not altered in spite of submissions received from student societies. As noted above, there are potential implications for the funding of student society programs.

Tuition and Student Financial Assistance

- The student leaders may also comment on tuition and student financial assistance.
- The Ministry's tuition limit policy places a cap of 2 per cent on annual increases. It has been in effect since September 2005.
- The British Columbia Loan Reduction Program provides grants to reduce outstanding provincial loans after the successful completion of each year of full-time study. About 23,000 students were issued the grant in 2012/13. Eligible students can receive the grant for up to four years (five years for students with dependents).
- The Province covers the interest on student loans for up to 10 years while students are in studies. In 2012/13, the Province spent \$9.1 million to cover interest on student loans for about 61,000 students.
- Eliminating interest rates would cost about \$36.7 million annually (based on outstanding portfolio at January 31, 2013.) British Columbia's interest rate of 2.5 percent is in line with the Canada Student Loan program.

The Kwantlen Students Association hasn't met with any Minister of Advanced Ed for some time, in fact I can't offhand recall preparing information for such a meeting ever.

Anyway, besides tuition and SFA, which as Connie points out are perpetual issues, one possible issue the KSA might raise is the MOU that KPU recently signed with Kinder Morgan working through Trans Mountain Expansion Project (TMEP).

The MOU was announced June 23, 2015 and gives KPU a total of \$300,000 in scholarships under three different schemes over 20 years, and a small amount of operating funding (\$2,000 x 20 years) for the KPU Environmental Technical Protection Lab at the Langley campus. A BCGEU press release states that the agreement also provides Kinder Morgan significant input into the educational content of the EPT program, allowing them to "engage with students as subject matter experts, program advisory committee members... and guest speaking opportunities."

TMEP's support to KPU is conditional upon the approval by the National Energy Board of the pipeline expansion project. The NEB is expected to rule on the pipeline early next year.

The KSA, Kwantlen First Nation, the BCGEU, and a student group called PIPE UP have all protested against KPU signing this MOU, citing KPU's ostensible dedication to environmental sustainability and the lack of consultation around its signing, and possible threats to academic freedom.

At a public meeting on July 6 with KPU students, President Alan Davis said, "I'm sorry if there's offense taken at taking money from particular causes. There is no legal or policy or governance issue about doing that, and it would be a political statement on my part to decline it and not one for me to make. I don't have academic freedom, and KPU should not be seen as a political agent itself.... It's a fact of life that we have to engage with industry in receipt of money to support our endeavours. It would be great if we

were 100 per cent funded and we were tuition free and didn't need to ask anybody for a penny." (quoted in the July 2015 issue of The Runner, the KPU student magazine http://issuu.com/runnermag/docs/the runner volume 7 issue 19)

I hadn't seen any Issues Note prepared about this, and while it did make a couple of headlines at the time there has been no further media coverage.

It is possible the KSA would raise this issue, and in my opinion the suggested response should be that the Ministry has no role to play here, no power to affect KPU's decisions, nothing illegal about it, etc..

- The extension will require TransLink to nominally increase monthly student fees to help cover inflationary costs of transit services. The U-Pass fee is currently \$38.00 per month and will increase to \$39.50 in year one and \$41.00 in year two of the extension.
- Student associations have been advised of the pending increases. While they would prefer no increases, they understand the need to cover some inflationary costs.
- Student referenda will be required prior to May 2016 to approve the fee increases.

Meeting Note Advice to Minister

Date: July 27, 2015 **Cliff #:** 100306

Issue: Meeting with BCIT Student Association to follow up on issues discussed at the March 9, 2015 meeting

Conclusion:

 The meeting is intended to maintain ongoing communication with the Minister and follow up on previous discussions.

Background / Facts:

- On March 9th Ministers Wilkinson and Yamamoto met with executive members of the BCIT Student Association (BCITSA) to discuss the needs of students attending BCIT and the positive socio-economic impact that current students and alumni have on the region.
- BCITSA has requested a further meeting to discuss ways that the BCITSA can work with Government to address issues of importance to BCIT students and the institution. Potential topics for discussion include:
 - The budget allocation for deferred maintenance;
 - o Infrastructural needs of trades programs at BCIT; and
 - Expanding the BC Completion Grant to specifically target critical trades areas.

 As suggested by Minister Yamamoto, the BCITSA met with the Small Business Roundtable to discuss co-op education, internships and other opportunities for mutual benefit for both BCIT students and small businesses.

Analysis:

Deferred Maintenance

- The British Columbia capital program for public post-secondary institutions includes funding for new capital projects and for maintenance and rehabilitation projects for the institutions' physical infrastructure.
- Routine capital funding is targeted to address deferred maintenance and projects that address campus safety and security, disabled access, site works and reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
- Projects are also prioritized based on factors such as health and safety, operating cost reduction, access to quality education, job creation/economic benefit, and infrastructure sustainability.
- Every year the ministry works with public post-secondary institutions to identify projects
 with varying degrees of deferred maintenance, such as renewal and upgrades to fire
 alarm and fire suppression systems, electrical and mechanical systems, building
 envelope elements, interior finishes and elevators.
- A summary of approved projects and capital planning projects is provided in Attachment One.

B.C. Skills for Jobs Blueprint: Skilled Trades needs:

- Government is investing \$185 million over three years in new trades training equipment and facilities throughout B.C. to support students entering in-demand sectors including LNG, shipbuilding and ship repair, and construction.
- As part of B.C.'s Skills for Jobs Blueprint, BCIT has received a total of over \$20 million for trades training infrastructure and equipment to support trades students:
 - In November, 2014, the new \$18-million BCIT/VCC Motive Power Centre of Excellence at Annacis Island officially opened. B.C. provided \$13.5 million toward the total project cost for tenant improvements and a one-time grant of \$4.5 million for moving and transition costs associated with relocation.
 - Over the past two years, a total of \$2,728,667 for trades training equipment.
 - \$421,500 in January 2015 for a lathe (machinist and millwright programs), a motor grader (heavy mechanic programs), welding equipment (welding and pipefitting programs), and fall arrest lifelines (carpentry programs).
 - \$2,307,167 in July 2015 to purchase industry-standard trades training equipment such as a power feed drilling machine and a hydraulic shear.

Expanding the B.C. Completion Grant to specifically target critical trades areas:

- The new B.C. Access Grant for labour market priorities was announced in September 2014.
- The program provides non-repayable funding to encourage students with financial need to enrol in foundational trades programs, at eligible B.C. public post-secondary institutions, that align to in demand occupations.
- In addition to the Tools and Unmet Need components (totalling \$7,000 in funding), eligible BCIT students may also have their B.C. student loan reduced by up to \$5,400.

Also, back in October 2014, Jason Rohrick asked for some comment on sections of the Societies Act that student societies might find problematic, and I attach the comments I made then.

I can see why Section 69 in the new act could be of interest to student societies; it's not that the membership is small or scattered (since they consist of all tuition-paying students at the institution) but they do often struggle with getting quorum at their AGMs.

In the past, I recall there have been occasional Liberal Party resolutions from the floor about making membership in students societies optional but Government has wisely not touched this issue.
