Health Management Plan

Identification and Tracking

Mink are identified by cards hung over each individual cage showing their previous breeding records, date of birth and any history of illness.

Mortalities are counted daily as they are put in the freezer and are tallied in a book specific to this purpose.

Vaccination and Treatment Protocols

All mink to be kept as breeding stock will be vaccinated for the following; Botulism, Distemper, Enteritis, and Pseudomonas. Records will be kept for all mink vaccinated in a record book.

If an animal is clearly paralyzed and is assessed that it will not recover, it will be euthanized by CO gas immediately.

If an animal has a sore or open wound, it will be moved to a designated "care area" and be administered a penicillin based antibiotic to fight infection, and administered Meloxicam for pain management.

If an animal has diarrhea or discoloured stools, it will be given mixed feed or liver with gallimycin.

Mink showing signs of illness are moved to the "hospital" shed; an area left empty with the specific purpose of housing mink that need to be treated. Mink will be marked with a tag with the description of its current illness. The tag will also be marked every time the mink is treated.

Any mink showing signs of foot rot, ear rot, or eye deterioration will be administered the appropriate dose of Penicillin or Baytril for three to four days. If the mink is showing no signs of improvement after a full treatment, the mink will be euthanized. Dosages are advised by Veterinarian depending on strength of suspension of antibiotic.

Any mink showing signs of Acidosis will have its feed reduced appropriately and be administered a full antibiotic treatment as per previous paragraph.

Nursing Anemia - Female will be off feed, thin, drowsy/dozy. Treatment is to administer 8-10ml of electrolytes per day, if kits are doing well, until female is looking better. If kits are not doing well after one day of treatment, they will be fostered to another female.

Mastitis - Shows up when kits are 3-4 weeks old. Female will be off feed, kits will look thin, small, showing ribs. Female will have swollen mammary glands. We will farm kits out, administer antibiotic protocols to female, mark female as "pelt" if and when she recovers.

New Stock Protocols

If and when new stock is required on the farm, the new mink will be housed in a separate quarantine area where they will be monitored closely for a minimum of two weeks before being introduced into permanent housing.

Euthanasia Protocols

At harvesting - Carbon monoxide tank will be turned on for 3 seconds to kill cart, 30 mink will be placed in the cart, the tank will be turned on again for 3 seconds, 30 more mink will be placed in the box, the tank will be turned on for a final time for 5 seconds. The mink will be left in the box for 8 minutes to ensure death before being removed and inspected for no signs of life before pelting.

Biosecurity/employee

competence

All mink are live in biosecure sheds and have no access to any other animals or visitors. Any visitors are made to wear reflective vests and sanitize hands and clothing. All employees have been trained to and understand the importance of biosecurity. Employees have all been trained to recognize any signs of illness injury or distress in the mink. Daily each individual mink is observed while cleaning of the previous days leftover feed. All employees of ^{s.79} have signed a document that recognizes that they will report any concerns of mink well-being and other biosecurity practise and if not their will be termination of employment.

POLLUTION ABATEMENT ORDER

The Director is satisfied on reasonable grounds that pollution is occurring from the property located at s.79 Abbotsford, B.C, legally described as

s.79

s.79, owned and operated by s.79

Ministry inspections at the above property have shown that agriculture waste (manure), waste milk food and the associated leachate and solids are escaping into the environment causing pollution.

Pursuant to Section 83 of the *Environmental Management Act*, s.79 is hereby ordered to comply with the following requirements:

1. **Retain a Qualified Professional(s) (QP)** to address the concerns identified below and prepare the necessary reports and plans. A QP is identified as an applied scientist or technologist specializing in a particular science including but not limited to agrology, biology, chemistry, engineering, geology or hydrogeology, and
 - a. Is registered in British Columbia with their appropriate professional organization, acting under that association's Code of Ethics, and is subject to disciplinary action by that association, and
 - b. Through suitable education, experience, accreditation and knowledge, may be reasonably relied upon to provide advice within their area of expertise.

There are a number of different specialty areas required below and more than one individual may be required. The QP must be an arm's length arrangement and a third party. The QP is to provide a statement of qualification identifying their ability to meet the requirements of this Order by **May 30th, 2014**;

2. **Immediately stop and prevent the further escape of effluent off-site from**
s.79 that is contaminated with agricultural waste (manure), waste mink food and the associated leachate that impacts the environment;
3. Submit to the Director, by July 31st, 2014, an **Environmental Management Plan (EMP)** that ensures all key environmental concerns are addressed at s.79
s.79 . The EMP must contain but is not limited to the following:
 - a. An **Agricultural Waste Management Plan** that provides proper collection, management and storage of agricultural waste (manure) and waste mink food to ensure this material does not contaminate storm water or create leachate that impacts groundwater and surface water;
 - b. A **Storm Water Management Plan** that addresses the storm water management issues on the farm and the farm building where agricultural waste (manure) or waste feed contacts and contaminates storm water that impacts groundwater and surface water;
 - c. A **Repair and Maintenance Program**, including an implementation schedule, for stopping and preventing leaks from the drinking water supply system located in the mink cages;
 - d. The EMP must include sketches identifying the legal boundaries of the property, buildings including manure storage facilities, storm water sources, watercourses, ditches, swales, creeks, etc.;
 - e. The EMP must provide recommendations indicating the necessary improvements in infrastructure, management practices or other pertinent detail to ensure all environmental concerns are addressed and that the contaminated storm water or leachate does not impact groundwater and surface water; and
 - f. The EMP must provide a schedule indicating when new facilities and improved management practices will be implemented to ensure contaminated storm water or leachate does not impact groundwater or surface water;
4. Submit to the Director, by November 30th, 2014, a **Nutrient Management Plan (NMP)** detailing where agricultural waste (manure) generated at s.79
s.79 is applied to land. The NMP must include, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. Minimize the loss of nutrients from agricultural waste and other fertilizer applied to land by eliminating runoff, leaching, emissions to the air or other mechanisms to prevent pollution;
 - b. Recommend an appropriate nutrient application rate, timing and method of application;

- c. Provide information on the crop(s) in terms of both yield and quality (i.e. nutrient value);
 - d. Submit to the Director by June 30, 2014, a **preliminary NMP** identifying agriculture waste application location and area, crops, recommended application rates and spring soil nutrient information;
 - e. In addition, the NMP must be updated by November 30, 2015 and submitted to the Director for review;
5. Submit to the Director by March 30th, 2015 an **Environmental Impact Study** (Study) that evaluates the impacts of any contaminated storm water discharge from s.79. The Study must provide data that takes into consideration seasonal conditions and variation of all existing or potential impacts to the environment including any off-site migration of effluent to any watercourse including ditches as well as the tributary to s.79. The Study must provide an analysis with a comparison to all applicable provincial water standards. The study must address the impacts identified during previous incidents in August 2004 and November 2005. Please note that Ministry can provide, upon request, additional information from these historical incidents.


Failure to comply with the requirements of this order is a contravention of the *Environmental Management Act* and may result in legal action.

This order does not authorize entry upon, crossing over, or use for any purpose of private or crown lands or works, unless and except as authorized by the owner of such lands or works. The responsibility for obtaining such authority rests with you. It is also your responsibility to ensure that all activities are carried out with due regard for the rights of third parties, and comply with other applicable legislation that may be in force, such as municipal bylaws relating to the discharge of waste to municipal storm or sanitary sewers.

This decision may be appealed to the Environmental Appeal Board in accordance with Part 8 of the *Environmental Management Act*. An appeal must be delivered within 30 days from the date notice is given. For further information, please contact the Environmental Appeal Board at (250) 387-3464.

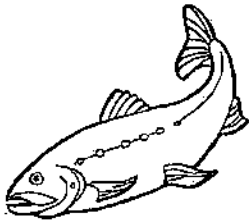

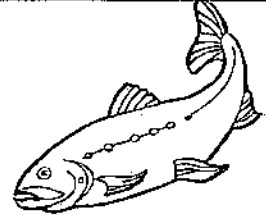
