Salmon

 There are a variety of high profile files underway in British Columbia relating to both farmed and wild salmon. Due to a variety of factors, many wild salmon runs are expected to have very low returns this year, including a number of Fraser River species being considered for listing as species at risk. Because Fisheries and Oceans Canada has the primary authority for both farmed and wild Pacific salmon, it is important for BC and Canada to work collaboratively on these issues.

Key messages:

1) MAACFA

- On April 5th, BC released the final report of the Minister of Agriculture's Advisory Council on Finfish Aquaculture (MAACFA).
- This multi-stakeholder advisory process had conflicting perspectives on salmon farming but
 was able to reach consensus on six overarching themes, including 29 recommended actions.
 Many of are the responsibility of Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO).
- DFO has been engaged in this process, and BC has been pleased to see many of these recommendations gaining traction, such as the National Science Advisor's new initiative on aquaculture science and the new cost-shared Fisheries and Aquaculture Clean Tech Adoption Program. It will be important that our two governments work together to assess and implement these recommendations.

2) Negotiations with Broughton First Nations

- BC is undertaking sensitive negotiations with five First Nations in the Broughton Archipelago. These First Nations have been consistently opposed to salmon farms in their traditional territories.
- Early discussions have been focused on the province's consideration of tenure renewals coming up in June 2018. However, given DFO's responsibility for fish health and the licensing of salmon farms, we will need senior level engagement by the Minister and DFO as these discussions progress.
- Approximately one-third of total salmon farm production in BC is in the Broughton Archipelago, so these discussions with First Nations will have important implications for the industry.

3) International Year of the Salmon – funding for fisheries

- The International Year of the Salmon (IYS) will be announced in Fall 2018, with its focal year being 2019, and projects and activities continuing into 2020.
- This could be an opportunity for Canada and BC to increase the profile of wild salmon and to prepare for further investments in fisheries as part of the Budget 2019 process.
- BC recognizes the significant recent federal investments in fisheries science and habitat protection.
- There remain outstanding funding gaps, in particular relating to monitoring and stock assessment, that currently limit our ability to effectively manage these fisheries and represent ourselves well in negotiations with the US.

4) Canada-US Pacific Salmon Treaty

 BC is participating in the Canadian negotiating team seeking to reach a new agreement with the US, on expiring conservation and sharing arrangements under the Treaty. It is

- critical that we reach an agreement with the US but it is also critical that Canada not accept "a bad deal".
- We are concerned about the risks of not reaching an agreement by May 2018, but see positive signs of progress in that another negotiating round is planned for April.
- Premier Horgan has discussed the importance of this agreement with the Governors of Washington and Oregon. Given the importance of the treaty to BC, the Premier will consider any other diplomatic efforts that align with Canada's strategy.
- BC is interested in knowing how it can assist with a Team Canada approach to advocacy on this issue with the US.

Ref: 185200 Date: October 21, 2016

Issue: BC's support for continuing engagement in international Pacific fisheries negotiations.

Background: In 2015, commercial capture fisheries in BC harvested 158,900 metric tonnes of seafood with a wholesale value of \$773.5 million. Capture fisheries account for about 54% of the total wholesale value of all BC seafood (wild capture and culture). Many of BC's resources are highly migratory or straddling fish stocks that are impacted by management and harvesting actions of other nations. International fisheries management cooperation is critical to achieving our shared interests regarding conservation, the environment, sustainable economic and community wellbeing, and climate change.

Although sovereign nations are responsible for international treaties and agreements, sub-national states such as BC also have strong interests. BC has significant authority, either exclusive or shared with the Federal Government, over many areas that are critical for fish, including managing habitat and forest practices, and the commerce of fisheries. The Province's direct engagement in international treaty negotiations has been noted as helpful in reaching successful conclusions, by both the federal government and industry.

A number of fishing arrangements including those under the CDA-US Pacific Salmon Treaty and the Albacore Tuna Treaty are set to expire in the near future (2018 and 2016 respectively). Both Parties are now making plans to enter renegotiation, and issues are beginning to emerge. Provincial fisheries agencies and the Intergovernmental Relations Secretariat (IGRS) may also need to be made aware of the issues.

It is important that BC remains directly involved in international fisheries negotiations to ensure sustainable management and sharing of regional resources. BC seeks to ensure that stable fishing agreements are reached, and they remain focused on fisheries issues (See Appendix1).

First Nations Considerations: Consultations with First Nations regarding international agreements are the responsibility of Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO). BC First Nations have a long history of involvement in commercial fisheries and processing. BC First Nations are actively involved in the Pacific Salmon Commission, as Commissioners and on panels and committees. First Nations also have a Commissioner on the International Pacific Halibut Commission and the Tri-National Sardine Forum.

Discussion: BC supports Canada's participation in international fisheries agreements as a mechanism for conservation and effective management of highly migratory and straddling fisheries stocks, including: Pacific salmon, hake, albacore tuna, halibut and sardines. International fisheries treaties and agreements:

- protect possible fishing opportunities for British Columbians and Canadian stocks that migrate outside Canada's Exclusive Economic Zone;
- · ensure that rules and access for international fisheries in the North Pacific reflect BC's interests;
- protect BC interests in ensuring that they remain fisheries focussed, and not delve into other areas of
 provincial jurisdiction (such as environment assessment); and,
- advance protective measures for vulnerable marine ecosystems that are consistent with BC's interests.

Conclusion:

Ministry staff are and need to continue to actively participate in negotiations and meetings of
international commissions to ensure BC's interests and position are represented and recognized by DFO
and other states.

- Good relations with the United States and other Pacific nations are important to the Province.
- BC continues to stay involved in the Pacific fisheries negotiations to ensure BC priorities and interests continue to be recognized and to avoid unreasonable intrusion into areas of BC jurisdiction.

Appendix 1 International Pacific Fisheries Management Treaties and Agreements:

Pacific Salmon Treaty (Canada/United States)

- The Pacific Salmon Treaty (PST) was the first bilateral salmon agreement that addresses the range of salmon interceptions on a coast-wide basis. It provides a forum for the countries to meet and develop coordinated fisheries management plans to achieve the objectives of the PST – conservation and sharing.
- The commercial and recreational salmon fisheries provide significant economic and social benefits to the Province. The commercial salmon fleet includes 1,809 licences, while 228,162 (in 2010) recreational saltwater anglers are licensed.
- Pacific salmon are of great social and economic importance to BC, sustaining communities' coast wide, generating a wholesale value of \$172.8 million in 2015, and the mainstay of the recreational fisheries sector.
- The Province has participated in the Pacific Salmon Commission (PSC) process since the PST was signed in 1985. Since 2001, the Province has had a Commissioner representing its interests;
 Mr. Paul Sprout is currently "BC's" Commissioner.
- Although a few chapters of the PST were recently re-negotiated, including the Fraser River sockeye and pink chapter, a number will expire in 2018, including chinook, coho, chum and transboundary.
- The Parties are currently preparing for renegotiations, and BC will be asked for its priorities, as part of Canada's negotiation plan (mandate).

International Pacific Halibut Commission (Canada/United States)

- The International Pacific Halibut Commission (IPHC), established in 1923, manages halibut stocks shared by Canada and the United States (US).
- The 2015 coast-wide catch limits for halibut were increased by 6% from 2014. However, using stock
 assessment information for the Canadian fishing zone (Area 2B), Canadian Commissioners negotiated
 an allowable catch of 7.038 million pounds which represents an increase of 3% from 2014 (and equal to
 the 2013 allocation), noting facts regarding the health and management of stocks in BC. This is 2.08
 million pounds more than the limit initially suggested for the Canadian Fishing Zone, and an increase of
 188,000 pounds from the 2014 allocation.
- BC's commercial harvest has averaged 3,667 metric tonnes (MT) and \$103.5 million in wholesale value (2013-2015).
- The 2015 BC recreational allocation will be 1.0557 million pounds which should be sufficient for the recreational fishery and provide charter operators and sport fishing lodges the longest possible operating season.
- AGRI staff played an active role in this year's negotiation and advice on the balance of domestic
 allocation, harvest rules and posture with respect to international commitments.

Treaty on Pacific Coast Albacore Tuna Vessels and Port Privileges

- The Canada-US Albacore Tuna Treaty (Treaty) was signed in 1981, after changes in ocean temperatures
 caused the majority of Pacific albacore stocks to shift northward into Canadian waters. The Treaty
 provided for reciprocal access to ports for albacore landings and vessel supplies, and to Exclusive
 Economic Zones (EEZ) for albacore fishing. In some years, ocean conditions cause the majority of the
 albacore stocks to shift to US waters.
- The fishing arrangement was suspended by the US for the 2012 fishing season. As a result, the landed volume of albacore caught by BC vessels was reduced from 5,415 MT valued at \$48.2 million (wholesale) in 2011 to 2,536 MT and \$36 million in 2012.
- In December 2013, Canada attempted to negotiate restored access to US waters for the Canadian fleet.
 Meetings, and advocacy efforts, which included the Federal Government, AGRI staff, industry, and the

Premier's Office, eventually resulted in an agreement on a renewed one-year fishing regime for 2013, allowing only 45 Canadian vessels to fish in US waters. In 2013, the total BC harvest was 5,100 MT with a wholesale value of \$53 million.

- Following intense negotiations, meetings on April 16 and 17, 2014 resulted in an agreement with the US
 Government on a three-year fishing regime which provides access for 45 Canadian vessels to the US
 zone under the same terms of the 2013 agreement until 2016.
- Canadians will have access to US waters from June 15 to September 15. The season for US harvesters in Canadian waters remains from June 15 to October 31.
- The fishing arranged has now expired, and Canada, industry, and BC are continuing to seek means to start some form of negotiations with the US. This is a high priority for Canada and BC.
- AGRI staff played a key role in design and negotiation of the previous fishing arrangements and is actively engaged in treaty discussions and developing Canadian negotiation strategies.

Hake Joint Management Committee (Canada/United States)

- In 2003, governments signed a treaty on the management of Pacific hake that was ratified in 2007.
 Pacific hake is a highly migratory stock that spawns off Southern California and Mexico and migrates north during the summer as far as BC. Hake fisheries occur off Oregon, Washington and BC which led to the need for a Canada/US Pacific hake agreement regarding stock assessment, management and harvest sharing.
- Pacific hake is the largest fishery by volume in BC with average landings of over 46,300 MT/year (2013-2015). The average wholesale value for the same period was \$39.6 million.
- · AGRI staff is actively engaged in domestic management and allocation committees for this fishery.
- Under the Treaty, a Joint Management Committee (JMC) is created; made up of four representatives from each country. The Province has an AGRI staff member on the JMC. The JMC negotiates the annual total allowable catch (TAC) for this fishery: for 2017 fisheries, they will meet in Seattle on February 28 –March 2, 2017. In 2016, a TAC of 130,000 MT was set. However, due to a number of factors, including water temperature and stock distribution changes, only about 60,000MT has been harvested in BC as of October, 2016.


Tri-National Sardine Forum (Canada, United States, Mexico)

- Although there is no current treaty or formal agreement between the parties, the Tri-National Sardine Forum (TSF) has met annually since 2000 to review the status of the stock and management of their fisheries. The next meeting is planned for December 8/9, 2016 in La Jolla, California.
- At some time in the future it is likely that Canada and the US will want to have a more formal
 agreement.
- BC fishermen have developed a modest fishery for sardines (averaging over 20,000 metric tonnes, and \$20 million in wholesale value – 2010-2012). The 2013 TAC was 25,477 MT; however, there was no harvest as the fish did not show up in BC waters. Similarly in 2014, the TAC was 17,174 MT, but again there was no harvest, due to an apparent absence of Pacific sardines in BC waters.
- There is a zero TAC for 2016, but early indications from DFO and the Sport Fishing Advisory Board (SIAB) point to the potential of a BC sardine fishery in June 2017.
- It is estimated that 50% of the sardine licences are held by BC First Nation Tribal Council/Bands.
- AGRI staff participated in the first TSF (2001) in Mexico and has actively engaged several times since.

Title: Canada-United States Pacific Salmon Treaty (PST) negotiations.

Issue: Update on the status of current negotiations under the PST to renew chapters which expire in 2018,

Background:

- The Pacific Salmon Treaty (PST) was the first bilateral salmon agreement that addresses the range of salmon interceptions on a coast-wide basis. It provides a forum for the countries to meet and develop coordinated fisheries management plans to achieve the objectives of the PST – conservation and sharing.
- Wild Pacific salmon are of great social and economic importance to British Columbia, sustaining communities' coast wide, generating a wholesale value of \$207 million in 2016. New data indicate that these fish generate \$4.8 Billion to the economy of Canada and the U.S. over the 2012 to 2015 period (over \$1B to B.C.). Commercial and recreational salmon fisheries provide significant economic and social benefits to B.C. The commercial salmon fleet includes 1,809 licences, while 228,162 (in 2010) recreational saltwater anglers are licensed.
- The Province has participated in the Pacific Salmon Commission (PSC) process since the PST was signed in 1985. Since 2001, the Province has had a Commissioner representing its interests with Mr. Paul Sprout currently appointed as "BC's" Commissioner.
- Most chapters are re-negotiated on a 10-year cycle and Canadian and U.S. representatives through the PSC process with potential negotiation of renewal of five chapters under Annex IV of the Treaty that expire December 31, 2018. These chapters are critical to the functioning of the Treaty as they set out the specific conservation and harvest sharing arrangements for Canadian and US salmon stocks and fisheries, subject to the Treaty.
- The Chinook Chapter (Chapter 3) is the most complex and difficult, due to the biology, and lifecycle of chinook, and the elaborate system in place in both countries to manage them.
- Complicating this are the uncertainties at play due to coastwide impacts of climate change, reduced
 marine survival, low abundance of most stocks, (potential SARA listing), and the need to protect chinook
 as primary prey species for SARA-listed Southern Resident Killer Whales (SRKW).
- B.C. through its Commissioner, participates directly as part of Canada's negotiating team as the Parties
 continue to renegotiate.
- Canada has signalled to the US that we are now essentially at an impasse, if cuts to harvest are expected to be taken only in B.C. waters. It is not prepared to sign a deal that is not beneficial to Canada.

First Nations Considerations: Consultations with First Nations regarding international agreements are the responsibility of Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO). BC First Nations are actively involved in the PSC, as Commissioners and on panels and committees. B.C. First Nations have a long history of involvement in commercial fisheries and in fish processing – about 31 percent of all commercial fishing jobs (including processing) are held by B.C.'s Indigenous people.

I am freelancing a feature article for a Canada-US magazine, based in Seattle, about salmon-fish farms. I have two sets of questions related to "Salmon Treaty" talks, and BC's review of fish processing plants.

"Salmon Treaty"

On March 16th, at a joint-newser seated beside B.C. Premier Horgan in Vancouver, Washington Gov. Inslee described negotiations for a "Salmon Treaty" with Canadian jurisdictions. Gov. Inslee said he was hopeful the "treaty" talks would conclude in the "weeks ahead" to protect salmon along our shared coast. That timeline would put us to about now.

- 1. What is the status and purpose of these "Salmon Treaty" negotiations with BC, described by Gov. Inslee?
- 2. Technically, is this a Canada-US "treaty", or some kind of other agreement between Washington state and

- B.C. (and possibly other jurisdictions)?
- 3. Do those negotiations for a treaty/agreement touch upon salmon aquaculture farms (a.k.a. fish farms)?
- 4. Does the "Salmon Treaty" described by Gov. Inslee have anything to do with negotiations for an updated "Columbia River Treaty"?

BC review of fish processing plants

In December, Minister Heyman announced a review of fish processing plants, in the wake of a "blood water" video that went public.

- 1. What has this B.C. review found so far?
- 2. A Dec. 20 CBC report said in December that the province conducted its own tests of the blood water, but "the results [were] not back yet." Are those provincial test results back in now -- and if so, what have tests shown?
- 3. What efforts, if any, is the BC government exploring to move BC's salmon fish farms inland? Deadline: end of week (May 4) if possible.

- The PST represents a bilateral Pacific salmon agreement that addresses conservation and harvest sharing on a coast-wide basis. It provides a forum for the countries to meet and develop coordinated fisheries management plans to achieve the objectives of Treaty conservation and sharing.
 - The Province has participated in the Pacific Salmon Commission (PSC) process since the Treaty was signed in 1985.
 - The Province has had a Commissioner representing its interests at the table since 2001.
 - The BC Commissioner is appointed by the federal Minister of Fisheries and Oceans. Paul Sprout is the current appointee.
 - No, the PST does not have a connection to the Columbia River Treaty.

Attributable on background to Ministry of Environment

- Following an announced review of fish processing plants on December 20, the provincial government initiated inspections of the 30 fish processing plants with provincial permits. The inspections will review whether:
- o Effluent discharge is potentially causing harmful pollution
- o Current authorizations contain strong environmental protection provisions.
- Current authorization holders in the fish processing sector are in compliance with their permit,
- o Best achievable technology (BAT) is being used in the treatment of effluent from fish processing plants.
- * Audit is on track to be complete by May 31, 2018.

* Once inspections and data collection is complete, Ministry staff will be reviewing permits and/or regulations to require that best available technology is used in the treatment of effluent from fish processing plants to protect wild salmon stocks.

- The Province is committed to helping the aquaculture industry transition to closed containment where possible.
- Government is also committed to protecting wild salmon and the nearly 10,000 good-paying jobs that depend on it.
- DFO is responsible for aquaculture licensing in B.C.
- The Province has started on a path forward with First Nations in the Broughton Archipelago that will engage them as true partners in protecting wild salmon on our coast.
- There is a cross-ministry effort to also work closely with the aquaculture industry and the federal government responsible for fish farm licensing.
