Hi Zak; Please see the following background information. If you need to quote someone, please attribute it to a ministry spokesperson.

Government self-insures buildings and manages insurance claims for property through an insurance pool known as the Universities and Colleges Insurance Protection Program up to \$250,000.

Claims over \$250,000 are the responsibility of the Ministry. This provides for a substantial savings in insurance costs. The exception is for buildings that are outside of direct education services that government does not directly fund. For example, athletic facilities, housing, gyms, swimming pools etc. Non-core buildings are covered through an optional private insurance program.

Good afternoon Members-

Pursuant to the *Members' Remuneration and Pensions Act*, Members' basic compensation must be adjusted every year on April 1, by the percentage increase of the Consumer Price Index for British Columbia for the 12 month period ending on December 31 of the previous year. The 2018 Consumer Price Index for British Columbia was calculated to result in an average increase of 2.7%.

As such, effective April 1, 2019, the basic compensation for each Member of the Legislative Assembly will increase by 2.7%, resulting in an annual increase of \$2918.84 and bringing Members' annual basic compensation to a total of \$111,024.19.

In addition, your annual constituency office allowance will increase by 2.7% on April 1, 2019, resulting in a rounded increase of \$3,700 and bringing the annual constituency office allowance to \$141,400.

Finally, mileage allowance rates will also change, moving from \$0.54 to \$0.55 per kilometer effective April 1, 2019. This increase, which mirrors the rate change for the provincial government, is applicable to all Members and employees who use their personal vehicles for Assembly related travel.

Subject: Japanese Beetle Control Regulation in your district

To Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Training Hon. Melanie Mark:

The Ministry of Agriculture, in partnership with the Canadian Food Inspection Agency, is carrying out an initiative to control the spread of Japanese beetle, a highly destructive pest that feeds on the leaves and fruits of over 250 host plants, including elm, maple, apple, peach, cherry, corn, grape vines and berries. Currently the beetle has only been detected in urban Vancouver, with the 2019 treatment area being centred around the False Creek area.

To prevent the beetles from spreading further, the Ministry is bringing forward an Order in Council for Cabinet approval on April 10, 2019, that will create a new Japanese Beetle Control Regulation under the *Plant Protection Act*. This regulation will allow inspectors (Ministry staff and licensed commercial applicators) to enter private land in a Japanese beetle treatment area, issue directions to land owners and occupiers in the treatment area, carry out inspections, and treat turf and outdoor plants through the one-time application of Acelepryn, a low-risk pesticide registered with Health Canada for the purpose of treating Japanese beetle.

This treatment plan follows a similar plan that was carried out in 2018, though treatment was voluntary as there was no regulation in place. No land owners refused the treatment once the program and course of treatment were explained to owners. Public outreach and education has been ongoing, including website updates, news releases, mail outs, information booths at events in the treatment area, presentations and webcasts, etc. No major concerns from stakeholders or the public have been raised, and we again expect little to no resistance to conducting treatment from the public.

The treatment program for 2019 will begin as soon as possible once the OIC is approved in early April and is planned to continue until the end of September. There may be follow-up visits in the summer to higher-risk properties to ensure treatment has been carried out and to inspect for mature beetles.

Cabinet Operations has advised us that we need to provide statements of support for this OIC from government MLAs in the electoral districts where treatment will take place in 2019. This includes your district of Vancouver-Mount Pleasant. We require a response indicating your support by **Tuesday, March 26** at **noon.**



It was an absolute pleasure to meet you at this year's BC Tech Summit. I was honestly moved by your depth of presence and very much look forward to continuing our conversation on providing a real solution for students, youth, young adults and the challenges they face today.

I am a professional coach, mentor and creator of Facing Dragons Quest, an online quest to help youth & young adults unlock their mission, vision and purpose. Participants gain essential life skills, tools of transformation and develop a positive sense of self and inner leadership.

- How much funding from the provincial government goes to Post-secondary Education institutions every year?
- Those students hope that the province can provide more funding. Can you commend on that?

Background

Recommendation

Provincial operating funding covers only a portion of the funding that is required to operate public post-secondary institutions in British Columbia. Additional funding sources include research grants, tuition, investment income and ancillary operations.

Operating grants for B.C. 25 public post-secondary institutions totalled \$1.9 billion in 2018-19.

- 2018-19: \$1.947 billion
- 2017-18: \$1.885 billion
- 2016-17: \$1.831 billion
- 2015-16: \$1.804 billion

Over the next three years, the ministry budget is expected to steadily increase.

In addition to operating grants, the province also provides funding toward capital projects such as providing \$45 million towards the new \$126 million Sustainable Energy and Engineering Building at SFU Surrey. Budget 2019 includes a direct investment of \$1.4 billion over the next 3 years in provincial capital funding.

Annual tuition increases remain capped at 2% per year for Canadian students.

This gov't was quick to take action on making post-secondary education and skills training more affordable with tuition-free adult upgrading programs since Sept. 1, 2017 with more than 20,000 students benefiting The Province is also funding a provincial tuition-waiver program for former youth in care, launched a new \$12-million graduate scholarship fund and effective Feb. 19, 2019, eliminated interest on B.C. gov't student loans. More than 200,000 borrowers will save about \$22 million in interest payments in 2019-20. Other work includes investing in open textbooks as approximately 99,000 students have saved as much as \$10 million since the open textbook project was launched in 2012.

Our Sector Labour Market Partnerships (SLMP) program area issued a Call for Responses (CFR) for pilot projects funded through their division.

Program let us know that specifically, these CFR sought pilot projects that will address the attraction, retention and career advancement of *equity-seeking groups in the B.C. workforce*. The pilot project(s) will help determine what works best to address the systemic structures and behaviors that create advantage for some and disadvantage others.



Name of pilot project: "Digital Phenotype Autopsy of Patients died of Opioid Overdose."

The method is to access digital data of persons died of opioid overdose, such facebook, twitter, whatsapp, texts etc.

The objective is to mine and analyze these data sets for retroactive prediction of imminent overdose event.

The project would need a one time funding of \$100,000 to UBC and time line of completion is approx 12 months.

- Designation is associated with a higher level of quality. Only designated institutions can apply for the BC
 Education Quality Assurance (EQA) designation and, once EQA is achieved, enrol international students on study permits and apply for StudentAid BC
- Interim designation may be issued when an institution applies for, but does not meet, all the requirements for designation. For example, an institution must be certified for at least one year before it is eligible for a designation certificate

Dear Minister Mark,

I am writing to you on behalf of the Carnegie Community Centre Association, a non-profit under the Societies Act and given the status of charity under the Canada Revenue Agency. I am the volunteer editor of the *Carnegie Newsletter* and its little sister publication *Help in the Downtown Eastside*. It is with the latter publication that I hope to engage your interest.

Help in the Downtown Eastside

The great majority of low-income people have daily concerns with the minimum necessities – food, clothing, shelter, medical aid and education. Services, agencies, groups and organisations have come together over time to help people better cope. The area between is filled when people find out what is available, which group or venue best meets their particular needs and how to contact them. This is the basic premise driving *Help in the Downtown Eastside* and its revision, updating and availability.

The resource guide began and remains as a pocket-sized booklet with names, addresses & phone numbers for those with free or low-cost food, clothing, thrift stores, household goods, housing providers, health services, drug & addiction services, legal & advocacy providers, peer counselling and support groups, community centres and drop-in venues, access to free phones and computers and services for mental health consumers.

The first edition was in 1991 and was immediately welcomed by staff and front-line volunteers as "so needed" in that they were answering the same questions day after day and writing directions on scraps of paper. The printings began at 1000 English and the first year saw 3 editions. By #4 there was also a French and then a Spanish translation as more people were using it. Funding for the printing was raised each time; there were and are no salaries for those producing it. For the first 17 years funds were raised from various sources, then in 2008 the global financial meltdown saw no outside funds coming in. It was also the year when the regular twice-annual updates/reprinting was extended to once in 8 months, then 10 months, then once 14 months and the last edition - #52 NOVEMBER 2017 – was 2 years after the previous full run printing. This full run has been 11,000 English and 1,000 each in French & Spanish.

The need for paper copies is attested to by both the heartfelt welcoming at each of the dozens of places to which copies are distributed and by the steady depletion of extant copies. The common

refrain is that such information is available online. Full stop. My experience is that the great majority of users do not have smartphones with dataplans, the requisite knowledge of computers or the ability to use such devices in a timely and safe manner. It is the work of many people, this editor included, to enable people to find what they need quickly and without runaround. Virtual access is certainly plausible but not ubiquitous to the majority of users. There is still a gap that must be filled.

To fill this gap in a useful manner, having a current edition of *Help* booklets available is the point of this appeal.

Printing a full run cost \$3200 in 2017. This will have increased and the funds required may be closer to \$4000.

Minister Mark, the *Help in the Downtown Eastside* booklets were the focus of a 3-4 year lobbying effort by staff at local Ministry offices in this area in the late 90s. They wanted their supervisors in Victoria to support this publication, saying that it was an invaluable adjunct to their work performance. Finally, in 2001, I received a letter from the Provincial Government stating that printing the booklets was going to become a fully-funded endeavour. This came a few months before the election that year and the defeat of the NDP. Upon assuming office, Gordon Campbell made no bones about cutting anything he could and the promise of funding this essential guide was not kept.

I am appealing to you now to renew the commitment made by the NDP and fund this publication. If it can come out twice a year it would be 2 x \$3750 or \$7,500 a year. If the printing could be done by the government then the cash outlay would be substantially reduced.

Please respond as soon as you are able. As stated above there has not been an update or revision since November 2017 and those people not technologically adept need it. If you wish to see the publication it is available through the website listed below. Thank you for your consideration.

I am writing to you asking you to please support a review and reversal of the decision by Kwantlen Polytechnic University's administration to cancel 2019-20 intake into the Bachelor of Music in Musical Arts degree program. This matter is unfortunately very urgent as notice of this cancellation was only made known in the last couple of weeks; the Board of Governors meets on March 27th to vote on the proposed KPU budget for next year, a budget which includes the cancellation of the 1st year intake.

Kwantlen's music program primarily serves students from Surrey, Langley, Abbotsford, Chilliwack, and other communities in the area. The degree program is flourishing, with full cohorts of students in each year. To me this demonstrates that the program is providing a quality education. Students are able to afford the programming offered and stay near their communities, instead of having to move into Vancouver itself or another large centre to study. The program is effective at delivering an excellent education, as graduates have proceeded to flourish in graduate-level studies, found employment in the music industry, and become successful teachers.

The cancellation of first-year intake is going to mean that ensembles will not have sufficient numbers to be sustainable, faculty and instructors will become un- or under-employed, elective courses will not be offered. Current students are even now urgently looking for opportunities to transfer to other institutions. The years spend in post-secondary studies are short, expensive, and critical to their futures. Why would any current student be willing at this point to stay in a program that is not supported by KPU's administration and where they will not receive the education they expected and are paying for? Music programs are more integrated between all years of a program than many others - mentoring and learning occurs from playing and singing in large and small ensembles with colleagues at all levels in the program. Losing one full cohort from the department severely compromises what is possible.

Music graduates from Kwantlen are ambassadors for the University as a whole. Musicians are formed by where they study and refer to it often in their professional lives, creating a brand for the program and school as a whole. Until this point, KPU's music program has been highly regarded in the wider music community. If the cancellation proceeds, the institution as a whole will lose this community support. Every school music teacher, studio teacher, professional performer, community band and choir director, church musician, and businessperson who has until now been proud to let others know they studied at Kwantlen will no longer spread support for the institution.

Please use your influence as a Member of the B.C. legislature to reverse this decision and choose to support this important program at Kwantlen.

NEW STRATEGY DEVELOPED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH INDUSTRY PARTNERS AND THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA TO CREATE A FRAMEWORK FOR OHS EDUCATION, CERTIFICATION, AND PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATION

Chilliwack, BC – The Manufacturing Safety Alliance of BC, sponsored by the British Columbia Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training and in cooperation with other industry partners, has developed

a strategy for defining educational standards and credentials for the occupational health and safety profession to address labour market challenges in the BC manufacturing sector.

The new strategy, developed in the third phase of a multi-year Manufacturing Sector Labour Market Partnership (SLMP), is now published on the Alliance website at safetyalliancebc.ca/sector-labour-market-partnership/.

More than half of occupational health and safety workers in BC do not have an Operational Health and Safety (OHS) certification, the labour market research phase of the Partnership found. Few companies require a specific OHS credential, and no specific OHS professional qualification is considered the standard for an OHS role in manufacturing.

BC manufacturers increasingly recognize safety as an essential factor in sustainability, employee engagement and retention, and business culture; however, there is no current consensus on the definition of an OHS professional in manufacturing, the required skills and knowledge, or the professional designations or credentials needed for an employee or candidate to be considered or certified as a qualified professional.

"This lack of a consistent standard handicaps the consistency and quality of occupational health and safety within manufacturing, as well as recruitment, career planning and professional development," said Daneen Skilling, Andrew Peller National Health, Safety and Environmental Manager and Chair of the project's Steering Committee.

In Phase 3 of this project, the Alliance and its partners developed a strategy to create a manufacturing sector OHS competency framework that will define occupational standards for qualifications, skills, knowledge, abilities, and professionalism.

The strategy includes establishing accredited training and education program standards for the OHS profession in manufacturing that are relevant to an evolving industry. It outlines the design of an OHS certification process for manufacturing that will be a benchmark for OHS excellence around the world among professionals and practitioners, training institutions, and employers. In addition, the strategy provides a framework to ensure that the OHS professional certification for manufacturing is known, recognized, and adopted by industry in BC and across Canada.

At this time, companies are more likely to train an existing employee for an OHS role than to recruit externally. The prevalence of mid-career transitions into OHS roles for manufacturing workers signals a continued and possibly growing need for certification programs to adopt an educational pathway that would accommodate this demographic.

"There are too many safety designations and no standards," stated one of the participants in the focus groups cited in the Phase 2 research.

The labour market study identified that only 16.7 per cent of respondents considered OHS knowledge skills and abilities to be the most important qualification in recruiting for an OHS position. Very few respondents (only 3.8 per cent) mentioned a specific OHS credential as the most important job requirement. The lack of defined standards may be a possible reason for this result.

"For a manufacturing occupational health and safety competency and certification strategy to be successful, it needs the buy-in of the industry and a thorough understanding of the value and importance of high-quality occupational health and safety to business and to professionals currently working in the field," said Manufacturing Safety Alliance of BC CEO Lisa McGuire. "It is essential to educate employers on the importance of recruiting a qualified OHS professional whose skills extend

beyond health and safety technical knowledge to include factors such as business acumen, mental wellbeing, influence, communication, change management, and demonstrated competence through practical application in a manufacturing environment."

The ultimate goal of this program is to make BC manufacturing the safest industry in the world.

CRANBROOK – Twice as many College of the Rockies students can rest their heads on more affordable, on-campus beds when a new student housing complex opens in 2020.

Six new cottage-style fourplexes will provide spaces for 96 more students, doubling capacity at the college and allowing students to focus on their studies and not where to live.

The energy-efficient project will be consistent with elements of the CleanBC plan to design more sustainable, energy-efficient buildings. It will include barrier-free first-floor units. And its projected monthly rent of \$500 is 30-40% below current rates in the stretched Cranbrook rental market.

Government is committed to adopting and implementing the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action and the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People by supporting Indigenous students.

College consultation with Indigenous students and the Ktunaxa Nation Council resulted in a design that balances privacy – with individual bedrooms and bathrooms – with opportunities for gathering in common kitchens and living areas.

The Province is investing \$11.6 million in the \$17.7-million project, and the College is contributing the remaining \$6.1 million. The College's contribution includes a \$1 million donation from the Columbia Basin Trust.

- Since 2018, the Province has funded additional 1,261 student homes, representing an 870% increase over the 130 student homes funded the previous 16 years.

- College of the Rockies has approximately 1,800 students, with approximately 48% from outside the Cranbrook area. Cranbrook has a rental vacancy of around 1.2%, according to Canada Mortgage and Housing's latest report (2018).
- The project will provide increased opportunities for local apprentices. It's expected to create 53 direct and 43 indirect jobs.
- Construction is expected to begin in summer of 2019, with the six new fourplexes expected to be ready for students in the fall of 2020.
- The B.C. government's 30-point plan on housing includes a BC Student Housing Loan Program that will allow public post-secondary institutions to access up to \$450 million to help finance student housing projects for 5,000 new student homes over six years.
- Combined with grants and institutional self-financing, B.C. should see approximately 8,000 new student homes built by 2028.
- Funding for this project comes from the Ministry's 10-year capital plan. It's the province's first investment in student housing at the College.
